California's 2014 Christmas Tree to be Cut and Delivered to State Capitol
Christmas tree to be harvested from a CAL FIRE-managed state forest

WHAT: Cutting & delivery of the state's official Christmas tree

WHEN/WHERE: **Tree Cutting: 8 a.m., November 3, 2014**, at Latour Demonstration State Forest, near Redding, CA. Rain or shine.

Media interested in covering the tree cutting must meet at the CAL FIRE North Operations Center (6105 Airport Road, Redding, California), and MUST be at the meet-up site NO LATER THAN 10:30 a.m. PST in order to be escorted through the forest.

Tree Transport & Arrival at State Capitol: 10 a.m. - 11 a.m., November 4, 2014. Tree will be transported from the Latour Demonstration State Forest to the west lawn of the State Capitol in Sacramento. The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) will transport the tree with a California Highway Patrol escort down Interstate 5 South to the Q Street exit, and will then proceed left onto 10th Street.

Set up: Approximately 12 p.m., November 4, 2014. Tree will be placed in the west lawn of Capitol Park (10th Street between N and L Streets).

SUMMARY: On November 3, a tree crew from the California Department of General Services will cut down the state's official Christmas tree from the Latour Demonstration State Forest near Redding and prepare the tree for transport.

Once set up of the tree is complete the following day, DGS crews will spend several days trimming the tree with 500 hand-crafted ornaments donated from the California Department of Developmental Services. The ornaments are created by children and adults with developmental disabilities who receive services and support from the state's development centers and 21 nonprofit regional centers.

The tree will also feature 10,000 ultra-low-wattage, light-emitting diode (LED) bulbs.

The Latour Demonstration State Forest is one of eight state forests operated by CAL FIRE. These forests are used to host research projects, and demonstrate improved forest management practices, from timber production and environmental stewardship, to public recreation uses. The 9,033 acres that make up Latour State Forest is in eastern Shasta County and offers public recreation activities such as camping, hiking, and the opportunity to cut a Christmas tree.
