The proposed regulatory updates may be considered for inclusion in the 2024 California Green Building Standards Code, Part 11 during the 2024 Triennial Code Cycle. The public is invited to participate and provide input and comments.

  - **a)** Pursuant to AB 2075, convene a workshop on EV charging infrastructure standards that includes HCD, DSA, CARB, CEC, and other relevant stakeholders to consider, among other things, projected demand for EV charging infrastructure based on the state's goals, as specified.
  - **b)** BSC is considering amending the existing exception for EV charging requirements to co-adopt HCD's existing EV exceptions for Areas of parking facilities served by parking lifts.
  - c) BSC is considering amending electric vehicle charging stations (EVCS) to add a new section for EVSE Receptacle regulation to comply with NEMA standard configurations in alignment with HCD's existing code language. BSC is also considering proposing new code language for EV charger connectors in alignment with HCD's current proposal.
  - **d)** BSC is considering adding new code language for raceway capacity requirements to allow for futureproofing for low-power Level 2 EV Charging Receptacles to accommodate future level 2 charging.
  - **e)** BSC will reassess EV charging percentages based on comments received during the 2022 Intervening Code Adoption cycle (pre-cycle activities) specific to retail and office employee charging needs using low power Level 2. BSC is also considering increasing the number of required EVCS.
  - **f)** Pursuant to AB 1738, in coordination with HCD and other relevant agencies, research, develop, and propose for adoption mandatory building standards for the installation of EV charging stations in existing nonresidential developments during specified qualifying retrofits, additions, and alterations to existing parking facilities.
    - BSC is considering amending the regulations for existing buildings or parking areas with previously installed EV capable infrastructure to build out the existing EV capable spaces.
  - **g)** Review HCD's draft proposal for EV charging building standards, Chapter 4 Residential Mandatory Measures.
    - 1. Section 4.106.4.2.2-Multifamily dwellings (Focus on EV Charger Connectors).
    - 2. Section 4.106.4.2.6-Hotels and motels (Focus on EV Charger Connectors).
    - 3. Section 4.106.4.3-(Proposed amendments pursuant to AB 1738) Electric vehicle charging for additions and alterations of parking facilities serving existing multifamily buildings, hotels, and motels.
    - 4. Section A4.106.8.2 Appendix A4 Residential Voluntary Measures.
