Chapter 5 Nonresidential Mandatory Measures, Section 5.106.4.1 Bicycle parking.

# SECTION 5.106 SITE DEVELOPMENT

. . .

- **5.106.4 Bicycle parking.** For buildings within the authority of California Building Standards Commission as specified in Section 103, comply with Section 5.106.4.1. For buildings within the authority of the Division of the State Architect pursuant to Section 105, comply with Section 5.106.4.2.
  - **5.106.4.1 Bicycle parking. [BSC-CG]** Comply with Sections 5.106.4.1.1 and 5.106.4.1.2; or meet the applicable local ordinance, whichever is stricter.
    - **5.106.4.1.1 Short-term bicycle parking.** If the new project or an addition or alteration is anticipated to generate visitor <u>foot</u> traffic, provide permanently anchored bicycle racks within 200 feet of the visitors' entrance, readily visible to passers-by, for <u>5-10</u> percent of new <u>foot traffic visitors</u> new <u>visitor motorized</u> <u>vehicle parking spaces being added</u>, with a minimum of one two-bike capacity rack.

**Exception:** Additions or alterations which add nine or less visitor <u>foot</u> traffic visitors <del>vehicular parking spaces</del>.

- **5.106.4.1.2 Long-term bicycle parking.** For new buildings with tenant spaces that have 10 or more tenant-occupants, provide secure bicycle parking for 5 10 percent of the percent of the tenant-occupant vehicular parking spaces tenant-occupants with a minimum of one bicycle parking facility.
- **5.106.4.1.3.** For additions or alterations that add 10 or more tenant-occupant vehicular parking spaces, provide secure bicycle parking for 5 10 percent of the tenant-occupants being added vehicular parking spaces being added, with a minimum of one bicycle parking facility.
- **5.106.4.1.4.** For new shell buildings in phased projects provide secure bicycle parking for 5-10 percent of the anticipated tenant-occupants vehicular parking spaces with a minimum of one bicycle parking facility.
- **5.106.4.1.5.** Acceptable bicycle parking facility for Sections 5.106.4.1.2, 5.106.4.1.3 and 5.106.4.1.4 shall be convenient from the street and shall meet one of the following:
  - 1. Covered, lockable enclosures with permanently anchored racks for bicycles;
  - 2. Lockable bicycle rooms with permanently anchored racks; or
  - 3. Lockable, permanently anchored bicycle lockers.
