I am the Deputy Director for the Building Inspection & Safety Division of the Marin County Community Development Agency.


It has come to my attention that the California State Fire Marshal's Office has introduced a proposal "Flammability Standards for Building Insulation Materials" which would change the California Building Code, California Residential Code, and California Code of Regulations to allow the use of polystyrene building insulation without added flame retardants for use in below-grade applications.

We have many builders, developers, and property owners in our county who have embraced "green-building" technologies and materials. Our County government has been a sustainability leader, encouraging and supporting positive change to keep Marin County healthy, vibrant, and sustainable for many generations into the future.

Some of these green building techniques require constructive modification of the building codes as well as our inspection protocols. My agency's perspective has always been that the building code should not be an obstacle to innovation, provided the code continues to ensure safety, protection and building integrity.

I have reviewed the Fire Marshal's proposal as well as the Oklahoma State University's fire study evaluating the burn characteristics of below grade polystyrene insulation without added flame retardants. I have concluded that this change in the state building codes would not pose an increased fire risk for buildings using this material installed below grade. Because the proposed code changes would require clear labeling on the product itself, I do not believe this would add any additional burden for our building inspectors to enforce.
