California State Agencies Responsible for Building Codes



This guide shows the state agencies that are involved in CBSC's rulemaking process and their areas of authority. By using this guide legislators will be able to contact and include the responsible agency when writing legislation regarding building standards. In addition, the building community and others can find the agency to contact for building code questions.

The California Building Standards Commission (CBSC) oversees the formal rulemaking processes, adoption, triennial and intervening code cycles and publication of the California Building Standards Code, Title 24, California Code of Regulations, which applies to the design, construction, maintenance, and alteration of all publicly and privately-owned buildings in California. CBSC also has the authority to develop and adopt building standards with application to state-owned buildings, nonresidential green building standards, and for building types that lack specific state agency authority.

No one state agency has authority for all the required codes or standards for all types of buildings.

Several State Agencies

participate with CBSC in the code development and adoption processes. Such as:

- Office of the State Fire Marshal
- Department of Housing and Community
 Development
- Division of the State Architect
- Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development

Each Agency is Accountable

for specific areas of the code. For example:

- The Office of the State Fire Marshal oversees fire and panic safety for all occupancies
- The Division of the State Architect develops structural safety for K-12 public schools, community colleges and essential services buildings and accessibility standards for most occupancies
- The Department of Housing and Community Development has authority for residential, permanent buildings in mobile home and special occupancies

Don't put into Law:

- Anything that will change with technology advancements or will change for other reasons. It is much easier to change code than law
- Anything with specifications such as measurements. The building community use the code book and may overlook law
- Anything that requires compliance from those who design and construct buildings.

The Rulemaking Process

Law: The process of adopting building standards is governed by requirements in the California Building Standards Law, the Administrative Procedure Act, the California Administrative Code, Title 24, Part 1, Chapter 1 and the Health and Safety Code (HSC) Section 18921. CBSC authority and directives are identified in HSC, Division 13, Part 2.5 commencing with Section 18901.

1. Coordinating Council

As mandated by law, CBSC's executive director chairs the Coordinating Council, which consists of representatives from code adopting and proposing state agencies. The council provides for communication and coordination between the state agencies concerning the code development processes.

- 2. State Agencies Participate in Workshops
 Each agency relies on interested party stakeholder groups in the process of developing building standards to ensure that the resulting code language is clear, consistent, achievable, and necessary.
- 3. Code Advisory Committees, Public Participation
 Code Advisory Committees (CAC) established by CBSC convene once proposed building standards are developed. Six discipline-specific committees, consisting of members that include subject matter experts, review the proposed codes and make recommendations to CBSC during open public meetings. Public comments are accepted during the CAC meetings and again during the 45-day comment period before proposed codes are presented to CBSC for approval. CBSC hears public testimony and takes CAC recommendations.
- 4. Commission Meeting
 Ten commissioners are appointed by the governor and represent the public, design professions, the building and construction industry, local government building officials, fire and safety officials, and CBSC is supported by a staff of 14 state employees. The executive director is appointed by the commissioners and is responsible for overseeing and carrying out the day-to-day obligations of the commission.
- 5. Publishing Title 24

Title 24 is published in its entirety every three years and includes current model codes and national standards. An intervening code adoption cycle occurs in between the triennial cycles for the purpose of adopting revisions and new code requirements. Each cycle requires nearly 18 months to complete.

Title 24

California Code of Regulations

The California Code of Regulations (CCR) is divided into 28 sections known as "Titles." Title 24 of the CCR is reserved for state regulations (building standards) that govern the design and construction of all buildings, associated facilities and equipment in the State of California.
