**5.408.1.3 Waste Stream Reduction Alternative**

- **Statement of specific purpose, problem, rationale and benefits:**  
CBSC is proposing to amend the language for the Waste Stream Reduction Alternative calculation by changing the 2 pounds per square foot (PSF) requirement to 1.4 PSF. This amendment is necessary to align the 2015 triennial code update where BSC changed the regulation verbiage from 50% to 65% but did not change the corresponding 2 pounds per square foot (PSF) requirement to 1.4 PSF required to achieve the 65% rate.

CALRecycle allows 4 PSF for construction waste in nonresidential occupancies and the 2 PSF met the 50% requirement. Since the 50% was changes to 65% the 2 PSF needed to be adjusted to 1.4 PSF to align with the new requirement.
