SUBJECT: 2025 California Building Standards Code: Triennial Code
Adoption Cycle Errata

The purpose of this bulletin is to notify code users of error and format corrections being made to the 2025 California Building Standards Code (California Code of Regulations, Title 24). A summary of noteworthy topics specific to these errata is discussed below. Additionally, this bulletin explains the purpose and application of errata.

These changes are published as errata (buff-colored pages) to various parts of the standards, and become effective and enforceable January 1, 2026, to coincide with the effective date of the 2025 California Building Standards Code. Errata have been issued for the following Title 24 Parts:

- Part 2 - California Building Code, Volumes 1 and 2
- Part 2.5 - California Residential Code
- Part 3 - California Electrical Code
- Part 4 - California Mechanical Code
- Part 5 - California Plumbing Code
- Part 6 - California Energy Code
- Part 9 - California Fire Code
- Part 10 - California Existing Building Code
- Part 11 - California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen)

Background

The 2025 edition of the California Building Standards Code was published on or before July 1, 2025, and is now available. Since publication, efforts have been made to ensure that all items that underwent rulemaking in the code adoption cycle are correctly represented in the 2025 publication, and that regulations carried forward are accurately placed. Additionally, grammatical and spelling errors, erroneous references, and other minor misprints that have been identified by users and publishing staff are corrected with this Errata, both for model code language and for California amendments. Errata can be issued at any time because there is no commission action necessary to promulgate those changes. The objective is to ease interpretation issues and enhance understandability in the use of the codes.

Errata

When corrections are necessary to resolve an error such as spelling or numerical mistakes that do not establish new code requirements, errata are issued on buff-colored paper. Errata may also include items that were erroneously omitted from printing but were completed during a previous rulemaking cycle. Errata, like supplements, are published by the respective code publishers (see page 10) with instructions concerning the code pages to be removed and replaced, and contain a History Note Appendix listing the effective date. More information about the application of the errata, maintaining Title 24, and obtaining issued errata copies is provided in the [2025 Guide to Title 24](#) and [Maintaining Your Title 24 guide](#).

Noteworthy Topics

Part 2, Volume 1:

In Chapter 1, Section 107.2.4 Exterior wall envelope, the description for exterior wall envelope is changed to exterior wall assembly.

In Section 110.3.9 Energy efficiency inspections, required inspections are clarified to be specific to building thermal envelope insulation products.

In Chapter 2, Section 202 Definitions, the model code defined terms for “Accessible Unit”, “Type A Unit” and “Type B Unit” dwellings have been removed.

The model defined terms for “Essential Facilities,” “Nominal Loads,” and “Risk Category” have been revised to add Tornado events for buildings and other structures that are intended to remain operational in the event of extreme environmental events, structure design loads and risk performance categories.

In Chapter 4, the following sections have been revised to remove Condition 1 and Condition 2 from Group I-2 Occupancy groups as California does not use those classifications:

403.4.8.1 Equipment room. Condition 2 is removed from the Exceptions.

404.5 Smoke control. Condition 2 is removed from the Exceptions.

407.2.5 Nursing home housing units, Condition 1 is removed.

407.2.6 Nursing home cooking facilities, Condition 1 is removed.

407.5.1 Smoke compartment size. Exceptions are removed.

407.9 Automatic *smoke* detection, Group I-2, Condition 2 and Exceptions 1 and 2 have been removed.

In Section 427.2 Interior supply location, a new sentence and requirement added to clarify that “Rooms containing medical gases shall be labeled in accordance with NFPA 99.”

In Chapter 5, Section 508.3.1.2 about Group I-2, Condition 2 occupancies is removed.

In Chapter 7, Section 710.5.3 Pass-through openings in Group I-2, Condition 2 is removed.

In Section 709.3 Fire-resistance rating, the Exception is removed.

In Chapter 9, Section 903.3.1.3 NFPA 13D sprinkler systems; Group R-4, Condition 1 is removed.

In Section 907.2.11.2 Groups R-2, *R-2.1*, *R-2.2*, R-3, *R-3.1*, and R-4, the Occupancy Group *R-4.1* is removed.

In Section 907.2.16 Aerosol storage uses, the following phrase is added to clarify that "aerosol cooking spray products or plastic aerosol 3 products" shall be provided with an approved manual fire alarm system where required by the *California Fire Code*.

In Section 907.5.2.1 Audible alarms, Exception 1, Condition 2 is removed from the I-2 Occupancy classification.

In Chapter 10, Section 1010.2.4 Locks and latches, Number 5, Single exit doors – "manual bolts" are allowed, provided that such devices are openable from the inside without the use of a key or tool.

In Section 1013.6.3 Power source, Condition 2 is removed from exit illumination requirements for the Group I-2 Occupancy classification.

In Chapter 12, *Table 1202.3.1—IECC Versus California Energy Code Climate Zone Comparison*, California Zone 7 is added to Energy Code comparison table column on the row for IECC Zone 3 (marine).

In Chapter 15, Section *1505.1.1 Roofing requirements within Fire Hazard Severity Zones or in the Wildland-Urban Interface (WUI)*, the reference pointer to CBC "Section 705A" is corrected to "*Chapter 5 of the California Wildland-Urban Interface Code.*"

Other minor editorial and format corrections to the Matrix Adoption Tables and some sections of code language are made throughout Part 2, Volume 1 and to correlate with Part 9, the *California Fire Code* as well.

Part 2, Volume 2:

In Chapters 16 and 16A, Tables 1604.5 and 1604A.5, "Condition 2" is removed from "Group I-2 occupancies" in the description for risk category IV.

Sections 1607.14.3 and 1607A.14.3 about photovoltaic panel systems, and the corresponding subsections are renumbered to Sections 1607.22 and 1607A.22 with subsections to be consistent with 2024 IBC errata.

Section 1607A.14.4, Uncovered open-frame roof structures, is renumbered to Section 1607A.23 so that it is an independent subsection of 1607A.

In Sections 1609.3 and 1609A.3, "design" is removed from the title to be consistent with 2024 IBC errata.

The user notes at the beginning of Chapter 19A, Concrete, are corrected to indicate that this chapter applies specifically to reinforced concrete.

The exception is deleted from Section 2108.1 as an amendment carried forward from prior rulemaking cycles.

In Sections 2203.1 and 2203A.1, General, the term "manufacture" is deleted and replaced with "fabrication."

Sections 2213.1 and 2213A.1 are revised to clarify that the standard applies specifically to material handling structures.

In the title of Section 3006 "opening" is removed and replaced with "door" to read "elevator lobbies and hoistway door protection."

In Chapter 35, Referenced standards, ICC-ES AC 106 – 24: Acceptance Criteria for Predrilled Fasteners (Screw Anchors) in Masonry is deleted as this standard is no longer published. ICC/NSSA 500-2023: ICC/NSSA Standard for the Design and Construction of Storm Shelters is added as it was erroneously omitted in the first printing.

Throughout Part 2, Volume 2, several references to applicable standards and code sections are corrected, adopting agency banners are revised for clarity, and other minor editorial and format corrections to code language and the Matrix Adoption Tables are made.

Part 2.5:

In Chapter 3, Figure R305.4—Termite Infestation Probability Map is replaced with correct map according to 2024 IRC Errata posted 09/13/2024.

In Section R306.2.1 Elevation requirements, the last sentence in sub-item 5.2.5 is separated to become sub-item 5.2.6.

In Chapter 7, Section R702.7.2, reference pointer to Section N1102.5.1.1 is replaced with the *California Energy Code*.

In California amendment *Table R702.7.3—IECC Versus California Energy Code Climate Zone Comparison*, California Zone 7 is added to Energy Code comparison table column on the row for IECC Zone 3 (marine).

In Section R703.2 Water-resistive barrier, reference pointer to Section N1102.5.1.1 is replaced with the *California Energy Code*.

In Section R703.7.3.1 Dry climates, “Dry (B)” is replaced with the phrase “*other than IECC 3 (marine) and 4 (marine)*” and a reference to Section R702.7.3 is deleted in relation to climate zones used in California.

In Section R703.7.3.2 Moist or marine climates, “the Moist (A) or Marine (C)” is replaced with the phrase “*IECC 3 (marine) and 4 (marine)*” and a reference to Section R702.7.3 is deleted in relation to climate zones used in California.

In Chapter 8, Table R806.5—Insulation for Condensation Control, in footnote a., the reference pointer to Section N1102.5.1.1 is replaced with the *California Energy Code*.

In Appendix BF, Figure BF106.4.1—Ultimate Design Wind Speeds for Patio Covers and Screen Enclosures, the map has been replaced with correct one according to 2024 IRC Errata posted 10/04/2024.

In Appendix CG, In Section CG101.2 System requirements, the referenced standard ANSI/CAN/IAPMO/ISO CG106.1 is updated to ANSI/CAN/IAPMO/ISO 30500.

In Appendix CI Swimming Pool Safety Act, the reprinted portion of the law has been updated according to BSC-01-24-CWoRE (Change Without Regulatory Effect) which was approved and filed with Secretary of State March 7, 2025. The changes are based on the enactment of AB 2866 (Chapter 745, Statutes of 2024) and SB 552 (Chapter 769, Statutes of 2024), which became effective January 1, 2025. These bills made amendments to the Swimming Pool Safety Act (Health and Safety Code (HSC) Sections 115920 – 115929)—which are required to be published in Title 24 pursuant to HSC Section 18942(b).

Other minor editorial and format corrections to the Matrix Adoption Tables and some sections of code language are made throughout Part 2.5.

Part 3:

Minor editorial, formatting, and margin marking corrections were made within code language, agency banners, and Matrix Adoption Tables. Various code section references were corrected in Section 89.111.3, Article 100 Accessory Dwelling Unit definition, Figure 315.60(D)(3) Note, Section 422.3(A) and (B), Section 517.34(7)(I), and

Section 551.4(A). Included below by page number (e.g., 70-XX) is a detailed listing of corrections:

- 70-555: Section 517.1(C) – Corrected margin marking inaccuracies.
- 70-558: Section 517.18(B)(2) – Identified removal of previous Exception and corrected margin marking inaccuracies.
- 70-560: Section 517.29(A.1) – Corrected editorial error in agency banner.
- 70-565: Section 517.34(7) – Corrected editorial error in agency banner for subsections j. and k. and inaccurate California Building Code reference in subsection l.
- 70-566: Section 517.35(B)(1) – Corrected formatting error in Exception.
- 70-568: Section 517.42(E) – Added missing model code language.
- 70-569: Section 517.44(A) – Corrected inaccuracies in model code and state adoption language in subsection (1)(a) and fixed typographical error in subsection (7).
- 70-606: Section 551.4(A) – Corrected code reference in model code language.
- 70-769: Section 705.20(7) – Included OSHPD 6 to agency banner.
- 70-776: Section 708.1 – Corrected formatting in agency banner.

Part 4:

The 2024 edition of the Uniform Mechanical Code (UMC) was updated to include reference to the 2019 edition of ASHRAE Standard 34. Additionally, consistent with IAPMO's extraction policy, Table 1102.3 was also updated to align with the latest information, at that time, from ASHRAE Standard 34. As part of this effort, values for Refrigerant Concentration Limits (RCLs) and Lower Flammability Limits (LFLs) were also included in this table, as were new refrigerants and other updates from the addenda to the 2019 edition of ASHRAE Standard 34. Unfortunately, the 2019 edition of ASHRAE Standard 34 and its associated addenda contained errors for a number of these newly incorporated refrigerant properties. As such, updates to Table 1102.3 are needed to resolve potential safety concerns that may now arise from the use of

incorrect RCLs and LFLs for Safety Group A2L refrigerant blends that were adopted into the 2024 edition of the UMC. Given the ongoing transition towards Safety Group A2L refrigerants, which are classified as having “Lower Flammability” per ASHRAE Standard 34, the need for these changes is critical.

Revise Table 1102.3 to read as follows:

Other minor edits include correcting the Government Code statute within the definition of Accessory Dwelling Unit in Chapter 2, and Table 4A footnote d was changed to reflect the correct section number in Chapter 4.

Part 5:

In Chapter 2, Accessory Dwelling Unit definition, and Chapter 3, Section 311.1 General, a referenced Government Code section was corrected.

In Chapter 4, Section 403.2, reference to ICC A117.1 was deleted.

In Table 422.1, a BSC and DSA-SS amendment was relocated to footnote 9; and printing errors were corrected in Table 4-2.

Part 6:

In Table 100.0-A – Application of Standards – referenced section number for prescriptive standards application is corrected for Solar PV and Battery Energy Storage Systems in Nonresidential buildings and Hotels/Motels.

In Section 100.1 – Definitions and Rules of Construction – definition of GLAZED DOOR is corrected and moved under definition of FENESTRATION. Definition of OSHPD is fixed to match the revised office name.

In Tables 140.10-B and 170.2-V – BESS capacity factors for Retail, Grocery and Warehouse building types is fixed in CZ1 and CZ3 (Table 140.10-B) and for Warehouse building type in CZ1 (Table 170.2-V).

Part 9:

In Chapters 1, 2, 10 and 11, references to the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) have been changed to the Office of Statewide Hospital Planning and Development.

In Chapter 1, Section 105.5.1 Additive manufacturing, the reference pointer to CBC Section 4103.3 is corrected to CBC Section 319.3 Industrial additive manufacturing.

In Table 105.5.22—Permit Amounts For Hazardous Materials, Footnotes a and b referring to Note k are corrected to be Note j.

In Chapter 2, Section 202 Definitions the following changes are made:

- Higher Education Laboratory and Laboratory Suite, the model code defined terms are removed as different classification is used in California.
- *WILDLAND-URBAN INTERFACE AREA (WUI)*. [SFM], the reference to CBC Chapter 7A, Section 702A.2 is corrected to reference the *California Wildland-Urban Interface Code* as Chapter 7A is removed from the California Building Code.

In Chapter 2, Section 203 Occupancy Classifications and Use the following changes are made:

- Section 203.3 Business Group B, “higher education laboratories” is removed from listed occupancies.
- Section 203.3.2 Ambulatory care facilities, the California amendment regarding *Group C (CAMPS, ORGANIZED)* is removed as it is duplicative with Section 203.13.
- Section 203.3.3 Higher Education Laboratories is removed in its entirety.
- Section 203.7.2.1 and its subsections addressing occupancy conditions 1 and 2 of Group I-2 are removed.
- Sections 203.9.4.1 and 203.9.4.2 addressing Residential Group R-4, Conditions 1 and 2 are removed.

In Chapter 4, Group R-2.1 Condition 2 was removed from several sections where it was missed in the rulemaking as it is not used in California.

In Chapter 6, Section 603.6.4 Grounding, language was added to clarify that portable appliances shall be “required to be connected to an equipment grounding conductor.”

In Section 603.5.1.1 Listing in Group I-2 occupancies and ambulatory care facilities, Conditions 1 and 2 removed from Items 1 and 2.

In Chapter 8, Condition 1 and Group 1-1 are removed from Sections 805.2.1.1 and 807.4.

In Section 808.1 Group I-1 is replaced with Group R2.1.

In Chapter 9, Section 903.3.1.2.3 Attics, Item 4 about Group R-4, Condition 2 occupancy is removed.

In Section 903.3.1.3 NFPA 13D sprinkler systems, Group R-4, Condition 1 is removed.

In Section 906.1, Exceptions 2 and 3 in Item 1 are removed; Item 2 is revised to remove Group I-1 and Condition 1.

In Sections 907.5.2.1 and 907.5.2.3 all references to Condition 2 are removed.

In Chapter 10, Section 1010.2.3, reference to International Swimming Pool and Spa Code was corrected to reference California Building Code instead.

In Section 1010.2.12.1, Group I-1 and Condition 1 are removed from Item 5, Exception 2.

In Section 1025.1, Group I-1 occupancy is removed.

In Chapter 11, references to Conditions 1 and 2 and Group I-1 are removed.

In Section 1104.8 Forces to unlatch and open doors, the first sentence “Forces shall be applied to the latch side” is removed.

In Chapter 50, Table 5003.1.1(5)—Hazardous Materials Exemptions, the reference to Section 416 for Material Classification, Flammable and combustible liquids and gases is changed to Chapter 24 in Column 3.

In Table 5003.11.2—Maximum Allowable Quantity, the value 39,000 ft³ for Category 1B, Gaseous is corrected to 390,000 ft³.

Other minor editorial and format corrections to the Matrix Adoption Tables and some sections of code language are made throughout Part 9 and to correlate with Part 2, Volume 1 of the *California Building Code* as well.

Part 10:

In Sections 1.1.3.2, 310A.1.2, and 311A.1.2, editorial changes are made to reflect the change in the organization name to the Office of Statewide Hospital Planning and Development (OSHPD).

In Sections 1.9.2.1.1 and 1.9.2.2.1, a corrected reference to Section 1103.7 is provided.

In Section 202, the definition of Accessory Dwelling Unit is updated with the correct reference to Government Code Section 66313.

In Chapter 3, the note under “About this chapter” is updated to indicate California Codes, not I-Codes.

In Section 303.2.1, the term occupant capacity is updated to design occupant capacity in accordance with the 2024 IEBC Errata.

In Section 502.3, a corrected reference to Section 502.4 is provided per the 2024 IEBC Errata.

In Section 804.6.4, a corrected reference to Section 1010.2.8 of the CBC is provided per the 2024 IEBC Errata.

In Section 1305.2.2.2, an editorial change is made to delete a comma per the 2024 IEBC Errata.

In Section 1504.1.4.1, the panel thickness of 15/16 inch is corrected to 5/16 inch per the 2024 IEBC Errata.

The Matrix Adoption Table for Chapter 16 is updated to include ASCE/SEI 41-2017.

In Chapter 16, referenced sections in ASME A17.1, A17.3, and A18.1 are deleted, and several references in CBC-25 are corrected.

Part 11:

In Chapters 1, 3 and A6, editorial changes are made to reflect the change in the organization name to the Office of Statewide Hospital Planning and Development (OSHPD).

In Chapter 2, reference to the Government Code section is corrected in the definitions of ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT and JUNIOR ACCESSORY DWELLING UNIT.

In Chapters 4, 5 and A4, various capitalization and punctuation inconsistencies are corrected.

In Chapter 8, footnote 4 to WORKSHEET (WS-2) WATER USE REDUCTION is corrected to require 0.35 gpm instead of 35 gpm. Inconsistent terminology and punctuation are corrected in various compliance forms and referenced materials.

In Chapter A5, various punctuation inconsistencies and formatting issues are corrected. References to California Building Code Chapter 7A provisions are corrected to refer to the California Wildland-Urban Interface Code.

In Chapter A6, various punctuation inconsistencies are corrected.

Enforcement Responsibility

The requirements within the California Building Standards Code establish the minimum regulations for the design and construction of buildings and structures in California. State law, in various cases, mandates that local government enforce these regulations and any local ordinances with qualified reasonably necessary and generally more restrictive building standards than provided for in the California Building Standards Code.

Exceptions for enforcement are for building standards applicable to hospitals, state buildings, public schools and colleges that are subject to state agency authority. For detailed information regarding enforcement responsibilities refer to Part 1 of Title 24 and Chapter 1 of most Parts of Title 24.

Amendment by Local Ordinance

Local ordinances amending the California Building Standards Code are subject to requirements of California law. Ordinances generally must be more restrictive than the building standards approved/adopted by the California Building Standards Commission (CBSC). These amendments must be filed, as appropriate, with either CBSC or other state agencies as directed by law. CBSC developed a [Guide for Local Amendments of Building Standards](#), which is available on its website for download or printing by navigating to the [Resources webpage](#). Additionally, CBSC developed in cooperation with the International Code Council, the [California Code Adoption for Local Jurisdictions video](#), available on YouTube.

CBSC also issued [Information Bulletin 25-02](#) (August 2025) relative to local government amendments adopted via ordinance, that addresses filing with and acceptance by CBSC or other agencies prior to enforcement.

Effective Date and Application of the 2025 California Building Standards Code

January 1, 2026, is the statewide effective date established by CBSC for the 2025 California Building Standards Code. All applications for a building permit that occur on or after January 1, 2026, are subject to compliance with the 2025 edition of the California Building Standards Code.

The 2022 California Building Standards Code is applicable to all submitted permit applications, where such application for a building permit was received on or before December 31, 2025.
