Summary:

Existing law requires the California Commission on Disability Access to develop educational materials and information for use by businesses to understand their obligations to provide disability access and to facilitate compliance with construction-related accessibility standards. Existing law requires the commission to develop and make available on its internet website, or work with another agency to develop, toolkits or educational modules that would educate businesses on the accessibility requirements and to facilitate compliance with those requirements. This bill would require, by July 1, 2023, the commission to develop toolkits or educational modules that focus on constructionrelated accessibility violations in parking lots and exterior paths of travel, including a checklist for businesses to recognize the most common construction-related accessibility violations in those areas.
