2. Special Closed Session

- a. Through the authority of Gov't Code 11126. (a)(1) A special meeting may be called at any time by the presiding officer of the state body or by a majority of the members of the state body. Nothing in this article shall be construed to prevent a state body from holding closed sessions during a regular or special meeting to consider the appointment, employment, evaluation of performance, or dismissal of a public employee or to hear complaints or charges brought against that employee by another person or employee unless the employee requests a public hearing.

3. Reopen the Meeting to the Public

- a. After the meeting in closed session to adjournment and report that a closed session was held pursuant to Government Code 11126, the general nature of the matters considered and whether any action was taken in closed session.

4. Adjourn
