Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code Section 16724.4, the Department of General Services is providing the attached instructions for obtaining bond expenditure information in lieu of a published *State General Obligation Bond Measures for the School Facility Program* report.

The following are descriptions of the publicly available data sources for viewing bond expenditure information and instructions for viewing and/or downloading the data. Collectively, these three sources display the current net bond authority committed to a project from all School Facility Program fund sources: Proposition 1A (1998); Proposition 47 (2002); Proposition 55 (2004); Proposition 1D (2006); Proposition 51 (2016); fiscal year 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24 General Fund; and Proposition 2 (2024).

Data Dashboard Department of General Services - Office of Public School Construction

Background:

The Department of General Services' (DGS') Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) publishes live data in the form of charts and graphs that contain information on all projects funded under the School Facility Program (SFP). OPSC, under the authority of DGS and as staff to the State Allocation Board (SAB), implements and administers the \$54.5 billion school facilities construction program, known as the SFP. Most recently, California voters approved Proposition 2, which authorizes an additional \$8.5 billion for SFP projects, in November 2024.

About the Data:

The data provided is derived from OPSC's online application management system, OPSC Online. The Data Dashboard is the best source for high-level program funding data for the net funding retained by a school district. The data includes projects that the SAB has approved for an Unfunded Approval that are still waiting for a cash Apportionment from the sale of statewide General Obligation Bonds and projects that received an Apportionment but are still waiting for a fund release.










Dashboard 2 – Apportionment, Expenditure, and Unfunded information by Funding Source. Using the filters on the right-hand navigation pane, the data can be customized.






2. The main page provides information on the source of the report information, last update date, and contact information for the data owners.



3. To download the data, click on the first "Download" button on the right-hand side. Additionally, click on the second "Download" button on the right-hand side to download the OPSC Data Dictionary, which provides important information about the contents of the data and provides details about any limitations on the data.



- 4. The downloaded .csv file lists all projects funded.
 - a. You may scroll up and down and left to right.
 - b. All data can be sorted in ascending/descending order by sorting the column headers.
 - c. To search for specific information, filter the column headers and/or use the "Ctrl F" keyboard shortcut to enter a search term.
