## REGARDING PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CALIFORNIA BUILDING CODE CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS, TITLE 24, PART 2

#### ITEM 11B.12.01 - RELATED CODE AMENDMENT

#### **DIVISION 7: COMMUNICATION ELEMENTS AND FEATURES**

11B-703.7 Symbols of accessibility. ... 11B-703.7.2 Symbols

11B-703.7.2.6 Toilet and bathing facilities geometric symbols. ...

11B-703.7.2.6.1 Men's toilet and bathing facilities. ...
11B-703.7.2.6.2 Women's toilet and bathing facilities. ...

11B-703.7.2.6.3 Unisex toilet and bathing facilities. Unisex toilet and bathing facilities shall be identified by a circle, ¼ inch (6.4 mm) thick and 12 inches (305 mm) in diameter with a ¼ inch (6.4 mm) thick triangle with a vertex pointing upward superimposed on the circle and within the 12-inch (305 mm) diameter. A circle, 1/4 inch (6.4 mm) thick and 12 inches (305 mm) in diameter with a 1/4 inch (6.4 mm) thick triangle with a vertex pointing upward, superimposed on and geometrically inscribed at entrances to unisex toilet and bathing facilities. The vertices of the triangle shall be located further than a 1/4 inch (6.4 mm) maximum from the circumference edge of the circle. The triangle symbol shall contrast with the circle symbol, either light on a dark background or dark on a light background.

#### 11B-703.7.2.6.4 Edges and vertices on geometric symbols. ...

**REASON:** DSA-AC is proposing to further amend Section 11B-703.7.2.6.3 based on a comment received during the 45-Day Public Comment Period. The commenter noted that use of the term "inscribed" in place of the term "superimposed" does not fully capture the intent of this section. DSA-AC is proposing to further amend this section by making several non-substantive changes in terminology to clarify the intent of this section. The language "geometrically inscribed on" is being replaced with "superimposed on and geometrically inscribed within", the language "located no further than ¼ inch maximum" is being replaced with "located ¼ inch maximum", the term "circumference" is being replaced with the term "edge". These changes in no way change the regulatory intent of this section, but will provide additional clarity and consistency for code users.

#### **DIVISION 8: SPECIAL ROOMS, SPACES, AND ELEMENTS**

#### 11B-812 Electric vehicle charging stations

11B-812.7 Access aisle. ...

#### 11B-812.7.1 Location. ...

11B-812.7.2 Marking. Access aisles at vehicle spaces shall be marked with a painted borderline around their perimeter. The area within the borderlines shall be marked with hatched lines a minimum of 36 inches (914 mm) on center. The color of the borderlines, hatched lines, and letters shall contrast with that of the surface of the access aisle. The blue color required for identification of access aisles for accessible parking shall not be used. Access aisle markings may extend beyond the minimum required length.

#### 11B-812.7.3 Lettering. ...

**REASON:** DSA-AC is proposing to further amend Section 11B-812.7.2, based on a comment received during the 45-Day Public Comment Period, to correct an inadvertent typographical error. The commenter noted the proposed language of this section was in conflict with the language existing in CBC Section 11B-502.3.3. Specifically, Section 11B-502.3.3 requires access aisles to be marked with hatched lines a *maximum* of 36 inches on center, while proposed Section 11B-812.7.2 would require hatched lines a *minimum* of 36 inches on center. DSA-AC is proposing to further amend this section to be consistent with the existing provisions of the CBC. This change will provide clarity and consistency for code users.
