The OAH Advisory Committee was created by Welfare and Institutions Code section 4717. The mission of the OAH Advisory Committee is to assist the hearing office by providing nonbinding recommendations for improvements to hearing and mediation operations. The Committee is required to meet at least two times a year.

13. It has been observed during conservatorship hearings, all references to the Lanterman Act are removed from any and all judiciary paperwork. In approximately 2016, all hearing paperwork referenced the Lanterman Act at least once. Is there any recourse to correct this situation?
