ORDER FOLLOWING PREHEARING
CONFERENCE, GRANTING
REQUEST FOR CONTINUANCE AND
SETTING NEW DATES

On November 10, 2014, a telephonic prehearing conference was held before Administrative Law Judge Robert Helfand, Office of Administrative Hearings. Karen E. Gilyard, Attorney at Law, appeared on behalf of the Buena Park School District. No one appeared on behalf of Parents on behalf of Student. The ALJ attempted unsuccessfully to contact Student's parents by telephone. The ALJ received a recording. The PHC was recorded.

The District filed its PHC Statement on November 4, 2014. Student has not filed a PHC Statement. The PHC was recorded.

Based on discussion of the parties, the ALJ issues the following order:

Motion to Continue: Buena Park's counsel stated that Parent had contacted her office requesting that all dates in this matter be continued. Buena Park does not oppose Student's request. This is the first request for a continuance. Good cause demonstrated the request to continue the matter is granted.

Accordingly, the currently scheduled hearing dates are vacated. This matter will be set as follows:

Prehearing Conference:	December 5, 2014, at 3:00 p.m.
Due Process Hearing:	December 11, 2014, starting at 9:30 a.m. December 15, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. December 16, 2014, at 9:00 a.m., continuing day to day, Monday through Thursday, as needed at the discretion of the Administrative Law Judge.

Prehearing Conference Statements: Student is reminded that he is responsible for filing with OAH a Prehearing Conference no later than December 1, 2014. Failure to comply with the requirement of filing a Prehearing Conference may result in the exclusion of evidence or other sanctions.
