ORDER FOLLOWING PREHEARING
CONFERENCE AND CHANGING
HEARING LOCATION

On April 1, 2016, a telephonic prehearing conference was held before Administrative Law Judge Robert Martin, Office of Administrative Hearings. Max Goldman, Attorney at Law, appeared on Student's behalf. Jan Tomsy, Attorney at Law, appeared on behalf of Alameda Unified School District. The PHC was recorded.

Based on discussion of the parties, the ALJ issues the following order:

1. Hearing Dates, Times, and Location. The hearing shall take place on April 11 and 12, 2016 and continue day to day, Monday through Thursday, at the discretion of the ALJ. The hearing shall take place at the Office of Administrative Hearings, 15350 Sherman Way, Suite 300, Van Nuys, CA 91406. The hearing shall begin at 1:30 p.m. the first day of the hearing, and at 9:00 a.m. all other days, unless otherwise ordered.

The parties shall immediately notify all potential witnesses of the hearing dates, and shall subpoena witnesses if necessary, to ensure that the witnesses will be available to testify. A witness will not be regarded as unavailable for purposes of showing "good cause" to continue the hearing if the witness is not properly notified of the hearing date or properly subpoenaed, as applicable.

2. Issues and Proposed Resolutions. The issues to be resolved at the due process hearing, as alleged in the complaint and clarified by the parties and the ALJ at the PHC, are whether District denied Student a free appropriate public education by:

- (1) Failing to timely identify and evaluate Student as a child potentially requiring special education, pursuant to its affirmative child find obligations, from November 24, 2013 through the end of the 2013-2014 school year; and
- (2) Failing to timely produce Student's educational records in response to Parents' September 23, 2015 written request?

Student's Proposed Resolutions are:

(1) An order directing District to:

- a. Provide Student's educational records, as requested on September 23, 2015;
- b. Fund independent educational evaluations (hereinafter "IEE") in the areas of psycho-educational (including academics), recreational therapy, behavior, assistive technology, speech and language therapy and occupational therapy; and
- c. Provide compensatory education, including reimbursement, if any, according to proof.

3. Exhibits. Exhibits shall be pre-marked and placed in three-ring exhibit binders prior to the hearing. Student shall mark Student's exhibits using the numbers S1, S2, S3, etc., and District shall mark its exhibits using numbers D1, D2, D3, etc. Each exhibit shall be internally paginated by exhibit, or all of a party's exhibits shall be sequentially Bates-stamped. Each exhibit binder shall contain a detailed table of contents. At the hearing, in addition to its own copy of its exhibits and the copy exchanged with the other party, each party shall supply an exhibit binder containing its exhibits for use by the ALJ, and an exhibit binder for use by witnesses (*i.e.*, each party should make at least an original and three copies of its exhibits to exchange and to use at the hearing). The parties may not serve exhibits on OAH prior to the hearing. In the event of duplicate exhibits, the most legible version will be used. Each party will include in its exhibits current resumes of its expert witnesses, and current resumes of any of its percipient witness whose education and employment are expected to be subjects of direct examination.

4. Witnesses. Each party is responsible for procuring the attendance at hearing of its own witnesses. District will make witnesses under its control reasonably available to Student without the need for subpoena. District will also inform Student of the identity of, and available contact information for, any witness identified by Student as an employee of District who has left District's employ, by 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 5, 2016. The parties will schedule their witnesses to avoid delays in the hearing and to minimize or eliminate the need for calling witnesses out of order. Neither party shall be permitted to call any witnesses not disclosed in the party's prehearing conference statement except for good cause shown, supported by written declaration under penalty of perjury, and at the discretion of the ALJ.

a. Timely Disclosure of Witnesses and Exhibits. Education Code section 56505, subdivision (e)(7), requires each party to disclose, at least five business days prior to the hearing, a list of all witnesses and their general area of testimony that the parties intend to present at the hearing, and a copy of all documents, including all assessments completed by that date and recommendations based on the assessments, that the parties intend to use at the hearing. The parties shall exchange final witness lists and exhibit binders on or before 5:00 p.m. on Monday, April 4, 2016. Witnesses and documents not disclosed by that time may be excluded at the request of the other party from introduction at the hearing. Each party reserves the right to present additional witness and documents for purposes of rebuttal. The

parties shall file their final witness and exhibit lists (but not the exhibits themselves) with OAH by no later than Thursday, April 7, at 5:00 p.m.

b. Meet and Confer Regarding Witnesses. The parties are ordered to meet and confer on Wednesday, April 6 at 3:00 p.m. regarding the schedule of witnesses for the hearing. Student's counsel for the hearing will place the telephone call to District's counsel to initiate the meet and confer. The parties are to coordinate the availability and order of testimony of witnesses to ensure that there is a witness available to testify at all times during the hearing, and to ensure that the hearing is completed as scheduled. The parties shall discuss a time estimate of the length of each witness's direct examination testimony, and identify those witnesses the party intends to call, as opposed to witnesses the party may call, depending on the flow of the hearing and the evidence.

On the first day of hearing, before the first witness testifies, the parties shall provide the ALJ with one detailed hour-by-hour schedule of all witnesses expected to testify at the hearing, which list shall also include an estimate of time for each party's direct and cross-examination. The ALJ and the parties will discuss the length of time anticipated for cross-examination of each witness and scheduling issues for individual witnesses and the ALJ will finalize the witness schedule. The parties shall be prepared at the end of each day of hearing to discuss the witnesses to be presented the next day and the time the testimony of each such witness is expected to take. The ALJ has discretion to limit the number of witnesses who testify and the time allowed for witnesses' testimony.

5. Scope of Witness Examination. Each witness shall be called to testify only once, except for rebuttal purposes, and all parties shall examine the witness on all issues when the witness is first called. After the first direct and cross-examinations, each party shall be limited in examining the witness to only those matters raised in the immediately preceding examination. The order in which the parties present their cases in chief shall be subordinate to the need for each witness to appear only once.

6. Telephonic Testimony. Neither party requested that a witness be permitted to appear telephonically at hearing in this matter. Whether a witness may appear by telephone is a matter within the discretion of the ALJ. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 5, § 3082, subd. (g).) Any party seeking to present a witness by telephone shall move in advance for leave to do so, unless the opposing party has stipulated that the witness may appear by telephone. The proponent of the witness shall provide the proposed witness with a complete set of exhibit binders from all parties, containing all of each party's exhibits, prior to the hearing; and shall ensure that the hearing room has sound equipment that allows everyone in the room to hear the witness, and the witness to hear objections and rulings. No witness will be heard by telephone unless all these requirements have been fulfilled.

7. Electronic Recording of Hearing.

a. Audio Recording. Student's request to make an audio recording of the hearing is granted, subject to the following conditions: 1) that OAH's recording is the only

official recording; 2) that the recording will be turned on and off at the same time as the ALJ's recording, in order to avoid recording conversations while off the record; and 3) that operation of the party's recording mechanism will not be allowed to delay the hearing. District may also make an audio recording under the same conditions.

b. Video Recording. No party, witness or anyone else present may make any video recording of any part of the proceedings. Any person doing so shall be subject to sanctions.

8. Order of Presentation of Evidence. In an administrative proceeding, the burden of proof is ordinarily on the party requesting the hearing. (*Schaffer v. Weast* (2005) 546 U.S. 49, 56-62 [126 S.Ct. 528, 163 L.Ed.2d 387].) Here, Student is the petitioning party. Accordingly, Student shall present Student's case-in-chief, followed by District.

9. Motions. The parties did not anticipate filing any motions prior to hearing. In the event that any other motion, other than a challenge to a newly-assigned ALJ for the hearing, is brought after this date, it shall be supported by a declaration under penalty of perjury establishing good cause as to why the motion was not made prior to or during the PHC.

10. Compensatory Education/Reimbursement. Any party seeking reimbursement of expenditures shall present admissible evidence of these expenditures, or a stipulation to the amount of expenditures, as part of its case in chief. A party seeking compensatory education should provide evidence regarding the type, amount, duration, and need for any requested compensatory education.

11. Stipulations. Stipulations to pertinent facts, contentions or resolutions are encouraged. Any proposed stipulation shall be submitted to the assigned ALJ in written form.

12. Conduct of Counsel and Hearing Room Decorum. Counsel, all parties, and all witnesses shall conduct themselves in a professional and courteous manner at all times. Cellular phones, pagers, recorders, and other noisemaking electronic devices shall be shut off or set to vibrate during the hearing unless permission to the contrary is obtained from the ALJ.

13. Special Needs and Accommodations . A party or participant to this case, such as a witness, requiring reasonable accommodation to participate in the hearing may contact the assigned calendar clerk at (916) 263-0880, the OAH ADA Coordinator at OAHADA@dgs.ca.gov or 916-263-0880 as soon as the need is made known. Additional information concerning a request for reasonable accommodation is available on OAH's website.

14. Hearing is Closed To the Public. The hearing will be closed to the public.

15. Settlement. The parties are encouraged to continue working together to complete an agreement before the due process hearing. The parties shall inform OAH in writing immediately should they reach a settlement or otherwise resolve the dispute before the scheduled hearing. If a settlement is reached within five days of the scheduled start of the due process hearing, the parties shall also inform OAH of the settlement by telephone at (916) 263-0880.

IF A FULL AND FINAL WRITTEN SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT IS REACHED AFTER 5:00 P.M. THE DAY PRIOR TO HEARING, THE PARTIES SHALL LEAVE A VOICEMAIL MESSAGE REGARDING THE SETTLEMENT AT (916) 274-6035 AND SHALL ALSO LEAVE CONTACT INFORMATION SUCH AS CELLULAR PHONE NUMBERS OF EACH PARTY OR COUNSEL FOR EACH PARTY. THE PARTIES SHOULD SIMULTANEOUSLY **FAX THE SIGNATURE PAGE OF THE SIGNED AGREEMENT OR A LETTER WITHDRAWING THE CASE TO THE OAH AT THE FAXINATION LINE at 916-376-6319.**

Dates for hearing will not be cancelled until the letter of withdrawal or signature page of the signed agreement has been received by OAH. The assigned ALJ will check for messages the evening prior to the hearing or the morning of the hearing.

If the matter settles subject to board approval, in addition to a signed copy of the signature page of the settlement agreement as noted above, the parties shall submit a request for a status conference and provide the date of the next board meeting. The hearing dates will not be cancelled without this information.

16. Failure to comply with this order may result in the exclusion of evidence or other sanctions.
