EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

Priority Funding Apportionments

The SAB, at its September 25, 2019 meeting, approved \$771.7 million in priority funding apportionments for 193 projects representing 106 applicants. Applicants were reminded to submit to OPSC the *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) by close of business on Tuesday, December 24, 2019. As of January 10, 2020, funds have been released totaling \$521.4 million and 122 of the required 188 Forms SAB 50-05 have been processed.

Recent Priority Funding Filing Round Closed

The current priority funding filing period began November 13, 2019 and closed December 12, 2019. At the close of the filing period, OPSC received valid requests from 130 applicants for 274 unique projects totaling \$829.7 million. These requests are valid from January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020. School districts and charter schools are reminded that the requirements for participation in the priority funding process remain in effect.

Sixth Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) Filing Round Is Open

The audience was reminded that the sixth CTEFP Filing Round remains open until April 6, 2020. CTE Grant Applications were due to CDE on or before December 2, 2019 and the *Application for Career Technical Education Funding* (Form SAB 50-10) is due to OPSC on or before April 6, 2020. CDE received 282 applications requesting review and approval and will be providing scores on a flow basis. OPSC encourages all applicants with projects with a score of 105 or higher to submit the Form SAB 50-10 immediately upon receipt of the CDE's score letter for the project.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT (continued)

OPSC contacted all prior applicants that submitted applications in the fourth and fifth CTEFP filing rounds that did not receive funding advising them of the ability to reapply in this current filing round using the same CTE score letter. OPSC Online is available now for all applicants to complete the Form SAB 50-10. Once the score is known it can be entered into OPSC Online and the application can be electronically submitted to OPSC immediately.

OPSC and CDE hosted a joint workshop on November 6, 2019 that provided an overview of both agency's application processes. The workshop was webcasted and can be found <u>here</u> or at https://tinyurl.com/v3eozm6.

Facility Hardship Program Regulation Amendments

OPSC held public stakeholder meetings on January 10, 31, and February 7, 2020 to discuss amendments to the Facility Hardship Program/Seismic Mitigation Program regulations, with the goal of bringing an item to the SAB for consideration in February 2020. All three stakeholder meetings were held at the State Capitol. The amendments center around streamlining the application process, clarifying existing regulations and addressing several other issues and concerns. OPSC looks forward to public and SAB member input as we work towards improvements in this critical program.

Assembly Bill (AB) 48/Proposition 13

On Monday, October 7, 2019, Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 48 into law. This bill, authored by Assembly Member Patrick O'Donnell and Senator Steve Glazer, will provide \$15 billion to construct and modernize education facilities; that includes \$9 billion for the School Facilities Program (SFP). OPSC will be monitoring the voting results for Proposition 13 at the March 3, 2020 statewide primary election. In addition, OPSC is working on an implementation plan should Proposition 13 be successful.

The SAB and stakeholders were reminded that the next SAB meeting scheduled would be for Wednesday, February 26, 2020 at 4:00 p.m.

SIXTH CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION FACILITIES PROGRAM (CTEFP) FILING ROUND IS OPEN

OPSC would like to remind everyone that the Sixth CTEFP Filing Round is open until April 6, 2020. CTE Grant Applications were due to the California Department of Education (CDE) on or before December 2, 2019. CDE received 282 applications requesting review and approval. The *Application for Career Technical Education Funding* (Form SAB 50-10) is due to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) on or before April 6, 2020. As of January 31, 2020, OPSC has received 15 applications requesting a total of \$23,043,170 in State funding from 11 applicants.

OPSC has received 71 scores from CDE and will continue to receive scores <u>on a flow</u> <u>basis</u>. OPSC encourages all applicants with projects with a score of 105, or higher, to submit the Form SAB 50-10 immediately upon receipt of the CDE's score letter for the project.

OPSC has contacted all prior applicants that submitted in the Fourth and Fifth CTEFP Filing Rounds and did not receive funding, advising of the ability to reapply in this current round using the same CTE score letter. Applicants using the same CTE score letter must use copies of the same supporting documents such as the CDE application and the cost estimate that were previously submitted in the past round.

OPSC Online is available for all applicants to complete the Form SAB 50-10. Once the score is known, it can then be entered into OPSC Online and the application can be electronically submitted to OPSC immediately.

FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN FACILITIES GRANT PROGRAM (FDKFGP)

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State of California State Allocation Board School Facility Program

This Resolution of the State Allocation Board (hereafter referred to as the "Board") is applicable to the appropriate sections of the Education Code and is described and filed in the office of the Executive Officer and will be made available to all interested parties as the Resolution pertains to the documents attached hereto. Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on February 26, 2020.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
- 2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a shortterm or a long-term basis.
- 3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3rd Street, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
- 5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

I, the undersigned, duly authorized as the Executive Officer of the State Allocation Board, do hereby certify the foregoing to be true and correct, and that this Resolution was adopted at a meeting of said Board on February 26, 2020 at Sacramento, California.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting, February 26, 2020

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To adjust the baseline eligibility for new construction and modernization projects under the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998.

DESCRIPTION

The districts listed on Attachment A have received eligibility approval for new construction. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.51.

The districts listed on Attachment B have received eligibility approval for modernization. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.61.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Approve an adjustment to the new construction eligibility baseline determination as shown on Attachment A.
- 2. Approve an adjustment to the modernization eligibility baseline determination as shown on Attachment B.
- 3. Provide that this approval of adjusted eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment for future funding by the State Allocation Board.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM UNFUNDED APPROVALS

(Lack of AB 55 Loans)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for unfunded approval.

DESCRIPTION

At the January 2020 Board meeting, the Board elected to provide an increase adjustment of 2.08 percent to SFP projects for calendar year 2020. The projects listed on the Attachment reflect the Board's action of the adoption of the 2.08 percent increase based on the RS Means Construction Cost Index. In addition, the project applications represent SFP New Construction, Modernization, Charter School and Overcrowding Relief Grant projects in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC).

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 defines an Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) as an information list of unfunded projects that was created due to the State's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans) to fund school construction projects as declared in the Department of Finance Budget Letter #33 issued on December 18, 2008.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.95 states:

"When the Board has no funds to apportion ..., the Board will also accept and process applications for apportionment for purposes of developing an Unfunded List based on the date the application is ready for Apportionment, with the exception of New Construction funding applications that utilize eligibility generated by the Alternative Enrollment Projection.

An application for funding included on an Unfunded List is eligible for reimbursement subject to adjustments in the New Construction Grants amount pursuant to Section 1859.77."

BACKGROUND

At the March 11, 2009 SAB meeting, the Board requested that Staff continue to process applications to the Board for unfunded approval, up to the bonding authority. The Attachment reflects applications being presented for unfunded approval, including SFP modernization and new construction projects in date order of a complete application being received by the OPSC. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date. The unfunded approval of the applications as reflected on the Attachment does not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
- 2. Provide that these unfunded approvals do not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

SUBSTANTIAL PROGRESS REDUCTION TO COSTS INCURRED

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present School Facility Program (SFP) project apportionments to be reduced to eligible costs incurred.

DESCRIPTION

The SFP projects listed on the Attachment is a financial hardship District that received a separate design fund release. The District has either requested to have their projects reduced to costs incurred or has not met the substantial progress requirement or has indicated that they will be unable to move forward with the SFP projects listed on the Attachment. The District has requested that their apportionments be reduced to costs incurred to recognize eligible costs for the separate design phase.

AUTHORITY

Pursuant to Education Code Section 17076.10(b), sufficient evidence of substantial progress for the design, site and adjusted grant apportionments shall be due 18 months from the date any funds were released to the district. The SFP Regulation Section 1859.105 requires that when an apportionment is reduced to project costs incurred or rescinded, all State funds not used to finance eligible expenditures are to be returned to the State Allocation Board (SAB). The SFP Regulations also stipulate that interest earned on State funds, which is not used to finance eligible expenditures, is due to the SAB.

- 1. Find that the District is unable to meet the substantial progress requirements or indicated that they will be unable to move forward with the projects listed on the Attachment.
- 2. Reduce the funded apportionments to costs incurred for the projects listed on the Attachment.
- 3. Direct Staff to adjust the District baseline eligibility, according to the increases (identified in the "Pupils Returned to the District's Baseline" column) on the Attachment, once all funds due to the State have been received.

DESCRIPTION

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

The water supply at Nord Country School is provided by a well system which provides domestic water and fire protection. In a letter dated July 25, 2017, the Butte County Environmental Health Department issued a compliance order finding "that the system is not in compliance with the primary drinking water standard by exceeding the nitrate MCL and thus cannot provide a reliable and adequate supply of pure, wholesome, healthful, and potable water." As a stopgap measure, the school is relying on multiple reverse osmosis treatment fixtures to decontaminate the existing domestic water supply, however the Butte County Environmental Health Department and the State Water Board have indicated that this is not a permanent long-term solution to mitigate the existing health and safety threat.

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The scope of this project includes the abandonment of the existing water well that is 200 feet deep and the construction of a replacement water well at a depth of 800 feet. At this greater depth, the nitrate levels in the water table are reduced below the accepted threshold of 10.0 milligrams per liter.

STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

The District anticipates beginning construction in the summer of 2020.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA

GOVERNMENT/STATE LEVEL OCCURENCE

The Butte County Environmental Health Department has provided a written concurrence that supports the industry specialist's findings and recommended work to mitigate the health and safety threat.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(a) states:

A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states, "A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils."

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1) provides for Facility Hardship grant funding when:

The facilities are needed to ensure the health and safety of the pupils if the district can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the health and safety of the pupils is at risk. Factors to be considered by the Board shall include the close proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission

lines, dam, pipeline, industrial facility, adverse air quality emission or other health and safety risks, including structural deficiencies required by the DSA to be repaired, seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable

Category 2 Buildings as verified by the DSA, traffic safety or because the pupils reside in remote areas of the district and transportation to existing facilities is not possible or poses a health and safety risk.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1)(A)(1) states,

If the total cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is 50 percent or less than the Current Replacement Cost, the district may qualify for either grant below, as applicable:

- a. Modernization Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for Rehabilitation Costs pursuant to Section 1859.83(e), or
- b. A grant not to exceed 50 percent of the cost estimate that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the Board for seismic repair.

Regulation Section 1859.83(e) states:

Excessive Cost for rehabilitation of facilities the Board has determined are a health and safety risk to the pupils pursuant to Section 1859.82(a)(1) and the cost/benefit analysis to mitigate the problem and remain in the facility is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the facility. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were pre-existing in the classroom or related facility. If the district qualifies, the district is eligible for funding of Rehabilitation Costs as a modernization project. If the Approved Application is received on or before April 29, 2002, the grant amount provided is 80 percent of the amount of the cost estimate required in Section 1859.82(a)(1) that has been reviewed by the OPSC and approved by the Board. If the Approved Application is received after April 29, 2002, the grant amount provided is 60 percent of the cost estimate required in Section 1859.82(a)(1) that has been reviewed after April 29, 2002, the grant amount provided for high performance incentive pursuant to Section 1859.77.4 provided that the high performance points attained are

related to the scope of the Facility Hardship project. For any project funded in whole or in part from Proposition 47 or Proposition 55 for which the construction contract is awarded prior to January 1, 2012, the district may be eligible for the funding provided to initiate and enforce a LCP as prescribed in Section 1859.78.1(a). For any project for which the construction contract is awarded on January 1, 2012 through June 19, 2014, the grant may be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.78.1(b) and subject to the limitations established in Section 1859.78.1(c).

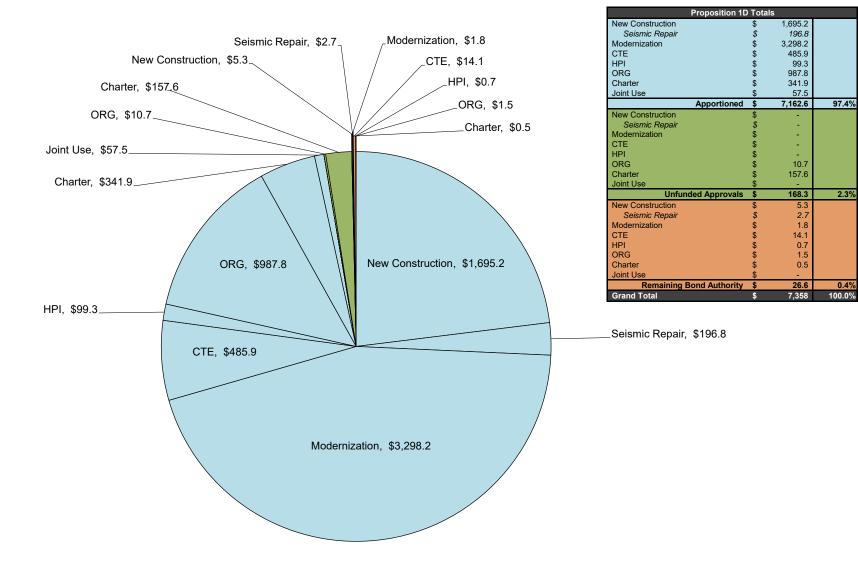
Proposition 51 Bond Authority - \$7.000 billion

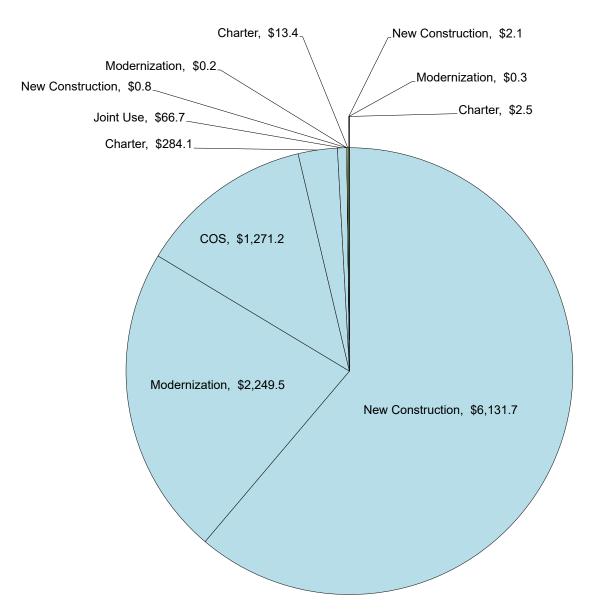


Proposition 1D Bond Authority - \$7.358 billion



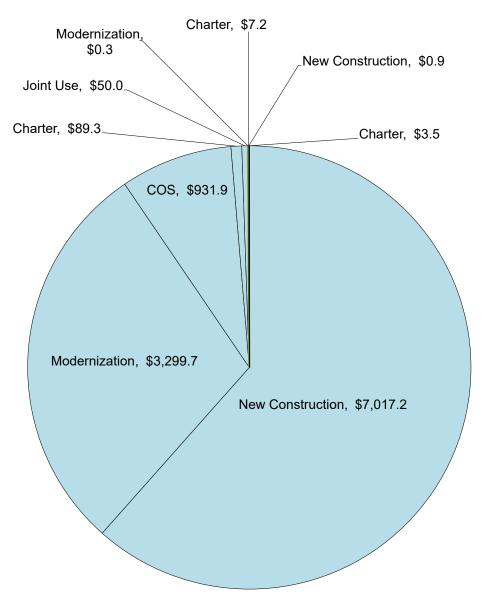


Proposition 55 Bond Authority - \$10.023 billion (in millions of dollars)

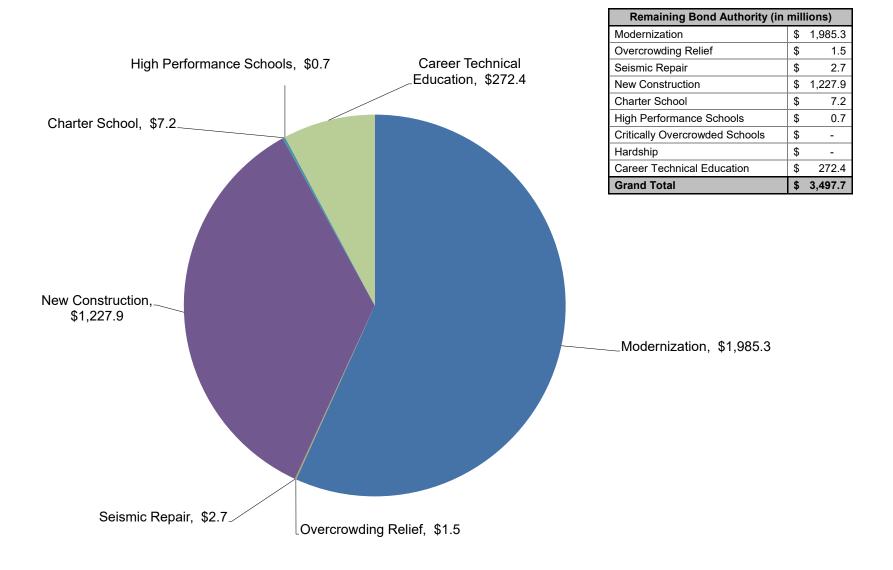
Proposition 47 Bond Authority - \$11.400 billion (in millions of dollars)



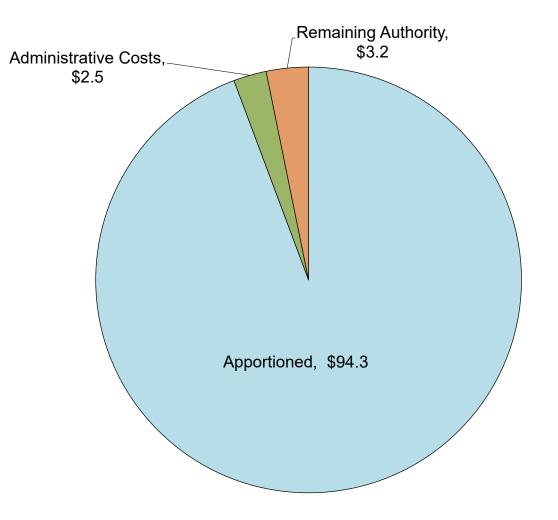

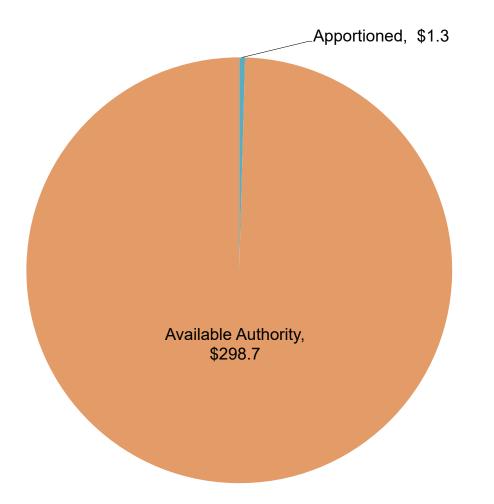

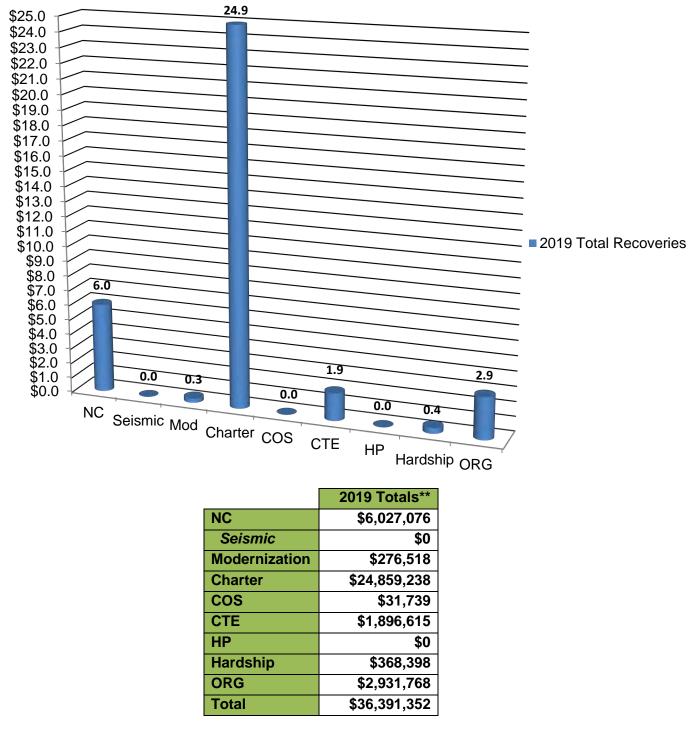
Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (FDKFGP) FY 2018/2019 Authority - \$100 million



Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (FDKFGP) FY 2019/2020 Authority - \$300 million

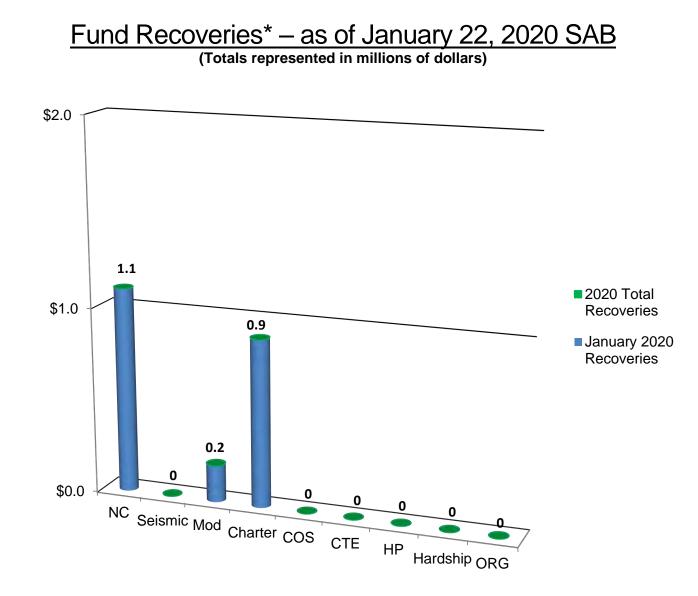


Fund Recoveries* – 2019 (Totals represented in millions of dollars)

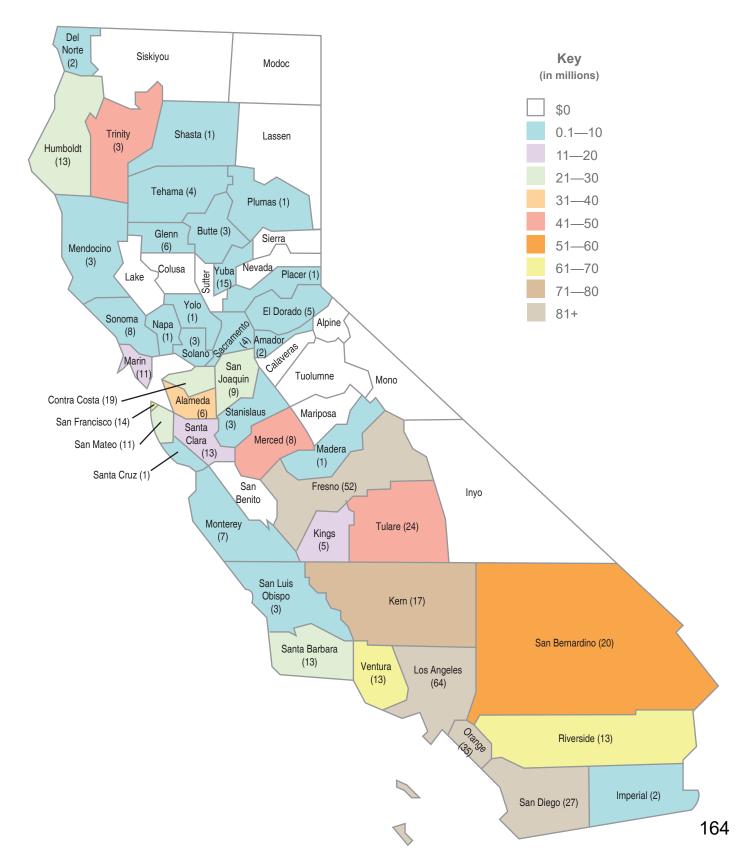

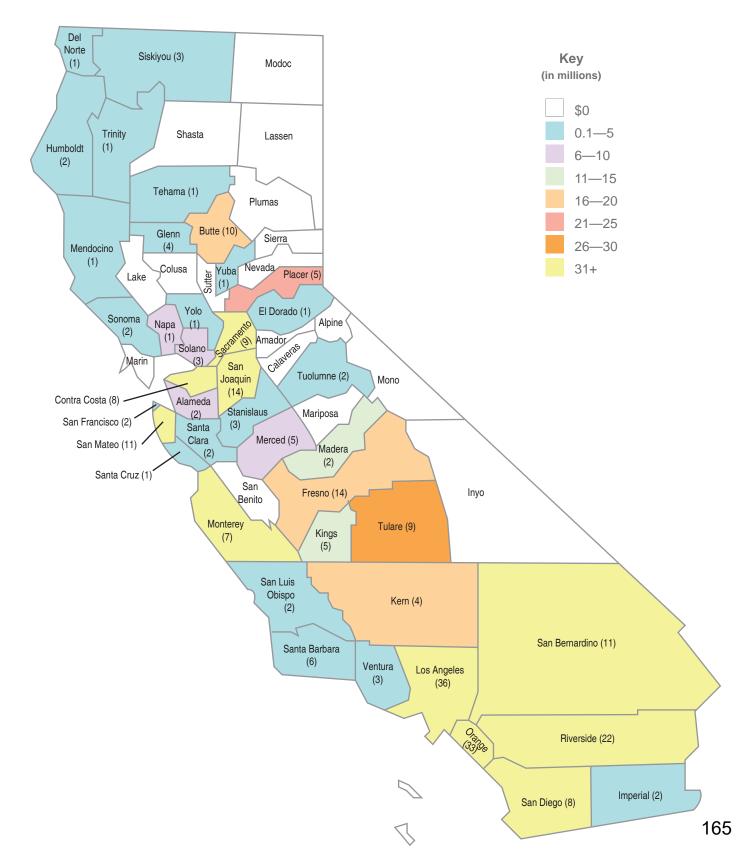
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Apportionments by County

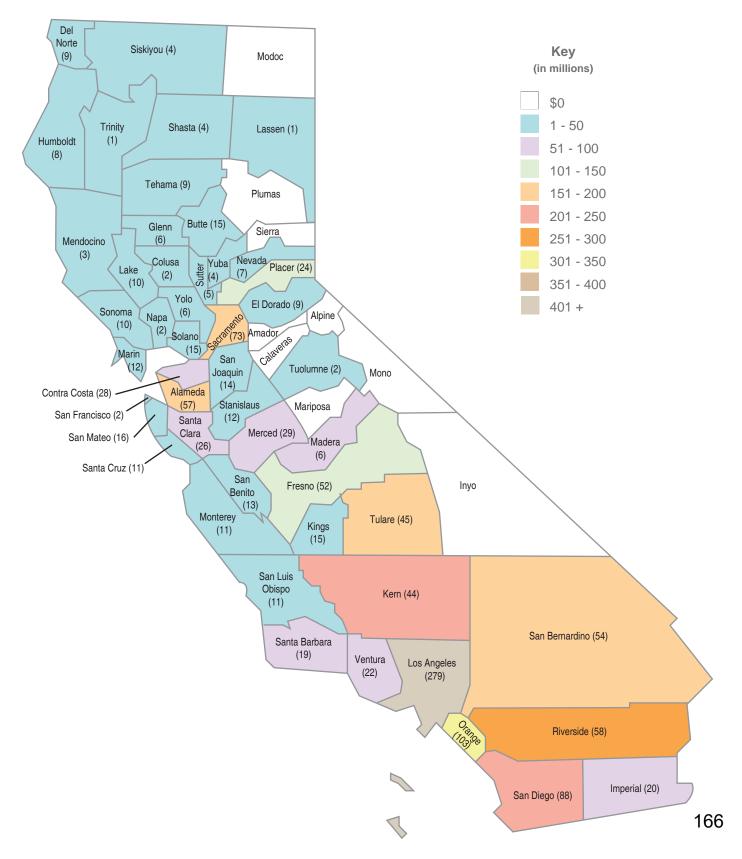
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Unfunded Approvals by County

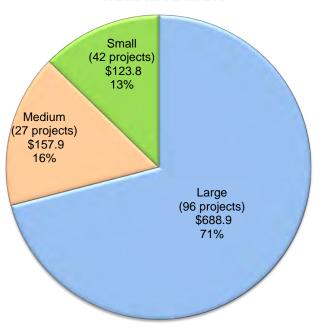

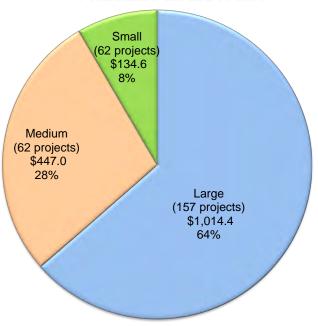
School Facility Program Bond Authority from Proposition 51 (in millions of dollars, as of January 31, 2020)

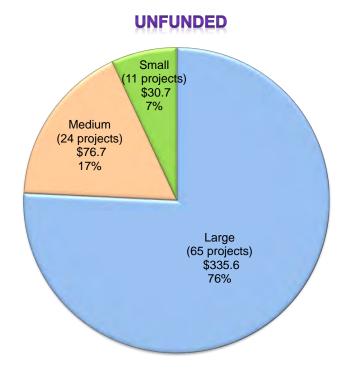

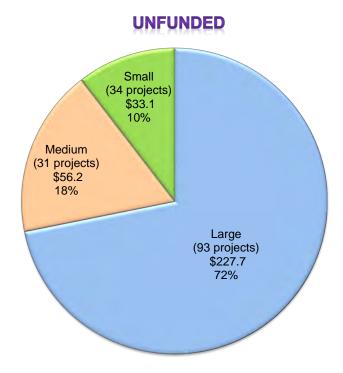

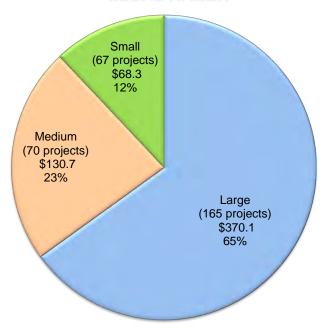




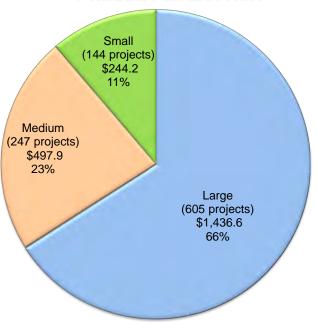

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request for the following:

- 1. To receive Financial Hardship status based upon "other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the State Allocation Board", and
- To receive expedited Apportionments outside of the priority funding process for Facility Hardship projects at Weaverville Elementary School and Trinity High School.

DESCRIPTION

In February 2020, the District submitted a *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189) to request Financial Hardship status for School Facility Program (SFP) Facility Hardship applications at Weaverville Elementary School and Trinity High School.

The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has reviewed the request and determined the District:

- Has long-term debt at 0% of debt capacity, which is below the 60% threshold,
- Has not passed a Proposition 39 bond measure within the last two years, and
- Has a debt capacity of \$26.2 million which is in excess of the \$5 million threshold.

As a result, the District is not eligible for Financial Hardship assistance under standard criteria.

The District is therefore requesting consideration for Financial Hardship status based on "other evidence". If the appeal request is approved, the District would contribute the currently available \$56,696 towards the project at Weaverville Elementary School and the total Financial Hardship grant for design funds at this time would be \$706,844.75. Financial Hardship approval status is also requested for two additional Facility Hardship projects at Trinity High School that will be presented at a future State Allocation Board (Board) meeting(s), and the full funding component of the Weaverville Elementary project. The District also has placed a bond on the March ballot and intends to contribute the proceeds of any available bond sales to the projects to offset some of the need for financial hardship funding if the bond passes and proceeds become available.

DESCRIPTION (cont.)

Additionally, the District is seeking immediate Apportionments for these Facility Hardship projects outside of the priority funding process to meet cash flow needs of the District. The discovery of mold in the elementary and high school campuses has resulted in the closure of the majority of the existing facilities and the need to rent portable buildings to continue the operation of the schools. The cost of the temporary housing has exhausted the District's reserve fund and the District cannot complete the reconstruction work necessary in the buildings absent the State funding. Due to the financial implications of having to rent temporary classroom facilities and the need to begin the reconstruction process as quickly as possible, the District does not believe it is possible to wait for the outcome of the election and to initiate the sale of any authorized bonds before coming before the Board.

AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

The District is comprised of three school sites (Alps View Continuation High, Trinity High, and Weaverville Elementary) located in Trinity County. The District serves the communities of Weaverville, Lewiston, Burnt Ranch, Coffee Creek, Junction City, Douglas City and Trinity Center. These "feeder school" communities send their students to Trinity High School. The District is made up of over 500 square miles of mostly rural land. The District reports that over 60 percent of the its students qualify for the free/reduced price meal program.

In June 2019, the District became aware of the likely presence of extensive toxic black mold at both school sites. Following testing, deep cleaning, and retesting, a thorough inspection of both campuses' facilities determined that large portions of both sites were unsafe for students and staff. Subsequently, the facilities were ordered closed by the Trinity County Environmental Health Department. The District used most of their available reserve funding to start the remediation work at both sites and obtain 28 portable classrooms that were installed on the adjacent play fields. The District has nearly exhausted reserve funding and has obtained a short-term loan from the Trinity County Treasurer to manage cash flow until property tax revenue is received.

The District submitted an *Application for Funding* (Form SAB 50-04) for design funding for the Facility Hardship project at Weaverville Elementary School. The submittal included a request for Financial Hardship funding because it does not have sufficient funds to provide the full matching share requirements under the SFP to mitigate the health and safety threat. The District has not submitted applications for the Facility Hardship projects at Trinity High School but will sometime in the near future. The mold

project at Trinity High School is of a larger scale but involves the same nature of work as the mold project at Weaverville Elementary School.

Attempts to Obtain Local Match

The District is attempting to pass a local bond (Measure F) on March 3, 2020 (the first possible election after the discovery of the mold). A 55 percent vote will be needed for the approval of the bond and will authorize the District to issue \$16.67 million in bonds. Due to the financial implications of having to rent temporary classroom facilities and the need to begin the reconstruction process as quickly as possible, the District does not believe it is possible to wait for the outcome of the election and to initiate the sale of any authorized bonds before coming before the Board; therefore, the District is requesting to receive immediate state assistance to help in its match in order for the reconstruction work to continue in time to open the school buildings for the 2020/2021 school year. The District has stated that if the local bond is successful, it will apply any proceeds available prior to project completion to offset financial hardship funds provided.

The District has spent nearly \$2 million of their available reserve for interim housing at both sites and had to take a short-term cash flow loan from Trinity County. The District has stated that the costs for remediation and reconstruction are estimated at \$11.7 million and future reconstruction cost could add an additional \$30 million in need.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

DISTRICT POSITION

As noted in its School District Appeal Request (Form SAB 189),

The District respectfully requests:

- (i) designation of Financial Hardship under "Other Evidence" as we do not qualify under the four general rubrics,
- (ii) (ii) with immediate apportionment for health/safety measures taken to date, and expedited apportionments for future approved expenditures, that will be submitted and processed by the State Allocation Board in the near future, respecting both the elementary facility hardship project and high school facility hardship project, to ensure sufficient cash flow for smooth and rapid progress on reconstructing the two campuses, and ensuring Trinity Alps Unified School District does not become insolvent or an additional candidate for State receivership under AB1200.

<u>The full text of the District's appeal request and the additional narrative is included as</u> <u>Attachment B</u>.

STAFF POSITION

Financial Hardship Under "Other Evidence"

The District has requested consideration under the "other evidence" of reasonable effort provision in the Financial Hardship regulations, which requires Board approval. There have been twelve prior requests for Financial Hardship status under "other evidence" considered by the Board. There are no set criteria to qualify for Financial Hardship status under "other evidence". Each district presented unique circumstances surrounding its request. Of these requests, five were approved as requested and three partially approved. The remaining four were not approved.

A full summary of all prior "other evidence" appeals and their outcomes is included as Attachment D.

Staff is providing the following overview of the District's ability to meet the standard financial hardship criteria for the Board's consideration of its request:

Financial Hardship Qualification

School districts may qualify for the Financial Hardship program by levying the maximum developer fees allowed by law and by meeting one of the four criteria outlined in regulation. The District is levying developer fees justified under law and meets this qualifying criterion; however, the District currently does not meet any of the secondary criteria, as illustrated below:

* Staff would note that most districts that qualify for Financial Hardship using the criteria for 60% bonded indebtedness achieve this through the issuance of local bonds.

The District placed a bond on the first available ballot after the discovery of the mold issue to attempt to raise the local matching share. If the bond passes in March 2020, the District would meet the administrative requirements for a review under the standard financial hardship criteria, without the need for an appeal. However, the District is concerned that waiting for the outcome of the election is not prudent given that it is necessary to return the students to the original facilities as quickly as possible to reduce the cost of the temporary housing, which has currently exhausted all of the District's reserve funds. Staff further notes that the District has placed a strong emphasis on ensuring that mitigation measures included in the funding request were truly the minimum work necessary to address the mold and complete the reconstruction work. Further, if the bond does pass, the District has placed available proceeds from future local bond sales to offset the financial hardship grant up to the point of project completion.

The District has indicated that prior to the discovery of the mold, standard facilities needs were typically addressed within the maintenance budget or through one time funds. The District had previously submitted one modernization project for funding under the SFP and had used a combination of Developer Fees, Forest Reserve funds, and Fund 17 funds (Special Reserve Fund for Other Than Capital Outlay Projects) to complete some of the work in the scope of that project. That project is still on the Workload List for processing. The County Office of Education has evaluated the District's finances and has issued a letter stating that it cannot support the District taking on any additional debt to address the construction work as it would put the District's fiscal solvency at risk (see Attachment C).

Summary of Funding Request

Because the District is appealing the decision of the initial Financial Hardship review, Staff proceeded with phase two of the Financial Hardship review to determine the amount of local funds that would be potentially available for the project, and the amount of Financial Hardship assistance necessary should the Board grant the District's appeal. Staff has confirmed that the District has only \$59,696 to contribute towards the Weaverville Elementary project, and \$43,659 as contribution from past expenditures for the Trinity Alps High project.

If the District's appeal is approved, the District would contribute \$59,696 towards the project and the total Financial Hardship grant is estimated to be approximately \$1,984,413. The District must finalize the plans and obtain Division of the State Architect approval before full funding can be reviewed and approved. However, if the Financial Hardship status is granted, the District is eligible for advanced design funding in the amount of \$706,844.75. The Weaverville Elementary School project is detailed in the table below.

The total Financial Hardship grant being requested in this appeal is unknown until the District submits *Applications for Funding* for the Facility Hardship projects at Trinity Alps High School, and for the full funding application for Weaverville Elementary School.

Immediate Apportionment Outside the Priority Funding Process

If the Board approves Financial Hardship status under other evidence, the District is also requesting an immediate Apportionment due to the urgency of the District's situation.

Apportionments outside of the priority funding process will result in the District having immediate access to cash once a signed Grant Agreement and Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 50-05) are submitted for the Facility Hardship projects. Without an immediate Apportionment, the District would not have the funding to continue the remediation measures. Funds from the local bond measure being

presented to voters in March of this year may be available in the future, but are not guaranteed and will not be available in time for the District to complete the reconstruction activities necessary to start the next school year back in the original facilities. The District has no other source of funding to complete the necessary reconstruction work, and has over \$9 million in invoices still pending for the remediation work that has occurred to date.

Therefore, if the Board approves the District's request for Financial Hardship status, it may also wish to consider approving Apportionments for design funding outside the priority funding process.

Conclusion

Staff is unable to administratively approve either of the District's requests; however, staff supports the District's request for both expedited Apportionments and Financial Hardship status under "other evidence".

Typically, Staff only supports Apportionments outside the priority funding process in the most severe circumstances. Due to the Health and Safety issue, the high cost of the temporary housing and associated impact to the District's budget, as well as the lack of other options to fund the needed construction work, staff supports the request for expedited apportionments. Expedited apportionments for design funds for the Weaverville Elementary School Facility Hardship project would allow the District to pay outstanding invoices for mold remediation work and complete the design process for the necessary reconstruction work so students can return to the original facilities. Approving the Expedited Apportionments for the future full funding of Weaverville Elementary and the mold related projects at Trinity High School as part of this item will further enable the District to quickly complete the reconstruction work without the need for an additional appeal on this topic. The fact pattern for these applications is similar to other appeals the Board has granted for immediate apportionment of other Facility Hardship projects.

Staff also supports the District's request for Financial Hardship status under "other evidence" for the following reasons:

- The District did not anticipate the mold problem and has exhausted its available resources to address the issue.
- The District has placed a bond on the first available ballot to attempt to raise the local matching share.
- If the bond is successful, the District intends to use available proceeds to offset financial hardship assistance for the health and safety projects, however the outcome of the election, the timing of any proceeds, and whether the local bond proceeds will fully cover the local share are currently unknown.
- Pursuant to the County Office of Education, the District does not appear to have other options to take on debt to complete the construction projects.

BOARD OPTIONS

Under the Rules and Procedures of the State Allocation Board, "Staff is providing the following options for the Board's consideration. A positive vote by six members is required for the Board to take action that is an alternative to Staff's administrative action. Absent a positive vote by six members of the Board, Staff's administrative action will stand, and the school district's appeal will be considered closed."

Option A1: Approve an Apportionment <u>with</u> Financial Hardship outside of the priority funding process for design funds for the Facility Hardship project at Weaverville Elementary School. (See Attachment E1)

This option would provide immediate access to cash to continue with the design of the reconstruction work at Weaverville Elementary School. The District will be required to submit a grant agreement prior to fund release.

Option A2: Approve an Unfunded Approval <u>with</u> Financial Hardship for design funds for the Facility Hardship project at Weaverville Elementary School (See Attachment E2)

This option would provide the District with approval of funds to continue the design of the reconstruction work necessary at Weaverville Elementary School. The District will be required to participate in the Priority Funding process during the next filing round, with cash potentially available in fall of 2020.

Option B1: Approve an expedited Apportionment <u>with</u> Financial Hardship outside of the priority funding process for the following future projects:

- Full funding application for Weaverville Elementary School
- Design Funding for mold related Facility Hardship projects at Trinity High School
- Full funding applications for mold related Facility Hardship projects at Trinity High School.

This option would provide immediate access to cash to continue with the reconstruction work. The District will be required to submit a funding application and grant agreement prior to fund release.

BOARD OPTIONS (cont.)

Option B2: Approve expedited Apportionments <u>without</u> Financial Hardship outside of the priority funding process for the future Facility Hardship projects at Weaverville Elementary and Trinity High School.

This option would require the District to provide a local match for the Facility Hardship projects at Weaverville Elementary and Trinity High Schools. This option would allow the district to receive cash quickly once the full funding applications are presented to the Board. However, without Financial Hardship, design funding is not an option. If this option is approved, the District will be required to submit a funding application and grant agreement prior to fund release.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve Options A1 and B1.

BOARD ACTION

In considering this Item, the Board approved Options A1 and B1, which would approve an Apportionment with Financial Hardship outside of the Priority Funding process for design funding (Attachment E1). The Board's action also included the approval of an expedited Apportionment with Financial Hardship outside of the Priority Funding process for full funding for Weaverville Elementary School and design/full funding at Trinity High School for mold-related Facility Hardship projects.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

Education Code (EC) Section 17070.35(a) states the following:

(a) In addition to all other powers and duties as are granted to the board by this chapter, other statutes, or the California Constitution, the board shall do all of the following:

(1) Adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, for the administration of this chapter. However, the board shall have no authority to set the level of the fees of any architect, structural engineer, or other design professional on any project. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted as emergency regulations, and the circumstances related to the initial adoption are hereby deemed to constitute an emergency for this purpose. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter by November 4, 1998. If the initial regulations are not adopted by that date, the board shall report to the Legislature by that date, explaining the reasons for the delay.

EC Section 17070.35(a)(2) states that the Board shall, "Establish and publish any procedures and policies in connection with the administration of \dots (*the SFP*) as it deems necessary."

EC Section 17075.10(b)(2) states that a school district applying for hardship state funding must "demonstrate that due to unusual circumstances that are beyond the control of the district, excessive costs need to be incurred in the construction of school facilities. Funds for the purpose of seismic mitigation work or facility replacement pursuant to this section shall be allocated by the board on a 50-percent state share basis.... If the board determines that the seismic mitigation work of a school building would require funding that is greater than the 50 percent of the funds required to construct a new facility, the school district shall be eligible for funding to construct a new facility under this chapter."

Education Code Section 17075.10(b)(1)(B) states that "... the school district has made all reasonable efforts to impose levels of local debt capacity and developer fees, and that the school district is, therefore, unable to participate in the program pursuant to this chapter except as set forth in this article."

EC Section 17075.15(d) states the following:

Further, regulations shall also specify a method for determining required level of local effort to obtain matching funds. The regulations shall include consideration of at least all of the following factors:

(1) Whether the school district has passed a bond measure within the two-year period immediately preceding the application for funding under this article, the proceeds of which are substantially available for use in the project to be funded under this chapter, but remains unable to provide the necessary matching share requirement.

(2) Whether the principal amount of the current outstanding bonded indebtedness issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities for the school district and

secured by property within the school district or by revenues of, or available to, the school district, which shall include general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos bonds, school facility improvement district bonds, certificates of participation, and other debt instruments issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities for the school district and for which owners of property within the school district or the school district are paying debt service is at least 60 percent of the school district's total bonding capacity, as determined by the board.

(3) Whether the total bonding capacity, as defined in Section 15102 or 15106, as applicable, is five million dollars (\$5,000,000) or less, in which case, the school district shall be deemed eligible for financial hardship.

(4) Whether the application for funding under this article is from a county superintendent of schools.

(5) Whether the school district submits other evidence of substantial local effort acceptable to the board.

(6) The value of any unused local general obligation debt capacity, and developer fees added to the needs analysis to reflect the district's financial hardship, available for the purposes of school facilities financing."

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.81(c) states

(c) "...The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:

(1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.

(2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).

(3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.

(4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.

(5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states the following: "A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to replace or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils."

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82(a)(1)(A) states:

If the request is for replacement facilities, a cost/benefit analysis must be prepared by the district and submitted to the OPSC that indicates the total costs to remain in the classroom or related facility and mitigate the problem is at least 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the classroom or related facility...If the cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost, the district may qualify for a Modernization Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for rehabilitation costs pursuant to Section 1859.83(e) or a grant not to exceed 50 percent of the cost estimate that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the board for seismic rehabilitation.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.90 states that "a district must submit the Form SAB 50-05, within 18 months of the Apportionment of the SFP grant for the project or the entire...apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action...."

- II. Immediate Apportionment for Health/Safety Measures to Date for all Affected Facilities and Expedited Apportionments for Future Approved Expenditures for all Health/Safety Related Actions

BACKGROUND

The Mold Emergency:

In June 2019, Trinity Alps Unified School District first became aware of the likely presence of extensive toxic black mold at both its Weaverville Elementary School and Trinity High School campuses. The Board of Trustees immediately hired a licensed industrial hygienist who confirmed the presence of toxic air spores across both campuses. Following initial extensive deep cleaning and retesting, and a thorough detailed inspection of both campuses' facilities, a determination was made that large portions of both facilities were unsafe for students as well as staff. The facilities were ordered closed by the Trinity County Environmental Health Department. Subsequently, on July 2, 2019, County Superintendent of Schools Sarah Supahan declared an emergency. (A map of each campus and photographs showing the affected facilities are attached to this Request and incorporated by reference herein.)

Upon further inspection, and through the removal of surface facing of interior walls and underlayment layers of the roof, the extensive pervasiveness of mold incursion in both campuses was revealed.

The extent of the problems varied dramatically between the two campuses:

Weaverville Elementary School: The elementary school had some modernization 14 years ago, along with the construction of a new wing, which helped forestall more major infestation there. Nonetheless, the cafeteria, gym, locker rooms, main office, library and many classrooms exhibited mold infestations.

Trinity High School: The high school was built 50 years ago and never modernized,

and major building systems, including roofing, HVAC and plumbing have reached the end of their useful lives and need replacement. Affected areas at the high school included the Career Tech Education shops, locker rooms, gym, cafeteria, hallways, the offices and the majority of the classrooms.

Except for the modernized areas at the Elementary campus, the facilities at the campuses are old and antiquated and in dire need of extensive renewal and modernization, and the mold is a result of the dilapidated condition of the facilities and their building systems (with leaks, cracks, breaks, etc.).

Temporary Campus Construction:

During the summer of 2019, as the depth and gravity of the mold infestation became apparent, the District sought the use of portable classrooms as a temporary interim measure to house students while the two campuses remained closed due to unsafe conditions. With significant effort, the District was able to locate 28 portable classrooms satisfactory for classroom instruction. The portables were installed on fields adjacent to the affected facilities. Total costs of installation and site preparation for interim housing to date were approximately \$2 million, funded through the District's available reserve funds. As a result the District's available reserve funds have been practically completely exhausted, which resulted in other adverse impacts. The District historically has used its cash reserves on a temporary basis to fund operational costs in the January-March timeframe each year when monthly cashflow goes negative. Application of the reserves to fund the installation of the portables caused the District for the first time in January 2020 to arrange a short-term cashflow loan of \$1,000,000 from Trinity County pursuant to Education Code Section 42621, until the property tax apportionments are received and distributed by the County Treasurer, also forcing the District to incur unanticipated interest expense. Given the extent of site preparation and the suddenness of these emergency conditions, the District also delayed the opening of school for the 2019-20 school year by two weeks, from August 19th to September 2.

To summarize, without cash reserves, due to the emergency "mold" expenditures, the District does not have available funds to allocate to its matching share, and now must even borrow externally to fund operational needs during negative cashflow periods. This demonstrates that the District cannot fund its match and qualifies for a financial hardship supplemental grant under the Regulation Section 1859.81(c)(5).

Nor will the District have available funds for its matching share in the foreseeable future. Ongoing rental expense of \$38,000/month (\$456,000 annually) for the portables continues to drain District cash balances, and the need for this expense will persist until remediation and reconstruction are completed. Further, the invoices for remediation work to date (over \$11 million, with only \$1.9 million paid) will become due, and a delay in funding of these could have a material adverse effect upon the reconstruction process. Consequently, the District's need for financial hardship designation and immediate apportionments is urgent and must be expeditiously met in order to avoid any lapses in work and progress and to mitigate additional costs arising from exposure to prompt payment penalties.

The Impact on Students and Staff:

The impact on students and staff has been intense, with disruptions felt at both campuses. The District rented kitchen facilities at the County jail to prepare and then transport food for both campuses at significant additional expense. Alternate areas had to be developed for students to eat lunch in. This was especially critical during inclement and freezing/snow conditions. The bathroom portables are not heated, bringing additional disruption and discomfort in wintry weather, which particularly impacted our younger students. The portables also limit the physical education instruction for the students, as well as recreational options. Student athletes have to travel 30-90 minutes daily to other school athletic facilities for practice and to play their "home" games, as the gyms were closed. As approximately 64% of the District's students qualify as low income, their parents and families also could not attend these games, given the disruption to schedules and travel costs. The overall situation has been especially difficult and trying for the District's students and families.

Managing Educational and Community Activities:

Meeting facilities for both students, staff, our Board and the community have been impacted, severely limiting the availability of the District's facilities for Civic Center purposes otherwise required by the Civic Center Act as set forth in Education Code Section 38130 et seq. Our largest room for meetings now can only accommodate 40 people. We have had to curtail assemblies, and in fact rent facilities for student testing and dances. School offices at both facilities and the District Office have been relocated into temporary facilities, with server and equipment disruptions. Board of Trustees meetings are now held at the County library or the County Office of Education, with access to Civic Center space for the community limited.

Our community is unlike larger communities, where a YMCA or teen centers are available for area youth and other residents. We have only our schools as *community focal points*. The gyms are for the community as well as students. They are annually utilized by the local men's league basketball teams, community indoor soccer teams, and the local recreation department, to name a just a few. Even large funerals take place in our gyms. Our cafeterias are also used to bake the pies for the 4th of July civic fundraiser. Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts use the schools for their meetings, as do county spelling bees and science fairs. <u>These campuses also serve as the Emergency Evacuation center for our area and the Red Cross Command Shelter</u>. Our schools are the community's hub- the mold emergency and remediation has especially affected our entire area.

Abatement and remediation of known affected areas is now substantially complete, with clearance by County Environmental Health. Less affected areas, such as the cafeteria, gym and library at the elementary school and the wood/industrial arts shop and cafeteria eating area at the high school, have re-opened to students. However, the more severely affected areas, such as the gym and locker rooms at the high school, remain closed, as there was significant demolition of interior walls, ceilings, floors and building systems, mandating extensive reconstruction. (See attached photos). District personnel and the County Office of Education have been meeting with architects this month to evaluate the scope, timing and duration, of the reconstruction phase of the work, which is still under review. Any further letting of contracts for this work must be delayed until funds are available.

As has been our practice in the past, the District will continue to provide information to both the County Office of Education and OPSC as it becomes available.

Community and Economy:

Trinity Alps Unified School District was created on July 1, 2008, through the merger of Weaverville Elementary School District and Trinity Union High School District. Trinity Alps USD serves the community of Weaverville, as well as the communities of Lewiston, Burnt Ranch, Coffee Creek, Junction City, Douglas City and Trinity Center. These "feeder school" communities send their students to Trinity High School as their default public high school. The District encompasses an area of 535.5 square miles, mostly rural. A large amount of the land is federally managed public land, limiting economic growth, revenue potential and tax base enhancement. District economic statistics indicate per capita income of \$24,827, and median household income of \$43,191. In this regard, October 2019 data submitted to the State indicate about 64% of the District's students participate in the federally subsidized meal programs for low-income, disadvantaged youth. The local economy includes resource industries such as timber, tourism and service sectors (including camping, fishing, environmental), and agriculture (including cultivation of marijuana, which appears to be diminishing with state legalization and consolidation of growers and distributors). Other sectors include government, utility and resource extraction.

Property Values:

Approximately 82% of Trinity County is non-taxable federally managed land and the remainder has experienced stagnant assessed valuation growth. The significant property appreciation in other areas of the State bypassed Trinity County and the District, with only moderate fluctuating growth over the past several years. District assessed valuation this year has not increased from last year, with increases of about 3.5%, 1% and 5.3% respectively in the prior three years, forecasting limited opportunities for structuring level debt service under the tax rate limitations of Prop. 39 (annual cap of \$60 in taxes per \$100,000 assessed valuation). This makes it difficult to obtain sufficient proceeds from general obligation bond sales, in a timely manner, for the District's facility needs. Due to the profound needs of the District, the Board of Trustees has ordered an election on a \$16,670,000 general obligation bond measure for the March ballot notwithstanding these present challenges. The bond measure authorization amount was sized to obtain the highest amount of bond proceeds that could be obtained in a single series, as limited by the Prop. 39 annual tax rate cap. This constraint limits the District's ability to access additional bond proceeds in time to address the capital needs resulting from the mold emergency.

General Obligation Bond on March 3rd 2020 Ballot:

The gravity of the mold emergency, the dollars required for proper remediation and reconstruction, and the requirements for State funding prompted the Board of Trustees to order a \$16.67 million General Obligation Bond election on March 3, 2020. However, funds will not be available until several months after passage, aggravating cash flow issues as well as contractor concerns, and this assumes no taxpayer challenges, as have befallen a neighboring school district.

The Board resolution ordering the ballot measure emphasized the mold and health and safety of pupils and staff as the primary objective of the bond measure. Financial hardship grants and any available bond proceeds will be prioritized first for mold remediation and reconstruction, with facility modernization initiatives having secondary priority. To the extent bond proceeds become available prior to close-out of each facility hardship project, the District will allocate bond proceeds to the project.

The District has previously not had to fund capital improvements through general obligation bonds, and has no general obligation debt outstanding. In 2016 the District applied for modernization funds for Trinity High School. Since that time (and prior to the discovery of the mold) the District has spent over \$1.5 million from its general fund to commence work on these modernization projects, confirming the District's good faith and competent stewardship regarding tax dollars for these purposes. It has imposed developer fees at the maximum that is permissible (and is aware of the 7.64% increase in maximum Level 1 developer fees approved on January 22, 2020, and is now initiating an updated developer fee study for action by our Board of Trustees).

The District is taking all actions available at this time for relief (including this Appeal) to avoid more drastic alternatives, such as negative certification (which could adversely impact bond sales) and State stewardship. The District is certified "qualified" under AB1200 for the first time ever this year and is in declining enrollment. The District is responsible for remediation costs incurred, estimated at \$11.7 million, with only \$1.9 million paid to date, and future reconstruction costs which could add an additional \$30 million, assuming no additional unforeseen health/safety issues.

This emergency, the extensive mold, the required expenditures for portables and site preparation, and the initial remediation efforts have exhausted the reserves of the District and precipitated the qualified certification. Anticipated future project requirements of \$30+ million threaten the financial capabilities and capacity of the District, without the remedies sought in this Request for Appeal.

Current Actions:

The District's inability to provide matching funds, actions taken by the Board of Trustees, and the current financial situation have led the District to this Request for Appeal. As noted above, the District arranged a County temporary transfer in January with no issuance costs, as a direct result of mold conditions exhausting reserves and putting further mold projects out of reach. This is in addition to placing the General Obligation Bond on the March ballot. These actions demonstrate that the District cannot fund the local match in its current condition. As noted above, actually incurred and projected costs outstrip what the District is able to raise from State supplemental hardship dollars and from passage of the bond measure.

The District is also working in close collaboration with the County Office of Education regarding the remediation and reconstruction project and its impact on District finances. The District has been proactive in streamlining its budget and reducing expenditures. It reduced certificated and classified staff by 6.5 positions for the 2019-20 school year and over \$600,000 was cut from the budget; this is projected to continue this March with a potential \$400,000 in additional reductions. While this is of assistance fiscally, the totality of the remediation and reconstruction,

estimated in the \$40+ million range, require immediate and extensive State financial hardship assistance.

Summary:

Trinity Alps Unified School District has been extremely fortunate to have its County Office of Education and OPSC available since June to assist the District as it worked its way through the mold exposure and remediation processes. The relationship with both offices has been extremely beneficial to the District in confronting this toxic condition, and without their respective assistance, we might have fallen into AB1200 State stewardship. For this help we are extremely appreciative and grateful.

The District has solid educational programs and an excellent reputation for graduating productive students. Its financial struggles due to the mold, however, threaten to jeopardize this success. The large expenditures required to complete the reconstruction and pay the current invoices, which are about half of the initial contractor estimates, far exceed the capability of the District itself to fund the matching share under the State modernization program guidelines, even assuming prompt access to bond proceeds. Notwithstanding our efforts and stewardship of the public fisc to which the District is entrusted, large mold remediation efforts in the \$40 million range are not fiscally sustainable for districts of our size, absent almost complete reimbursement, as has been also evidenced by Mountain Valley School District and Burnt Ranch School District in our county. And the underlying cause, the presence of mold, particularly in older antiquated facilities, is not going away, a matter which for Trinity Alps Unified School District has been covered in the local and national media.

For the reasons noted in this School District Appeal Request, the District respectfully requests **(i) designation of Financial Hardship** under "Other Evidence" as we do not qualify under the four general rubrics, **(ii) with immediate apportionment** for health/safety measures taken to date, and expedited apportionments for future approved expenditures, that will be submitted and processed by the State Allocation Board in the near future, respecting both the elementary facility hardship project and high school facility hardship project, to ensure sufficient cashflow for smooth and rapid progress on reconstructing the two campuses, and ensuring Trinity Alps Unified School District does not become insolvent or an additional candidate for State stewardship under AB1200.

The undersigned, Superintendent of Trinity Alps Unified School District, wishes to thank OPSC staff for their interest in our District, for the personal relationship created through meetings in Sacramento as well as OPSC site visits in Weaverville, and for its guidance to our District in weathering this crisis.

Examples of mold found in the classroom walls and floors.



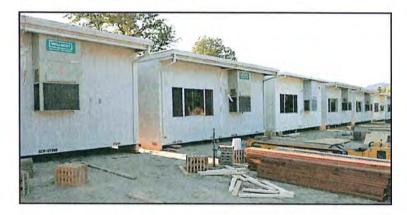


The remediation process begins. Mold is found in the ceilings, carpets and walls. Asbestos is found in the floor tiles and pipes. The remediation process renders classrooms unusable.





Temporay facilities were brought in to house the students because the old classrooms were not safe to use. Areas large enough to accommodate portables were found at both school sites. All basic infrastructure had to be put in, from wiring to plumbing to internet.











The first portables arrived onsite one month after the mold had been discovered. The start of school was delayed by only a few days. Two temporary campuses had been built in a little over a month.







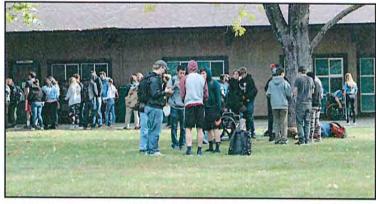






The remediation of the mold and asbestos has been completed, but an enormous amount of reconstruction remains to be done. Flooring and ceiling tiles need to be replaced in the majority of the rooms. Walls that were torn down need to be rebuilt. The high school gym and locker rooms were gutted, they need extensive work. The students are back in class, but they are anxious to go home to their old campus.

Dear OPSC Staff,

Regarding the financial status of Trinity Alps Unified School District (District) and their application for Financial Hardship, the Trinity County Office of Education (TCOE) is of the following position:

The District had a qualified budget for the 2019-20 First Interim Financial report due to unforeseen expenditures necessary to address the health and safety projects at their school sites. Key points of the districts extremely fragile financial condition include:

- District borrowed funds from County Treasury in advance of receipt of property tax revenue to cover January 2020 payroll
- District has limited cash for school operations and no margin for error for additional unforeseen events
- District has paid \$ 1.93 million to date on this project
- District has an additional \$ 9.8 million in pending obligations for work already completed

Under Education Code 42133, before the District could issue any general fund backed debt, such as certificates of participation, our office would be required to find that repayment of the proposed indebtedness is probable.

Cost estimates for the combined projects could reach as much as \$ 40 million. As of the District's 2019-20 First Interim Financial Report, the District's total projected unrestricted General Fund revenue was \$ 7.4 million, and our office projects this to decline over the next

few years due to decreased enrollment. Issuing any debt beyond this amount could lead to default and possible state intervention and takeover. The District has already obligated all available local dollars to repairing their facilities. Due to the District's small size and limited financial resources, it would be fiscally irresponsible to take on additional debt beyond what the projected revenues can support.

While the District has a pending General Obligation Bond appearing on the March 03, 2020 ballot, the bond measure is limited to \$ 16 million, which even if passed would not supply the district with adequate finances for the project completion.

The Trinity County Office of Education cannot, in good conscience, support or recommend any significant amount of debt to be carried by the District. Not only would such significant debt only be able to be fully repaid if sufficient funding were available from the state, but entering into any debt of this nature would introduce risks to the District's fiscal solvency. The issues faced by the District are urgent in nature and of potentially serious impact to the health and safety of the students and faculty, and must be addressed promptly. Further, as detailed above, the District does not have the financial resources to meet the need, which could be as much as \$ 40 million.

Therefore, our office supports the District's application for financial hardship funding as the District will be unable to take on additional General Fund debt for its required matching share.

Dear Mr. Green,

I was contacted by your agency to review the results submitted first from Schneider Laboratories Global, INC, these reports gave concerning results regarding the elevated levels of several types of mold and toxigenic molds that can effect students and employees. Those with a weakened or compromised immune system are more sensitive to the negative effects of toxigenic mold, but indoor mold exposure can cause respiratory tract infections in healthy populations as well.

The recommendations provided for site remediation provided by Interstate, in consultation with APEX, to cut, remove, treat, and replace materials, prevention of further growth and use PPE during this process is in accordance with OSHA laws and regulations is the appropriate approach to this situation.

I really appreciate the effort that is being taken by the school district to insure the health of its students, as well as the staff. I hope we can continue to work together to make sure that the best efforts are continued as we move forward.

DESCRIPTION

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

In June of 2019, Trinity Alps Unified School District became aware of potential mold growth at the Weaverville Elementary school site. A report by a licensed industrial hygienist, dated July 5, 2019 and July 24, 2019 confirmed the presence of extensive mold growth throughout the campus. The cafeteria, gym, locker rooms, main office, library and multiple classrooms were determined to be unsafe for occupation by students and staff and subsequently closed. A follow up report dated September 19, 2019, by Interstate Restoration LLC. indicates that "multiple areas throughout the school have been identified needing mold abatement before students can be allowed back into the building to resume regular activities."

SCOPE OF PROJECT

Rehabilitation work consists of mold abatement on all surfaces, including the removal and replacement of ceiling tiles and drywall, the cleaning of all HVAC systems and

components, and performing the necessary repairs to prevent future water intrusion and return the affected facilities to pre-loss condition.

Students are temporarily housed in leased portables on the Weaverville Elementary site. The first phase of work to mitigate the mold has been completed. PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM FOR THE FACILITY HARDSHIP PROGRAM AND SEISMIC MITIGATION PROGRAM

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the following for State Allocation Board (Board) approval:

- Proposed School Facility Program (SFP) regulatory amendments for the Facility Hardship Program and the Seismic Mitigation Program; and,
- A new form for use and submission of a cost estimate with Facility Hardship and Seismic Mitigation Program applications (Form SAB 58-01)

DESCRIPTION

The Facility Hardship Program began in 1998 with the creation of the School Facility Program. In 2006, California voters approved Proposition 1D which provided funding to create the Seismic Mitigation Program.

The Facility Hardship Program provides funding assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances that have caused an imminent health and safety threat to students and staff. Extraordinary circumstances may include seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 facilities. Qualified projects may receive Facility Hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct school buildings or related required components.

This item seeks Board approval for proposed amendments to the SFP regulations for the Facility Hardship Program and the Seismic Mitigation Program and a new cost estimate form to be required for Facility Hardship and Seismic Mitigation application submissions under these proposed regulations. BACKGROUND

With the increased number of applications received under the Facility Hardship Program, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has identified a number of areas of opportunity to provide clarity, increase consistency, and improve user readability of the SFP regulations governing this program.

OPSC held three public meetings on January 10, 2020, January 31, 2020, and February 7, 2020 to discuss the proposed amendments of the Facility Hardship Program and Seismic Mitigation Program regulations. The meetings were webcast live and the recordings are available on OPSC's website to provide access to all stakeholders. Staff invited stakeholders to provide feedback regarding the proposed regulation text as well as changes to the program.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

Notable Program Changes

To provide increased clarity to school districts applying to the programs, the proposed regulation amendments incorporate changes to the overall organization and structure of the regulation text. Additionally, the proposed regulations expand flexibility in program options, and increase funding for some areas of these programs. In some circumstances, the proposed changes may limit funding opportunities by providing stricter accountability for state bond funds.

The chart below summarizes the main changes between existing regulations and these proposed regulations, a more detailed description of the changes follows the chart:

Organizational Changes

The overarching organization and structure of the Facility Hardship Program and Seismic Mitigation Program regulation text has been revised to improve clarity of program purpose and implementation. Staff has provided a high level outline of the proposed organizational structure in Attachment B. The Facility Hardship Program has been separated from the Seismic Mitigation Program into two new subsections. This delineation between the related programs allows for a focused expression of the requirements unique to each program.

Within both subsections, there is increased enumeration to assist with navigating the various aspects of program eligibility, application requirements, and funding calculations.

Additionally, the Facility Hardship Program regulations discussing applications for rehabilitation are now included in the Facility Hardship Program subsection 1859.82.1(c) as opposed to inclusion as an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant in Section 1859.83.

Applications for the Reimbursement of Completed Facility Hardship Projects

In the proposed regulations, districts must submit eligible facility hardship applications for projects to OPSC within one year of receiving DSA approval of their plans. For projects that do not require DSA approval, districts must submit applications for completed eligible projects within 6 months of project completion as demonstrated by occupancy of the affected building or use of the affected system.

The proposed regulations provide the opportunity for reimbursement for projects not meeting the above criteria for 90 days following the effective date of the regulations. The application must meet all other criteria and requirements of the revised regulations.

The proposed facility hardship regulations are designed to more closely align the regulations with Education Code Section 17075.10 which outlines that funding be provided either in cases where there is extreme financial, disaster-related, or other hardship that is causing an unmet need for pupil housing or cases of "extraordinary circumstances" where "excessive costs need to be incurred in the construction of school facilities...." The purpose of this Section is to provide assistance to school districts whom are otherwise unable to address a health and safety issue and also meet the housing needs of the district. Health and safety issues addressed several years prior to application submittal do not appear to meet the intent of the statute.

Applications for the Mitigation of Mold

For projects where the main health and safety threat is due to mold, OPSC will require a site visit prior to the completion of any mitigation work. This will allow OPSC to review the conditions at the site and assist in determining funding eligibility.

With an increase in applications requesting funding for the mitigation of mold, OPSC has encountered situations in which the mold has been mitigated or the affected building materials had been removed prior to obtaining the documentation required to submit an eligible application. This can ultimately render the project ineligible for program funding as the required documentation may be difficult to obtain after remediation has taken place. The intent of requiring a site visit for projects seeking state funding for the mitigation of mold is to establish early communication between the district and OPSC to ensure that the necessary documentation is obtained prior to remediation. This early outreach also allows the district and OPSC to discuss state funding calculations for the application.

Return of Incomplete Applications

Applications that do not contain all required components of a complete application as outlined in the proposed regulations will be determine incomplete and returned to the district without processing. This is consistent with current procedure and has been added to the proposed regulations for clarification. This increases the focus on processing complete facility hardship and seismic mitigation applications. OPSC will continue to work with and assist districts that are in the early stages of a project and have questions in advance of submitting an application.

Facility Hardship Cost Estimate Form (Form SAB 58-01)

The existing regulations require that districts submit a cost estimate. The proposed regulations require the cost estimate to be submitted in a specified format. The intent of this revision is to streamline the application process for districts and provide a consistent framework for an equitable review process and a consistent funding determination. To facilitate this, Staff has created the proposed *Facility Hardship Cost Estimate* (Form SAB 58-01); a copy of this form is provided as Attachment A2.

Districts must reference the most current published edition of the Current Construction Costs Remodeling Repair publication by Sierra West Publishing for the reference data required to complete Form SAB 58-01. Total unit costs must be entered at the increased F3 degree of difficulty.

OPSC intends to publish the Form SAB 58-01 annually in a template format with updated allowances in conformance with the Sierra West Current Construction Costs Remodeling Repair publication.

Replacement Grants for Portable School Buildings

The existing regulations for the Facility Hardship Program provide for funding for replacement area using a price per square footage calculation based on an amount that is provided in the SFP Regulations. These amounts are intended for the replacement of permanent type construction and do not reflect an accurate amount for the purposes of calculating replacement costs for portable buildings. This calculation results in a funding amount that does not seem appropriate for portable type construction.

In the regulatory amendments, a new option for districts to replace or rehabilitate their portable facilities has been added. This is to allow districts more flexibility in the design of their mitigation plans as they work to resolve the existing health and safety threat. Due to statutory eligibility criteria regarding the type of construction required for the Seismic Mitigation Program, portable buildings remain ineligible to receive Seismic mitigation funding.

OPSC contacted multiple portable manufacturers for supporting information regarding portable costs and received from stakeholders several generalized estimates for the purchase, delivery, and installation of classroom portables. Based on a submitted and publically available piggyback contract provided to OPSC, OPSC calculated the cost to purchase, deliver and install a portable to illustrate what replacement grant could be. The portable replacement grants to do not contain allowances for design, planning, or utilities. The utility costs will be allowed through site development grants, and the soft costs are provided as a percentage to the allowable site development grants. The grant values derived from this contract were consistent with the general range of costs received from the other information provided by stakeholder. The bid document used for the determination of these grants can be found on Attachment C. The Replacement Grant for Portables would follow the calculation procedure for Replacement Square Footage as outlined in the proposed regulations. Based on the data currently available to OPSC, the proposed Portable Replacement Grant would provide a matching share amount of \$46.56 per square foot for replacement portables classified as "other" space and \$118.62 per square foot portable square footage classified as "toilet" space.

These amounts include costs for delivery and installation of the portable and will be adjusted annually as part of Annual Adjustment to School Facility Program Grants. For comparison, the grant for permanent replacement space is \$204 for "other" and \$366 foot "toilet" square footage. Using these per square foot costs for 2020, a 960 square foot replacement classroom portable would generate a Replacement Grant amount of \$44,697.60. For a 480 square foot restroom portable, the Replacement Grant amount would be \$56,937.60.

Supplemental Grant for Small Size Projects

The current supplemental grant for Small Size Projects is calculated based on the number of pupil grants requested for New Construction projects. The Facility Hardship and Seismic Mitigation Programs can fund replacement areas using the Square Footage Grant which does not directly equate to pupil grants.

Staff proposes an update to the Small Size Project Grant regulations to provide a calculation for eligible Facility Hardship replacement projects to receive this grant. This proposed calculation uses the Square Footage Grant to estimate the equivalent number of pupil grants for the purposes of determining the project's eligibility for the supplemental Small Size Project Grant. The proposed calculation is provided in the text of Attachment A1 under Section 1859.83(b).

Supplemental Grant for Excessive Costs due to Geographic Location

Staff has proposed an expansion of the Excessive Cost Hardship Grant due to Geographic Location to provide this supplemental grant to rehabilitation applications. Projects for replacement schools and replacement facilities are currently eligible for the grant, which is applied as a percentage increase to calculated grant amounts.

Under existing regulations, applications for Facility Hardship or seismic rehabilitation are ineligible to receive this grant, which is intended to compensate for the increased construction costs districts may realize due to considerations associated with remote locations. Previously districts would provide a written narrative requesting the consideration of costs at the increased F3 degree of difficulty to address this discrepancy.

With the proposed regulations allowing districts to use F3 costs as a standard in the new Facility Hardship Cost Estimate (Form SAB 58-01), Staff recommends addressing the increased costs due to geographic location through the established criteria already in SFP regulations of a standard percentage increase currently used for replacement applications. This removes ambiguity associated with determining geographic considerations through the line items of the required cost estimate and allows for a more equitable distribution of funding.

Advanced Site and Design Funding

Application submittal requirements and grant calculations were not previously outlined in the Facility Hardship and Seismic Mitigation Program regulations. Staff has provided clarifying language to outline the requirements for submittal and how advanced design and site funding is calculated for these programs. Additionally, seismic rehabilitation design and site grants will be provided in alignment with how modernization projects are funded for design (25% of the state share), rather than how new construction projects are funded (40% of the state share). This more appropriately reflects the project scope of these types of applications.

Incorporated Stakeholder Feedback

OPSC held three public stakeholder meetings on January 10, January 31, and February 7, 2020 at the California State Capitol building. The meetings were also aired as a live webcast including transcription to provide access to stakeholders who were unable to attend in person.

Staff would like to thank stakeholders that were able to view, attend or participate in these meetings and also thanks those who provided valuable feedback either at the meeting or through written correspondence to OPSC. Below is a table summarizing the topics raised by stakeholders and incorporated into these proposed regulations:

Unincorporated Stakeholder Feedback

Staff would like to thank stakeholders for the following feedback that OPSC considered but did not incorporate in the proposed regulatory changes:

- The usage of actual costs instead of estimated cost values in the required cost estimate.
 - The SFP is a formula-driven grant program that was not intended to fund the exact cost of construction, as costs fluctuate depending on a variety of factors and geographic locations. The use of a formula-driven calculation ensures consistency in the calculation of grant funding for all school districts.

As part of OPSC's review of a project, the SFP does provide increases to SFP grants, including Facility Hardship and SMP grants, for local bidding and construction climates in California through supplemental grants such as the Excessive Cost Hardship Grant due to Geographic Location which provides a percent increase to overall grants based on the school district's location. There are also increases for various soft costs in cost estimates such as overhead and profit, architect fees, testing and inspection, etc. SFP Regulations do not require any reductions to grants based on favorable bidding climates.

- Consideration of F4 level of difficulty costing for projects with certain types of work.
 - OPSC has previously confirmed with Sierra West that the F4 level of difficulty should only be applied to particular line items. The proposed regulations provide increased funding at the F3 level of difficulty across the board, provide additional supplemental grants, and attempt to streamline the application process. The broad applicability of the proposed regulations does not provide an exception for F4 level of difficulty funding.
- Providing funding for Industrial and Technology/ Education Laboratory in the same square footage amount as allowed by the Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP).
 - The CTEFP does not provide funds on a square footage basis. The CTEFP provides a cap of \$3 million for projects that include the construction of new facilities. Districts have flexibility in project design and use of funds.
 - OPSC has confirmed with CDE that the minimum recommended size for Industrial and Technology/ Education Laboratory classrooms is 960 square feet.
- Providing funding for site development requests for projects using replacement funding to complete rehabilitation work
 - In this context, the site development work is theoretical work outside the building construction costs that would be triggered as a result of the replacement of the building(s). For example, replacement of a school may enable a local government to require the school district to install a sidewalk or a streetlight. A traditional replacement project (where the facility is actually being replaced) may receive site development funds for this type of cost as the work is necessary to complete the project.
 - However, for projects in which the district is asking to use replacement funding to do rehabilitation work, these same costs would not be triggered, as the building is not actually being replaced. It does not seem necessary to provide this additional funding for projects that do not trigger the requirements.
 - OPSC acknowledges that some districts that choose the option to use replacement funds for rehabilitation work do so as a result of financial constraints, and that adding theoretical site development work increases funding levels. However, theoretical site development calculations are nearly impossible to verify or apply equitably because it is based on work that will not be completed. OPSC does not feel that this is an appropriate allocation of bond funds.

- Stakeholders requested that all projects be allowed to submit an application up to six months after project completion.
 - The proposed regulations allow two different timelines for application submission depending on if the project requires DSA approval.
 - While OPSC recognizes that it would be simpler to have a single deadline for the retroactive submission of applications for completed projects, the scope of work for projects that require DSA approval are generally much larger and more complex than the scope of work for projects that are eligible for an exemption from DSA plan approval.
 - Projects requiring DSA approval often require more time to complete an eligible project spanning several years. Tying application submittal to completion in these circumstances would result in the project receiving higher grants than necessary based on costs in place years after the contract has been entered into.
 - The proposed timeline of 12 months after DSA approval with a possible extension of 6 months for extenuating circumstances appears reasonable.

"Rehabilitation Cost" means the health and safety mitigation grant that is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the School Building.

Rehabilitation Costs provided shall be 60 percent of the eligible costs in Form SAB 58-01 required in Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(C) that has been reviewed and approved by OPSC and approved by the Board.

"Seismic Rehabilitation Grant" means a grant allowable under Education Code Section 17075.10(a) and (b)(2) and Section $\frac{1859.82(a)(1)(A)(1)b}{1859.82.2(c)(4)}$ excluding additional grants.

Section 1859.51. Adjustments to the New Construction Baseline Eligibility.

The baseline eligibility for new construction determined on the Form SAB 50-03 will be adjusted as follows:

(h) Increased by the number of pupils eligible for grants pursuant to Section $\frac{1859.82(a)}{1859.82.1(b)(4)(A)}$ or $\frac{1859.82.2(b)(4)(A)}{1859.82.2(b)(4)(A)}$.

Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

(a)(8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section <u>1859.82.2</u> 1859.82 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section <u>1859.82.2</u> <u>1859.82</u>. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

Section 1859.82. Facility Hardship.

A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils. A facility hardship is available for:

(a) Repair of facilities, new classrooms and/or subsidiary facilities (corridors, toilets, kitchens and other non-classroom space), or replacement facilities if either (1) or (2) are met:

(1) The facilities are needed to ensure the health and safety of the pupils if the district can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the health and safety of the pupils is at risk. Factors to be considered by the Board shall include the close proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission lines, dam, pipeline, industrial facility, adverse air quality emission or other health and safety risks, including structural deficiencies required by the DSA to be repaired, seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as verified by the DSA, traffic safety or because the pupils reside in remote areas of the district and transportation to existing facilities is not possible or poses a health and safety risk. Funding for seismic mitigation related and ancillary costs for the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as health and safety risk. Funding for seismic mitigation related and ancillary costs for the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as health category 2 Buildings shall only be provided from the SFP New Construction Account.

(A) The district shall prepare and submit to the OPSC an Application which includes a cost/benefit analysis which will be used to compare the total costs to remain in the classroom or related facility and mitigate the problem to the Current Replacement Cost of the classroom or related facility. The cost/benefit analysis may include applicable site development costs as outlined in Section 1859.76. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were pre-existing in the classroom or related facility.

1. If the total cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is 50 percent or less than the Current Replacement Cost, the district may qualify for either grant below, as applicable:

a. Modernization Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for Rehabilitation Costs pursuant to Section 1859.83(e), or

b. A grant not to exceed 50 percent of the cost estimate that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the Board for seismic repair.

2. If the total cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is greater than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost and the Application is for replacement facilities, the district may qualify for a grant for a new or replacement school or replacement facilities as a new construction project.

3. If the total cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is greater than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost and the Application is for the repair, not the replacement, of a Qualified Historical School Building, the district may qualify for funding as a new construction project. The district must demonstrate that the facility meets the definition of a Qualified Historical School Building. Qualified Historical School Building status must be determined by an appropriate local, state, or federal governmental agency or by a person(s) who meets the Professional Qualification Standards set forth by the Secretary of the Interior's Standard and Guidelines for Archeology and Historical Preservation.

(B) If the request is for facilities that include structural and/or seismic deficiencies, the cost/benefit analysis must also include a report from a licensed design professional identifying the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval. The report must contain a detailed cost estimate of the repairs. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were pre-existing in the classroom or related facility. The report and cost estimate shall be subject to review by the OPSC for conformance with the Current Construction Cost Publication by the Sierra West Group and, at the OPSC's discretion, the DSA. For seismic deficiencies of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings, the report and the cost estimate for the minimum work necessary must be reviewed by the DSA.

(C) The seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:

1. The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;

2. The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval;

3. The building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and

4. The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. If the unacceptable risk of injury is due to the presence of faulting, liquefaction or landslide, these hazards must be documented by a geologic hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance with California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with the concurrence of the California Geological Survey.

The structural engineer's report shall conform to the guidelines prepared by the DSA, in accordance with Education Code Section 17310.

(2) The classroom or related facility was lost or destroyed as a result of a disaster such as fire, flood or earthquake and the district has demonstrated satisfactorily to the Board that the classroom or related facility was uninsurable or the cost for insurance was prohibitive.

If the district qualifies for a new or replacement school pursuant to either (a)(1)(A)2. or (a)(2) above, the district is eligible for a New Construction Grant as a new construction

project for the lesser of the pupils housed in the replaced facility based on loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2) or the latest CBEDS enrollment at the site.

If the district qualifies for repair of a Qualified Historical School Building pursuant to (a)(1)(A)3. or replacement facilities on the same site pursuant to either (a)(1)(A)2. or (a)(2) above, the district is eligible for funding as a new construction project. Replacement facilities and square footage amounts used to determine funding for a Qualified Historical School Building shall be allowed in accordance with the square footage amounts provided in the chart in Section (b) below. If the facility eligible for replacement is not shown in the chart in Section (b) below, the replacement facility shall be limited to the square footage replaced. If the Qualified Historical School Building is a facility type not shown in the chart in Section (b) below, the square footage amounts used to determine funding shall be limited to the existing square footage of the Qualified Historical School Building. The grant amount provided shall be \$173.30 per square foot for Toilet Facilities and \$96.30 per square foot for all other facilities. Additional funding may be provided for applicable site development costs pursuant to Section 1859.76, New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) pursuant to Section 1859.83(a), (b) or (d), therapy room pursuant to Section 1859.72, multilevel construction pursuant to Section 1859.73, project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1, and high performance incentive pursuant to Section 1859.77.4 provided that the high performance points attained are related to the scope of the Facility Hardship project. The amounts shown will be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. For any project funded in whole or in part from any State bond funds for which the construction contract is awarded prior to January 1, 2012, the district may be eligible for the funding provided to initiate and enforce a LCP as prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(a). For any project for which the construction contract is awarded on January 1, 2012 through June 19, 2014, the grant may be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(c) and subject to the limitations established in Section 1859.71.4(d).

Any grants provided pursuant to either (a)(1) or (a)(2) above will be reduced for any space deemed available by the Board in the district, the HSAA or Super HSAA that could be used to house some or all of the displaced pupils, fifty percent of any insurance proceeds collectable by the district for the displaced facilities and fifty percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of any displaced facilities. If the district qualifies for rehabilitation of facilities on the same site pursuant to subsection (a)(1)(A)(1)b, the district is eligible for a Seismic Rehabilitation Grant. The grant provided is pursuant to subsection (a)(1)(A)(1)b. and Education Code Section 17075.10(b)(2). Additional funding may be provided for a high performance incentive grant pursuant to Section 1859.77.4. For any project for which the construction contract is awarded on January 1, 2012 through June 19, 2014, the seismic rehabilitation grant may be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(c) and subject to the limitations established in Section 1859.71.4(d).

(b) A multi-purpose room, toilet, gymnasium, school administration or library/media center, facility that meets all the following:

(1) The facility was lost or destroyed as a result of a disaster, including but not limited to fire, flood or earthquake.

(2) The facility is no longer useable for school purposes as recommended by the California Department of Education and approved by the Board.

(3) The district has demonstrated satisfactorily to the Board that the facility was uninsurable or the cost of insurance was prohibitive.

If the district qualifies, the district is eligible for funding as a new construction project. The funding amount provided shall be \$96.30 per square foot for library/media center, school administration, gymnasium and multi-purpose facilities, and/or \$173.30 per square foot for Toilet Facilities. A New Construction Additional Grant may be provided for applicable site development costs pursuant to Section 1859.76, New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) pursuant to Section 1859.83(a) and (d), therapy room pursuant to Section 1859.72, multilevel construction pursuant to Section 1859.73, project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1, and high performance incentive pursuant to Section 1859.77.4 provided that the high performance points attained are related to the scope of the Facility Hardship project. The amounts shown will be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. For any project funded in whole or in part from any State bond funds for which the construction contract is awarded prior to January 1, 2012, the district may be eligible for the funding provided to initiate and enforce a LCP as prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(a). For any project for which the construction contract is awarded on January 1, 2012 through June 19, 2014, the grant may be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(c) and subject to the limitations established in Section 1859.71.4(d).

Any grants provided pursuant to (b) above, shall be reduced by fifty percent of any insurance proceeds collectable by the district for the displaced facilities and fifty percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of any displaced facilities.

The square footage provided, after accounting for all useable facilities on the site, shall not exceed the following:

Any facilities eligible for facility hardship not shown in the above chart or for Alternative Education facilities not shown in the table in Section 1859.77.3(a)(5) shall be eligible for replacement square footage equal to the facilities replaced. For an Alternative Education school eligible for a facility hardship, utilize the square footage provided in Section 1859.77.3(a)(5), with the exception of toilet and administration where the chart above shall be utilized.

The modernization baseline eligibility provided n Section 1859.60 will be adjusted as a result of funding provided as a new construction project pursuant to (a) or (b) above.

A district may request a determination of eligibility for facility hardship funding in advance of project funding.

-(c) A district seeking replaced facilities as a result of either (a) or (b) above must submit Form SAB 50-04 for the replaced facilities:

(1) Within 18 months if the replacement facilities will be located on the same site.

(2) Within 24 months if the replacement facilities will be located on a replacement site.

If an Approved Application for the replaced facility is not accepted within the time periods identified in (c)(1) or (c)(2) above, the Board shall re-review the criteria submitted by the district for replacement of the facility prior to apportionment of the replaced facility.

1859.82 Facility Hardship Program and Seismic Mitigation Program

A school district may apply for Facility Hardship, including Seismic Mitigation, Program assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances that have caused an imminent health and safety threat.

1859.82.1 Facility Hardship Program

"School Building" for the purposes of this Section shall have the same definition as Education Code Section 17283, and shall also exclude any districtwide administrative facilities.

A district is eligible for Facility Hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct School Buildings or related required components that are currently causing a health and safety threat to the students and/or staff. Projects solely to replace components that have reached the end of their useful life, perform routine maintenance or repair, issues resulting from the deferment of routine maintenance or repair, lack of current code compliance, or the addition of components that were not previously existing, do not meet the qualifying criteria of the program. However, this work may be incorporated into a qualifying Facility Hardship application if it is required to be completed to gain DSA approval.

Beginning 90 days after the effective date of these regulations, Approved Applications requesting Facility Hardship Program funding shall be submitted to OPSC within 12 months of DSA approval for the scope of work mitigating the identified health and safety threat. If the project does not require DSA approval, then the Approved Application for funding must be received within the 6 months following project completion, as demonstrated by the earliest of the following: the date that the notice of completion of the project has been filed; occupancy of any portion of the project are currently in use by the district. For cause shown, if a district demonstrates that extreme or unusual circumstances prevented the submission of an eligible application within the applicable timeline outlined above, OPSC may allow up to an additional 6 months for submittal.

- (a) <u>Districts may qualify for funding to replace or construct new School Buildings.</u> <u>Factors to be considered by the Board to determine eligibility for Facility Hardship</u> <u>program replacement funding may include, but are not limited to:</u>
- (1) Damage or loss as a result of a natural disaster such as a fire, flood, or earthquake.
- (2) <u>Proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission</u> <u>lines, dam, pipeline, or industrial facility.</u>
- (3) Adverse air quality.
- (4) Structural deficiency to the School Building, and
- (5) Site conditions such as faulting, toxic soil, or liquefaction.
- (6) Or other factors approved by the Board.
- (b) <u>To qualify for replacement funding for School Buildings, the district must submit an</u> <u>Approved Application for funding and either (1) or (2) below:</u>
- (1) For School Buildings that are lost, destroyed, or unable to be repaired, the district must submit:
- (A) <u>A report from an industry specialist that states that the only way to mitigate the health and safety threat is to replace the School Building(s).</u>
- (B) <u>Documentation which demonstrates that the facilities in the project must be</u> reconstructed in order to house the current enrollment of the district.

- (2) For permanent School Buildings where the cost to rehabilitate the School Building(s) exceeds 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost, or for Portable Classrooms where the cost to rehabilitate exceeds the Portable Classroom Replacement Grant or Portable Toilet Replacement Grant, the district must submit:
- (A) A report by an industry specialist that outlines the minimum work to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the existing School Building. If the threat is due to the presence of mold, OPSC must conduct a site visit to view the damage prior to remediation. If the remediation is done prior to a site visit, the application will be ineligible for funding. Requests for asbestos mitigation must include lab test results indicating the asbestos is currently friable, and provides the location, material, and testing methods used.
- (B) <u>A letter of concurrence from a governmental agency that has jurisdiction or expertise</u> <u>over the field in which the health and safety threat originates. The letter must</u> <u>concur with the industry specialist report on both 1. and 2. below:</u>
- 1. An imminent health and safety threat to student and/or staff exists.
- 2. The mitigation measures outlined in the industry specialist's report are the minimum measures required to mitigate the threat and allow the continued use of the School Building(s).
- (C) Applications must include a detailed Form SAB 58-01 that meets the following requirements:
- 1. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 must use the most current edition of the Current Construction</u> <u>Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing. The Form SAB</u> <u>58-01 shall not include contract amounts, actual costs paid, or bid amounts, unless</u> <u>the scope of work is not contained in the most current edition of the Current</u> <u>Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing.</u> <u>OPSC may accept other supporting documentation for scopes of work not contained</u> <u>in the Sierra West Current Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost publication.</u>
- 2. <u>All requested line items shall include Construction Specifications Institute reference</u> <u>number, description, F3 total unit cost amount, and quantity. Any line items that</u> <u>include amounts in lump-sum formats will not be reviewed or approved.</u>
- 3. <u>The work in the Form SAB 58-01 provided by the licensed design professional shall</u> match the work outlined in the report for the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety threat.
- 4. The estimate submitted to OPSC shall be for the same scope of work reviewed and concurred to by DSA, and that is referenced in the governmental concurrence letter for the project.
- 5. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 may also include any work required by DSA to obtain plan</u> <u>approval.</u>
- (D) <u>A cost/benefit analysis that demonstrates the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the School Building exceeds 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the existing Square Footage of the School Building. The minimum work required may include work required by DSA to gain approval for the mitigation project.</u>
- (E) <u>All other documents required to complete an Approved Application for funding. This</u> includes:
- 1. <u>A completed Application for Funding (Form SAB 50-04).</u>
- 2. The DSA Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from DSA verifying that the project is exempt from their approval process.

- 3. <u>CDE Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from CDE verifying that</u> <u>the project is exempt from their approval process.</u>
- 4. If the project is for a high school site, a letter or meeting minutes from the district's Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) certifying that the district is in compliance with all career technical facility needs and assessments as outlined in Education Code, Section 17070.955.
- (3) Applications for Facility Hardship replacement funding that do not submit all documents required as part of (1) or (2) above shall be returned without review.
- (4) If the district qualifies for funding to replace their School Buildings, the district is eligible to receive funding for the project as follows:
- (A) If the district is required to replace all School Buildings on site, the district is eligible to receive funding as follows:
- 1. A New Construction Grant will be provided for the lesser of 2. or 3. below.
- 2. <u>The classroom capacity determined by multiplying the number of classrooms on the project site being replaced by:</u>
- a. 25 pupils for each K-6 classroom.
- b. 27 pupils for each 7-12 classroom.
- c. <u>13 pupils for each Non-Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs</u> <u>classroom.</u>
- d. 9 pupils for each Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs classroom.
- 3. The higher of a., b., or c. below:
- a. The CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year at the existing project site.
- b. <u>The average CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year</u> and two immediately preceding enrollment reporting years at the existing project site.
- c. <u>If the site is closed, use the CBEDS Report of the last enrollment reporting year in</u> which the site was open.
- 4. Additional funding may be provided, as applicable, for:
- a. Fire Code Requirements pursuant to 1859.71.2,
- b. therapy room pursuant to Section 1859.72,
- c. multilevel construction pursuant to Section 1859.73,
- d. project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1.
- e. replacement with multistory construction pursuant to Section 1859.73.2,
- f. site acquisition pursuant to 1859.74, 1859.74.5, and 1859.75,
- g. Hazardous waste removal pursuant to 1859.74.2, 1859.74.3, and 1859.74.4,
- h. Applicable site development costs pursuant to 1859.76, and
- i. <u>New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) for geographic location pursuant</u> to Section 1859.83(a),
- j. <u>New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) for small size projects pursuant</u> to Section 1859.83(b)
- k. <u>New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) for new school projects</u> pursuant to Section 1859.83(c), and
- I. <u>New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) urban location, security</u> requirements and impacted site pursuant to Section 1859.83(d)
- (B) If the district qualifies to replace some but not all School Buildings on the project site, funding will be based on the Square Footage of the School Buildings replaced and is capped by the lesser of the amount provided in accordance to the chart below and

the Square Footage constructed for each category as justified by enrollment at the project site as follows:

- 1. The enrollment at the project site, is determined by the higher of a. or b. below, or c.:
- a. <u>The CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year at the existing project</u> <u>site.</u>
- b. The average CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year and two immediately preceding enrollment reporting years at the existing project site.
- c. If the site is closed, use the CBEDS Report of the last enrollment reporting year in which the site was open.
- 2. <u>Using the enrollment determined in 1. any permanent replacement Square Footage</u> provided will be calculated in accordance to a., b., c., below and the chart below.
- a. If the actual square footage being constructed in the replacement project is less than the amount allowable in the chart for each facility type, the replacement Square Footage shall be limited to the actual square footage constructed.
- b. <u>Non-specialized classroom space provided is limited by the enrollment determined in</u> <u>1. rounded up to the nearest whole classroom based on 1859.82.1(b)(4)(A)2., and</u> <u>then reduced for any classroom space available at the site to house the pupils at the</u> <u>site.</u>

- (c) <u>Districts may qualify for funding to rehabilitate their School Buildings, components of</u> <u>School Buildings, or school site conditions. Factors to be considered by the Board</u> <u>may include (1) or (2) below:</u>
- (1) <u>School Buildings where the minimum cost to mitigate the health and safety threat</u> and remain in the School Building is 50 percent or less of the Current Replacement Cost.
- (2) Components of the School Buildings or school sites conditions are causing a health and safety threat to students and/or staff. Health and safety threats that may qualify include, but are not limited to:
- (A) <u>School Building structural deficiency.</u>
- (B) <u>Hazardous conditions such as methane, lead, or asbestos mitigation.</u>
- (C) Unsafe water supply.
- (D) Site conditions such as faulting, toxic soil, landslide risk, or liquefaction.
- (1) <u>To qualify for Facility Hardship rehabilitation funding for School Buildings or</u> <u>components of School Buildings, the district must submit an Approved Application</u> <u>for funding and all documents outlined below. Applications that do not meet the</u> <u>requirements below shall be returned without review.</u>
- (A) <u>A report by an industry specialist that outlines the minimum work to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the existing School Building. If the threat is due to the presence of mold, OPSC must conduct a site visit to view the damage prior to remediation. If the remediation is done prior to a site visit, the application will be ineligible for funding. Requests for asbestos mitigation must include lab test results indicating the asbestos is currently friable, and provides the location, material, and testing methods used.</u>
- (B) <u>A letter of concurrence from a governmental agency that has jurisdiction or expertise</u> over the field in which the health and safety threat originates. The letter must concur with the industry specialist's report on both 1. and 2. below:
- 1. An imminent health and safety threat to student and/or staff exists.
- 2. <u>The mitigation measures outlined in the industry specialist's report are the minimum</u> <u>measures required to mitigate the threat and allow the continued use of the School</u> <u>Building(s) or component.</u>
- (C) Applications must include a detailed Form SAB 58-01 that meets the following requirements:
- 1. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 must use the most current edition of the Current Construction</u> <u>Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing. The Form SAB</u> <u>58-01 shall not include contracted amounts, actual costs paid, or bid amounts,</u> <u>unless the scope of work is not contained in the most current edition of the Current</u> <u>Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing.</u> <u>OPSC may also accept other supporting documentation for scope of work not</u> <u>contained in the Sierra West Current Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost</u> <u>publication.</u>
- 2. <u>All requested line items shall include Construction Specifications Institute (CSI)</u> reference number, description, F3 total unit cost amount, and quantity. Any line items that include amounts in lump-sum formats will not be reviewed and will be disallowed.

- 3. <u>The work in the Form SAB 58-01</u>, provided by the licensed design professional, shall <u>match the work outlined in the report for the minimum work required to mitigate the</u> <u>health and safety threat.</u>
- 4. If the project requires DSA plan approval, the Form SAB 58-01 submitted to OPSC shall be for the same scope of work reviewed and concurred to by DSA, and that is referenced in the governmental concurrence letter for the project.
- 5. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 may also include any associated work required by DSA as a result of the mitigation of the health and safety threat.</u>
- (D) Facility Hardship applications for School Buildings must also include a cost/benefit analysis. The cost/benefit analysis shall be completed based on the type of the project as outlined below:
- 1. For permanent buildings, the district must demonstrate the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the School Building is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the School Building. The minimum work required may include work required by Division of the State Architect to gain approval for the mitigation project.
- 2. For Portable School Buildings, the district must demonstrate the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the portable building is less than the Portable Classroom Replacement Grant. The minimum work required may also include any associated work required by DSA as a result of the mitigation of the health and safety threat.
- 3. <u>Applications that are for necessary components of a site or School Building, such as hazardous water supply, methane mitigation, faulting, liquefaction, landslide potential, friable asbestos, do not require a Cost Benefit Analysis to be submitted.</u>
- (E) <u>All other documents required to complete an Approved Application for funding. This</u> includes:
- 1. A completed Application for Funding (Form SAB 50-04).
- 2. <u>The DSA Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from DSA verifying</u> that the project is exempt from their approval process.
- 3. <u>CDE Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from CDE verifying that the project is exempt from their approval process.</u>
- 4. If the project is for a high school site, a letter or meeting minutes from the district's Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) certifying that the district is in compliance with all career technical facility needs and assessments as outlined in Education Code, Section 17070.955
- (4) If the district qualifies for funding to rehabilitate or repair their School Buildings, the district is eligible to receive funding for the project as follows:
- (A) Rehabilitation Costs provided shall be 60 percent of the eligible costs in the Form SAB 58-01 required in Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(C) that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the Board.
- (B) If the district qualifies for rehabilitation funding, the funding may be used towards the replacement of the facility as long as the qualifying health and safety threat is fully mitigated.
- (C) <u>Applicable supplemental grants may be provided for the following:</u>
 - 1. project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1.
 - 2. geographic percentage factor pursuant to 1859.83(a)
 - (d) Any grants provided in accordance to (b) or (c) above shall be adjusted as follows:
 - (1) For projects funded in accordance to (b) above:

- (A) <u>Reduced for any space deemed available by the Board in the district, HSAA, or</u> <u>Super HSAA that could be used to house some or all of the displaced pupils in the</u> <u>project.</u>
- (B) <u>Reduced by 50 percent of any insurance proceeds collectable by the district for the project. Any insurance proceeds collected after Apportionment shall be reported to OPSC and the Apportionment will be amended accordingly.</u>
- (C) <u>Reduced by 50 percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of the property and/or facilities in the project.</u>
- (2) For projects funded in accordance to (c) above:
- (A) 60 percent of any insurance proceeds collectable by the district for the project.
- (B) <u>60 percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of any displaced</u> <u>facilities in the project.</u>
- (e) Adjustments to School Facility Program per-pupil grants.
- (1) <u>The district's New Construction Eligibility will be adjusted for any net increase in</u> <u>classroom capacity in the project pursuant to Section 1859.51(i).</u>
- (2) The baseline eligibility for modernization as provided in Section 1859.60 will be adjusted for any funding received in accordance to (b) above. The age of the classroom and square footage in the project shall be reset to the date of the Apportionment for the project.
- (f) Districts that qualify for Financial Hardship assistance may file an application for design funding, site funding, and determination of program eligibility in advance of construction funding.
- (1) To request advanced funding for design for eligible projects, the district must submit an Application for Funding (Form SAB 50-04) indicating the request for design funding and all documents listed in Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(A) through Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(D)3.
- (2) Advanced funding for design shall be provided based on the eligible project type as follows:
- (A) For projects receiving funding for advanced design for the replacement of all School Buildings on the project site pursuant to Section 1859.82.1(b)(4)(A), the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed 40 percent of the New Construction Grant less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a).
- (B) For projects receiving funding for advanced design for at least one but not all School Buildings on the project site pursuant to Section 1859.82.1(b)(4)(B), the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed 40 percent of the Facility Hardship Square Footage Grant less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a).
- (C) For projects receiving funding for advanced design for Rehabilitation Costs pursuant to Section 1859.82.1(c)(4)(A), the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed 25 percent of the Rehabilitation Costs determined pursuant to Section 1859.82.1(c)(4)(A) less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a).
- (3) Advanced funding for site shall be provided pursuant to 1859.82.1(b)(4)(A)4. The district is eligible for advanced funding for site acquisition as calculated pursuant to 1859.81.1.
- (4) The amount apportioned for advanced design is an estimate of the funds needed for design, engineering, and other pre-construction project costs. Qualifying districts

may request a separate Apportionment for the design and for site acquisition for the same facility hardship project.

- (5) <u>The district is required to submit an Approved Application for funding and an updated</u> Form SAB 58-01 for projects funded in accordance to 1859.82.1(c) or site <u>development worksheet for projects funded in accordance to 1859.82.1(b), that</u> reflects the final approved drawings for the project within:
- (A) <u>18 months from the date of Apportionment if the project scope will be for repair or replacement on the same site.</u>
- (B) <u>24 months from the date of Apportionment if the project scope is for the replacement of School Building(s) which will be located on a replacement site.</u>
- (6) If the district does not submit the Approved Application for funding within the timelines required by Section (2) above, the application will be reduced to eligible costs incurred.
- (7) Upon receipt of the Approved Application, the application will be reviewed for conformance with all program laws and regulations.
- (8) <u>Any funding provided in Section 1859.82.1 shall be offset by any funding previously</u> provided for the project.

1859.82.2 Seismic Mitigation Program

<u>"School Building" for the purposes of this Section shall have the same definition as</u> <u>Education Code Section 17283, and shall also exclude any districtwide administrative</u> <u>facilities.</u>

A school district is eligible for funding to repair, reconstruct, or replace the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings which were originally constructed to be used as School Facilities and pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of seismic activity. Program eligibility is determined by the Division of the State Architect while determination of grant funding is determined by the Board based on the following criteria.

Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding. Any grants provided for the purpose of this section shall be provided as a new construction project and allocated on a 50 percent state share basis.

- (a) Seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:
- (1) The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;
- (2) <u>The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain</u> <u>DSA approval;</u>
- (3) The School Building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and
- (4) <u>The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. The structural engineers report shall conform to the guidelines prepared by the DSA, in accordance with Education Code Section 17310.</u>

If the unacceptable risk of injury is due to the presence of faulting, liquefaction or landslide, these hazards must be documented by a geological hazards report

prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance with California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with concurrence of the California Geological Survey.

- (b) <u>To qualify for replacement funding for School Buildings, the district must submit an</u> <u>Approved Application for funding based on their specific circumstances in</u> <u>accordance to either (1) or (2) below:</u>
- (5) For School Buildings that are lost, destroyed, or unable to be repaired the district <u>must submit:</u>
- (A) <u>A report from a licensed design professional identifying the School Buildings that</u> are the Most Vulnerable Category 2 building(s) and;
- (B) DSA letter(s) of concurrence to the findings in the report required in (b)(1)(A);
- (C) If the collapse potential is due to faulting, liquefaction, or landslide, or if it is otherwise required by DSA for project approval, the district must submit 1. and 2. <u>Below:</u>
- 1. <u>A geological hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist indicating the</u> <u>potential for building displacement and recommended site improvements to</u> <u>mitigate the hazard</u>
- 2. Concurrence to the report from the California Geological Survey.
- (D) <u>Documentation which demonstrates that the facilities in the project must be</u> reconstructed in order to house the current enrollment of the District.
- (6) For School Buildings with interior square footage to be mitigated, the district must submit:
- (A) <u>A report from a licensed design professional identifying the structural deficiencies</u> <u>that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event and the</u> <u>minimum mitigation work necessary to obtain DSA approval.</u>
- (B) DSA letter(s) of concurrence to the report
- (C) If the collapse potential is due to faulting, liquefaction, or landslide, or if it is otherwise required by DSA for project approval the district must submit 1. and 2. below:
- 1. <u>A geological hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist indicating the</u> potential for building displacement and recommended site improvements to <u>mitigate the hazard</u>
- 2. Concurrence to the report from the California Geological Survey.
- (D) <u>Documentation that demonstrates that the facilities in the project must be</u> reconstructed in order to house the current enrollment of the district.
- (E) A detailed Form SAB 58-01 that meets the following requirements:
- <u>The Form SAB 58-01 must use the most current edition of the Current Construction</u> <u>Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing. The Form SAB</u> <u>58-01 shall not include contract amounts, actual costs paid, or bid amounts, unless</u> <u>the scope of work is not contained in the most current edition of the Current</u> <u>Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing.</u> <u>OPSC may accept other supporting documentation for scopes of work not</u> <u>contained in the Sierra West Current Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost</u> <u>publication.</u>
- 2. <u>All requested line items shall include Construction Specifications Institute reference</u> <u>number (CSI #), description, quantity, unit, cost per unit, and District's request. Any</u>

line items that include amounts in lump-sum formats will not be reviewed or approved.

- 3. <u>The work in the Form SAB 58-01 shall match the work that outlined in the report</u> provided by the licensed design professional for the minimum work that would be required to mitigate the seismic threat if the School Building were to be rehabilitated instead of replaced.
- 4. The Form SAB 58-01 may also include any ancillary work required by DSA to obtain plan approval for the minimum work required to mitigate the seismic threat.
- (F) <u>A cost/benefit analysis that demonstrates that the minimum work to mitigate the seismic threat and remain in the School Building(s) exceeds 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost.</u>
- (G) <u>All other documents required to complete an Approved Application for funding.</u> <u>This includes:</u>
- 1. <u>A completed Application for Funding (Form SAB 50-04).</u>
- 2. <u>The DSA Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from DSA verifying</u> <u>that the project is exempt from their approval process.</u>
- 3. <u>CDE Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from CDE verifying that</u> <u>the project is exempt from their approval process.</u>
- 4. If the project is for a high school site, a letter or meeting minutes from the district's Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) certifying that the district is in compliance with all career technical facility needs and assessments as outlined in Education Code, Section 17070.955.
- (7) <u>Applications for seismic mitigation replacement funding that do not meet the</u> requirements of (1) or (2) above shall be returned without review.
- (8) If the district qualifies for Replacement funding in accordance to (a)(1) or (a)(2) above, the district is eligible to receive funding for the project as follows:
- (A) If the district is required to replace the entire site and relocate to a new site, the district is eligible to receive funding as follows:
- 1. A New Construction Grant will be provided for the lesser of 2. or 3. below.
- 2. The classroom capacity determined by multiplying the number of classrooms on the project site being replaced by:
- a. 25 pupils for each K-6 classroom.
- b. 27 pupils for each 7-12 classroom.
- c. <u>13 pupils for each Non-Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs</u> <u>classroom.</u>
- d. 9 pupils for each Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs classroom.
- 3. The higher of a., b., or c. below:
- a. The CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year at the existing project site.
- b. <u>The average CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year and two</u> <u>immediately preceding enrollment reporting years at the existing project site.</u>
- c. If the site is closed, use the CBEDS Report of the last enrollment reporting year in which the site was open.
- 4. Additional funding may be provided, as applicable, for:
- a. Fire code requirements pursuant to 1859.71.2,
- b. therapy room pursuant to Section 1859.72,
- c. multilevel construction pursuant to Section 1859.73,
- d. project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1.

- e. replacement with multistory construction pursuant to Section 1859.73.2,
- f. site acquisition pursuant to 1859.74,
- g. Hazardous waste removal pursuant to 1859.74.2,
- h. Applicable site development costs pursuant to 1859.76, and
- i. <u>New construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for geographic location pursuant to</u> <u>Section 1859.83(a)</u>,
- j. <u>New construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for small size projects pursuant to</u> <u>Section 1859.83(b)</u>
- k. <u>New construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for new school projects pursuant</u> to Section 1859.83(c)
- I. <u>New construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant urban location, security</u> requirements and impacted site pursuant to Section 1859.83(d)
- (B) If the district qualifies to replace some but not all School Buildings on the project site, funding will be based on the Square Footage of the School Buildings replaced and is capped by the lesser of the amount provided in accordance to the chart below and the Square Footage constructed for each category as justified by enrollment at the project site as follows:
- 1. The enrollment at the project site, is determined by the higher of a. or b. below, or c.:
- a. <u>The CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year at the existing project</u> <u>site.</u>
- b. <u>The average CBEDS Report of the current enrollment reporting year and two</u> immediately preceding enrollment reporting years at the existing project site.
- c. If the site is closed, use the CBEDS Report of the last enrollment reporting year in which the site was open.

- (C) If the collapse potential is due to faulting, liquefaction, or landslide, or if it is otherwise required by DSA for project approval, the district must submit 1. and 2. below:
- 1. <u>A geological hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance</u> with California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with the concurrence of the California Geological Survey.
- 2. Concurrence to the report in 1. from the California Geological Survey.
- (D) A detailed Form SAB 58-01 that meets the following requirements:

- 1. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 must use the most current edition of the Current Construction</u> <u>Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing. The Form SAB</u> <u>58-01 shall not include contract amounts, actual costs paid, or bid amounts, unless</u> <u>the scope of work is not contained in the most current edition of the Current</u> <u>Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost publication by Sierra West Publishing.</u> <u>OPSC may accept other supporting documentation for scopes of work not</u> <u>contained in the Sierra West Current Construction Remodeling and Repair Cost</u> <u>publication.</u>
- 2. <u>All requested line items shall include Construction Specifications Institute reference</u> <u>number (CSI #), description, quantity, unit, cost per unit, and District's request. Any</u> <u>line items that include amounts in lump-sum formats will not be reviewed or</u> <u>approved.</u>
- 3. <u>The work in the Form SAB 58-01 shall match the work outlined in the report provided</u> by the licensed design professional for the minimum work required to mitigate the seismic threat. The Form SAB 58-01 submitted to OPSC shall be for the same scope of work reviewed and concurred to by DSA, and that is referenced in the governmental concurrence letter for the project.
- 4. <u>The Form SAB 58-01 may also include any ancillary work required by DSA to obtain</u> <u>plan approval for the minimum work required to mitigate the seismic threat.</u>
- (E) <u>A cost/benefit analysis that demonstrates that the minimum work to mitigate the seismic threat and remain in the School Building(s) is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost.</u>
- (F) <u>All other documents required to complete an Approved Application for funding. This</u> includes:
- 1. A completed Application for Funding (Form SAB 50-04).
- 2. <u>The DSA Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from DSA verifying</u> that the project is exempt from their approval process.
- 3. <u>CDE Plan Approval letter for the project or documentation from CDE verifying that</u> <u>the project is exempt from their approval process.</u>
- 4. If the project is for a high school site, a letter or meeting minutes from the district's Career and Technical Education Advisory Committee (CTEAC) certifying that the district is in compliance with all career technical facility needs and assessments as outlined in Education Code, Section 17070.955.
- (4) If the district qualifies for seismic mitigation funding to repair their permanent School Buildings, the district is eligible to receive funding for the project as follows:
- (A) The Seismic Rehabilitation Grant based on 50 percent of the eligible costs in the Form SAB 58-01 required in Section 1859.82.2(c)(3)(D) that have been reviewed by OPSC and approved by the Board.
- (B) If the district qualifies for rehabilitation funding, the funding may be used towards the replacement of the facility as long as the qualifying seismic threat is fully mitigated.
- (C) Applicable supplemental grants may be provided for the following:
- 1. project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1.,
- 2. Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for geographic location pursuant to 1859.83(a), and
- 3. Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for accessibility and fire code requirements in accordance to 1859.83(e)(3).
- (d) Any grants provided in accordance to (b) or (c) above shall be adjusted as follows:
- (1) For projects funded in accordance to (b) above:

- (A) <u>Reduced for any space deemed available by the Board in the district, HSAA, or</u> <u>Super HSAA that could be used to house some or all of the displaced pupils in the</u> <u>project.</u>
- (B) <u>Reduced by 50 percent of any insurance proceeds collected by the district for the project. Any insurance proceeds collected after Apportionment shall be reported to OPSC and the Apportionment will be amended accordingly.</u>
- (C) <u>Reduced by 50 percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of the property and/or facilities in the project.</u>

- (C) For projects receiving funding for advanced design for a Seismic Rehabilitation Grant pursuant to Section 1859.82.2(c), the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed 25 percent of the costs determined pursuant to Section 1859.82.2(c)(4)(A) less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a).
- (3) <u>Advanced funding for site shall be provided pursuant to 1859.82.2(b)(4)(A)4. The district is eligible for advanced funding for site acquisition as calculated pursuant to 1859.81.1.</u>
- (4) The amount apportioned for advanced design is an estimate of the funds needed for design, engineering, and other pre-construction project costs. Qualifying districts

may request a separate Apportionment for the design and for site acquisition for the same seismic mitigation project.

- (5) The district is required to submit an Approved Application for funding and an updated Form SAB 58-01 for projects funded in accordance to 1859.82.2(c) or site development worksheet for projects funded in accordance to 1859.82.2(b), that reflects the final approved drawings for the project within:
- (A) <u>18 months from the date of Apportionment if the project scope will be for repair or replacement on the same site.</u>

- (6) If the district does not submit the Approved Application for funding within the timelines required by Section (2) above, the application will be reduced to eligible costs incurred.

A district may request approval from the Board to determine eligibility for facility hardship or seismic mitigation programs in advance of project funding. Board approval does not constitute a reservation of bond authority. Board approval only confirms the district meets the criteria in Section 1859.82.

(a) To request conceptual approval for facility hardship projects, the district must submit an *Application for Funding* (Form SAB 50-04) indicating the request for conceptual approval and all documents listed below:

(1) For replacement projects, all of the documents listed in Section 1859.82.1(b)(2)(A) through Section 1859.82.1(b)(2)(D).

(2) For rehabilitation projects, all of the documents listed in Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(A) through Section 1859.82.1(c)(3)(D)3.

(b) To request conceptual approval for seismic mitigation projects, the district must submit an *Application for Funding* (Form SAB 50-04) indicating the request for conceptual approval and all documents listed below:

(1) For replacement projects, all of the documents listed in Section 1859.82.2(b)(2)(A) through Section 1859.82.2(b)(2)(F).

(2) For rehabilitation projects, all of the documents listed in Section 1859.82.2(c)(3)(A) through Section 1859.82.2(c)(3)(E).

(2) The funding provided by Sections 1859.71.2, 1859.71.3, 1859.72, 1859.73, 1859.73.2, 1859.76(d)(1) and (2), 1859.78.4, 1859.78.5, <u>1859.82.1,</u> <u>1859.82.2,</u>1859.82(a) and (b), 1859.83(b), (c), (d) and <u>(e) (f)</u> and 1859.125(a)(1) through (a)(2).

(b) Excessive Cost for Projects that House No More than 200 Pupils (Small Size Projects).

(1) Excluding Joint-Use Projects and grant requests pursuant to Section 1859.79.3(a)(1) or (a)(2), if the project will house less fewer than 101 pupils, the district is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equal to 12 percent of the funding provided by the New Construction Grant or 12 percent of the funding provided by the Modernization Grant.

(2) Excluding Joint-Use Projects and grant requests pursuant to Section 1859.79.3(a)(1) or (a)(2), if the project will house between greater than 100 101 and fewer than 201 200 pupils, the district is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equal to four percent of the funding provided by the New Construction Grant or four percent of the funding provided by the Modernization Grant.

(3) A Type I Joint-Use Project and a Type II, part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, Joint-Use Project is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equal to:

(A) 12 percent of the funding provided by Section 1859.125(a)(1) through (a)(2), if the qualifying SFP New Construction or Modernization project pursuant to Section 1859.123 or 1859.123.1 will house less fewer than 101 pupils.

(B) Four percent of the funding provided by Section 1859.125(a)(1) through (a)(2), if the qualifying SFP New Construction or Modernization project pursuant to Section 1859.123 or 1859.123.1 will house between greater than 100 101 and fewer than 201 200 pupils.

(4) A Type II Joint-Use Project, not part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equal to eight percent of the funding provided by Section 1859.125(a)(1) through (a)(2).

(5) A grant request pursuant to Section 1859.79.3(a)(1) or (a)(2) and less fewer than 101 pupils is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equal to four percent of the funding provided by the Modernization Grant.

(6) A Facility Hardship project that is eligible to receive funding pursuant to 1859.82.1(b)(4)(B), 1859.82.1(b)(4)(C), or 1859.82.2(b)(4)(B), may request an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for small size project if the following qualifications are met:

(A) For the purposes of determining qualification for (6)(B) or (6)(C) below:

(1) Calculate the Facility Hardship Square Footage Grant pursuant to section 1859.82.1(b)(4)(B). If the Facility Hardship project is for the replacement of portable space, calculate the sum of the Portable Replacement Grant and Portable Toilet Replacement Grant pursuant to section 1859.82.1(b)(4)(C).

(2) Divide the amount determined in (6)(A)(1) by the New Construction Grant at the time the project is approved by the Board, for the highest grade level served at the site.

(3) Round the quotient to the nearest whole number.

(B) The District is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equivalent to 12 percent of the funding provided by the Facility Hardship Square Footage Grant if the calculated result of Section (6)(A) above is fewer than 101.

(C) The District is eligible for an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant equivalent to four percent of the funding provided by the Facility Hardship Square Footage Grant if the calculated result of Section (6)(A) above is greater than 100 and fewer than 201.

1859.83(e) Excessive Cost for rehabilitation of facilities the Board has determined are a health and safety risk to the pupils pursuant to Section 1859.82(a)(1) and the cost/benefit analysis to mitigate the problem and remain in the facility is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the facility. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were preexisting in the classroom or related facility. If the district gualifies, the district is eligible for funding of Rehabilitation Costs as a modernization project. If the Approved Application is received on or before April 29, 2002, the grant amount provided is 80 percent of the amount of the cost estimate required in Section 1859.82(a)(1) that has been reviewed by the OPSC and approved by the Board. If the Approved Application is received after April 29, 2002, the grant amount provided is 60 percent of the amount of the cost estimate required in Section 1859.82(a)(1) that has been reviewed by the OPSC and approved by the Board. (a) For each Application on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) for new construction, modernization, Facility Hardship pursuant to Section <u>1859.82.1 or</u> <u>1859.82.2</u>, <u>1859.82</u>. or rehabilitation pursuant to Section <u>1859.83(e)</u>, the occurrences of (1) or (2) below shall be limited after the effective date of this regulation section [March 25, 2013]. For each Application on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) for Overcrowding Relief Grant, Career Technical Education Facilities Program, and Charter School Facilities Program, excluding advance release of design and/or site acquisition funds from a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, the occurrences of (1) or (2) below shall be limited after the effective date of this regulation section [October 1, 2014]

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Section 1859.91. Implementation of Priority Points Due to Insufficient State Funds. (Repealed)

This Regulation shall only apply to Approved Applications for New Construction Grants funded with the proceeds of state bonds approved by the voters prior to January 1, 2002.

(a) The OPSC shall report to the Board on a monthly basis the amount of funds available for New Construction Grants and Modernization Grants and the estimated amount of Approved Applications for New Construction Grants and Modernization Grants not yet apportioned. The Board shall implement a priority point mechanism described in (b) for New Construction Grants requests when either of the following occur: (1) The amount of Approved Applications for New Construction Grants and Modernization Grants not yet apportioned exceed the funds available for New Construction Grants and Modernization Grants.

(2) The funds available for New Construction Grants are \$300 million or less.
 (b) Once either (1) or (2) in (a) occurs, the Board shall approve and apportion the funds available for New Construction Grants requests based on the following priority point mechanism: (1) From the funds available for New Construction Grants, the Board shall

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establish a final allotment equal to the lesser of \$450 million or the balance of the funds available for New Construction Grants, to be apportioned in accordance with (2) below. After deducting the final allotment, the Board shall divide the remaining funds into seven equal allotments, to be apportioned on a quarterly basis, commencing with the last quarter of calendar year 2000 and ending the second quarter of calendar year 2002. Quarterly apportionments are subject to the following: (A) The Board shall apportion Approved Applications for New Construction Grants requests received prior to the beginning of the quarter that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (d), until the funds available for New Construction Grants for that quarter are exhausted. New Construction Grants requests eligible for an apportionment shall be apportioned in the following order: To projects that meet the criteria of subsection (d) where the Approved Application date adjusted back in time would have qualified the project for an apportionment.

To projects exempt from priority points pursuant to Section 1859.92(e).

To projects having the greatest number of priority points.

(B) If two or more projects have the same number of priority points, those projects shall be first ranked according to the Approved Application date.

(C) No New Construction Grants request will be recommended for apportionment unless the project can be entirely apportioned from the funds available for that quarter. (D) If the Approved Applications for New Construction Grants received prior to the quarter that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List prior to the quarter and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (d) are less than the quarterly allotment, plus any funds remaining from the previous quarter(s), the excess funds shall be added to the next quarterly allotment.

(E) If the Approved Applications for New Construction Grants requests received prior to the quarter that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List prior to the quarter and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (d) are greater than the quarterly allotment, plus any funds remaining from the previous quarter(s), any New Construction Grants requests not apportioned by the Board shall be placed on an Unfunded List.

(F) All New Construction Grants requests, as described in (A) above, that are Ready for Apportionment in a quarter shall not be apportioned before the last regularly scheduled Board meeting for that quarter with the exception of New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (b)(1)(A)(1) or (2). Any New Construction Grants request that is Ready for Apportionment in a quarter that meets the criteria of subsection (b)(1)(A)(1) or (2) may be apportioned at any of the regularly scheduled Board meetings during that quarter.

(2) The final allotment shall be apportioned subject to the following: (A) The Board shall apportion Approved Applications for New Construction Grants received between April 1, 2002 and June 26, 2002 that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (e), until the final allotment, plus any funds remaining from the previous quarters are exhausted. New Construction Grants requests eligible for an apportionment shall be apportioned in the following order: To projects that meet the criteria of subsection (e) where the Approved Application date adjusted back in time would have qualified the project for an apportionment.

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To projects exempt from priority points pursuant to Section 1859.92(e).

To projects having the greatest number of priority points.

(B) If two or more projects have the same number of priority points, those projects shall be first ranked according to the Approved Application date.

(C) If the Approved Applications for New Construction Grants received between April 1, 2002 and June 26, 2002 that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (e) are greater than the final allotment, plus any remaining funds from the previous quarter(s), any New Construction Grants request not apportioned by the Board shall be placed on an Unfunded List.

(D) All New Construction Grants requests, as described in (A) above, that are Ready for Apportionment shall be apportioned at the regularly scheduled Board meeting in August 2002 with the exception of New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (b)(2)(A)(1) or (2). Any New Construction Grants request that is Ready for Apportionment that meets the criteria of subsection (b)(2)(A)(1) or (2) may be apportioned at either the regularly scheduled Board meetings in July or August 2002. (E) If the Approved Applications for New Construction Grants received between April 1. 2002 and June 26, 2002 that are Ready for Apportionment, all New Construction Grants requests that were included on an Unfunded List and New Construction Grants requests that meet the criteria of subsection (e) are less than the final allotment, plus any remaining funds from the previous quarter(s), the excess funds shall be apportioned on a monthly basis beginning in September 2002 for Approved Applications for New Construction Grants received after June 26, 2002 that are Ready for Apportionment, in descending order, commencing with the project having the greatest number of priority points. This process shall continue until the funds available are exhausted. If two or more projects have the same number of priority points, those projects shall be first ranked according to the Approved Application date.

(c) Approved Applications for New Construction Grants requests received during a quarter may, at the discretion of the Board, be considered for funding available for that quarter or a future quarter if all the following criteria are met: (1) Either the Executive Officer of the Board, the State Architect, the Director of School Facilities Planning Division within the CDE, or the Chief of the School Property Evaluation and Cleanup Division within the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) certify to the OPSC that the district's application was delayed for a specified number of calendar days in relation to other similar applications submitted to that agency at the same time. (2) The Approved Application date adjusted back in time for the number of calendar days the application was delayed is prior to the beginning of the quarter in which the application was received.

(d) Approved Applications for New Construction Grants requests received after June 26 2002 may, at the discretion of the Board, be considered for funding available for the final allotment if all the following criteria are met: (1) Either the Executive Officer of the Board, the State Architect, the Director of School Facilities Planning Division within the CDE, or the Chief of the School Property Evaluation and Cleanup Division within the DTSC certify to the OPSC that the district's application was delayed for a specified number of calendar days in relation to other similar applications submitted to that agency at the same time.

(2) The Approved Application date adjusted back in time for the number of calendar days the application was delayed is prior to June 27, 2002.

Section 1859.92. Priority Points For New Construction Projects. (Repealed)

This Regulation shall only apply to Approved Applications for New Construction Grants funded with the proceeds of state bonds approved by the voters prior to January 1, 2002.

The priority points allowed for a New Construction Grants request shall be based on the following computations rounded up to the nearest whole number. The computation shall be made on a districtwide basis if the district utilized districtwide CBEDS enrollment data reported on the Form SAB 50-01 in effect at the time the district's application for funding was submitted to the OPSC for the project. When multiple applications have the same Approved Application date, or have an Approved Application date which permits the projects to be Ready for Apportionment in the same quarter when priority points are implemented as provided in Section 1859.91, the priority order shall be as requested by the district on the Form SAB 50-04. The computation shall be made on a HSAA or Super HSAA basis if the district utilized HSAA or Super HSAA CBEDS enrollment data reported on the Form SAB 50-01 in effect at the time the district's application for funding was submitted to the OPSC for the project. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1859.41, a district that has previously reported its enrollment on a HSAA or Super HSAA basis may calculate both its eligibility and its priority points on a districtwide basis. A project shall receive priority points based on the total of (a), (b) and (c):

(a) Priority points for the percent of unhoused pupils for both of the following:

(1) Six points for each percent of current unhoused pupils.

(2) Four points for each percent of projected unhoused pupils.

(b) Priority points for the number of unhoused pupils for both of the following: (1) One point for each 100 currently unhoused pupils.

(2) One point for each 200 projected unhoused pupils.

(c) A maximum of 100 priority points for the following: (1) Twenty points if the district's CBEDS enrollment at the time of application submittal to the OPSC for funding is less than 2,501.

(2) Twenty points for a County Superintendent of Schools' project that only includes classroom space solely for Non-Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs.
 (3) Twenty points if the site acreage for the project is less than 50 percent of the site size recommended by the CDE for the master planned pupil capacity.

(4) Twenty points for a project that either used "stock plans" pursuant to Education Code Section 17070.33(b)(6) or re-used plans that were previously used to construct at least two other schools.

(5) Twenty points if the district's CBEDS enrollment at the time of application submittal to the OPSC for funding is less than 301.

(6) Twenty points for a project that uses 20 percent less energy than the Energy Budget as defined and calculated in a manner consistent with the California Energy Code, Part 6, Subchapter 5, Section 141 – Performance Approach: Energy Budgets.

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(7) Twenty points for a project that is a new high school serving any grades nine through twelve.

(8) Twenty points for a project that received financial hardship assistance pursuant to Section 1859.81.

(9) Twenty points for a project where the site acquisition qualified and received an apportionment authorized under Section 1859.75.1, Separate Site Apportionment for Environmental Hardship.

(10) One hundred points if the Approved Application was accepted prior to the date the priority point mechanism is implemented by the Board pursuant to Section 1859.91(a)(1) or (a)(2).

(d) The calculation of priority points in (a), (b) and (c) above shall be determined at the time the Approved Application is accepted.

(e) The following projects are exempt from priority points: (1) A project that received Facility Hardship approval pursuant to Section 1859.82.

(2) A county superintendent of schools' project that includes classroom space for Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs.

(3) A county superintendent of schools' project that only includes classroom space solely for community school pupils.

(4) A school district's project that only includes classroom space solely for Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs.

(f) The project received a separate site and/or design apportionment under the provisions of the LPP or pursuant to Sections 1859.75.1 or 1859.81.1, the district's funding priority of the project shall be determined by the Approved Application date for the New Construction Adjusted Grant or separate site funding request filed pursuant to Section 1859.81.1 (a) or 1859.75.1. If separate site funding requests have been submitted, the funding priority of the project shall be determined by the CBEDS enrollment data utilized for those applications.

(c) Should a district request hardship funding for either a financial hardship grant pursuant to Section 1859.81, a facility hardship grant pursuant to Section 1859.82 or an Excessive Cost Hardship Grant pursuant to Section 1859.83 and the Board has no funds to allocate for that specific hardship, the district may elect to either:

(1) Accept funding for the project less and hardship funding grants that are not available. When this option is selected, the hardship funding grants not allocated for the project shall be placed on the Unfunded List. If the project was previously placed on the Unfunded List, the project shall retain the original date it was placed on that Unfunded List.

(2) Decline to accept funding for the project. When this option is selected, the project shall be placed on the Unfunded List. If the project was previously placed on the Unfunded List, the project shall retain the original date it was placed on that Unfunded List.

A project of portion of a new construction project not funded as a result of subdivision (c) shall be subject to the Board's priority mechanism pursuant to Section 1859.91 and 1859.92.

(A) That due to extreme financial, disaster-related, or other hardship the school district has unmet need for pupil housing.

(B) That the school district is not financially capable of providing the matching funds otherwise required for state participation, that the district has made all reasonable efforts to impose all levels of local debt capacity and development fees, and that the school district is, therefore, unable to participate in the program pursuant to this chapter except as set forth in this article.

(2) Demonstrate that due to unusual circumstances that are beyond the control of the district, excessive costs need to be incurred in the construction of school facilities. Funds for the purpose of seismic mitigation work or facility replacement pursuant to this section shall be allocated by the board on a 50-percent state share basis from funds reserved for that purpose in any bond approved by the voters after January 1, 2006. If the board determines that the seismic mitigation work of a school building would require funding that is greater than 50 percent of the funds required to construct a new facility, the school district shall be eligible for funding to construct a new facility under this chapter.

(c) The board shall review the increased costs that may be uniquely associated with urban construction and shall adjust the per-pupil grant for new construction or modernization hardship applications as necessary to accommodate those costs. The board shall adopt regulations setting forth the standards,

methodology, and a schedule of allowable adjustments, for the urban adjustment factor established pursuant to this subdivision.

(Amended by Stats. 2008, Ch. 179, Sec. 41. Effective January 1, 2009.)

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82. Facility Hardship.

A district is eligible for facility hardship funding to replace or construct new classrooms and related facilities if the district demonstrates there is an unmet need for pupil housing or the condition of the facilities, or the lack of facilities, is a threat to the health and safety of the pupils. A facility hardship is available for:

(a) New classrooms and/or subsidiary facilities (corridors, toilets, kitchens and other non-classroom space) or replacement facilities if either (1) or (2) are met:
(1) The facilities are needed to ensure the health and safety of the pupils if the district can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board that the health and safety of the pupils is at risk. Factors to be considered by the Board shall include the

close proximity to a major freeway, airport, electrical facility, high power transmission lines, dam, pipeline, industrial facility, adverse air quality emission or other health and safety risks, including structural deficiencies required by the DSA to be repaired, seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings as verified by the DSA, traffic safety or because the pupils reside in remote areas of the district and transportation to existing facilities is not possible or poses a health and safety risk. The total available funding for seismic mitigation related and ancillary costs for the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings is \$199.5 million.

(A) If the request is for replacement facilities, a cost/benefit analysis must be prepared by the district and submitted to the OPSC that indicates the total costs to remain in the classroom or related facility and mitigate the problem is at least 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost of the classroom or related facility. The cost/benefit analysis may include applicable site development costs as outlined in Section 1859.76. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were pre-existing in the classroom or related facility. If the cost to remain in the classroom or related facility is less than 50 percent of the Current Replacement Cost, the district may qualify for either grant below, as applicable:

1. Modernization Excessive Cost Hardship Grant for Rehabilitation Costs pursuant to Section 1859.83(e), or 2. A grant not to exceed 50 percent of the cost estimate that has been reviewed and approved by the OPSC and approved by the board for seismic rehabilitation.

(B) If the request is for replacement facilities that included structural and/or seismic deficiencies, the cost/benefit analysis must also include a report from a licensed design professional identifying the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval. The report must contain a detailed cost estimate of the repairs. The cost/benefit analysis shall not include increased costs associated with high performance related costs or components, with the exception of those high performance components that were pre-existing in the classroom or related facility. The report and cost estimate shall be subject to review by the OPSC for conformance with the Saylor Current Construction Cost Publication and, at the OPSC's discretion, the DSA. For seismic deficiencies of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings, the report and the cost estimate for the minimum work necessary must be reviewed by the DSA.

(C) The seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:

1. The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;

2. The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval;

3. The building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and

4. The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. If the unacceptable risk of injury is due to the presence of faulting, liquefaction or landslide, these hazards must be documented by a geologic hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance with

ATTACHMENT D

California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with the concurrence of the California Geological Survey.

The structural engineer's report shall conform to the guidelines prepared by the DSA, in accordance with Education Code Section 17310.

(D) Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding.

(E) If an Application for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings cannot be fully apportioned or approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) because insufficient funding is available, the applicant may accept the remaining funding amount or refuse funding entirely. If partial funding is accepted, the applicant will remain eligible for the additional amount of seismic funds, up to the initial funding request, if funds become available within the Seismic Mitigation Program authority amount of \$199.5 million. If funding is refused, the Board shall consider funding the next project eligible for funding pursuant to this Section.

For any Application for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings not apportioned or approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) pursuant to this Section, the application shall be returned to the applicant.

(2) The classroom or related facility was lost or destroyed as a result of a disaster such as fire, flood or earthquake and the district has demonstrated satisfactorily to the Board that the classroom or related facility was uninsurable or the cost for insurance was prohibitive.

If the district qualifies for a new or replacement school pursuant to either (1) or (2) above, the district is eligible for a New Construction Grant as a new construction project for the lesser of the pupils housed in the replaced facility based on loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2) or the latest CBEDS enrollment at the site.

If the district qualifies for replacement facilities on the same site pursuant to either (1) or (2) above, the district is eligible for funding as a new construction project. Replacement facilities shall be allowed in accordance with the square footage amounts provided in the chart in Section (b) below. If the facility eligible for replacement is not shown in the chart in Section (b) below, the replacement facility shall be limited to the square footage replaced. The grant amount provided shall be \$173.30 per square foot for Toilet Facilities and \$96.30 per square foot for all other facilities. Additional funding may be provided for applicable site development costs pursuant to Section 1859.76, New Construction Excessive Cost Hardship Grant(s) pursuant to Section 1859.83(a), (b) or (d), therapy room pursuant to Section 1859.72, multilevel construction pursuant to Section 1859.73, project assistance pursuant to Section 1859.73.1, and high performance incentive pursuant to Section 1859.77.4 provided that the

high performance points attained are related to the scope of the Facility Hardship project. The amounts shown will be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. For any project funded in whole or in part from any State bond funds for which the construction contract is awarded prior to January 1, 2012, the district may be eligible for the funding provided to initiate and enforce a LCP as prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(a). For any project for which the construction contract is awarded on or after January 1, 2012, the grant may be adjusted in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71.4(c) and subject to the limitations established in Section 1859.71.4(d).

Any grants provided pursuant to either (1) or (2) above will be reduced for any space deemed available by the Board in the district, the HSAA or Super HSAA that could be used to house some or all of the displaced pupils, fifty percent of any insurance proceeds collectable by the district for the displaced facilities and fifty percent of the net proceeds available from the disposition of any displaced facilities.

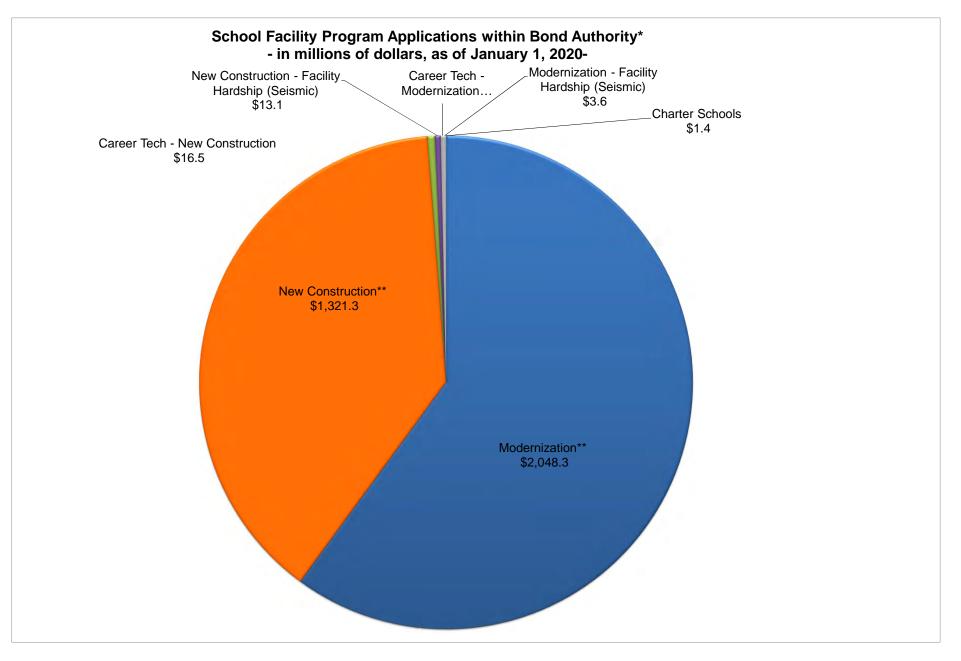

Facility Hardship and Rehabilitation Estimated Total Need (State Share)

Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

- (b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:
 - (1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.
 - (2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.
 - (3) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).
 - (4) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.
 - (5) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.
 - (6) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.
 - (7) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

- (c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:
 - (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.
 - (2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).
 - (3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.
 - (4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.
 - (5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

- (A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship status.
- (B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.
- (d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).
- (e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).
 - (1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.
 - (2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must requalify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.

(3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

- (f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.
- (g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.
- (h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.
 - (1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.
 - (2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:
 - a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.
 - b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.
 - (3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.
 - (4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
