#### **EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT**

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

#### Virtual School Facility Program Training Series

Since the update provided at last month's SAB meeting, OPSC has held two more free virtual training workshops. The first workshop, held February 19, 2021, covered the Basics of State School Facility Program (SFP) Funding. This workshop introduced the funding programs available under the SFP and the basic program eligibility criteria for each. There were 104 attendees that registered for this workshop.

The second workshop, held February 22, 2021, covered the SAB's "Three Lists" and provided information on each of the lists. This workshop covered an in-depth look at the history, purpose, and associated timelines of the SAB's Workload List, the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans), and the Application Review Beyond Bond Authority List. There were 93 attendees that registered for this workshop.

The Executive Officer announced that for the month of March, OPSC has scheduled four workshops as shown below:

# EXECUTIVE OFFICER STATEMENT State Allocation Board Meeting, March 24, 2021

#### **FUTURE PRIORITY FUNDING ROUND 20 APPORTIONMENTS**

As a result of cash proceeds that became available from the General Obligation Bond Sale that took place this month, staff is currently preparing Priority Funding Apportionments for presentation to the State Allocation Board at the April 28, 2021 meeting.

#### VIRTUAL SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM (SFP) TRAINING SERIES

Since the last update provided at the February 2021 board meeting, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has held two more free virtual training workshops.

The first workshop on March 16, 2021 covered the Facility Hardship and Seismic Mitigation Programs. The workshop provided an overview of the two programs, navigating through the program requirements, and on how to submit a funding request for an eligible health and safety project.

The second workshop on March 19, 2021 provided an overview of OPSC online. The workshop covered the OPSC Online OPSC paperless application system, and how to utilize the various tools available to manage application submittals.

Two additional workshops will conclude our March series and two in April 2021 and they are as follow:

On Friday, March 26, 20201 from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., OPSC will provide a workshop covering the submittal of eligibility applications in OPSC Online. The session will guide attendees on how to create, review, and submit eligibility establishments/updates as well as on how to review the eligibility history of a district or individual site. OPSC currently has 48 attendees registered for the workshop.

On Tuesday, March 30, 20201 from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., OPSC will provide a workshop covering the submittal of funding applications. The session will guide attendees on how to create, review, and submit funding applications through OPSC Online. The topic will also cover what documents are required to submit a successful funding application. OPSC currently has 50 attendees registered for the workshop.

On Tuesday, April 13, 2021 from 10 a.m. - 11:30 a.m., OPSC will provide a workshop on the Priority Funding Process. The session will cover a general overview of the process including timelines, eligibility, and what does it mean when an applicant chooses to participate. OPSC currently has 60 attendees registered for the workshop.

On Thursday, April 15, 20201 from 10 a.m. – 11:30 a.m., OPSC will provide a workshop covering the Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) Reservation of Funds. The session will explain the timelines of a CTEFP project that includes a Reservation of Funds request and how they interact with the Priority in Funding Process. OPSC currently has 24 attendees registered for the workshop.

We continue to encourage Interested parties to register for all workshops. Registration links are available on our Virtual Training Series webpage.

#### State of California State Allocation Board School Facility Program

This Resolution of the State Allocation Board (hereafter referred to as the "Board") is applicable to the appropriate sections of the Education Code and is described and filed in the office of the Executive Officer and will be made available to all interested parties as the Resolution pertains to the documents attached hereto. Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on March 24, 2021.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

#### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
- The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
- 3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
- 5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

### SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To adjust the baseline eligibility for new construction and modernization projects under the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998.

#### DESCRIPTION

The districts listed on Attachment A have received eligibility approval for new construction. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.51.

The districts listed on Attachment B have received eligibility approval for modernization. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.61.

# REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting, March 24, 2021

#### SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM UNFUNDED APPROVALS

(Lack of AB 55 Loans)

#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for unfunded approval.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

At the January 2021 Board meeting, the Board elected to provide an increase adjustment of 1.42 percent to SFP projects for calendar year 2021. The projects listed on the Attachment reflect the Board's action of the adoption of the 1.42 percent increase based on the RS Means Construction Cost Index. In addition, the project applications represent SFP New Construction, Modernization, Charter School and Overcrowding Relief Grant projects in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC).

#### **AUTHORITY**

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 defines an Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) as an information list of unfunded projects that was created due to the State's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans) to fund school construction projects as declared in the Department of Finance Budget Letter #33 issued on December 18, 2008.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.95 states:

"When the Board has no funds to apportion ..., the Board will also accept and process applications for apportionment for purposes of developing an Unfunded List based on the date the application is ready for Apportionment, with the exception of New Construction funding applications that utilize eligibility generated by the Alternative Enrollment Projection.

An application for funding included on an Unfunded List is eligible for reimbursement subject to adjustments in the New Construction Grants amount pursuant to Section 1859.77."

#### **BACKGROUND**

At the March 11, 2009 SAB meeting, the Board requested that Staff continue to process applications to the Board for unfunded approval, up to the bonding authority. The Attachment reflects applications being presented for unfunded approval, including SFP modernization and new construction projects in date order of a complete application being received by the OPSC. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date. The unfunded approval of the applications as reflected on the Attachment does not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- 1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
- 2. Provide that these unfunded approvals do not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

## **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To present School Facility Program (SFP) project apportionments to be reduced to eligible costs incurred.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

The SFP projects listed on the Attachment are District and financial hardship County Office of Education (COE) that received a separate design and site fund release. The District and COE have either requested to have their projects reduced to costs incurred or have not met the substantial progress requirement or have indicated that they will be unable to move forward with the SFP projects listed on the Attachment. 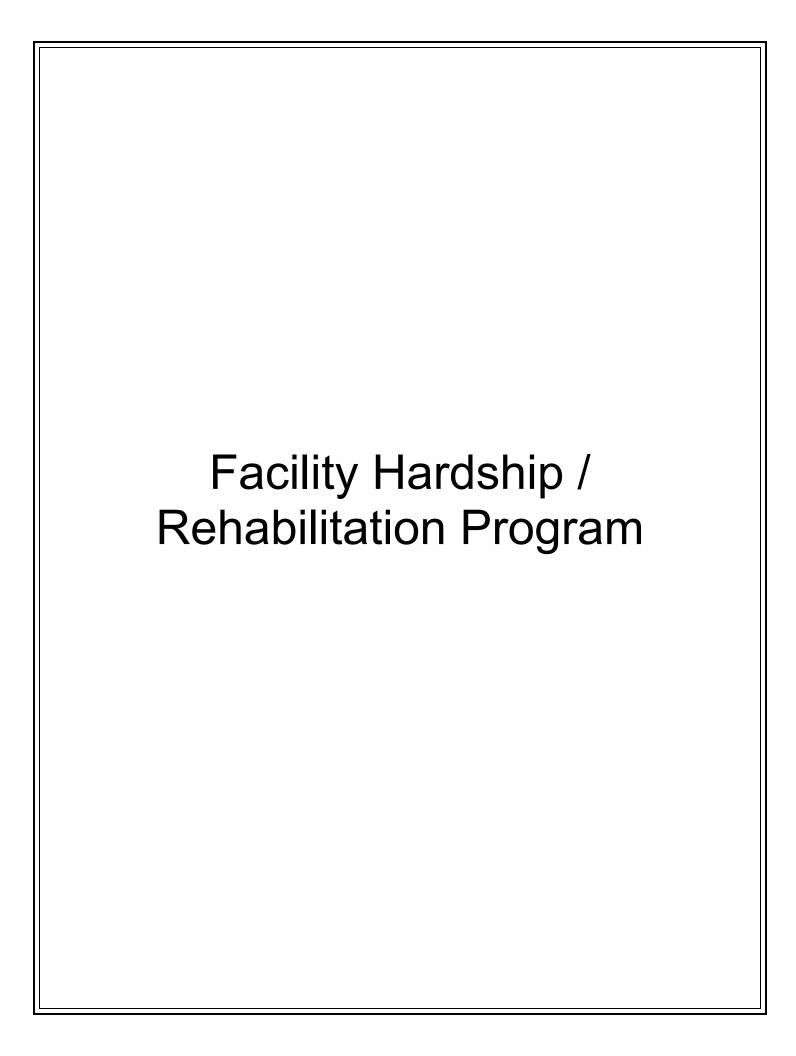

## DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

The water supply at Pleasant View Elementary School is provided by a single well system which provides domestic water to the facilities. In the summer of 2014, statewide emergency drought conditions caused the existing water table throughout Tulare County to drop below the depths accessible by existing well systems causing them to run dry and resulting in extreme water shortages. In order to provide a consistent, reliable water source for the site, the District was required to dig a deeper well to prevent the loss of access to a potable water source. In a letter dated October 20, 2017, the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water indicates that "the Pleasant View West School water system should be capable of providing water to consumers that is pure, wholesome, and potable and in compliance with statutory and regulatory drinking water requirements at all times."

#### SCOPE OF PROJECT

The scope of this project includes the abandonment of the existing water well and the construction of a replacement water well at an alternate location on the site.

#### STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

The project is complete and the replacement well is now in use.

However, this work may be incorporated into a qualifying Facility Hardship application if it is required to be completed to gain DSA approval."

## DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

Visible black mold was discovered at the Quincy Elementary School site in mid-2014, causing the closure of one classroom wing. In early 2018, additional mold was discovered in Unit A, the main classroom wing, which prompted further testing of the facilities. Following an assessment, by an industrial hygienist, the District closed the building to students and staff. The industrial hygienist's report by Asbestos Science Technologies Inc. dated June 18, 2018 found "visible mold/fungal contamination throughout the school" and indicates that water incursion emanated from the roof areas of the building. The report additionally states "this is causing the failure of the roof and wall areas which no longer adequately protect the school from water incursion issues. This has also become a health and safety issue for the district as students and faculty are being exposed to airborne mold spores which are above normal levels for allergenic and toxigenic mold spores." The District contacted the Plumas County Environmental Health (PCEH) which conducted a site visit on November 5, 2018 and concurred to the mold findings of the report, requesting that the District "not inhabit the affected areas of the school until remediation measures have been addressed, due to the potential health concerns for students, staff and the public."

#### SCOPE OF PROJECT

Rehabilitation work consists of mold abatement of contaminated surfaces, including the removal and replacement of ceiling tiles, roof plywood and insulation, drywall, siding and wall plywood under a negative air containment area.

#### STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

The mitigation work has been completed and the facilities are occupied by students and staff.

## **GOVERNMENT/STATE LEVEL CONCURRENCE**

The District obtained concurrence with the hazards reported and with the proposed minimum work for rehabilitation from PCEH.

## **AUTHORITY**

## Facility Hardship Program – Rehabilitation Projects

(as of August 31, 2020)

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(a) states:

A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states, "A school district may apply for Facility Hardship, including Seismic Mitigation, Program assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances that have caused an imminent health and safety threat."

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.1 states that "a district is eligible for Facility Hardship funding to repair, replace, or construct School Buildings or related required components that are currently causing a health and safety threat to the students and/or staff. Projects solely to replace components that have reached the end of their useful life, perform routine maintenance or repair, issues resulting from the deferment of routine maintenance or repair, lack of current code compliance, or the addition of components that were not previously existing, do not meet the qualifying criteria of the program. However, this work may be incorporated into a qualifying Facility Hardship application if it is required to be completed to gain DSA approval."

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.1(c) states,

Districts may qualify for funding to rehabilitate their School Buildings, components of School Buildings, or school site conditions. Factors to be considered by the Board may include (1) or (2) below:

- (1) School Buildings where the minimum cost to mitigate the health and safety threat and remain in the School Building is 50 percent or less of the Current Replacement Cost.
- (2) Components of the School Buildings or school sites conditions are causing a health and safety threat to students and/or staff.
