EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

22nd Priority Funding Round Apportionments

At the April SAB meeting, there was \$652 million in Apportionments made through the Priority Funding process. As of May 6, 2022, OPSC received valid fund release authorizations for 33 unique projects totaling \$83.6 million in State funding.

Current Priority Funding Filing Round is Open

As of May 11, 2022, the 23rd Priority Funding filing period began and will close June 9, 2022. OPSC encourages applicants to submit Priority Funding requests electronically through OPSC Online and will also accept Priority Funding requests with electronic signatures via email. All requests must be received by OPSC before the end of the day on Thursday, June 9, 2022. These requests will be valid from July 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

As a reminder, projects on the OPSC Workload List cannot make this request. Any Priority Funding requests received for projects on the OPSC Workload List will be returned to the school district.

Joint State Agency Workshop

OPSC, the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), the CDE and the Division of the State Architect conducted a free workshop via Zoom on Thursday, May 5, 2022. The workshop provided information on how to prepare school facilities for natural disasters and emergencies and how these state agencies can assist school districts that have facilities impacted by an emergency.

There were 97 external participants that attended the workshop and the feedback from school districts and stakeholders was overwhelmingly positive. The recording of the workshop has been made available via OPSC's YouTube Channel at: <https://www.youtube.com/user/OPSCYou>.

Current Charter School Facilities Program Filing Round and Virtual Workshop

The filing round to submit applications for the Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) preliminary apportionments opened May 2, 2022 and closed June 3, 2022. As of May 16, 2022, OPSC received eight (8) applications requesting an estimated \$210 million.

OPSC and the California School Finance Authority held a workshop on Thursday, April 28, 2022, that provided step-by-step instructions to charter schools, school districts, and other interested stakeholders on how to complete and submit all required forms and supporting documents through OPSC Online. There were 40 external participants that attended this workshop. Recent Filing Round for the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program

The first filing round for the expanded California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program opened April 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022. OPSC received a total of 352 applications from 207 school districts requesting an estimated \$1.5 billion.

Executive Officer Statement

EXECUTIVE OFFICER STATEMENT
State Allocation Board Meeting, June 22, 2022

STAFF RETURN TO OFFICE AND NEW OFFICE LOCATION

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) temporarily suspended in-person services. Effective May 31st, OPSC staff have now returned to the office and have moved to the fourth floor (prior location was the sixth floor) at 707 Third Street, West Sacramento, CA. At this time, most OPSC staff will continue to telework on a hybrid schedule where a complement of teams will be rotating in the office once a week. If a district is requesting an in-person meeting, please schedule an appointment in advance with staff so that they may ensure they are available to accommodate the in-person meeting. We also want to encourage districts to continue to utilize cost effective measures that save on travel costs by establishing virtual meetings via Zoom or Microsoft Teams.

For those visiting our offices, OPSC staff will maintain social distancing when participating in in-person meetings. OPSC is committed to meeting the needs of our schools and stakeholders by keeping our offices open, limiting contact through social distancing when we can, and making the accommodations needed to keep work flowing.

23RD PRIORITY FUNDING ROUND CLOSED

The most recent priority funding filing period began on May 11, 2022 and closed on June 09, 2022.

At the close of the filing period, OPSC received valid requests for 127 unique projects totaling to \$481.5 million in State funding. These requests are valid from July 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.

5 projects did not submit requests during the filing period, 2 of which were SFP projects that received a first occurrence for non-participation in Priority Funding and 3 projects of which were Charter School Facilities Program projects.

RECENT CHARTER FACILITIES PROGRAM FILING ROUND CLOSED

The most recent round to submit Applications for Charter School Facilities Program preliminary apportionments closed on June 3, 2022. OPSC received 39 applications requesting an estimated \$625.8 million.

NEXT MEETING

No meeting will be held in July 2022. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, August 24, 2022 at 4:00 p.m.

Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on June 22, 2022.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3rd Street, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To adjust the baseline eligibility for new construction and modernization projects under the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM UNFUNDED APPROVALS

(Lack of AB 55 Loans)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for unfunded approval.

DESCRIPTION

At the February 2022 Board meeting, the Board elected to provide an increase adjustment of 15.80 percent to SFP projects for calendar year 2022. The projects listed on the Attachment reflect the Board's action of the adoption of the 15.80 percent increase based on the RS Means Construction Cost Index. In addition, the project applications represent SFP New Construction, Modernization, Charter School and Overcrowding Relief Grant projects in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC).

AUTHORITY

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2 defines an Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) as an information list of unfunded projects that was created due to the State's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans) to fund school construction projects as declared in the Department of Finance Budget Letter #33 issued on December 18, 2008.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.95 states:

"When the Board has no funds to apportion ..., the Board will also accept and process applications for apportionment for purposes of developing an Unfunded List based on the date the application is ready for Apportionment, with the exception of New Construction funding applications that utilize eligibility generated by the Alternative Enrollment Projection.

An application for funding included on an Unfunded List is eligible for reimbursement subject to adjustments in the New Construction Grants amount pursuant to Section 1859.77."

BACKGROUND

At the March 11, 2009 SAB meeting, the Board requested that Staff continue to process applications to the Board for unfunded approval, up to the bonding authority. The Attachment reflects applications being presented for unfunded approval, including SFP modernization and new construction projects in date order of a complete application being received by the OPSC. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date. The unfunded approval of the applications as reflected on the Attachment does not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
2. Provide that these unfunded approvals do not constitute a guarantee of future funding.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request to release funding for two Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) projects.

DESCRIPTION

The District has two CTEFP projects for New Construction at the Dinuba High School site (OPSC Application numbers 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007). Both projects were approved by the State Allocation Board (Board) for a Reservation of Funds on September 30, 2020 and received Apportionments at the April 28, 2021 Board meeting. The District submitted the California Department of Education (CDE) plan approvals and Division of the State Architect (DSA) approved plans and specifications to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) within 12 months of receiving the apportionments.

During development of formal plans, the District encountered estimated costs exceeding the funding available for these projects. The District engaged CDE in March 2021 to propose scope changes "to reduce cost without adversely impacting the CTE program delivery." Additionally, the approved plans and specifications submitted to OPSC specify "New Dinuba High" as the school site whereas the original CTEFP application documents indicate "Dinuba High." Due to the change in scope and site name discrepancy in submitted documentation, OPSC placed a hold on the release of funds for these two projects.

The District submitted an appeal request on March 15, 2022 requesting a release of the funds for CTEFP projects 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007.

AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

The District is a K-12 district located in Tulare County and has one primary high school site, Dinuba High, which currently serves a student population of 2,171 pupils in the rural locale.

In 2020, the District submitted two CTEFP applications as part of the Cycle 6 funding round. OPSC Application 55/75531-00-006 requested funds for facilities and equipment to provide curriculum in the Health Science and Medical Technology

industry sector with a focus on the Patient Care Pathway and Application 55/75531-00-007 requested funds for facilities and equipment to provide curriculum in the Agriculture and Natural Resources industry sector focusing on Plant and Soil Science as well as the Animal Science pathways. Both projects were competitive in the Cycle 6 CTEFP round and the Board approved apportionments for a Reservation of Funds on April 28, 2021. While the submitted plan documentation indicated the projected total project costs to exceed the maximum funding available through CTEFP, both projects were awarded the maximum grant available for New Construction projects (\$6,000,000.00 per project).

When the District went out to bid the project, all bids came in significantly over the anticipated costs. In order to proceed, the District approached the project architect to reduce cost by removing auxiliary space within the lobby area; the CTEFP areas remain the same and the indicated curriculum is unchanged by the proposed alterations. The District then requested re-review by CDE and DSA for approval of the reduced scope. The revised plan sets identify the site for this construction as "New Dinuba High" reflecting the District's intent to replace Dinuba High on a new high school site.

The District submitted final CDE and DSA plan approvals for these projects on December 17, 2021 which is within the 12 month timeframe for CTEFP projects to convert an approved Reservation of Funds for fund release. OPSC staff determined that the CDE and DSA project approvals could not be accepted as submitted as OPSC staff does not have the administrative authority for changes to scope or site location. Since the approvals are required components to process the fund release request for the projects, a hold has been placed on processing fund release as of February 4, 2022.

Status of the Project

The District has received CDE and DSA plan approvals for the change of scope. Processing of the fund releases is currently on hold pending Board approval of the reduced scope and a change in the physical location of the facilities.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

District's Position

The District requests the release of the funds for Career Technical Education Projects 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007 at Dinuba High School due to the following considerations:

- The District engaged CDE in March 2021, as required by the "CTE Change of Scope Projects" policy document issued by CDE, and sent details regarding the proposed changes for review and approval. The CDE responded via email on April 6, 2021 and stated that as long as there were "no other programmatic changes, the requested changes are approved". There are no programmatic

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

changes to this project, and the District complied with all requirements within the “CTE Change of Scope Projects” policy.

- All of the CTE application documents, including CDE, DSA, and Board/OPSC contemplate the CTE project on a new site. The CTE grant applications, preliminary conceptual plans, DSA approved plans, and supporting documents all show the CTE projects on a new site, regardless of the names of the schools.

The full text of the District’s request is included as Attachment B.

Staff’s Position*Scope Change*

The District’s approval for the Reservation of Funds is partially based on the proposed areas submitted during preliminary planning for these projects. Upon learning that the costs with the original design exceeded the existing budget for the projects, the District took the steps needed to gain updated plan approvals from CDE and DSA to modify the scope of work by removing auxiliary areas that do not affect the District’s ability to provide CTE curriculum consistent with the program scope as provided in the original applications.

Both projects received approval for the maximum grant amount available for CTEFP New Construction and the proposed reduction does not alter the facilities or components which justify maximum funding. CTEFP provides financial assistance through a loan option as opposed to the financial hardship provided for non-CTEFP New Construction projects; thus the District is not restricted by the amount of the loan provided in the CTEFP grant so long as the curriculum outlined in the CTEFP grant applications is still achieved by the facilities. Staff has reviewed the revised plans and determined that no funding changes would occur to the existing approved Reservation of Funds as a result of the proposed reduced scope of work.

Staff is supportive of the District’s alteration to scope for both projects, however changes to originally approved scope cannot be approved administratively and requires consent of the Board.

Designated Site Location

The District’s original application documentation indicated “Dinuba High” which is an existing site within the District. CTEFP documentation does not request a site address and it was not clear from the original submission that the District intended to build new high school facilities at an alternate location.

Site location is a critical aspect of CTEFP applications as they are reviewed and scored within the context of a given locale. The locale is one of the determining criteria used to equitably allocate funding to eligible applications received in a given

funding cycle, and CDE's review considers the site location during initial scoring of CTEFP grant applications.

Staff has verified that the locale is the same between the two sites, however, there was concern that the alternate site may have impacted the original score CDE assessed for these projects which may have affected the competitiveness of the applications in Cycle 6. Staff contacted CDE which confirmed that neither the new location of the New Dinuba High School site or the reduction of scope would have resulted in different scores. Thus, staff is supportive of the applications with the understanding that the currently approved plans are intended for the new high school site.

Conclusion

Staff supports the District's request to resume processing the fund releases for projects 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007. While the intended location of the New High School site is a significant factor in the scoring system used to determine funding eligibility, in this case CDE has confirmed that the final score for both projects remain unchanged by the relocation of the high school. Additionally, the proposed reduction of scope does not impact the intent or operation of the originally approved CTEFP projects and the revised plans have both CDE and DSA approval. The scope change does not result in any change to the amounts of the previously approved Reservation of Funds. If the Board approves the District's request, the District would have 90 days to submit a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) and signed Grant Agreement.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approve the change of scope to OPSC Applications 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007.
2. Approve the District's appeal to resume processing release of funds for OPSC Applications 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007.

ATTACHMENT A

AUTHORITY

SFP Regulation Section 1859.2. Definitions

For the purpose of these regulations, the terms set forth below shall have the following meanings, subject to the provisions of the Act:

....

“Approved Application for Career Technical Education Facilities Project Funding” means an applicant has submitted an Application for Career Technical Education Facilities Funding, Form SAB 50-10, including all required supporting documents as identified in the General Information Section of that Form, to the OPSC and the OPSC has accepted the application for processing.

....

“Career Technical Education Facilities Project” means a project approved by the Board pursuant to Education Code Section 17078.72.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.192. Career Technical Education Facilities Program Eligibility.

An applicant requesting funding for a Career Technical Education Facilities Project may submit Form SAB 50-10 to the OPSC if all the following criteria are met:

(a) For a new construction project, the applicant:

(1) Is a local educational agency operating a comprehensive high school pursuant to Education Code Sections 51224, 51225.3 and 51228.

(2) Has an active career technical advisory committee pursuant to Education Code Section 8070.

....

(c) The applicant’s Career Technical Education Facilities Program application has met all the requirements in Education Code Section 17078.72(i) and scored at least 105 points.

An applicant need not demonstrate New Construction Eligibility or Modernization Eligibility in order to participate in the Career Technical Education Facilities Program.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.197. Fund Release Process.

The OPSC will release State funds that have been apportioned by the Board pursuant to Sections 1859.195 and 1859.196 after submittal by the applicant of the Form SAB 50-05.

(a) If an Apportionment was made for a Career Technical Education Facilities Project, the applicant must submit a Form SAB 50-05 within 18 months of the Apportionment as outlined in Education Code Section 17076.10 or the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action.

(b) If Career Technical Education Facilities funds were reserved for the applicant pursuant to Section 1859.193(d) of these Regulations, the applicant:

(1) Has one year from the date of Apportionment to submit the CDE plan approval and DSA-approved plans and specifications, as required, to the OPSC for the Career Technical Education Facilities Project, otherwise the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action.

(2) Has 18 months from the date the CDE plan approval and DSA-approved plans and specifications, as needed, are submitted to the OPSC to submit a completed Form SAB 50-05 or the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action. If the district is requesting an Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.90.1 or 1859.90.2, the Board will

require that this time limit be reduced to no more than 90 days from the date of the Apportionment.

(c) For an Apportionment received pursuant to Section 1859.90.2 where submittal of the necessary CDE plan approval and/or DSA-approved plans and specifications were not required at the time the Board granted an unfunded approval, then the applicant:

(1) Has up to 12 months to submit the required approvals from the date of Apportionment. If the required submittal(s) is not received within 12 months, the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action and the Career Technical Education Facilities bond authority will return to the program for reallocation.

(2) The submittal date in (c)(1) shall start the 90-calendar-day fund release process in Section 1859.90.2.

(d) If the applicant requires a loan for the entire matching share requirement pursuant to Section 1859.194(b) of these Regulations:

(1) Subject to the availability of financing provided by the Pooled Money Investment Board for bond-funded projects, the OPSC will release ten percent of the Career Technical Education Facilities grant to the applicant within 30 calendar days of the Apportionment.

(2) The applicant has one year from the date of Apportionment to submit the CDE plan approval and DSA-approved plans and specifications, as required, to the OPSC for the Career Technical Education Facilities Project, otherwise the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action.

(3) The applicant has 18 months from the date in (d)(2) to submit a completed Form SAB 50-05 or the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action.

(e) If the district is requesting an Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.90.1 or 1859.90.2 and if the district is requesting funding as prescribed in Section 1859.71.6 or Section 1859.77.4, as applicable, then the district must submit the necessary approvals from the DSA and/or the CDE, as applicable, at least 90 days prior to requesting an Apportionment.

(f) If the district receives an Apportionment pursuant to (a) or (b) and if the district is requesting funding as prescribed in Section 1859.71.6 or Section 1859.77.4, as applicable, then the district must submit the necessary approvals from the DSA and/or the CDE, as applicable, at least 90 days prior to receiving an Apportionment.

(g) The applicant is subject to substantial progress time limit on the Apportionment as outlined in Education Code Section 17076.10(b).

(h) In the event the Board determines there is a fiscal emergency or crisis on the part of the State of California, the Board may grant an extension not to exceed 12 months to the time limit prescribed in (b)(1) and (d)(2) above and Section 1859.193(d). Regulation Section 1859.197(h) shall become inoperative January 1, 2010.

SAB 189 School District Appeal Request

The Health Science and Medical Technology CTE Project (55/75531-00-006) received a \$6 million apportionment from the State Allocation Board (SAB) on April 28, 2021. During development of the DSA approved plans, the project architect estimated the project costs to be nearly \$9.5 million. Because Dinuba Unified is a Financial Hardship district it is unable to provide, and prohibited from providing, funding for the project above the maximum State funding of \$6 million. As a result of this increased cost the District had to modify the project in order to deliver the CTE program as approved by CDE and the SAB/OPSC.

The District chose to modify the preliminary, conceptual, plans by removing a lobby and interior corridors, making minor changes to the medical rooms, and combining three small prep areas into one large central prep space that will serve all classrooms. These specific changes were made in order to reduce cost without adversely impacting the CTE program delivery. These changes preserved the integrity and original purpose of the CTE program, maintained the original number of classrooms constructed, and maintained the original number of students served. Additionally, the project does not exceed the construction cost or square footage provided on the CTE application and the SAB 50-10 form. These changes are all consistent with “CTE Change of Scope Projects” policy.

The District engaged CDE in March 2021, as required by the “CTE Change of Scope Projects” policy, and sent details regarding the proposed changes for review and approval. The CDE responded via email on April 6, 2021 and stated that as long as there were "no other programmatic changes, the requested changes are approved". There are no programmatic changes to this project, **and the District complied with all requirements within the “CTE Change of Scope Projects” policy (see attached).**

Both the Health Science and Medical Technology CTE Project (55/75531-00-006) and the Agriculture and Natural Resources CTE Project (55/75531-00-007) are located on a new high school site. As part of a comprehensive District-wide master Plan, the District will build a new High School and convert the existing high school to a middle school. The current High School is named Dinuba High School. When the new high school is completed it will take the name Dinuba High School and the old high school will be renamed as a middle school. All of the CTE application documents, including CDE, DSA, and SAB/OPSC contemplate the CTE project on a new site. The CTE grant applications, preliminary conceptual plans, DSA approved plans, and supporting documents all show the CTE projects on a new site, regardless of the names of the schools.

The CTE projects were always planned for the new high school site. The CTE Grant applications were submitted in this manner and the CDE approved the projects on the new site. The District is unaware of any reason why this confusion would affect the approval and funding of these projects. The SAB approval of the projects appears to exactly match the projects as they will be built.

CTE Change of Scope Projects

Background: Proposition 51 provided \$500 million to fund the construction of Career Technical Education (CTE) program classrooms and purchase CTE-related equipment. Funds were made available to interested school districts and regional occupational programs (ROP) through a competitive application process. CTE projects were eligible for funding based on their score.

Since the score of the CTE application was based on the program elements, construction design and/or equipment needs of the project, applicants were expected to execute the construction project in a manner consistent with the application.

Problem Definition: However, as projects evolved from the conceptual planning stage, school districts expressed a need for flexibility within the parameters of the CTE applications. Since the time of the original application submission, some applicants were able to further refine their projects which typically resulted in more effective building designs and relevant equipment purchases. As a result, applicants may change of scope of their original CTE projects provided that CDE and OPSC reviews and approves the request.

What constitutes a change of scope?

For equipment: any significant changes or modifications to the original equipment list would require a change of scope request to CDE and OPSC.

For buildings: significant changes to the instruction areas or supporting components, overall change in building design, or change in building designation would constitute a change of scope request. A shift in the location of the program components would not necessarily constitute a change of scope request.

Please consult with John Gordon to determine whether your proposed change would need to be reviewed and approved by CDE and OPSC.

Change of Scope Guidelines: The California Department of Education (CDE) and the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) will consider changes to the original CTE projects based on the following conditions:

- Any building and/or equipment changes requested should be consistent with the scope of the original application.
- Changes should not negatively affect the number of students served as listed in the original CTE application.
- The result of the modification does not exceed the construction cost or square footage provided on the CTE application and the SAB 50-10 form.

ATTACHMENT B

Change of Scope Process:

The school district/ROP should submit the following items to the CDE for review:

1. Narrative explaining the nature of change of scope and justification of why the change is needed.
2. Comparison between the original project and the proposed change.
3. Explanation of how the change will impact the implementation of the CTE program as stated in the CTE application.
4. Documentation that the local CTE advisory committee met and approved the change of scope.
5. If applicable, architectural drawings of the original project and modified project or spreadsheet illustrating the equipment changes.

The School Facilities Planning Division will work with the Secondary, Postsecondary, Adult Leadership Division to review the request and ensure the changes are consistent with the original application and Education Code 17078.72(a). CDE will provide a recommendation and forward the request to OPSC.

On December 17, 2021, the District submitted the project plan approval letters for the Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) projects at Dinuba High School for application numbers 55/75531-00-006 and 55/75531-00-007. These documents are required to be submitted within 12 months of an apportionment for CTEFP projects that were approved as a reservation of funds. School Facility Regulations state that the submittal of these documents allows the District to submit a fund release request within 90 days from the plan approvals submittal date. However, Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) staff is not able to administratively approve the continued processing of these funding applications due to a change of project scope for the Health Science facility in application -006 and the change in location for both projects. As a result, the District must submit a *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189) for the State Allocation Board's (Board) consideration of these changes.

Reduction in Square Footage

During the review, OPSC observed that the square footage of the facilities in the Health Science project (-006) was reduced by 4,219 square feet. Upon request, the District submitted a narrative description of the reason for the change in design, which OPSC learned had already been reviewed and approved by the CA Department of Education (CDE) in April 2021. The original project scope, as described in the CTEFP application, was approved by the Board. Therefore, any scope changes may also require approval by the Board. Considering the significant change in the size of the project facilities, OPSC staff has determined that this change request must be submitted to the Board for consideration, as OPSC staff does not have the administrative authority to approve it.

As noted above, the vehicle for submitting such a request is the *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189). The District must submit a completed Form SAB 189 to OPSC to request the Board to consider its change of scope for the Health Science CTE project (-006). The Form SAB 189 should include details such as what was included in the previously submitted narrative.

Project Cost Estimate

In the narrative for the change of scope, the District states that the reduction in square footage was for budgetary reasons. In order to support the new project scope, the District must also submit an updated cost estimate for the -006 project with consideration of the site development grants previously provided for the *New High School* site on new construction application number 50/75531-00-006.

Projects Site Location

In addition, OPSC observed that the submitted CDE Plan Approval letters lists the school site as *New Dinuba High School*. Based on the original CTEFP applications, including the CDE grant application, OPSC processed the applications as if the new facilities would be built on the existing Dinuba High School campus. In a re-review, OPSC is unable to find any reference to an alternate location in the grant application. The submitted Division of the State Architect (DSA)-approved plans confirm that the new facilities are located on the proposed new high school campus for which new construction funding was previously provided under separate funding applications. Therefore, it is OPSC's conclusion that the site location of both projects (-006 and -007) has changed since the initial submittal and Board approval of the corresponding funding applications.

A change in site location is not within the OPSC's administrative authority to approve. In order to proceed with the project as designed on the new high school site, the District must also request approval from the Board to change the location of the approved CTEFP projects.

Hold on Fund Release

As mentioned above, OPSC is not able to accept the CDE and DSA project approvals as submitted which would allow for the submittal and processing of a fund release for these two projects. Thus, the 12-month time limit on Apportionment has not yet been fulfilled. OPSC recommends and encourages the District to submit a Form SAB 189 no later than April 28, 2022, consistent with the original 12-month deadline for plan approval submittal. Submittal of the Form SAB 189 by this date will allow OPSC to administratively stop the 12-month clock until the District's request can be considered by the Board.

This application is placed on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) pursuant to the Board's action on March 11, 2009. This approval does not constitute a guarantee or commitment of future state funding.

The Applicant is required to submit a signed Grant Agreement pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation Section 1859.90.4 for the project prior to or concurrent with a request for the release of funds.

The state's portion of any and all project savings realized from the funding of a Career Technical Education Facilities Program project must be returned to the state pursuant to School Facility Program Regulation Section 1859.199.

The Applicant shall ensure that it is in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and certifications it made on the program forms.

The Applicant is responsible for ensuring that the project is compliant with Prevailing Wage Monitoring and/or Labor Compliance Program requirements at the time construction contracts are executed and/or construction commenced.

The Applicant has requested a Reservation of Funds. CHARTER SCHOOL FACILITIES PROGRAM EXTENSION TO CONVERSION DEADLINE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present Libertas College Prep's (Applicant) request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline for its Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) new construction project.

DESCRIPTION

Applicants participating in the CSFP must convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment (PSCA) to an adjusted grant apportionment within a four-year period pursuant to School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.166. This item requests a one-year extension to the conversion deadline for the Applicant's new construction project, application number 54/64733-00-102, pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.166.1.

AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

The CSFP provides PCSAs (reservations of bond authority) for new construction and rehabilitation projects. The PCSA for a CSFP project must be converted within a four-year period to an adjusted grant apportionment meeting all the SFP Regulation requirements, unless a single one-year extension is granted by the State Allocation Board (Board).

Applicants may request the Board to approve a single one-year extension. The request will be approved when the Applicant meets the criteria in (a) or (b):

- a) The charter school has provided evidence of both of the following:
 - The California Department of Education (CDE) has made a contingent or final approval of the proposed site; and,
 - The Division of the State Architect (DSA) has confirmed that the final plans for the project have been submitted to the DSA for review and approval.
- b) Other evidence satisfactory to the Board justifying the extension.

STAFF ANALYSIS/COMMENTS

The project will consist of purchasing a site within the Los Angeles Unified School District and constructing a new school. The Applicant is requesting an extension due

to delays caused by challenges in locating a site and Covid-19. The Applicant anticipates identifying a site by late Summer 2022 and receiving final site approval from the CDE by late Fall 2022. The Applicant plans on submitting plans to CDE and the DSA by Winter 2022, and receiving final plan approval from DSA and CDE, entering into escrow for the site and submitting a complete conversion application to the Office of Public School Construction by May 2023. The current conversion deadline for the project is May 23, 2022. If approved the new deadline will be May 23, 2023.

Staff has reviewed the Applicant's request (Attachment B) and determined that it provides satisfactory evidence to justify the extension. Staff supports the Applicant's request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Applicant's request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline. Require that the PCSA for application number 54/64733-00-102 be converted to a final apportionment by May 23, 2023, or the PCSA will be rescinded, and the bond authority returned to the CSFP.

- (a) A complete request to convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment to a Final Charter School Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.165 shall be made within four years of the date of the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment unless the Charter School received approval of an extension pursuant to Section 1859.166.1.
- (b) If (a) is not met, and the Charter School has not received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:
 - (1) the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the Charter School, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (2) the SFP New Construction Eligibility will be increased by the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 for the school district that physically contains the Charter School within its geographical boundaries.
- (c) If (a) is not met, and the Charter School has received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:
 - (1) The Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the Charter School, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (2) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(a) shall be reduced to cost incurred and closed-out pursuant to Section 1859.106 with a corresponding SFP new construction baseline eligibility adjustment for the pupils assigned to the Preliminary Charter School Application. The adjustment to the baseline eligibility shall be based on the ratio of the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 and the project capacity which generated the project funding to the eligible expenditures. Any funds released are subject to the fifty percent local matching share requirement as required by EC 17078.54(d). Funds returned pursuant to Section 1859.106 shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (3) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(b) shall be subject to the provisions of Section 1859.171.

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

The original multipurpose building and attached lunch shelter at the Crenshaw High school site were designed in the late 1960s and contains concrete bearing shear walls with reinforced brick masonry structural elements. A report by Miyamoto International, Inc., dated November 23, 2011, examines the multipurpose building identifies several structural deficiencies in the original structure. The report references material insufficiencies with the building including the wall anchorage systems and load path transfer systems that render the facilities at high risk of collapse in the event of seismic activity. The buildings qualify for the SMP based on the qualifying criteria in Education Code Section 17075.10 and SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2.

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The scope of this project includes the demolition and replacement of the enclosed area of the multipurpose room building.

STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

Construction was completed in 2021 and the building is open for occupancy to students and staff.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA

GOVERNMENT/STATE LEVEL CONCURRENCE

The lunch building and food service area was classified as a Most Vulnerable Category 2 Building type as defined in SFP regulations and has met qualifying criteria of the SMP. The Division of the State Architect (DSA) has approved the District for Phase One (Eligibility Evaluation), Phase Two (Replacement Option Analysis) and final plan approval. These approvals enable the District to apply for funding from the Board.

AUTHORITY

Seismic Mitigation Program – Replacement Projects (as of August 31, 2020)

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(a) states:

A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states, “A school district may apply for Facility Hardship, including Seismic Mitigation, Program assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances that have caused an imminent health and safety threat.”

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2 states that “A school district is eligible for funding to repair, reconstruct, or replace the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings which were originally constructed to be used as School Facilities and pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of seismic activity. Program eligibility is determined by the Division of the State Architect while determination of grant funding is determined by the Board based on the following criteria.

Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding. Any grants provided for the purpose of this section shall be provided as a new construction project and allocated on a 50 percent state share basis.”

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2(a) states,

- (a) Seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:
- (1) The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;
 - (2) The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval;
 - (3) The School Building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and
 - (4) The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. The structural engineers report shall conform to the guidelines prepared by the DSA, in accordance with Education Code Section 17310.

If the unacceptable risk of injury is due to the presence of faulting, liquefaction or landslide, these hazards must be documented by a geological hazards report prepared by an engineering geologist in accordance with California Building Code, Part 2, Chapter 18, section 1803A and with concurrence of the California Geological Survey

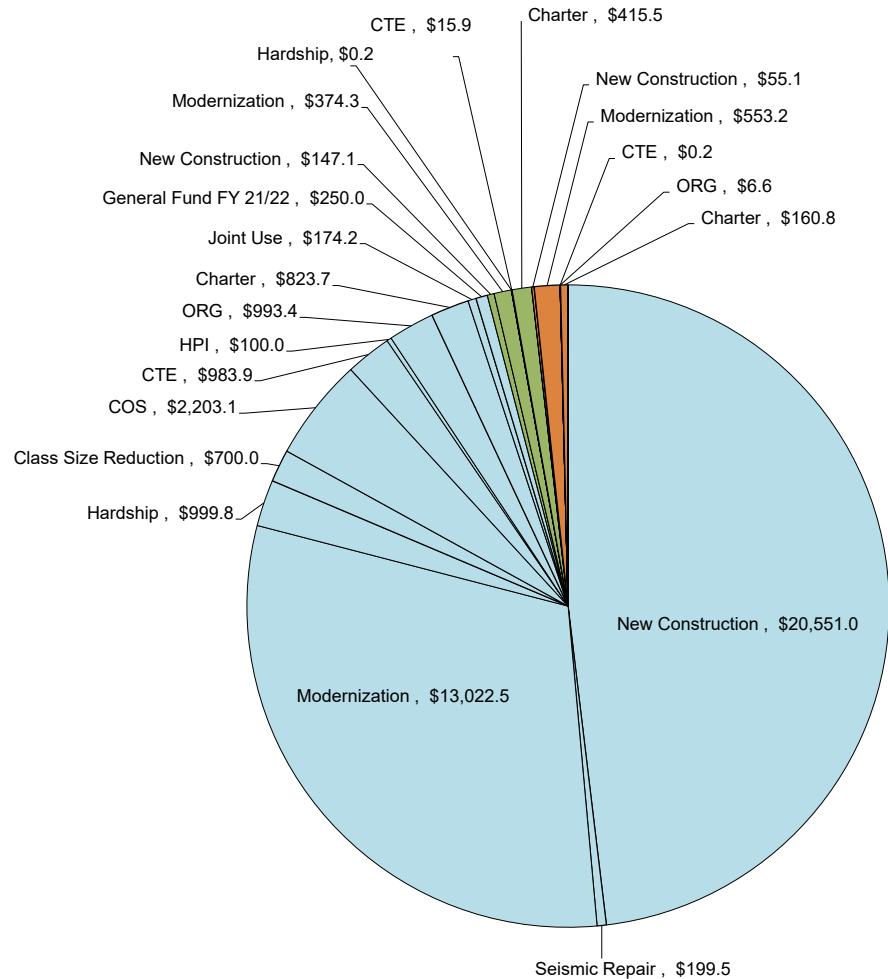

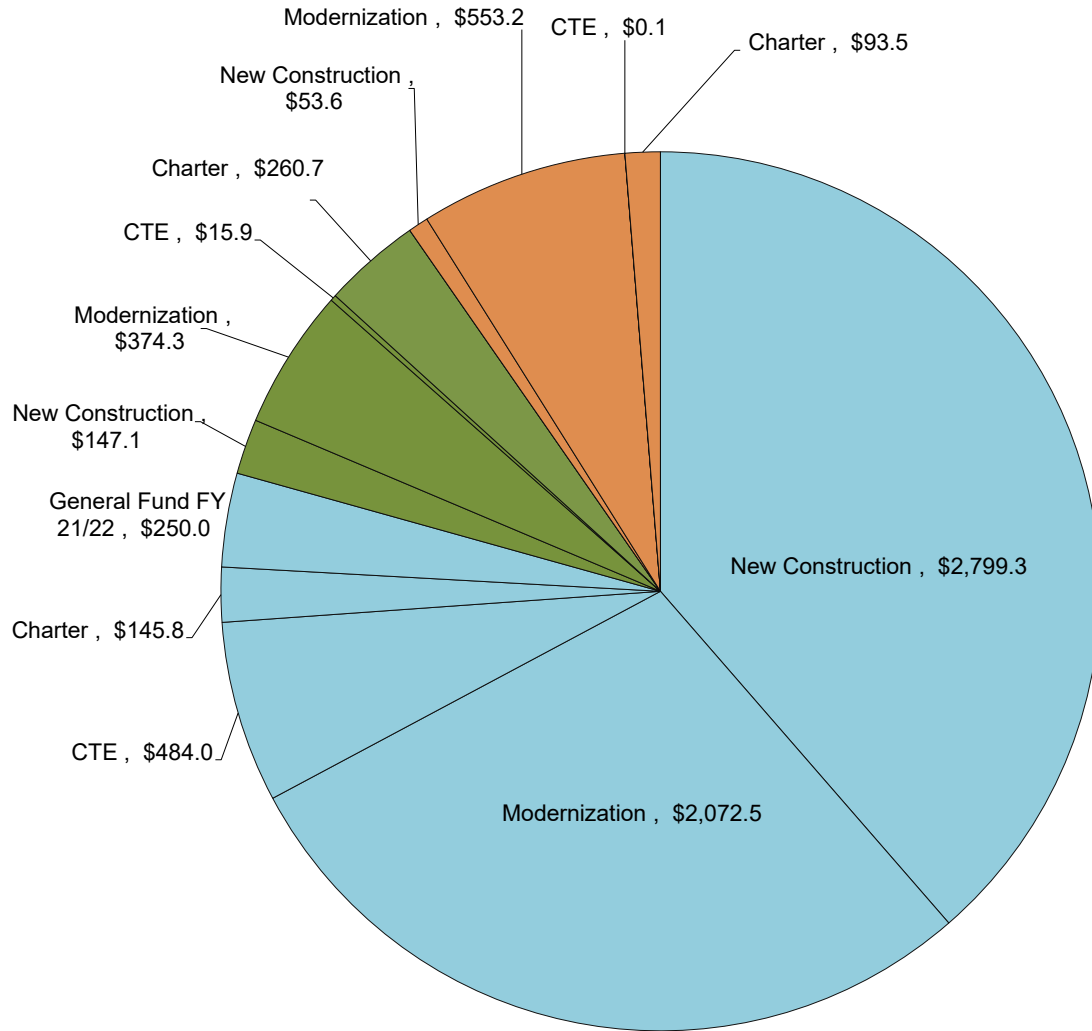

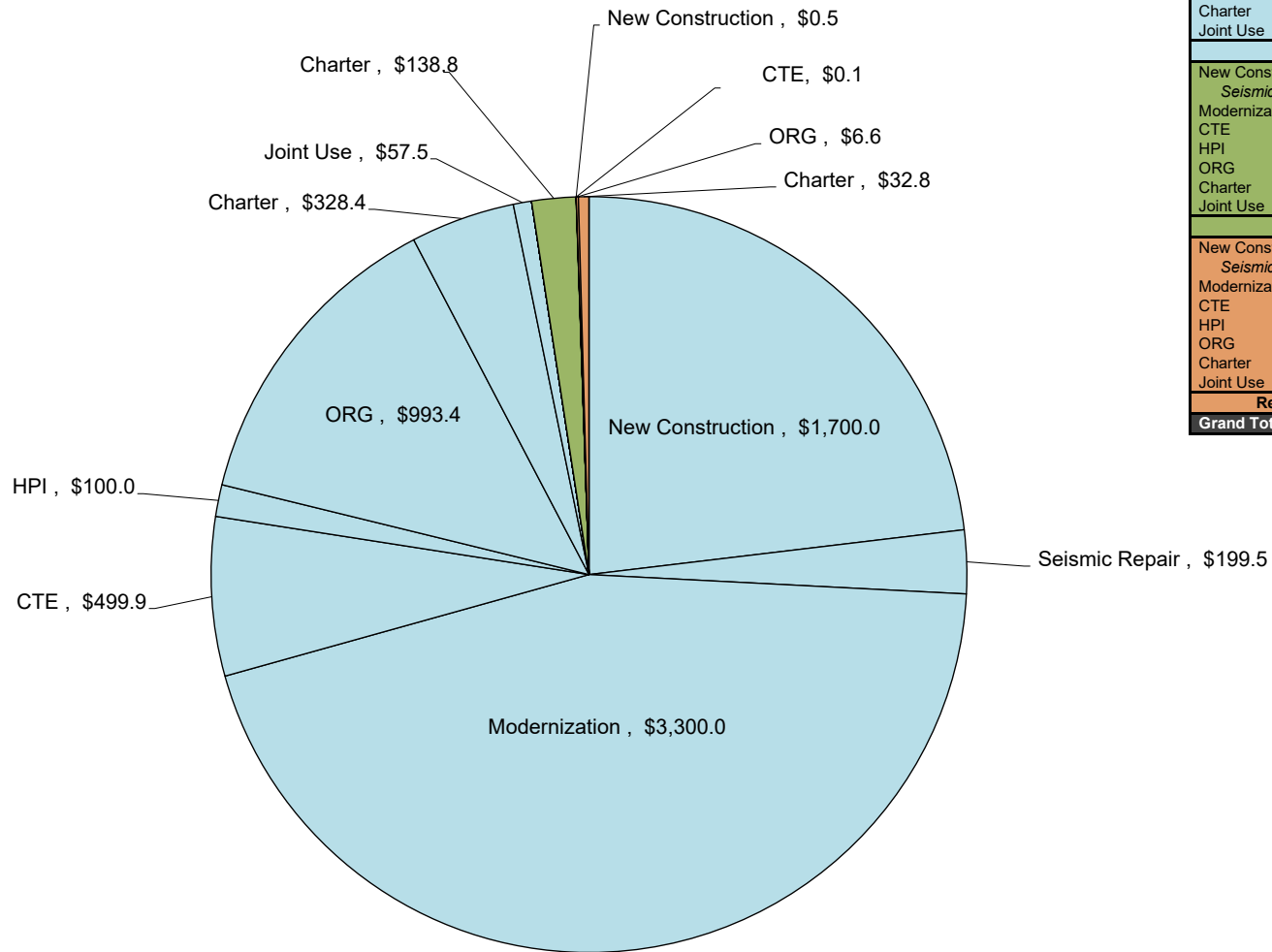
Proposition 51 Bond Authority - \$7.250 billion

Proposition 1D Bond Authority - \$7.358 billion (in millions of dollars)

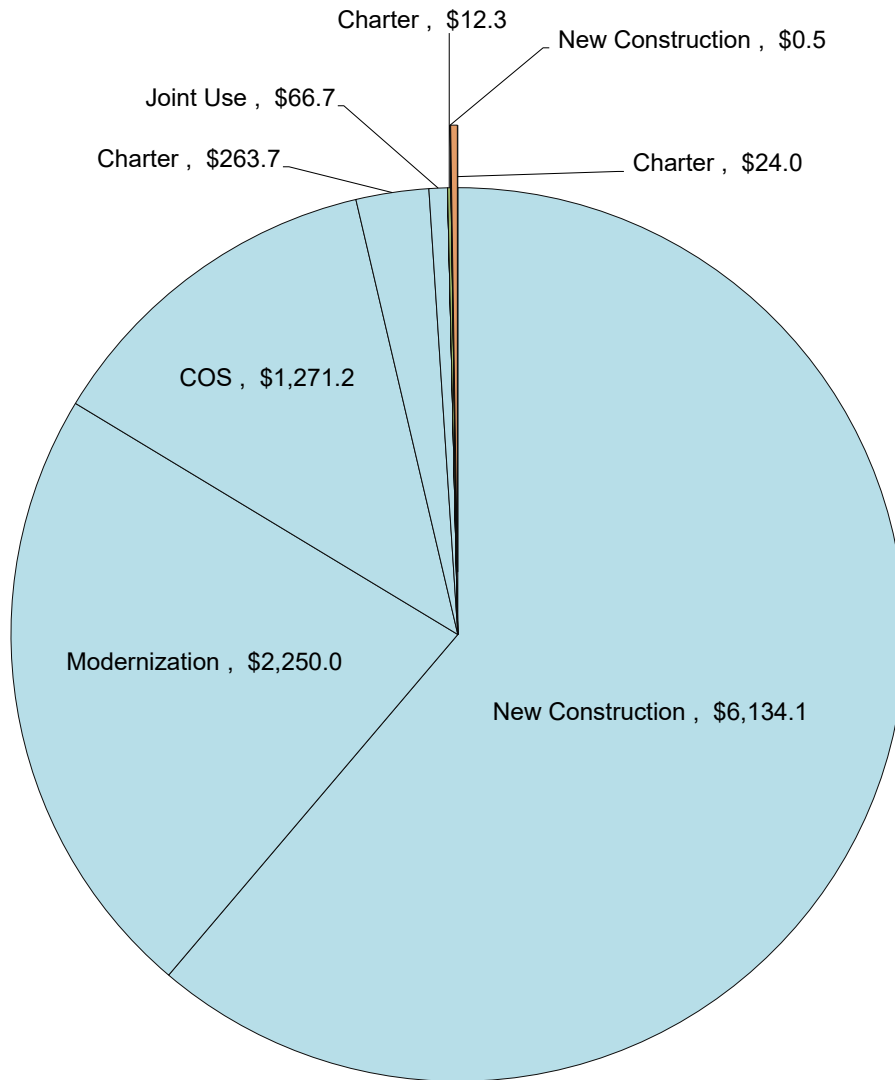

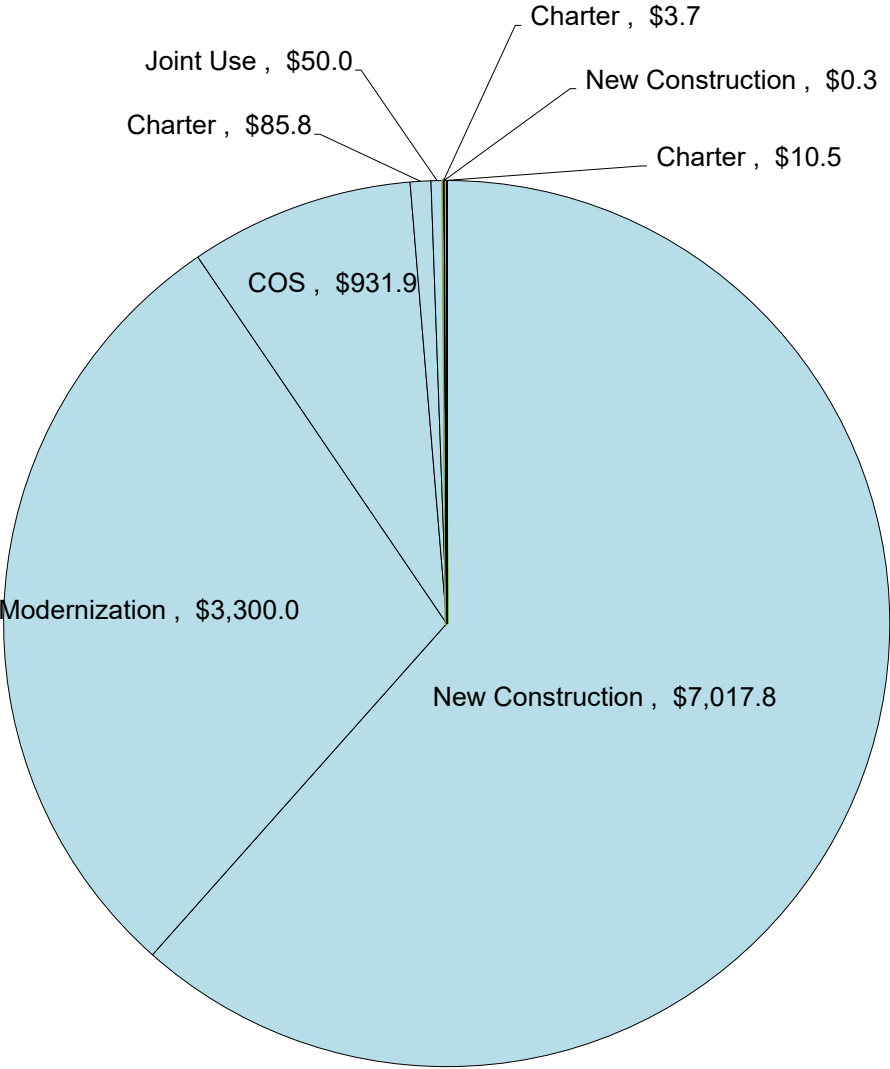

Proposition 47 Bond Authority - \$11.400 billion

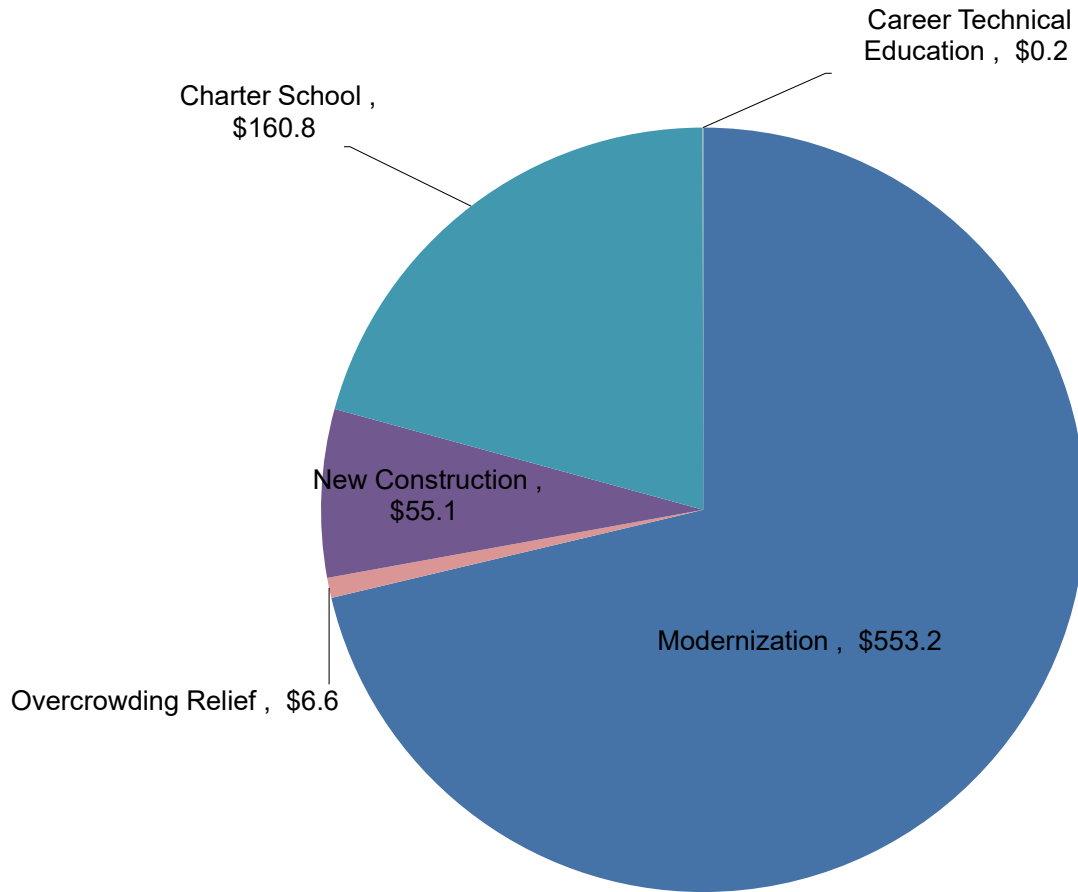

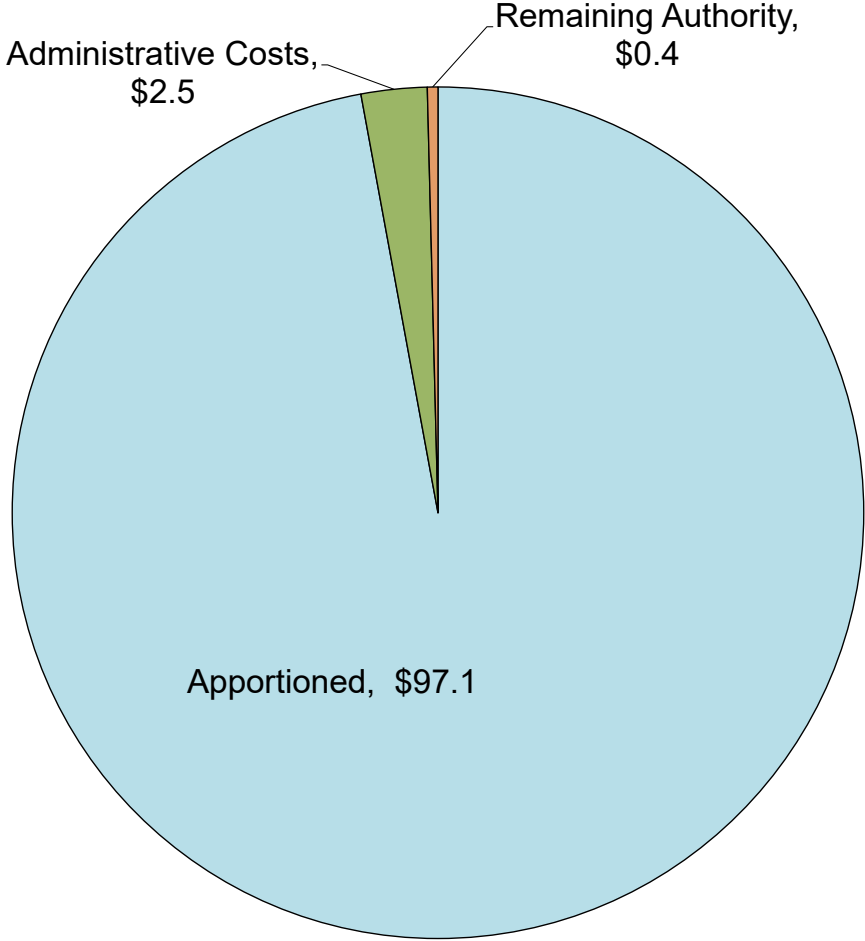

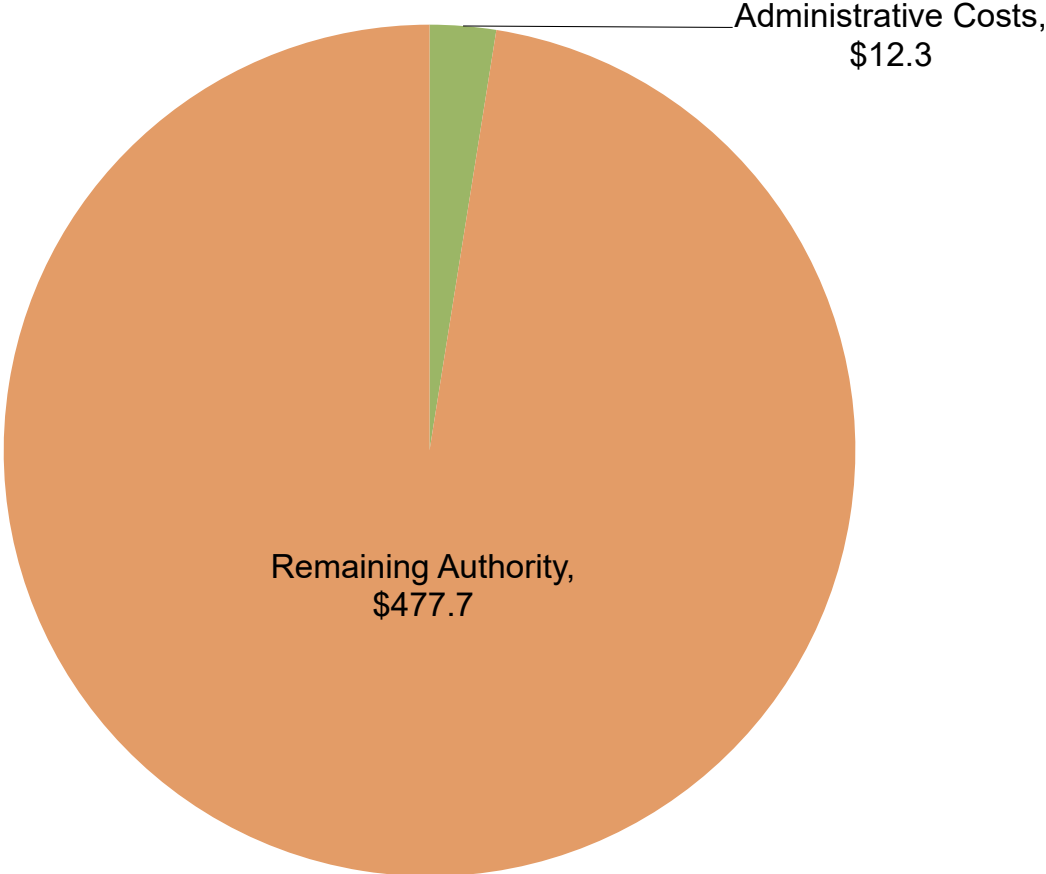
Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (FDKFGP)

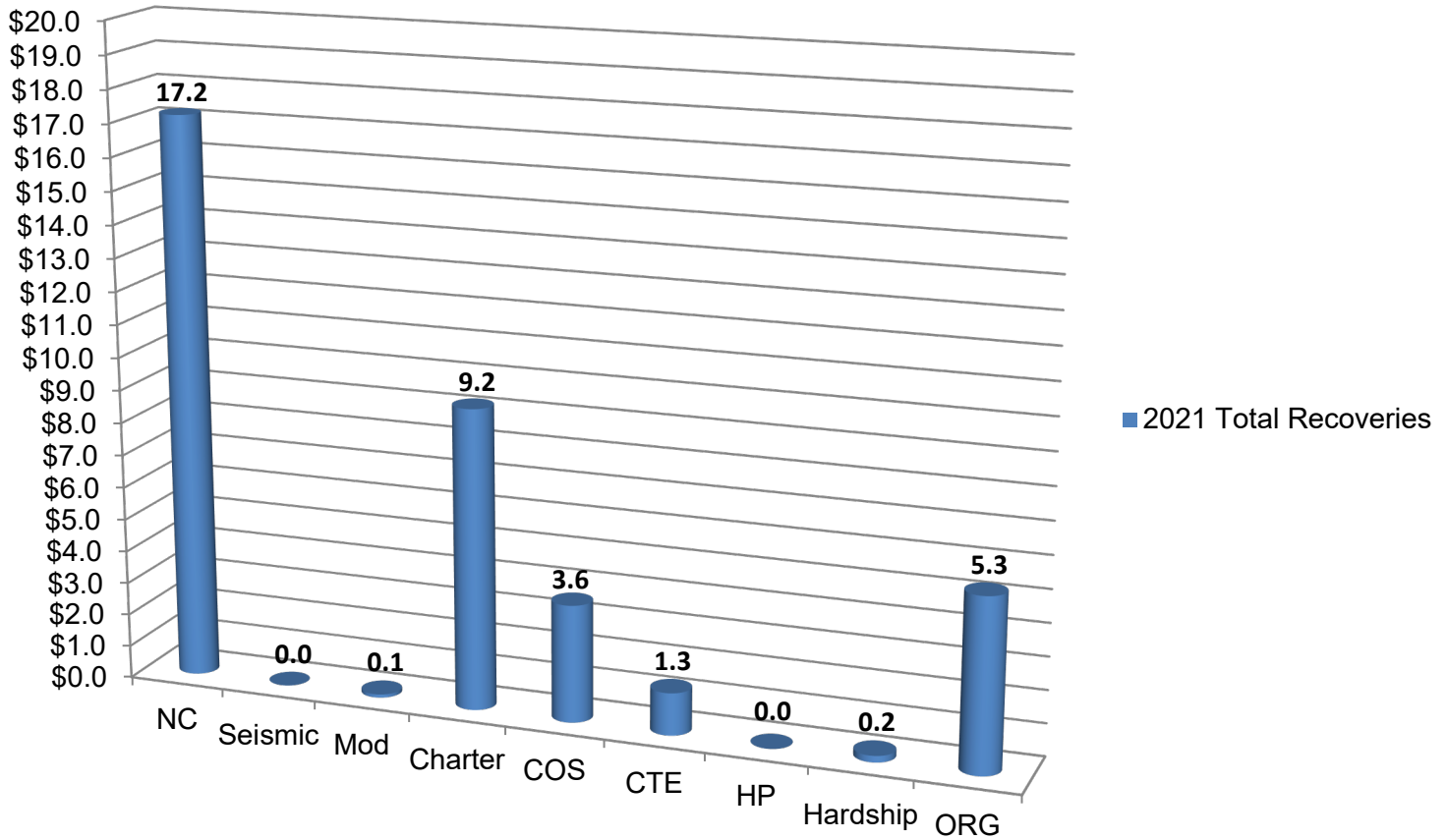

Fund Recoveries* – 2021 (Totals represented in millions of dollars)



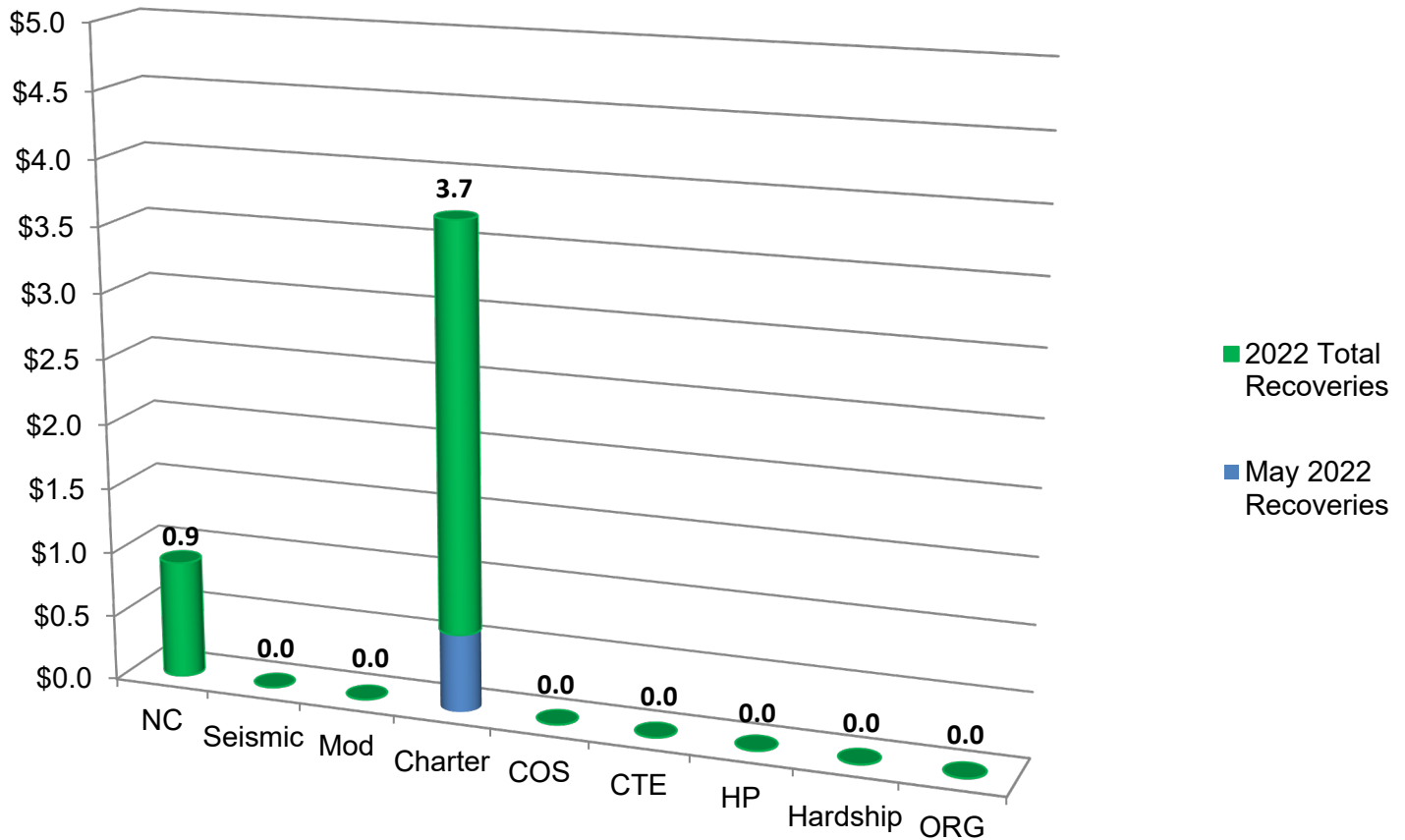

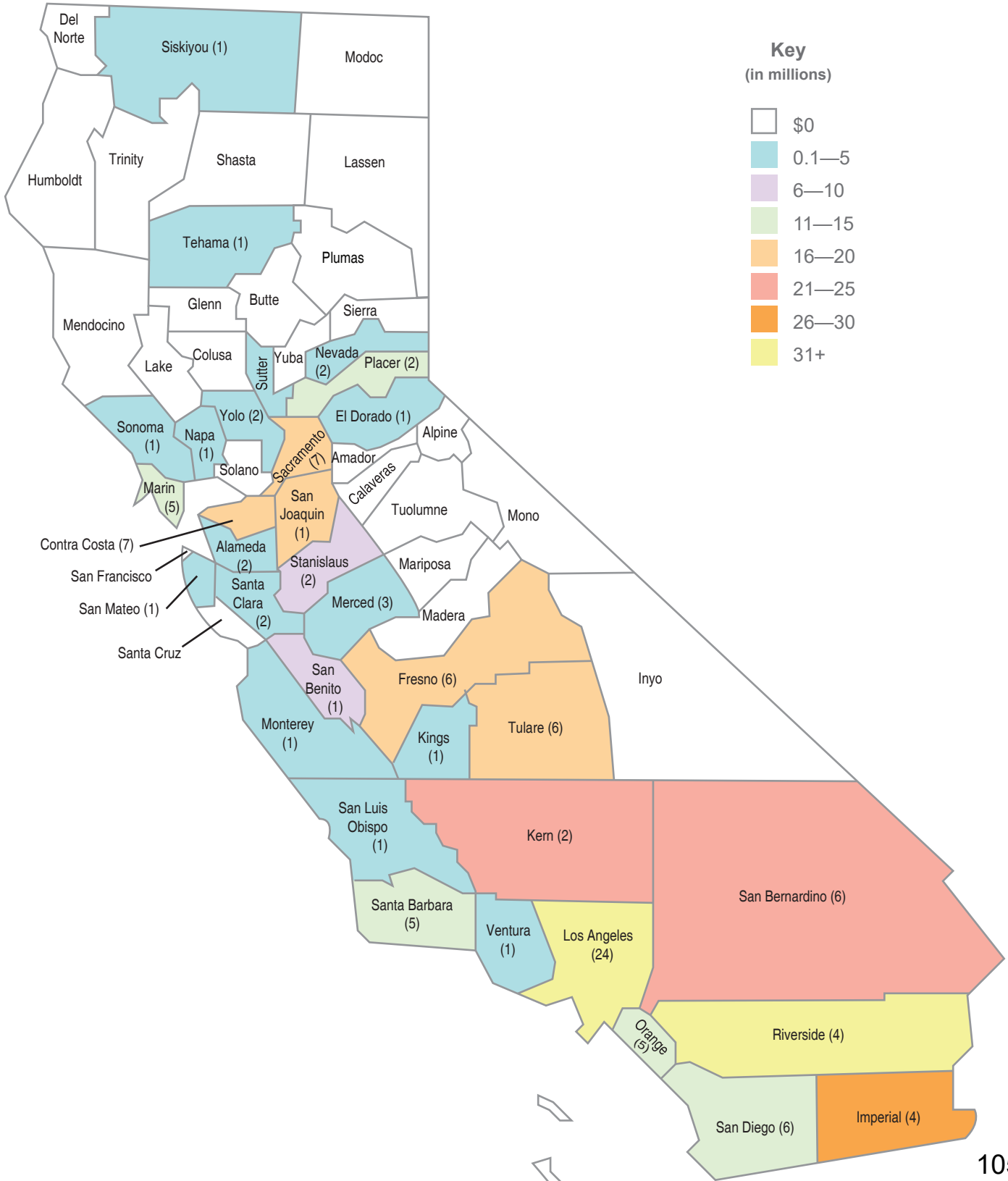
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Apportionments by County

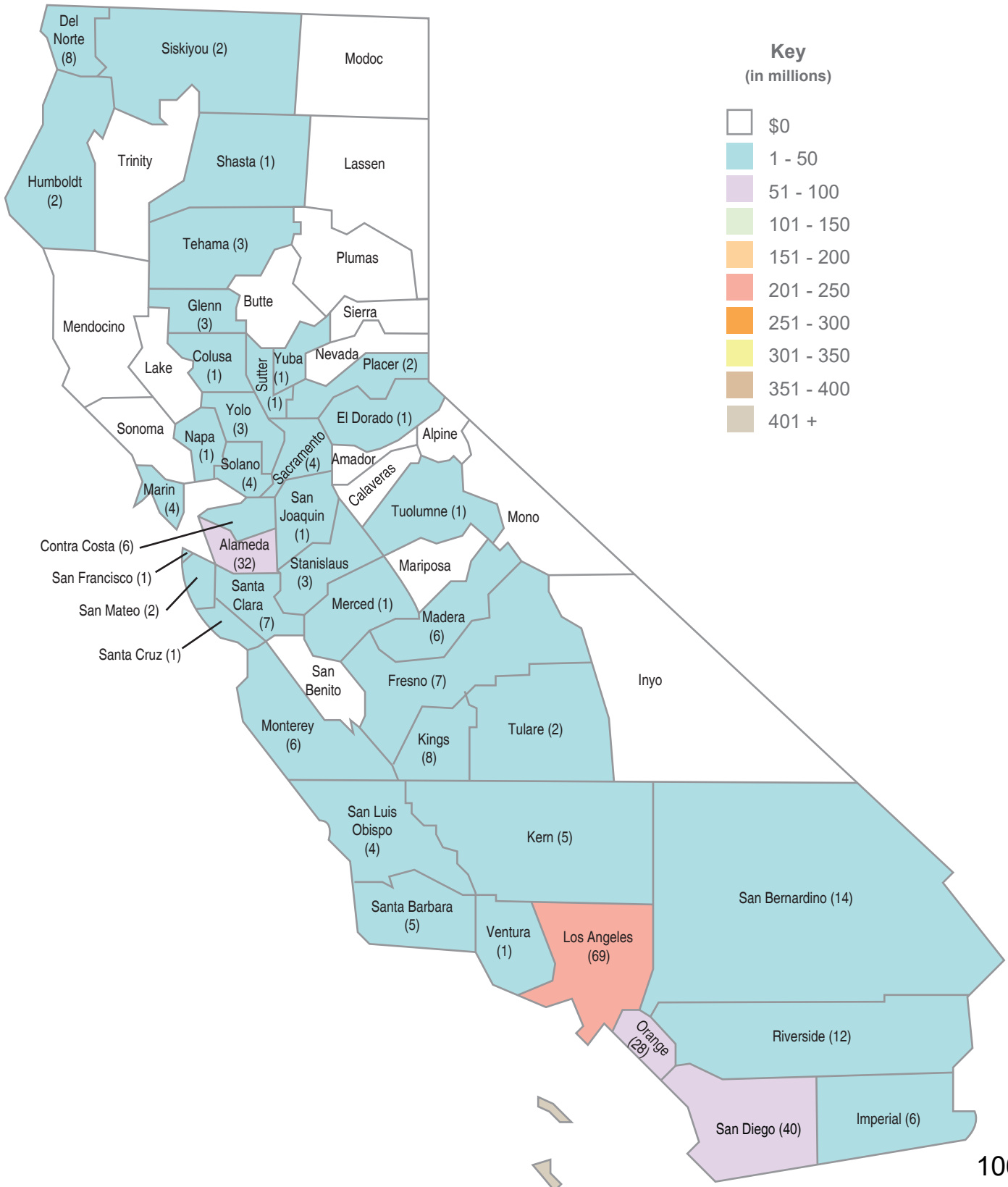
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Unfunded Approvals by County

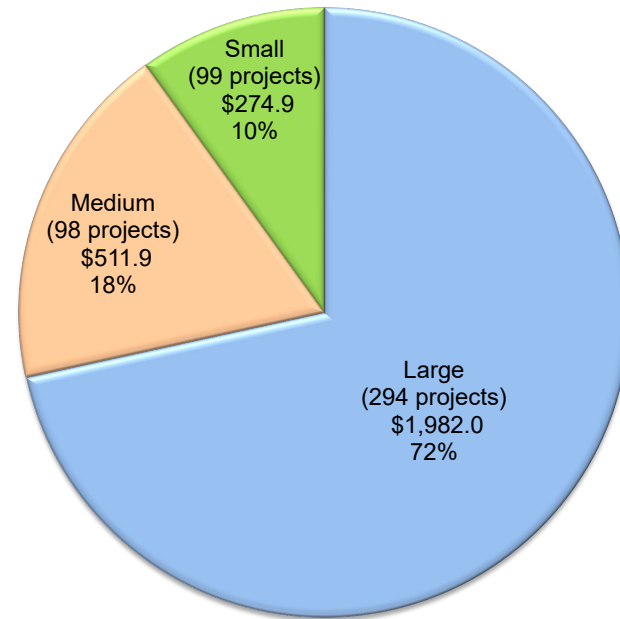

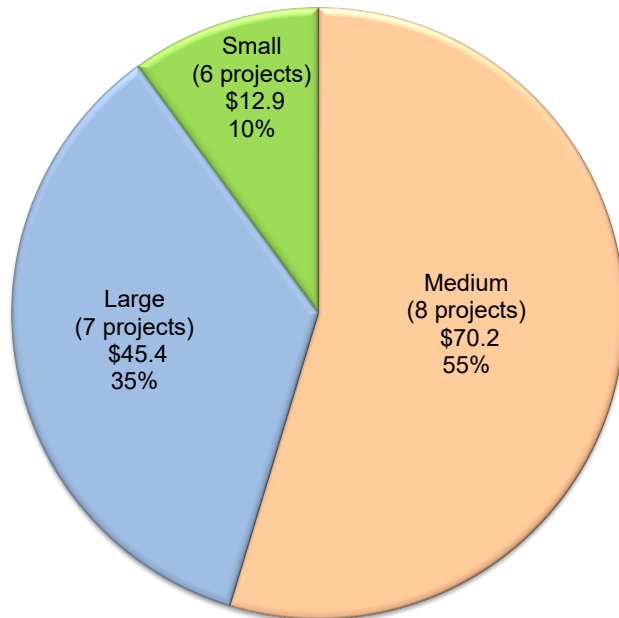

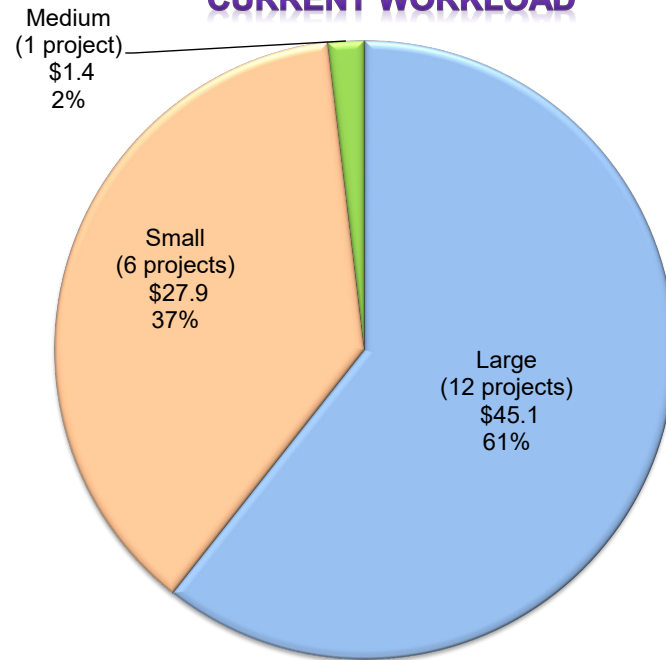

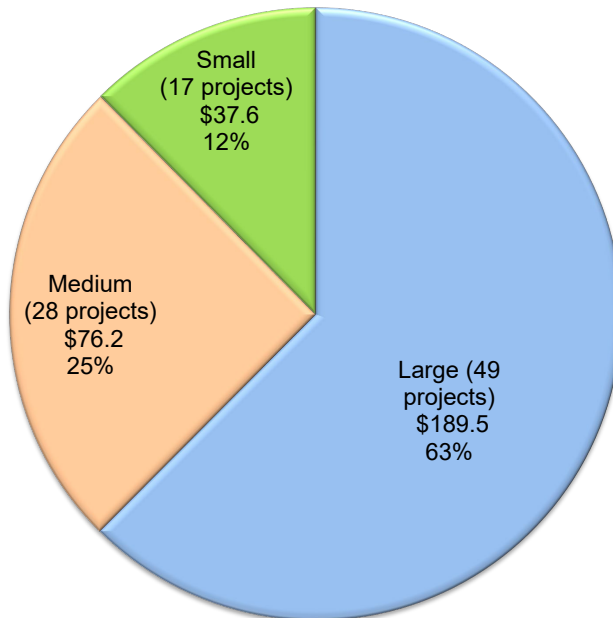

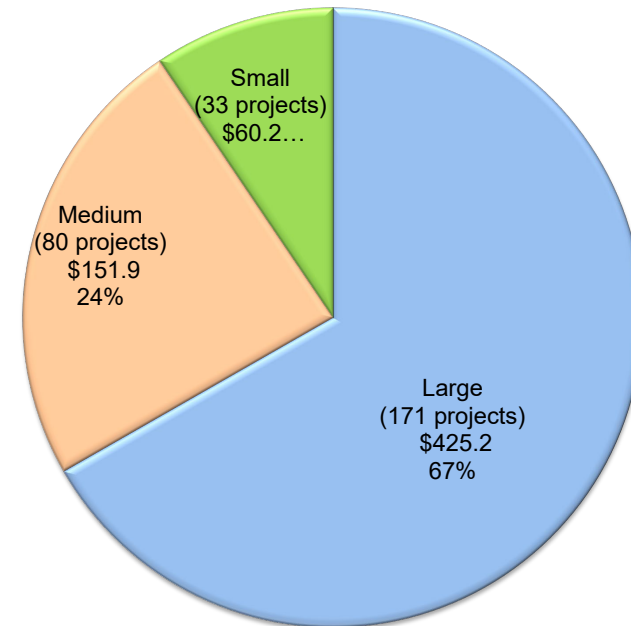

PIGGYBACK CONTRACTS AND PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE COMPLIANCE RELATED TO
MODULAR SCHOOL FACILITIES

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present a follow-up item to the February 23, 2022 State Allocation Board meeting regarding piggyback contracts and Public Contract Code (PCC) compliance relative to modular school facilities.

DESCRIPTION

At the February 2006 State Allocation Board (Board) meeting, staff presented the Attorney General's (AG) Opinion 05-405 dated January 24, 2006, which concluded that school districts must competitively bid contracts to acquire modular school facilities for installation on a permanent foundation (Attachment 1). At the direction of the Board at the January and February 2006 meetings, staff provided numerous notices to ensure that school districts were aware that all contracts related to acquisition and installation of permanent modular facilities signed after January 25, 2006, must be competitively bid to receive funding consideration by the Board. (Attachment 2)

As a result of recent communications between staff and stakeholders, staff has learned that alternate interpretations of the AG opinion to acquire and install school facilities exist. On February 23, 2022, Staff presented the State Allocation Board (Board) with a copy of the original Board reports and the AG's opinion dated January 24, 2006, to remind all stakeholders of the PCC requirements.

The Board requested that Staff prepare a follow-up item to the report presented at the February 2022 meeting that discusses the following question:

- Should school districts be allowed to use piggyback contracts for modular school facilities?

AUTHORITY

PCC Section 100

The Legislature finds and declares that placing all public contract law in one code will make that law clearer and easier to find. Further, it is the intent of the Legislature in enacting this code to achieve the following objectives:

- (a) To clarify the law with respect to competitive bidding requirements.
- (b) To ensure full compliance with competitive bidding statutes as a means of protecting the public from misuse of public funds.
- (c) To provide all qualified bidders with a fair opportunity to enter the bidding process, thereby stimulating competition in a manner conducive to sound fiscal practices.
- (d) To eliminate favoritism, fraud, and corruption in the awarding of public contracts.

PCC Section 1100

"Public entity," as used in this part, means the state, county, city, city and county, district, public authority, public agency, municipal corporation, or any other political subdivision or public corporation in the state.

PCC Section 1101

"Public works contract," as used in this part, means an agreement for the erection, construction, alteration, repair, or improvement of any public structure, building, road, or other public improvement of any kind.

AUTHORITY (cont.)

PCC Section 20118

Notwithstanding Sections 20111 and 20112, the governing board of any school district, without advertising for bids, if the board has determined it to be in the best interests of the district, may authorize by contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, any public corporation or agency, including any county, city, town, or district, to lease data-processing equipment, purchase materials, supplies, equipment, automotive vehicles, tractors, and other personal property for the district in the manner in which the public corporation or agency is authorized by law to make the leases or purchases from a vendor. Upon receipt of the personal property, if the property complies with the specifications set forth in the contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, the school district may draw a warrant in favor of the public corporation or agency for the amount of the approved invoice, including the reasonable costs to the public corporation or agency for furnishing the services incidental to the lease or purchase of the personal property, or the school district may make payment directly to the vendor. Alternatively, if there is an existing contract between a public corporation or agency and a vendor for the lease or purchase of the personal property, a school district may authorize the lease or purchase of personal property directly from the vendor by contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order and make payment to the vendor under the same terms that are available to the public corporation or agency under the contract.

PCC Section 20111

School districts are required to competitively bid any contract equal to or greater than:

- \$50,000 for non-public works contracts identified as the purchase or lease of equipment, materials, or supplies; non-construction related services; or repairs or maintenance that would not be considered public contracts
- \$15,000 for public projects (as defined under PCC Section 22002 to include the erection, alteration, or renovation of a publicly owned or leased facility).

The districts with contracts that meet or exceed the above cost parameters are required to let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

In brief, the AG opinion focuses on the definition of “personal property” in PCC section 20118 which provides one of the few exceptions to the competitive bidding requirements for contracts awarded by school districts. It specifies that “building structures to be permanently affixed to land do not have the characteristics of the listed ‘personal property’” [in Public Contract Code section 20118].” The opinion, citing applicable statutes and caselaw, further notes that once permanently affixed, such structures constitute real property and not personal property. The principal conclusion thus remains that if the classrooms are affixed onto a permanent foundation, they are considered real property and their acquisition and construction must be competitively bid.

In response to Staff’s presentation and several stakeholders’ reaction to this report, the Board requested that Staff prepare an additional item for a future Board meeting that would discuss the following question:

Should school districts be allowed to use piggyback contracts for modular school facilities?

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

School District Perspectives

Interpretation of Statute - Recently, it has become evident that school districts have differing opinions on the types of acquisition and construction that can be allowed using piggyback contracts and have sought clarification from Staff. Stakeholders have stated that the construction of modular components offsite, then transported to the school site, is similar to portable relocatable facilities. Therefore, because the building components can be transported, they should be considered personal property, and that piggyback contracting is permissible.

Cost/Time Savings – School districts have also indicated the use of piggyback bidding saves money and lowers the amount of time needed to complete a project by:

- Piggybacking the bid from an originating entity that sought a low bid, then using the same bid to award their construction contracts, takes advantage of potential lower per-building costs through economy-of-scale.
- Eliminating the PCC Section 20112 requirement to solicit for construction bids at least once a week for two weeks.
- Eliminating the need for interviews and a legal review of bid packages for compliance with submittal requirements prior to award.
- Eliminates the need for school districts to hire employees with experience in creating and evaluating requests for bids and submitted bid packages.

OPSC does not have data on cost or time savings with the use of piggyback bids.

Staff's Analysis

Per the Board's direction, Staff looked closely at the issue and notes the following considerations that may be relevant should the Legislature decide to consider a change to the PCC to explicitly allow school districts to use piggyback contracts for modular school facilities.

Considerations

- Currently, the PCC defines a public works project as an agreement for the erection, construction, alteration, repair, or improvement of any public structure, building, road, or other public improvement of any kind that is entered into by a public entity. PCC defines a "public entity" as "the state, county, city, city and county, district, public authority, public agency, municipal corporation, or any other political subdivision or public corporation in the state." **Simply authorizing school districts to enter into piggyback bid contracts is outside the authority of the Board. Any changes to the PCC would require Legislative action to add, remove, or amend the statutes.**
- The statute governing the PCC consistently emphasizes competitive bidding as the desired contracting practice for most public entities including school districts and only includes limited exceptions including PCC sections 20113 for certain emergency repairs and 20118 for "personal property". Adding an additional exclusion from the competitive bidding requirements for contracts for modular school facilities would require a change to the PCC statute. Other contracting methods that are alternatives to traditional competitive bidding are specifically authorized in statute.
- School districts have expressed to OPSC on several occasions that piggybacking contracts for buildings is an effective cost saving strategy. As Staff noted in a December 2004 report to the Board, by piggybacking onto another district's construction contract, "a district can take advantage of lower per-building costs realized through economy of scale and also avoid the time and expense of the public bid process."

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

On the other hand, piggybacking on existing contracts between other school districts and modular companies may result in certain modular companies receiving a disproportionate percentage of modular contract work throughout the state as many school districts may piggyback off of the same contract for several years. This may cause a decrease in competition in the modular manufacturing landscape, which could reduce competitive pricing and could prevent school districts from obtaining the lowest price possible in future years. This contradicts the intent of PCC Section 100 of the governing statutes.

Additionally, after a piggyback contract has been awarded, school districts can continue to work with the modular company to add/subtract enhancements to the base bid rate to customize the modular classroom to suit their needs. The back and forth process to set the final purchase price can take months to complete and negate the potential time savings.

At the February 2006 meeting, the Board asked how a school district would know if they were getting the best price if the project does not go out to bid. The Board also expressed concern with the optics of piggyback bidding as it related to a full and open competition.

However, costs of construction have been increasing, as evidenced by the change in the Construction Cost Index adopted earlier this year. School Districts maintain that even saving a few months in the contract process can result in necessary cost savings on construction projects in the current environment.

- Staff has an obligation to ensure that state funding in general, and general obligation bond funding specifically, are administered properly and in compliance with all laws pertaining to the construction or modernization of school facilities. As Staff noted in a December 2004 item, school districts' "contractual arrangements by which projects are constructed using state bond funding are governed by law and are not generally subject to SAB [State Allocation Board] regulation or oversight. However, the integrity of the use of general obligation bonds allocated by the SAB must be above reproach."

Conclusion

In 2006 the Board chose to follow the legal opinions of both Board counsel and the AG's Office as it relates to use of piggyback contracts for modular construction.

However, if the Legislature believes the benefits of using piggyback contracts for modular construction outweigh the current restrictions in the PCC, the Legislature could propose amendments through the Legislative process to clarify or provide exceptions to the PCC for public works projects using modular construction.

Absent further Board direction or a statutory change, Staff is obligated to maintain the direction of the Board at the February 2006 meeting. Projects that use piggyback contracts for modular construction would be ineligible for state funding.

OPTIONS

As multiple stakeholders have asked for guidance, Staff is presenting two options for the Board's consideration to address projects seeking funding where school districts may have already awarded contracts using piggyback bids for modular components.

Option 1 – Take no action

No action is necessary for the Board to continue to follow previous Board action based on the AG opinion. School districts would continue to be ineligible for state funding for projects where piggyback bids were used for modular construction. If the piggyback contract is known prior to recommendation for funding, Staff would return the application to the district.

Considerations

- Consistent with the Board's action at the February 2006 meeting.
- School district employee turnover may result in a lack of understanding of the PCC and the Board's position on piggyback contracts from 17 years ago.
- The Board currently has one appeal on the workload list for a project that was already completed.
- Stakeholders have shared that many projects have used piggyback bids for modular components, and it has not been identified by staff. The universe of impacted projects is unknown as the information was not reported with the funding application submittals. If additional impacted projects are identified, funding decisions will need to be determined by individual appeal requests.

Option 2 – Provide a grace period for Board-administered programs for projects with construction contracts signed on or within sixty calendar days of this Board action. Create a new process to begin after this grace period where Staff evaluates the contracts during the time of application processing and prior to fund release to ensure no piggyback contracts have been used for modular components.

With this action, Staff would:

- Continue to process and present applications that signed piggyback contracts prior to the conclusion of the grace period.
- Notify all District Superintendents and District Representatives on file with OPSC, as well as all stakeholders on OPSC's master email subscription list via email that consistent with the PCC and the AG Opinion, that modular components must be competitively bid.
- Create a webpage to advise school districts of the Public Contract Code and its applicability to state funding.
- Establish a specific process during application processing and/or in advance of fund release for thoroughly reviewing contracts to ensure that funds are not released for project that use piggyback contracts for modular components.
- For any contracts entered into after fund release (after OPSC's review), Staff would work with the State Controller's Office to amend the K-12 Audit Guide for Appendices B and C, to ensure that as part of the project audit, and the K-12 local auditor would review the contracts for compliance.

OPTIONS (cont.)

Considerations

- The Board would be maintaining that the statute could lack clarity which could have led to alternate interpretations by school districts, but the Board is still supportive of the AG's opinion, absent a court opinion.
- Given the potential lack of clarity and alternate interpretations by school districts, the Board is repeating the Board's 2006 action and declaring a grace period for school districts to come into compliance with the AG's interpretation.
- This action acknowledges the 17-year gap since the Board's prior action and the lack of repeat communication from the Board or Staff.
- Staff would create a webpage dedicated to requirements of the PCC to provide a long-term reminder to school districts.
- Projects processed now, and in the future, with contracts prior to the grace period would remain eligible for funding.
- This Option would ensure that all contracts are reviewed to ensure piggyback bids are not used for modular construction.
- The new process would aim to find the issues before funds are released as opposed to at the time of audit when the state funds have already been spent.
- Addition of another verification step is consistent with how the Board and Staff previously handled another certification in the SFP that was being overlooked where districts were requesting funds too early and funds were in jeopardy as a result.
- Absent a statutory change, this process may still identify projects in the future that may have contracts that appear to conflict with the AG opinion. Districts could still appeal if these contracts were discovered and funding was denied by Staff.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff seeks Board direction.

BOARD ACTION

In considering this Item, the Board approved Option #2, which 1) provides a grace period for Board-administered programs for projects with construction contracts signed on or prior to 60 calendar days of this Board action (June 22, 2022 through August 21, 2022); and 2) creates a new process to begin after this grace period where staff will evaluate the contracts during the time of application processing and prior to fund release to ensure no piggyback contracts have been used for modular components. In addition to Option #2, the Board directed staff to 1) work with the Board's Vice Chair and research the possibility of developing proposed legislation addressing the issue of modular components in piggyback contracts; and 2) submit a formal request with the Office of the Attorney General seeking an updated Attorney General's opinion.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present a follow up report regarding piggyback contracts and Public Contract Code (PCC) compliance relative to modular school facilities for installation on permanent foundations.

DESCRIPTION

At the February 2005 State Allocation Board (SAB) meeting, the Board requested that Staff request a formal opinion regarding the legality of the use of PCC Section 20118 to acquire and install factory built modular building components that result in the assembly of permanent schools without further competitive bid.

AUTHORITY

PCC Section 20118

Notwithstanding Sections 20111 and 20112, the governing board of any school district without advertising for bids, if the board has determined it to be in the best interests of the district, may authorize by contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, any public corporation or agency, including any county, city, town, or district, to lease data-processing equipment, purchase materials, supplies, equipment, automotive vehicles, tractors, and other personal property for the district in the manner in which the public corporation or agency is authorized by law to make the leases or purchases. Upon receipt of any such personal property, provided the property complies with the specifications set forth in the contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, the school district may draw a warrant in favor of the public corporation or agency for the amount of the approved invoice, including the reasonable costs to the public corporation or agency for furnishing the services incidental to the lease or purchase of the personal property.

PCC Section 20111

School districts are required to competitively bid any contract equal to or greater than:

- \$50,000 for non-public works contracts identified as the purchase or lease of equipment, materials, or supplies; non-construction related services; or repairs or maintenance that would not be considered public contracts
- \$15,000 for public projects (as defined under PCC Section 22002 to include the erection, alteration or renovation of a publicly owned or leased facility).

The districts with contracts that meet or exceed the above cost parameters are required to let the contract to the lowest responsible bidder, and ensure that the bidder presents a form of security (such as a bonded surety).

STAFF COMMENTS

Staff has received the Attorney General's office opinion (see Attachment), which concludes, "A school district may not without advertising for bids, contract with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation." At the January 2006 SAB meeting, a board member requested that all contracts for modular construction on a permanent foundation signed as of January 25, 2006 must be competitively bid in order to retain or receive funding consideration by the Board. In addition, Staff was requested to notify all school districts and county offices of education of the Attorney General's opinion and of the impact to project apportionments.

It is important to note that the Attorney General's office opinion is in regard to modular building components, which refers to a facility comprised of multiple pre-manufactured building components, which may include as an example a separate wall and floor system that are transported to a site where all components are installed on a permanent foundation. The opinion does not address portable or relocatable classrooms as defined by Education Code Section 17070.15(j), which typically are factory-built as two complete building modules that are simply connected on-site and placed on temporary foundations.

STAFF COMMENTS (cont.)

Last year after the initial report was presented to the SAB in February 2005, Staff sent out an advisory to all districts and county offices of education. The advisory notified districts that the Board expressed concern and questioned the legality of piggyback contracts for modular facilities on permanent foundations, and referred districts to the details of the report. Currently, to ensure that districts are aware of the interpretation of the law and the January 25, 2006 effective date, Staff has posted an advisory to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) Web site. In addition, Staff has sent out a mass mailer to all Superintendents, and included an Advisory Action article in the January 2006 edition of the OPSC Advisory Actions Newsletter, which was mailed to all county offices of education and all districts within the State of California.

Staff has received numerous calls from districts, architects, and modular construction companies regarding the Attorney General's office opinion. The overall concern is the impact on construction contracts that are in the process or construction contracts that districts were planning to piggyback in the near future to address immediate housing needs. As indicated by the Board, those projects that have construction contracts signed prior to January 25, 2006 will still be considered for funding. Therefore, the districts' concern lies with those projects where the district was planning to piggyback in the near future to address immediate housing needs.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Accept the Attorney General's Office opinion.
2. Direct Staff to provide additional notices to ensure that school districts are aware that all contracts for permanent modular construction signed after January 25, 2006 must be competitively bid in order to receive funding consideration by the Board.

THE STATE ALLOCATION BOARD has requested an opinion on the following question:

May a school district, without advertising for bids, contract with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation?

CONCLUSION

A school district may not, without advertising for bids, contract with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation.

ANALYSIS

Under the Local Agency Public Construction Act (Pub. Contract Code, §§ 20100-20920),¹ counties, cities, school districts, and other local public agencies may enter into contracts with private parties for the construction of local projects. A central requirement of this statutory scheme is that, once the local agency has provided contract specifications for a given project, the contract must be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. The question presented for resolution is whether a school district may avoid advertising for bids by contracting with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation. We conclude that it may not do so.

Preliminarily, we note that a school district is generally required to award its contracts for a “public project” to the lowest responsible bidder. Subdivision (b) of section 20111 provides:

“The governing board shall let any contract for a public project, as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 22002, involving an expenditure of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) or more, to the lowest responsible bidder who shall give security as the board requires, or else reject all bids. All bids for construction work shall be presented under sealed cover”

Section 22002, subdivision (c), defines a “public project” as follows:

“ ‘Public project’ means any of the following:

“(1) Construction, reconstruction, erection, alteration, renovation, improvement, demolition, and repair work involving any publicly owned, leased, or operated facility.

“(2) Painting or repainting of any publicly owned, leased, or operated facility.

“(3) In the case of a publicly owned utility system, ‘public project’ shall include only the construction, erection, improvement, or repair of dams, reservoirs, powerplants, and electrical transmission lines of 230,000 volts and higher.”

¹Hereafter, all references to the Public Contract Code are by section number only.

ATTACHMENT 1

And the term “facility” is defined in section 22002, subdivision (e), as follows:

“For purposes of this chapter, ‘facility’ means any plant, building, structure, ground facility, utility system, subject to the limitation found in paragraph (3) of subdivision (c), real property, streets and highways, or other public work improvement.”

Section 20113 contains special provisions respecting emergency repairs, sections 20114 and 20115 allow for the rendering of certain services by day labor or force account, and section 20116 prohibits school districts from “splitting” work orders to avoid the cost threshold for mandatory competitive bidding. (See 84 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 5, 6-9 (2000).)

Accordingly, as a general rule, a school district intending to contract for the construction, reconstruction, renovation, improvement, or repair of any school building, where the work will require an expenditure of \$15,000 or more, must follow a competitive bidding process.

The focus of our opinion, however, is upon the terms of section 20118, providing a limited exception to the competitive bidding requirements for certain “personal property.” Section 20118 states:

“Notwithstanding Sections 20111 and 20112, the governing board of any school district without advertising for bids, if the board has determined it to be in the best interests of the district, may authorize by contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, any public corporation or agency, including any county, city, town, or district, to lease data-processing equipment, purchase materials, supplies, equipment, automotive vehicles, tractors, and other personal property for the district in the manner in which the public corporation or agency is authorized by law to make the leases or purchases. Upon receipt of any such personal property, provided the property complies with the specifications set forth in the contract, lease, requisition, or purchase order, the school district may draw a warrant in favor of the public corporation or agency for the amount of the approved invoice, including the reasonable costs to the public corporation or agency for furnishing the services incidental to the lease or purchase of the personal property.”²

²Sections 20111 and 20112 set forth the competitive bidding process to be followed by school districts. (See, e.g., 84 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. *supra*, at pp. 6-7; 18 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 1, 2-3 (1951); 8 Ops.Cal.Atty.Gen. 226, 226-228 (1946).)

Section 20118 thus permits a school district, without advertising for bids, to enter into a contract with another public agency under the specified circumstances, thereby “piggybacking” its order for personal property on an existing order placed by the other agency. In addition, the other agency may charge the school district for “services incidental” to its acting, in essence, as the district’s purchasing agent.³

We are informed that a school district is considering whether it may use the authorization contained in section 20118 to purchase modular structural components for the installation of classrooms and other school buildings and facilities, such as a cafeteria, gymnasium, and library, on permanent foundations. (See Ed. Code, § 17340.) Once these modular components have been attached at the building site, and after significant on-site finish work has been completed, they would result in permanent school buildings of varying dimensions, purposes, and architectural styles.⁴

In examining the language of section 20118, we follow well established rules of statutory construction. Here, the governing rule is known as *ejusdem generis* (“of the same kind, class, or nature”), which is illustrative of the more general legal maxim known as *noscitur a sociis* (“it is known from its associates”). (See *Moore v. California State Bd. of Accountancy* (1992) 2 Cal.4th 999, 1011-1012; *Dyna-Med, Inc. v. Fair Employment & Housing Com.* (1987) 43 Cal.3d 1379, 1391, fn. 14; *Texas Commerce Bank v. Garamendi* (1992) 11 Cal.App.4th 460, 471, fn. 3; *Martin v. Holiday Inns, Inc.* (1988) 199 Cal.App.3d 1434, 1437; *People v. Stout* (1971) 18 Cal.App.3d 172, 177.) In *Harris v. Capital Growth Investors XIV* (1991) 52 Cal.3d 1142, 1159-1160, the court explained this rule of construction as follows:

“The principle of *ejusdem generis* holds that ‘ “where general words follow the enumeration of particular classes of persons or things, the general words will be construed as applicable only to persons or things of the same general nature or class as those enumerated. [It] is based on the obvious reason that if the [writer] had intended the general words to be used in their unrestricted sense, [he or she] would not have mentioned the particular things

³By its terms, section 20118 applies only to a school district’s contracts with, and payments to, another “public corporation or agency” to lease or purchase personal property “for the district” where the other entity “is authorized by law to make the leases or purchases.” The statute provides *no* authority for a school district contract directly with a lessor or vendor.

⁴Because of their permanent foundations and immovability, the structures in question would be distinguishable from typical “portable” or “relocatable” single-classroom buildings. (See *Steelgard, Inc. v. Jannsen* (1985) 171 Cal.App.3d 79, 89-90; see also Ed. Code, §§ 17085-17095.) The procedures to be followed in acquiring the latter units and placing them on school property are beyond the scope of this opinion.

or classes of things which would in that event become mere surplusage.”⁵
 [Citations.]” (Fn. omitted)

The court further noted:

“*Ejusdem generis* applies whether specific words follow general words in a statute or vice versa. In either event, the general term or category is ‘restricted to those things that are similar to those which are enumerated specifically.’ [Citations.]” (*Id.* at p. 1160, fn. 7.)

In section 20118, the Legislature has indicated the types of “personal property” covered by the statute: “data-processing equipment, . . . materials, supplies, equipment, automotive vehicles, tractors.” The phrase “other personal property” immediately following these particular items must be limited to the same classes of personal property under the rule of *ejusdem generis*. Plainly, building structures to be permanently affixed to land do not have the characteristics of the listed “personal property.”⁵

In contrast to the language of section 20118, when the Legislature has authorized the construction of school buildings and other structures and facilities upon permanent foundations, it has employed different language in delegating such authority. (See, e.g., § 20111, subd. (b) [“construction work”]; § 20114, subd. (a) [governing board may “erect new buildings”]; § 20115 [“any plant, building, structure, ground facility, utility system, or real property”]; § 20118.4 [permitting change orders “for reconstruction or rehabilitation work other than for the construction of new buildings or other new structures . . .”]; § 20118.4 [“construction of new buildings or other new structures . . .”] § 22001 [“construction work”]; § 22002, subd. (b) [“public works construction”]; § 22002, subd. (c)(1) [“Construction, reconstruction, erection, alteration, renovation, improvement, demolition, and repair work involving any publicly owned, leased, or operated facility”]; § 22002, subd. (e) [“any plant, building, structure, ground facility”]; and see, e.g., Ed. Code, §§ 17350-17360 [“factory-built school buildings”].)

If the Legislature had intended to extend the contracting option of section 20118 to construction contracts for school buildings on permanent foundations, we believe that the language of the statute would have referred to such construction projects in terms other than “lease data-processing equipment, purchase materials, supplies, equipment, automotive vehicles, tractors, and other personal property.” Section 20118 makes no

⁵Indeed, once the structures are affixed to permanent foundations, they constitute real property, not personal property. (See, e.g., Civ. Code, §§ 657, 658, 660; *Escondido Union School Dist. v. Casa Suenos De Oro, Inc.* (2005) 129 Cal.App.4th 944, 965-966.)

mention of buildings, structures, classrooms, facilities, or construction projects. “When the Legislature uses materially different language in statutory provisions addressing the same subject or related subjects, the normal inference is that the Legislature intended a difference in meaning. [Citation.]” (*People v. Trevino* (2001) 28 Cal.4th 237, 242.)

We therefore conclude that a school district may not, without advertising for bids, contract with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation.

1 members who would be happy to come down and --

2 MS. ROUSSIN: Thank you.

3 SENATOR MARGETT: Wannabe lawyers.

4 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: All right.

5 MS. PARK: The Consent Calendar's --

6 SENATOR LOWENTHAL: -- we could do the
7 sandbagging.

8 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Yeah. As it were --
9 different kind.

10 All right. So if there are no other questions on
11 the Consent Specials, we'll entertain a motion.

12 ASSEMBLY MEMBER MULLIN: So move.

13 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Second.

14 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: We have a motion and a
15 second to approve the Consent Specials. All those in favor.

16 (Ayes)

17 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Any opposed? That is
18 approved.

19 MS. PARK: Next item is on the **Special Calendar**,
20 Tab 10, page 224. This item has to do with **piggyback**
21 **contracts** and public contracts compliance related to
22 **permanent modular school facilities**.

23 Back in 2005, the State Allocation Board directed
24 staff to obtain an Attorney General's opinion on whether or
25 not this method of contracting was appropriate.

1 Last month, right before the Board meeting on
2 January 24th, I received the Attorney General's legal
3 counsel's opinion, and at that time, I informed the Board
4 that we had received that opinion and at this meeting we
5 would bring forth the information on that opinion.

6 At that meeting, we were directed to notify all
7 school districts that they were not permitted to use this
8 method of contracting after January 25th of 2006. We put out
9 advisory on the Web site. We sent out a formal letter, and
10 we put it into our advisory actions.

11 So the Board -- the public in general has been
12 notified, but we do understand that there are individuals
13 here that do want to speak to the Board regarding this issue.

14 And just to say that our report is to accept the
15 Attorney General's Office opinion and to direct staff to
16 provide additional notices regarding the January 25th, 2006,
17 as the cutoff window for using this type of contracting.

18 So with that, I --

19 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Yes. I know a number of
20 people from the public would like to comment. So shall we
21 hear from them and then we can -- and I know a number of
22 Board members also would like to discuss this. Tom? And
23 then I have Karl Bradley? Are you Karl? Okay.

24 MR. DUFFY: Hi. Tom Duffy for Coalition for
25 Adequate School Housing. Good afternoon and thank you.

1 I sent a letter to you all today where we've
2 basically tried to identify for you that we believe that
3 proliferation of the use of piggybacks began in 2004 because
4 of the bid climate and what we referred to as the inadequacy
5 of the grants.

6 You heard a district I think about this time last
7 year who had bid a number of projects and found that it had
8 to scrap its stick-built plans and go with modular
9 buildings -- in other words, was able to provide classrooms
10 for those schools. That's happened over and over again in
11 California.

12 I wanted to point that out to you because what you
13 will be doing now without having dealt with the issue of
14 grant adequacy is probably continuing to hinder districts in
15 moving forward with providing classrooms.

16 The opinion is the opinion and we think that you
17 have to obey it, and we think that you have to follow this.
18 And so we suggest that you do that.

19 But we'd really like to have Ms. Goldberg's bill
20 and then also Ms. Daucher's bill move forward to deal with
21 grant adequacy and the adjustments of the bids at a time
22 during the year that isn't January, but is more related to
23 the actual indices and what's happening in the field.

24 So we think that that's critical and we have said
25 that to Senator Scott and his community and Ms. Goldberg and

1 her committee when we've talked about the bonds. So we think
2 that that's extremely important.

3 So grants are very low and districts have had to
4 avoid building schools that are stick-built schools and gone
5 with modulars or portables, and they will have to continue to
6 do that. The opinion just makes it harder for them.

7 And with that, the second part of the letter that
8 I sent to you identifies that the communication from Luisa --
9 and we thank her for that and we met with her to understand
10 how this would proceed. We think that further refinement
11 needs to be done so that districts will fully understand what
12 it is you require of them so that they are in conformance
13 with what you would like them to do.

14 I do not think that the issue is really -- is
15 easily definable as saying these are modular components and
16 this is a portable. I think that there's more to it.

17 We have experts in our organization. We'd be
18 pleased to meet with Luisa and others and in fact you may
19 want to -- I'm sure you're going to move forward with this
20 today, but you may want to ask the Implementation Committee
21 to just tease out the issues because I think that there will
22 be a number.

23 And it -- just having heard from a number of
24 districts and talked to many attorneys -- CASH has a legal
25 advisory committee and we have met with them and discussed

1 this in detail. We have a conference going on across the
2 street, talked about ~~that just this afternoon.~~

3 So we can give -- I think we can offer help to you
4 here.

5 You -- in 1998 this -- the state program changed
6 with SB50. One of the reasons that it changed -- and,
7 Ms. Goldberg, we talked about this at your committee about
8 three weeks ago.

9 One of the reasons that it changed to a grant
10 program was to delink the state funding mechanism and what
11 school districts do with that funding. In essence, the state
12 was being sued from time to time because school districts --
13 in the discovery process, was that -- it was found that there
14 was a lease-purchase document signed by the executive officer
15 and the school district and so that linked the state in and
16 the state was then sued.

17 You may with this directive -- and believing
18 you're going forward with it. You may find that part of that
19 delinking is gone away, that -- you may find -- and it's --
20 you know, we're not -- this is not a threat or anything.
21 We're just simply saying we don't want school districts to be
22 sued over this. You may be implicated in it, so that may be
23 something else that Mr. Ness helps you to look at.

24 So I think that that's important. Districts may
25 also be in the planning process and they may want to come

1 back to you for reimbursement because of what they have to
2 do.

3 And just sharing with you various that have come
4 our way. But we really would like you to deal with grant
5 adequacy and we believe -- and we told you this last May. We
6 believe you have certain authority through the regulatory
7 process and what is in statute to actually adjust the grants
8 now and we would urge you to do that.

9 Thank you. Any questions for me?

10 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Any questions for Mr. Duffy?
11 Senator Lowenthal.

12 SENATOR LOWENTHAL: Were not districts notified by
13 our own legal counsel that -- almost a year ago that this was
14 going on and that they should proceed with caution?

15 MS. PARK: That is correct. Back in February of
16 2005 when the issue was initially brought forward to the
17 Board, at that time, we did have Garry Ness's opinion and he
18 has concerns about -- she did have concerns about the
19 piggyback process the districts were using.

20 So at that time, when we went forward to ask for
21 an Attorney General's opinion, we did put out advisories
22 advising districts to move very cautiously when they use this
23 type of method.

24 MR. DUFFY: And, Senator, my response to that is
25 yes, and we've talked about it as well. But notwithstanding

1 that, districts had to move forward and put classrooms in
2 place and they did that with less than adequate funds.

3 So the -- last year was an important year for
4 districts to get a lot done just like this year is.

5 You had a particular concern and you've addressed
6 it -- or attempted to address it in your legislation and we
7 had opposed that and you may not have been pleased with us or
8 with me, but our opposition was really to allow districts to
9 continue to have the ability to move quickly and especially
10 at a time when we don't have enough grants.

11 And I'd be pleased to share the information that
12 we have developed in comparing the grants under the old
13 program to the new program because there is a deficiency.
14 Thank you very much.

15 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: -- I think has a question.

16 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Yes. You mentioned
17 delinking and linking. Are you getting -- are you saying
18 that currently if a district does something that they are
19 sued about that the only person who can be the recipient of
20 that lawsuit is the district? I know you can sue anybody,
21 but that we have protections in place so that the State
22 Allocation Board is not involved and that if we take this
23 action that that may muddle that or cloud that? And I guess
24 I'd like your opinion and then I'd like to hear our lawyer's
25 opinion.

1 MR. DUFFY: Maybe you --

2 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Is that what you said or
3 not?

4 MR. DUFFY: It is what I said.

5 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Okay.

6 MR. DUFFY: That under the old program, there was
7 a direct link because of the contractual relationship of the
8 lease-purchase program. Because the Allocation Board and the
9 state were sued when districts made mistakes and they may
10 have been small districts, they may have been larger
11 districts, but I remembered working with Senator Leroy Greene
12 on the issue of grants and he was very concerned because the
13 state was being sued for district mistakes.

14 So the delinking happened with the grants. That's
15 why you have the language and statute that says full and
16 final apportionment.

17 Now, you could be sued of course --

18 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Right.

19 MR. DUFFY: -- for following the law and school
20 districts may be. It's just -- I was just suggesting that
21 this may be something that Mr. Ness needs to consider and
22 advise you on.

23 We haven't heard of anybody wanting to sue
24 anybody, but it -- this -- you know, we're talking about a
25 fairly sizeable amount of money that isn't in the pipeline to

1 be built.

2 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: I'd like to get --

3 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Sure. Garry, would you want
4 to address that briefly.

5 MR. NESS: Well, I can maybe give you some
6 background. The -- Tom is accurate. The old program created
7 opportunities for contractors and such to bring the State
8 Allocation Board in because the old program created an agency
9 relationship between the state and the school districts and
10 also had this lease-purchase program which actually required
11 the state to lease the facility to the school districts.

12 All those things have been taken out of this
13 program and it is truly a grant program. We're simply giving
14 grants to school districts to fund construction.

15 There is a provision in statute, however, that
16 talks specifically about liability and indicates that funding
17 decisions made by the Board shall not in and of themselves
18 make the Board liable for any tort, breach of contract, or
19 any other action for damages caused by the school district
20 arising from new construction or modernization by the
21 district.

22 So I think the Board is pretty well protected with
23 respect to that statute in terms of any contractual liability
24 that might arise from a district's construction contract.

25 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: So then if we start

1 advising districts or telling districts how they should let
2 their contracts, does that statute still protect us or is it
3 cloudy?

4 MR. NESS: Well, I still think that it's fairly
5 good protection. I mean -- it would depend upon what the
6 Board's direction was.

7 I mean in this situation, the Attorney General has
8 advised the Board what the state law and all the Board would
9 be saying is you've got to follow the state law as it's been
10 opined by the Attorney General.

11 So I don't know that we're telling the districts
12 that they have to do one thing or another. It's just that
13 the state's legal advisor has advised this Board that's what
14 the law is and so that's what the Board would look for the
15 school districts to do to follow.

16 That doesn't mean that this statute has been
17 tested in court. The Attorney General's opinion is an
18 opinion of a lawyer. It's not, you know, precedent setting.
19 It has to be followed as a matter of law.

20 There still could conceivably be a different view
21 announced by a California Court if they looked at it, but I'm
22 not aware of any litigation over it and I'm not aware that
23 anybody's going to challenge it, but it also means that
24 contracts that were let contrary to this provision
25 conceivably are subject to challenge and would, if

1 successful, be -- the contract could be found to be void and
2 unenforceable and that would put the district and contractor
3 and potentially state bond money in jeopardy.

4 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: So then if a district
5 were to choose to -- if they were in the middle of this
6 process and they were to choose to go forward for, you know,
7 maybe it's the only way they can get classrooms up by
8 September -- and I'd be interested if there's a case like
9 that. I'd like to hear about it -- then are you saying to
10 the best of your knowledge, we would -- could rely on the
11 statute where we would not be at risk, but it would be the
12 districts who would be at risk. Is that what you're telling
13 us?

14 MR. NESS: That's my belief, yes.

15 MS. PARK: In addition --

16 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Go ahead.

17 MS. PARK: Just in addition, when a district
18 applies for a state funding, they certify compliance to all
19 laws and regulations and this section is in the Education
20 Code as part of the public contract.

21 So they have certified that they are complying
22 with all the requirements of the law.

23 MR. DUFFY: And we don't -- we're not arguing with
24 this at all. We say -- we believe you have to follow this
25 and in fact we'll be working with our districts to make sure

1 that they know.

2 We're asking you for further clarification and
3 CASH will be sponsoring a workshop next month on doing this
4 to make sure districts know what they need to do to stay
5 compliant with what you want them to do so you can give them
6 money to house kids. Thank you.

7 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: Just send more
8 grants -- higher grants.

9 MR. DUFFY: Say it again.

10 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: Just send higher
11 grants.

12 MR. DUFFY: Thank you very much, Ms. Goldberg,
13 yes.

14 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Girard and then
15 Ms. Moore has a question.

16 MS. GIRARD: I just have a question. You know,
17 looking to make sure you get the best price because obviously
18 money is the issue, if it doesn't go out to bid, are you
19 really getting the best price? How do you know by not going
20 out to bid that you're really getting the best price because
21 that's exactly what this is all about?

22 You don't have enough money, so you want to make
23 use of the most money that you have. If you're not going to
24 bid you don't know if you have the right -- the best price.
25 So how are you coming to that conclusion?

1 MR. DUFFY: Thank you for the question because
2 it's a seminal question. There is a bid in the beginning.
3 So District A bids a project and because modular buildings or
4 portable buildings are built in a factory very much like a
5 car is built, they're -- in the main, they are a reuse of a
6 plan, districts know what exists and they've seen them.

7 So District A puts out a bid and competitively
8 bids it and one of the manufacturers receives that bid.
9 District B then says that's a good price and I can get those
10 now without the period of time for bidding and I can see
11 exactly what I'm going to get, and so what they've done is
12 they have used that bid themselves as another public agency.

13 General Services does the very same thing and they
14 do it today. So your question is a good question. If the
15 bid would be an old bid -- as a superintendent, I did this.
16 If it's an old bid, I wouldn't want to use that. I would
17 want to use something newer.

18 But the idea of cost -- if you compared the state
19 grant program today with what it really costs to build a
20 school, there is not an equality there. So districts have
21 been able to say I know that I can pay -- now I can pay for
22 these modulars because I know what that price is -- or the
23 portables. So hopefully I answered your question.

24 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Moore.

25 MS. MOORE: Tom, can you explain exactly what

1 isn't clear and what needs to have further clarification?

2 MR. DUFFY: Thank you, Kathleen. What I'm
3 speaking to is the opinion -- the question asked is may
4 modular components be utilized and the answer is no, they may
5 not.

6 But there is --

7 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: Without a bid.

8 MR. DUFFY: Without a bid. Yes. Thank you.
9 There is subnote 4 on page 4 that identifies that those are
10 distinguishable from portable classrooms, and portable
11 classrooms are basically two pieces of a building that are
12 trucked out to a site and put together and put on a site.

13 I believe that the intent -- and I think it was
14 the intent of your bill, Senator -- was to say those are okay
15 for piggybacking. What we don't want are pieces that get
16 trucked out and get put together on the site. And -- just
17 make sure that districts are -- if that's what the intent is,
18 that that is very clear, and I would appreciate your -- staff
19 being able to put that in some written form so districts know
20 what it is because every building isn't the same.

21 Some manufacturers build buildings that are seated
22 differently and the question in the opinion also is answered
23 by talking about a permanent foundation.

24 Individual portables are placed on concrete.
25 They're placed on asphalt. They're placed on dirt. But they

1 are affixed to the site because of seismic issues.

2 We just want to make sure that since it appears
3 that portables are okay, modular components are not, that we
4 know exactly what those are. That's --

5 MS. MOORE: And there is a question about
6 permanent foundations --

7 MR. DUFFY: Because the -- because the opinion
8 talks about a permanent foundation and we have talked to our
9 friends at DSA. They can tell you what a permanent
10 foundation is, but individual portable classrooms are placed
11 on different kinds of foundations.

12 Some of them are placed on concrete piers because
13 it's an efficient way to put them in place. They're movable
14 and they may be moved, but they're put on concrete piers.

15 Is that permanent? We want to make sure we know
16 since we do not want to have the district interrupted in the
17 process and you tell them that we're not going to give you
18 any money because you violated our directive.

19 MS. PARK: Under staff comments, I think we have a
20 pretty clear description of what the difference is.

21 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Any other questions --

22 MR. DUFFY: Okay. Thank you very much.

23 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Sure. Thanks.

24 MR. DUFFY: Appreciate your patience.

25 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Yeah. I think we had some

1 other individuals who would like to testify? Can you just
2 identify yourself for the record.

3 MR. BRADLEY: Madam Chair, members of the State
4 Allocation Board, my name is Karl Bradley. I'm the Chief
5 Facilities Officer for Vista Unified School District. We're
6 a district that serves about 24,000 students in the
7 northwestern corner of San Diego County.

8 And we passed a local bond measure in the amount
9 of around \$140 million in March of 2002, and our aim was to
10 end the terrible overcrowding we had in our district. We had
11 kids at both the middle and elementary school level on the
12 Concept 6, Multi-Track Year-Round Schedule, and our goal is
13 using our local bond funds as well as state matching funds to
14 build more elementaries, build another middle, build tons of
15 stuff.

16 Even at the -- early on in our bond program, we
17 realized that the state match really wasn't ever 50 percent,
18 but we kind of kept plugging along. But a few years back, we
19 started seeing unprecedented escalation of construction
20 costs.

21 And the state grant fell farther and farther below
22 what actually constitutes a 50 percent match of the actual
23 costs of construction.

24 We continued as best we could with our program and
25 now we're at a point where we need to build our largest final

1 and most important program which is a high school facility.
2 We've got two high school in our district that are at nearly
3 double their capacity, and looking at our budget, looking at
4 how much local money we have left, predicting what the state
5 grant would be, we realized there was no way we could create
6 the classroom space we needed, not on out permanent --
7 conventional permanent construction with the remaining funds
8 we had.

9 So we determined that we would go with modular
10 construction and we elected to utilize the piggyback bid
11 because that way we could quantify that amount. That way we
12 could -- within budget and so forth.

13 But at this point -- you know, now -- I feel we
14 were sort of backed into a corner where we couldn't afford
15 anything. We didn't want to build modular schools. No
16 facilities administrator wants their legacy to be modular
17 construction. We love to build permanent schools with
18 beautiful architectural features. We can't. We don't have
19 enough money.

20 I think I speak for a lot of districts here and
21 I'm here to ask that this Board at the very least postpone
22 any action that will reduce school districts' ability to
23 obtain modular building components via piggyback contracts
24 and I also ask that you take immediate action to increase the
25 grant amount so we can go back to the schools we really want

1 to build. And I thank this Board for your time.

2 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Hold on. Senator Lowenthal,
3 did you have a question?

4 SENATOR LOWENTHAL: Yeah. I -- no. I just wanted
5 to comment on that. I think that grant issue is a separate
6 issue and I think that's a reasonable issue to ask us to
7 address. That's one issue.

8 The second issue, I -- kept getting back to --
9 that you -- you know, this is not a new issue. This -- you
10 were notified that this is -- to proceed with caution, almost
11 a year ago.

12 The law is really clear. We can't authorize you
13 to go ahead and break the law. I mean that -- we -- unless
14 you're saying you want us to delay the law -- you can't do
15 that. You can't -- we can't delay the law.

16 And you can still do what you're doing with -- if
17 you go out to bid. We're not stopping you. No one is saying
18 that there's anything wrong with what you want to do. You
19 don't want to do that. You would rather have the grants
20 modified--and we understand that.

21 But since you now what to go out, you want --
22 you're not precluded from doing that. We're talking about
23 piggyback contracts and the law is real clear now. And we've
24 known that and that's why we asked for the AG's opinion.

25 We were concerned about that and conveyed that to

1 you almost a year ago.

2 MR. BRADLEY: Respectfully, Senator Lowenthal, we
3 believe there's a great potential for cost increase if we go
4 through the bidding process. We believe there's a potential
5 for project delays if we go through the bidding process.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Any other questions? Thank
7 you. Oh, Senator Scott?

8 SENATOR SCOTT: I don't quite know how you want us
9 to violate the law. I mean that's the problem. I mean we
10 all find certain laws onerous, and we don't particularly --
11 we don't like them, but most of us have to say, well, you
12 know, that's what's there.

13 And so we -- you know, we think maybe if you went
14 out to bid there's the possibility, as was pointed out by one
15 of our members, that you might even come in lower than this
16 piggyback bid.

17 But I think for us to ignore what the Attorney
18 General has said to us the plain implications of the law are,
19 I personally have never been comfortable doing that.

20 MR. BRADLEY: Once again with all due respect,
21 sir, I heard your own counsel state that the Attorney
22 General's opinion is merely an opinion and does not
23 necessarily --

24 SENATOR SCOTT: Well, do you have an opposing
25 opinion other than yours that has any legal basis?

1 MR. BRADLEY: No, sir, I do not.

2 SENATOR SCOTT: Okay.

3 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Girard.

4 MS. GIRARD: I'm just having problems with -- on
5 construction delay on a modular. If you take it out to bid
6 and you've already stated that you're going to build modulars
7 because you can't afford to do the other. So you're taking
8 it out to bid. Where is the delay on the modulars going to
9 come in? You're putting it out for modular bid; right?

10 MR. BRADLEY: Ma'am, we were ready to take a
11 contract to our board at our February school board meeting
12 for ratification, you know, and we basically -- once we heard
13 statements made at the February -- or excuse me -- January
14 State Allocation Board meeting this year, we basically put
15 things on hold until we were going to hear what you said at
16 this meeting.

17 At this point, if that's the direction, of course
18 we're going to bid. We're going to obey the law. But
19 there's already the time that has been lost since that last
20 meeting and there's also the issue of the time frame for
21 legal advertising and so forth.

22 And -- you know, one thing that was proposed I
23 know -- I saw a letter that was written to you by one of the
24 modular manufacturers was that at least the Board consider
25 some sort of a grace period rather than abruptly depriving

1 districts of their ability to do this.

2 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: I guess one observation I
3 have, you are a member of CASH, I assume, Tom's group that
4 was just up here?

5 MR. BRADLEY: Yes, ma'am.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: And I think both CASH --
7 when this issue came up last year and this was one of my
8 first Board meetings and I think the staff -- people were
9 aware that we had requested this opinion.

10 So while I understand January when we received it,
11 you know, may have come as a shock, but I think the people
12 who had been tracking the work of the Board were aware that
13 the request had been made and as with -- you know, the answer
14 could come in any time.

15 So I think as someone said, it had been out there
16 for close to a year that we had made that request and that
17 there was, you know, at least 50-50 chance that that could
18 have come in.

19 So if you did not -- were not aware of that, you
20 know, we can certainly work on communication in the future,
21 but I think most people were aware that that request had come
22 from the Board to the Attorney General's Office.

23 Any other -- Ms. Daucher.

24 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: This is an opinion. It
25 isn't law. It is an opinion and it has certain weight to it,

1 but it isn't necessarily right or wrong. I think the
2 Legislature would do well to fix this.

3 We still have districts at risk in this situation
4 even if we follow the Board recommendation of January 25th.
5 We still have -- some districts will still have an issue.

6 And if we're saying this January 25th, there's a --
7 you know, we're making an opinion as to when to implement
8 this. And really who skates in under what you seem to
9 believe is going to be a lower cost -- do you believe the
10 cost will be higher? I mean is that -- I presume -- delay
11 and --

12 MR. BRADLEY: I believe there is a good -- I think
13 the district --

14 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: You believe it's a risk.

15 MR. BRADLEY: -- good risk that it would be more,
16 yes.

17 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Okay. So I mean I guess
18 what I'm saying is we have a -- you know, we're picking a
19 date with no real rational reason to pick one date versus
20 another date, and I guess what I would like to see is a date
21 that's a little bit more in the future, a date -- legislation
22 that maybe we could all agree on that would protect districts
23 who -- even if we were to follow the Board's recommendation,
24 there will still be districts at risk and I don't want to see
25 any district at risk here.

1 And I don't know if it would be possible for us to
2 get urgency legislation through that would give some
3 protection to districts that are caught in this problem, give
4 them a grace period, and then -- I don't know if we could all
5 agree on legislation. I don't know if that's possible or
6 not.

7 But if we don't, we're going to have a fait
8 accompli, so it might be a good way for us to agree on
9 legislation. But to protect districts who would be at risk
10 and to give a longer grace period so that we don't see
11 schools that are delayed.

12 I mean we have overcrowding now and what this is
13 really going to mean is even if it were to come in cheaper,
14 you're talking of -- about a delay of going out to bid which
15 what's the minimum time you can go out to bid and get an
16 answer?

17 MR. BRADLEY: It generally takes at least six
18 weeks.

19 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Six weeks and then you
20 have to award the bid. What's the end of the process when
21 you can --

22 MR. BRADLEY: Award the -- the bid, whatever, the
23 appropriate board meeting would be, and then there's a five-
24 to ten-day notification process before notice to proceed can
25 be issued.

1 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: So I guess I'd like to
2 try and help these districts out and recognizing that not
3 very district is a big district that might have people who
4 regularly read and pay attention to all the notices and
5 paperwork that we send out.

6 I mean I know I come from a very small school
7 district that, you know, the person wears lots of hats who
8 does this and, you know, maybe they should have, could have,
9 would have, you know, paid attention a year ago, maybe they
10 didn't. And grant adequacy probably worked into that.

11 But I think it would behoove us if we could agree
12 legislatively to protect -- you know, give some protection to
13 these districts. I don't know if that's possible
14 legislatively -- a grace period and do an urgency bill.
15 That's what I would like to have a discussion about.

16 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Okay. Senator Lowenthal.

17 SENATOR LOWENTHAL: Well, I would like, as Tom had
18 mentioned, to just remind us that we did have legislation
19 last year about this very issue. It was passed by the Senate
20 and the Assembly, went to the Governor, was vetoed
21 prohibiting piggyback.

22 Every district was part of that. You know, CASH
23 was, as Tom said, they opposed it. All the members knew this
24 and Governor's veto message said wait until the AG. It's
25 real clear. Everyone has known about this.

1 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Senator Margett. Oh, and
2 then -- sorry.

3 SENATOR MARGETT: Were you ahead of me, Jackie?
4 Go ahead.

5 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Goldberg, sorry.

6 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: I just wanted to make
7 sure I got on the list sometime. Did your board discuss this
8 possibility when they talked about going to this modular --
9 since this has been a year ago now? Did they discuss the
10 possibility that the decision might go the other way? Was it
11 presented to them?

12 MR. BRADLEY: To my knowledge, I don't believe it
13 was. Because there was -- in our minds -- at least in my
14 mind, there was no certainty as to which way the decision
15 would go.

16 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: If I was on a board --
17 Ms. Daucher was on a board, I would want the staff to come to
18 me and say we're recommending this, but you need to know we
19 got this warning and at any time that decision could come in.
20 Nobody told that board that? Right? Is that what you're
21 telling me?

22 MR. BRADLEY: To the best of my knowledge, no,
23 they did not.

24 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: I have a real problem
25 with that. I have to tell you that. You know, if the board

1 then said that they'd like to take the risk, then we're in
2 one situation, but we're in a very different situation if the
3 board was never informed -- well, that's my view. Thanks.

4 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Senator Margett.

5 SENATOR MARGETT: Yes. I can certainly empathize
6 with where you are and what you're doing -- what you're
7 trying to do. There's no question about that.

8 May I ask just a few questions about divulging
9 bids and so on and so forth. Approximately what is the
10 amount of the contract that you're looking at here for this
11 modular?

12 MR. BRADLEY: I believe it's roughly \$11 million,
13 sir, because it was based on the piggyback pricing we had.

14 SENATOR MARGETT: \$11 million and how long have
15 you known that it's been \$11 million? Is that just the
16 salesman came in and said we can do it for \$11 million if you
17 piggyback?

18 MR. BRADLEY: We've been in negotiations with the
19 modular manufacturer for several months since I believe
20 November of last year.

21 SENATOR MARGETT: And did he give any deadline or
22 any -- say, hey listen, you have to buy this within this next
23 six months or this next year to be able to get this
24 \$11 million price?

25 MR. BRADLEY: Well, typically the piggyback things

1 do have an expiration date. I do not know exactly when the
2 expiration date is.

3 SENATOR MARGETT: You don't know when the
4 expiration is on this particular --

5 MR. BRADLEY: Not off the top of my head, sir.

6 SENATOR MARGETT: I mean just -- well, just off
7 the top of my head, I would think that an \$11 million deal,
8 that's not -- I mean that's not peanuts. I got to tell you
9 that's a nice contract for somebody.

10 I would think that you could probably go ahead and
11 bid that. I'm not saying you're going to get it less, but I
12 would say that they would still be interested in performing
13 under that contract going through the legal aspects of this
14 thing and you could very well get your buildings in at your
15 \$11 million -- budget.

16 MR. BRADLEY: Absolutely, sir. We're very well
17 aware of that and we do have two and perhaps three modular
18 manufacturers that we know are very anxious to bid this work
19 with us should it go --

20 SENATOR MARGETT: Oh, I think this whole
21 competitive thing is -- really works in America, believe it
22 or not, today. I mean it's there and I'm happy for it.

23 May I ask counsel one question also? Mr. Ness, if
24 there's a consortium that comes together of school districts
25 that know in their planning that they're going to want

1 modular buildings and they want -- could that consortium
2 group of school districts form a consortium to be able to do
3 that and escape this business with regards to piggybacking?

4 In other words, that's an entity that's buying as
5 opposed to --

6 MR. NESS: I think I know what you mean and quite
7 frankly I don't know what the answer is to that. I'm not
8 that familiar with the school districts public contract code
9 requirements to give you a good answer on that. So I guess
10 I'd have to duck your question and say I don't know the
11 answer to your question.

12 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Girard.

13 MS. GIRARD: My concern is that it gives the
14 appearance of favoritism when you start to do that. When you
15 do put something out to bid, the reason -- not just the
16 lowest cost or whatever, but you've opened it up for more
17 people to bid.

18 When you go to one distributor, it just doesn't
19 appear to look good. It looks like there's something going
20 on. If it's wide open and everybody could bid it, then you
21 feel everybody that's involved -- the Board giving money
22 here, the taxpayers, everybody else is getting the best price
23 and that it's a full and open competition.

24 When you limit that, you make it look ugly, and I
25 know. I'm a contractor. So I know. I'm speaking because I

1 know this, that you should always have more than one bid to
2 know that you're getting the best price.

3 MR. BRADLEY: Ma'am, we actually did have a
4 request for a proposal process that was competitive. It
5 was -- our bid contract, but we had request for proposal. We
6 had criteria specification. There were two modular
7 manufacturers who looked at the pricing on this and we
8 were -- yeah. We were basically finalizing the contract with
9 the manufacturer who had offered us the best price on that
10 basis.

11 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: All right. Thank you for
12 your comments.

13 MR. BRADLEY: I thank the Board.

14 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Anyone else? Yes. Please
15 come forward and identify yourself.

16 MR. BUCKLEY: Thank you, Madam Chair, members of
17 the Board. My name is David Buckley. I'm the Chief
18 Executive Officer of ModTech.

19 ModTech is the largest provider of modular
20 facilities in the State of California and in the country.
21 Each year we provide approximately 2,000 classrooms for the
22 State of California which equals about -- 60,000 -- that's
23 probably me. Let me turn that off. I'm sorry.

24 Approximately 50- to 60,000 students are housed in
25 our buildings each year in California.

1 I want to address Senator Lowenthal's question
2 about why aren't these publicly bid. Quite frankly we prefer
3 public bids. We prefer public bids because we are always 15,
4 20, 25 percent cheaper than on-site construction and we're
5 typically 50 to 75 percent faster.

6 So we aren't afraid of the public bid.
7 Approximately 30 or 35 percent of our revenues come from
8 piggyback type revenues. One of the reasons that we're
9 hearing from the school districts that come to us on that
10 basis is the fact that they don't have the internal
11 capabilities to put together a bid document.

12 A typical bid document is 600 to 700 pages long.
13 It takes a lot of experience to put something like that
14 together and it takes a lot of wherewithal to know how to go
15 out and publicly bid one of those documents.

16 Half of the reason for the piggyback in our eyes
17 is so that school districts that don't have that internal
18 capability can piggyback off of a school district that does
19 have that capability, that has that expertise in-house.

20 So for those school districts that don't have that
21 capability, what do they do now? Where do they go and how do
22 they do this because it's our opinion that there's not enough
23 people in the State of California with enough mileage to fill
24 that gap right now.

25 So by forcing the cutoff on January 25th, it's our

1 belief that there's going to be quite a few school districts
2 that are left out in the cold and quite frankly we think a
3 lot of children that will truly be left out in the cold as a
4 result of this.

5 We are not the answer to everything. We provide a
6 need that can be quickly fulfilled by schools that need space
7 quickly.

8 I live down in Southern California where it's
9 growing like mad and quite frankly if you started a project
10 today on traditional construction, three years from now,
11 you'd have a school.

12 With modular construction, you can typically fill
13 that much quicker. So our position is that we think there
14 does need to be an extension to allow for these school
15 districts that don't currently have the wherewithal or the
16 capabilities to put out a bid to go and find the expertise
17 that will allow them to put a bid out, and secondly, we think
18 that there needs to be some legislation that clarifies this
19 because we happen to be one of those manufacturers that
20 builds a complete unit in the factory.

21 We bring it to the site and we bolt it together to
22 form a classroom or we can bolt 2 together or we can bolt 200
23 together. And where's the definition? Where's the
24 distinction between 2 bolted together and 200 bolted together
25 because it's not fair to us and it's not clear to three

1 lawyers that we've gone out to and gotten opinions on.

2 So I think there is still some ambiguity and I
3 think there's about 35 percent of the school districts in the
4 state that are going to be in real trouble here if there's an
5 immediate cut off.

6 MS. MOORE: Can I just ask --

7 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Sure.

8 MS. MOORE: -- staff, in his -- in that example,
9 is it in or is it out?

10 MS. PARK: Is what in?

11 MS. MOORE: The example that he gave of the type
12 of portable construction.

13 MR. BUCKLEY: Two fully complete units that are
14 brought to a site and bolted together.

15 MS. PARK: That's a relocatable classroom.

16 MR. BUCKLEY: But most of ours are attached to
17 permanent foundations. Now, they can be relocated at some
18 point in the future, but most schools do not. So where's the
19 definition and where's the defining line?

20 MS. PARK: The relocatable is defined in law and
21 the definition for a relocatable is that it does travel in
22 two pieces. They come onto the site. Yes, sometimes they
23 put them on temporary foundations. Sometimes they put them
24 on permanent foundations, but in essence, it's just putting
25 the two pieces together and sealing them.

1 MR. BUCKLEY: So that's okay?

2 MS. PARK: Yes, sir.

3 MR. BUCKLEY: Regardless of whether it's 2 or 50?

4 MS. PARK: Yes, it is.

5 MR. BUCKLEY: Okay. I'm done.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: But you may want to meet
7 that gentleman from Vista because --

8 MS. MOORE: However, doesn't our definition talk
9 about a permanent foundation?

10 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Um-hmm.

11 MS. MOORE: And in that instance, you said it
12 could be on a permanent foundation. So --

13 MS. PARK: We have found that some districts will
14 put a portable on a permanent foundation.

15 MS. SPEAKER: And that's what the AG is
16 prohibiting.

17 MS. MOORE: But then isn't that a prohibited
18 piggyback because it's on a permanent foundation?

19 MS. PARK: I do not believe that that is the case.
20 I mean these buildings are being transported and brought to
21 the site basically complete with the exception of being
22 placed on a foundation.

23 MS. MOORE: So the foundation --

24 MS. PARK: And the modular comes in pieces, single
25 walls. They have to be put together on site and -- and so

1 that type of construction is different than a relocatable.

2 MS. MOORE: So it can be located on a permanent
3 foundation and perhaps that's where clarity needs to --

4 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: I have a question.

5 MS. MOORE: -- to be because I think it states --

6 MS. PARK: In here on the bottom of page 224, the
7 opinion does not address portable or relocatable classroom as
8 defined in the Education Code Section 17070.15(j), which
9 typically -- the word typically -- are factory built as two
10 complete building modules that are simply connected on site
11 and placed on a temporary foundation.

12 There are times that they are placed on permanent
13 foundation, but they come in in two pieces.

14 And, Garry, do you want to read that -- do you
15 have that section with you?

16 MR. NESS: Find it right now.

17 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Okay. Ms. Daucher, did you
18 have a question?

19 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: I just want to follow up
20 with what you said.

21 MR. BUCKLEY: Yes, ma'am.

22 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: You didn't think you
23 were talking about relocatables based on what you provide,
24 but based on that definition, you could -- is what you're
25 saying you could set them up that way and bring them in two

1 pieces and then they're now instantly poof.

2 MR. BUCKLEY: Yes, ma'am. All of ours are built
3 in that manner. We do not build on site. We do not assemble
4 on site. Nothing -- when our units go out to site, they are
5 typically 80 to 90 percent complete. The only thing that's
6 necessary on site is to seal the modular line where the units
7 are brought together, to complete the cross-connects, and to
8 seal the roof.

9 Sometimes there's some stucco work that's done,
10 but we don't do that. We let the local contractors do
11 that -- general contractors or people of that nature. The
12 only thing that we really concentrate on is those modular
13 units.

14 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: So does that change -- I
15 guess I'd ask Mr. Ness if that changed the definition.

16 MR. NESS: We have a definition in the school
17 facilities program that defines what a portable classroom is.
18 It means a classroom building of one or more stories that is
19 designed and constructed to be relocatable and transportable
20 over public streets and with respect to a single-story
21 portable classroom, is designed and constructed for
22 relocation without the separation of the roof or floor from
23 the building when measured at the most exterior walls has a
24 floor area not to exceed -- not in excess of 2,000 square
25 feet.

1 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: Does that -- just as
2 follow-up. Does that -- your units would fit that
3 description or they could?

4 MR. BUCKLEY: Well, it depends on what size unit
5 you're looking at. This project for Vista is a project that
6 we bid. And we say bid because the school district's --
7 there's many, many modular manufacturers in the state.

8 All of those modular manufacturers -- the majority
9 of them have gone out and received a contract with a school
10 district that is then piggybackable. So when a school
11 district comes to us for a job, they are also going to each
12 of those other manufacturers and in essence they're holding a
13 public bid on top of a public bid.

14 So when they come to us, it's already been bid
15 once and then it's in essence being bid a second time,
16 although it's not a formal public bid.

17 The issue with the Vista project is that it's a
18 large project with multiple school pods where there's four or
19 five classrooms per pod, and for those pods, we are
20 connecting --

21 ASSEMBLY MEMBER DAUCHER: So does it fit the
22 definition --

23 MR. BUCKLEY: -- units. I don't know.

24 MS. PARK: I don't think so.

25 MS. MORGAN: To amend our answer earlier, the

1 definition as Garry read into the record would need to be met
2 in order to be exempt from this opinion. If it does not --

3 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Relocatable --

4 MS. MORGAN: -- meet the definition, then it would
5 not -- then it would be subject to the AG opinion.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Ms. Goldberg, did you have a
7 question?

8 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: Actually no, just a
9 comment. I think at some point it isn't just a matter of
10 whether it's 1, 2, 50, or 100. One or two or three or four
11 is not a whole school without a bid. I mean that's the
12 difference. We're talking about building a whole school
13 unbid.

14 MS. PARK: Yeah.

15 ASSEMBLY MEMBER GOLDBERG: That's a big
16 difference. That's \$11 million versus a few hundred thousand
17 dollars.

18 The reason we want people to bid is so that we can
19 guarantee the public that their tax dollars are going to the
20 lowest bidder and it isn't negotiating. These are sealed
21 bids in which everybody knows what the specifications are and
22 you're trying to bid the contract so you're going to try to
23 get the cost down. That's why we ask there to be bids.

24 I'm sorry that this interfering with some folks.
25 I'm fighting for higher grants. That's how I think we solve

1 this. It is not to try to say that a whole school is the
2 same as a few portables being put on because the public's
3 going to look at us and say are you guys nuts.

4 You just built a school without a bid.

5 MS. PARK: Some of these schools are complete
6 schools with core facilities built in this manner.

7 MS. GIRARD: Can I just interject here?

8 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Yeah, oh. Ms. Girard.

9 MS. GIRARD: I never -- you brought up -- you had
10 mentioned that some schools don't have the ability or the
11 staff to --

12 MR. BUCKLEY: Currently the --

13 MS. GIRARD: -- put together a proposal and get it
14 out. Okay. And you're telling me they don't have
15 construction management companies that work in their behalf
16 because that's part of the cost of construction is
17 construction management company --

18 MR. BUCKLEY: Sure.

19 MS. GIRARD: -- that puts the bid out. So who are
20 they using?

21 MR. BUCKLEY: I don't know.

22 MS. GIRARD: Because I cannot believe that the
23 school district is running a construction job on themselves
24 so there's -- somebody's running this project. It will be
25 the -- the first person you bring onboard is the construction

1 management that works on your behalf as the school district
2 or whoever's building the school.

3 That is the person who handles the project, gets
4 the bids out, and takes care of it. Cost of construction.

5 MR. BUCKLEY: You may want to ask some of the
6 school district --

7 MS. GIRARD: Well, now you brought the project --
8 you brought it forward, so I'm asking you.

9 MR. BUCKLEY: Yes, ma'am. Typically we do not
10 deal with construction management firms on a case-by-case
11 basis. On the larger schools, we do. On the smaller
12 schools, we do not. So it depends on the size of the project
13 and it depends on the school district in question.

14 I heard a lot of noise back here. I'm sure
15 there's people with opinions about this. I don't have the
16 overall answer for each school district, but what I do know
17 is that there are school districts that are now purchasing
18 from us the two-unit, fully-portable schools and they're
19 doing it because they have no other way to get schools by
20 September.

21 And so what you're doing in effect by not
22 extending this piggyback out but by forcing action now is
23 causing schools to go out and purchase additional portable
24 units that are just going to be there four or five years from
25 now and need to be replaced with permanent again.

1 So you're extending a problem that already exists
2 in that there's a ton of portables out there that we might
3 have to dispose of. And this is going to come right back for
4 those schools that need space for September and cause another
5 problem.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: All right. Any further
7 questions? Thank you for your comments.

8 MR. BUCKLEY: Thank you.

9 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Is there anyone else who
10 would like to address the Board on this? Did you want to --

11 MR. HANSEN: Just a brief statement. Jay Hansen
12 with the State Building Construction Trade Council. We
13 thought that the Attorney General's opinion was quite clear
14 and I think that the Board took a courageous action at the
15 last meeting and by giving an extension, all that's going to
16 do is continue to put school districts in jeopardy. If
17 they've received faulty legal advice that told them that
18 piggyback contracting was okay to do, now that's between them
19 and their law firms.

20 They should follow the law. It's affecting a very
21 small amount of school districts. The vast majority of
22 school districts are doing things properly.

23 You know, our organization is advocating put it
24 out to bid. That's all we're asking for. It doesn't prevent
25 someone from using modular facilities, but it prevents

1 problems from happening when things don't go out to public
2 bid.

3 There was a company that went under called Turnkey
4 Construction that some of you might be familiar with earlier
5 this year -- or last year. They wasted millions and millions
6 and millions of dollars of taxpayer dollars because probably
7 part of it was they failed to put these projects out to bid
8 and it was a company that was not financially solvent.

9 And they left school districts holding the bag and
10 the school districts probably came here asking for you to get
11 extra money to pay for portable or modular facilities that
12 were never constructed.

13 And by letting these kind of companies continue to
14 do it, you know, sure, they've got a financial interest in
15 it. That's why they're asking for an extension.

16 You know, but you have a responsibility to the
17 taxpayers that you step forward on and took that action last
18 month. And we'd ask you to keep to that commitment and let's
19 just do things the right way.

20 All we're asking is for a modular facility be put
21 out to bid and I think the Attorney General's opinion was
22 very clear and school districts that want to continue to do
23 that same thing of putting themselves in legal jeopardy from
24 folks from who'd like to see things go out to public bid.

25 So I think the action that was taken last month

1 was the appropriate one and we'd like to ask that the Board
2 just stand by that. Thank you.

3 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Thank you, Mr. Hansen. Any
4 questions? Any other comments from Board members?

5 MS. MOORE: Anne, I just have a final comment.

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Sure.

7 MS. MOORE: I agree that the Attorney General has
8 provided their opinion. However, I'm still not clear as a
9 Board member what constitutes the type of portable or
10 relocatable or modular building that is considered in the
11 Attorney General's opinion and that is considered outside the
12 Attorney General's opinion.

13 And if it is that it's a permanent foundation that
14 is part of the definition, and yet I heard that it could --
15 the type of building could be on a permanent foundation. So
16 is there need for clarity or do you --

17 MS. PARK: I think the law is clear on what a
18 relocatable is.

19 MS. MOORE: And so the foundation doesn't matter.

20 MS. PARK: I do not believe that that is the big
21 issue here.

22 MS. MOORE: Okay.

23 MS. PARK: It's that definition that Garry read.
24 The fact is that the relocatable has to be able to move again
25 and even if you put it on a permanent foundation does not

1 mean that that building can't be moved again. And size.

2 MS. MOORE: And the definition that is referenced
3 here does not talk about a foundation.

4 MS. PARK: I do not believe that it was specific
5 to the foundation in the law, Garry?

6 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: I don't recall that. He's
7 going to look that up and then we'll see. The classrooms
8 were small.

9 MR. NESS: The definition contained in the school
10 facilities program of what a portable classroom does not
11 address a foundation.

12 MS. MOORE: Okay. Good. Thank you.

13 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Okay. Did you have
14 something else you wanted to add? Okay. This is an action
15 item? All right. So is there a motion?

16 SENATOR LOWENTHAL: I so move to accept the
17 Attorney General Office's opinion and direct staff to provide
18 additional notices to ensure that school districts are aware
19 that all contracts for permanent modular construction signed
20 after January 25th, 2006, must be competitively bid in order
21 to receive funding consideration by the Board.

22 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Which is the staff's
23 recommendation. Is there a second on that motion?

24 A second. One question that I would have is that
25 the staff is, in response to Mr. Duffy's concern in terms of

1 any further clarification, as you get questions to be able to
2 post that information to people so that we can get as much
3 information out there so that people are not inadvertently
4 making --

5 MS. PARK: We have had some questions and we have
6 responded to those --

7 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Okay.

8 MS. PARK: -- as they've come in. And we've also
9 tried to put further clarification on our Web site.

10 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Yeah. It may be helpful to
11 put -- you know, FAQs or some sort of question and answer on
12 the Web site to clarify for some of the districts who may
13 have questions about this, you know, like the questions
14 Ms. Moore had and what are the definitions. It could be
15 helpful.

16 MS. PARK: Most of them that -- you know, they --
17 when they've described their facilities, they have been
18 relocatable.

19 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Okay. Okay. So we have a
20 motion and a second to accept the staff recommendations. All
21 those in favor say aye.

22 (Ayes)

23 CHAIRPERSON SHEEHAN: Any opposed? Any
24 abstentions? That motion carries. All right. The final --

Subject: **CRITICAL INFORMATION REGARDING SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM (SFP) FUNDING PIGGYBACK CONTRACTS AND PERMANENT MODULAR CONSTRUCTION**

Last year, at the February 2005 State Allocation Board (SAB) meeting, the Board requested that Staff request a formal opinion regarding the legality of the use of Public Contract Code Section 20118 to acquire and install factory built modular building components that result in the assembly of permanent schools without further competitive bid. The Office of Public School Construction has received a formal opinion from the Attorney General's office regarding this issue. The opinion concludes that, "A school district may not without advertising for bids, contract with another public agency to acquire factory-built modular building components for installation on a permanent foundation."

It is important to note that the Attorney General's office opinion is in regard to modular building components, which refers to a facility comprised of multiple pre-manufactured building components, such as separate wall and floor systems, that are transported to a site where all components are installed on a permanent foundation. The opinion does not address portable or relocatable classrooms as defined by Education Code Section 17070.15(j), which typically are factory-built as two complete building modules that are simply connected on-site and placed on temporary foundations.

The SAB stipulated at the January 2006 SAB meeting that any contracts for modular construction on a permanent foundation signed after January 25, 2006, must be competitively bid. Those SFP projects that have construction contracts of this type signed prior to this date that were not competitively bid will continue to be considered for funding. However, for construction contracts signed after January 25, 2006, it is critical that your district be aware that these projects must be competitively bid so that State funding is not jeopardized.

The Attorney General's office opinion will be presented in a report for discussion at the February 22, 2006 SAB meeting. A copy of the opinion can be viewed on our website: www.opsc.dgs.ca.gov. If you have any questions regarding piggyback contracts and modular construction, please contact your district's legal counsel.

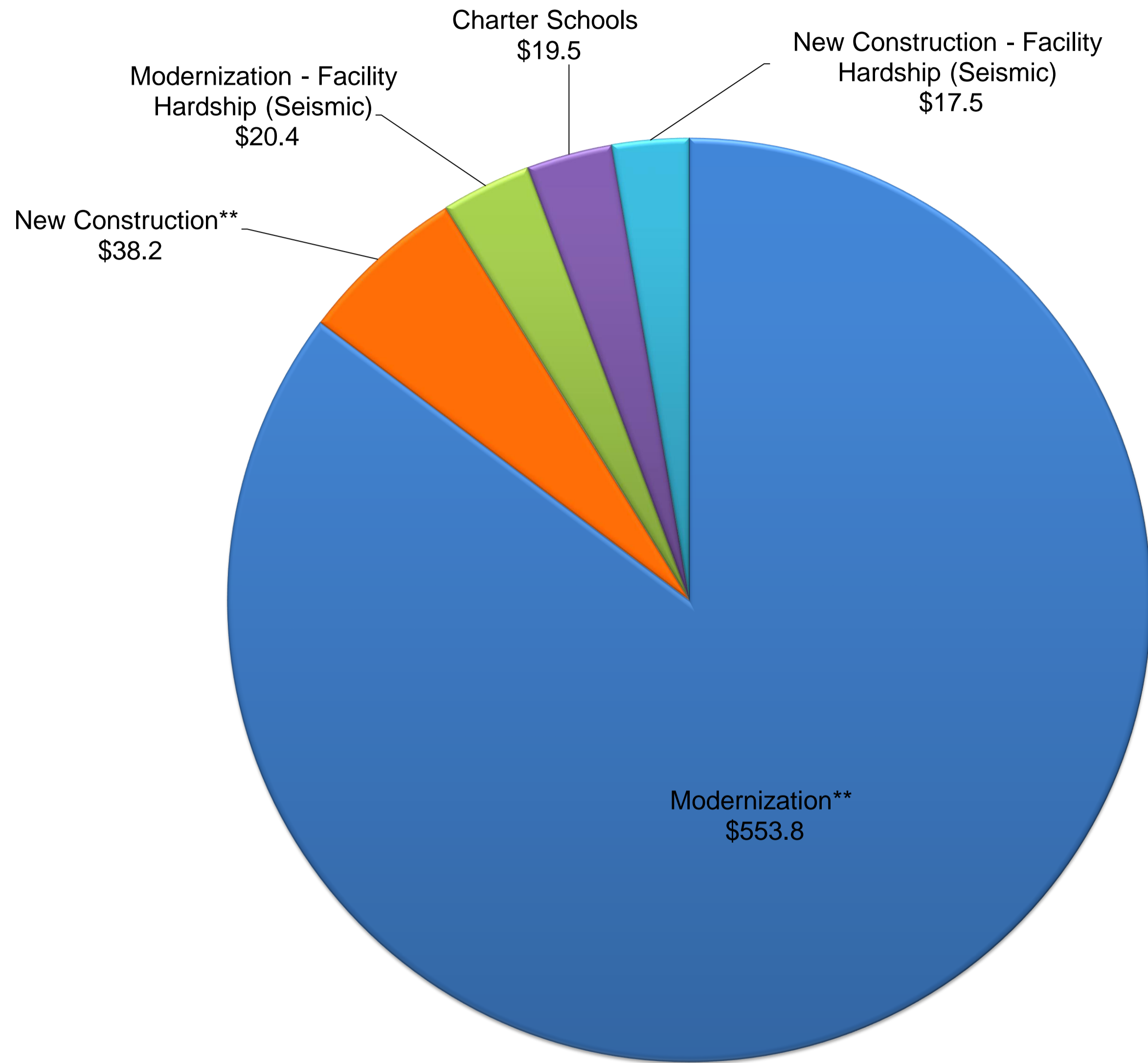

DENIED EXTENSION REQUESTS

Denied Extension Requests	
Alpaugh Unified	The District requested a time extension to submit the final Expenditure Report to OPSC. The delay was due to staff turnover and not COVID-19 related; OPSC worked with District through the regular time extension request process.
Anaheim Union High	The District did not hire a cost estimator until after receiving the 15-day letter request from OPSC. A detail cost estimate is part of a complete application acceptance.
Glenn County Office of Education	District applied for funding in the sixth round of CTE funding. The architect's cost estimate included lump sums. The 15-Day letter sent July 3, 2020 requested them to be broken out. The extension request to November 2nd was well after the anticipated September 2020 funding round.
Greenfield Union Elementary	Change of scope requested for a Full-Day Kindergarten project. A two-year extension was requested. Request was denied because it was the subject of an appeal that OPSC could not administratively approve.
Hilmar Unified	The project was delayed due to the District and its advisory committee requesting a change the of scope to the project as a result of additional local funds being available. The project was approved by the State Allocation Board in May 2019, well before the start of the COVID-19 pandemic
Hollister	The request was not COVID-19 related. OPSC worked with District through the regular time extension request process.
Island Union Elementary	This project was apportioned in October 2018 for Advanced Design. The District had one year to obtain DSA approval of plans. At the time of the extension request, the District still had three months to obtain DSA approval.
Lagunita Elementary	The project was funded in November 2018 and requested a Substantial Progress extension. The request was denied because the reason for the delay is a local funding/priorities issue. The District can also already request a Substantial Progress deadline extension under "other evidence" if needed.

The District needed to determine how to address the need for an increase in the grant request after the application was scored by CDE. Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82.2 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

(b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:

(1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.

(2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.

(3) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).

(4) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.

(5) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.

(6) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.

(7) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82.2. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

(c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:

(1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.

(2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).

(3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.

(4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.

(5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

(A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship status.

(B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

(d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).

(e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).

(1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the

provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.

(2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must re-qualify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.

(3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

(f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.

(g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.

(h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.

(1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.

(2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:

a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.

b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.

(3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.

(4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
