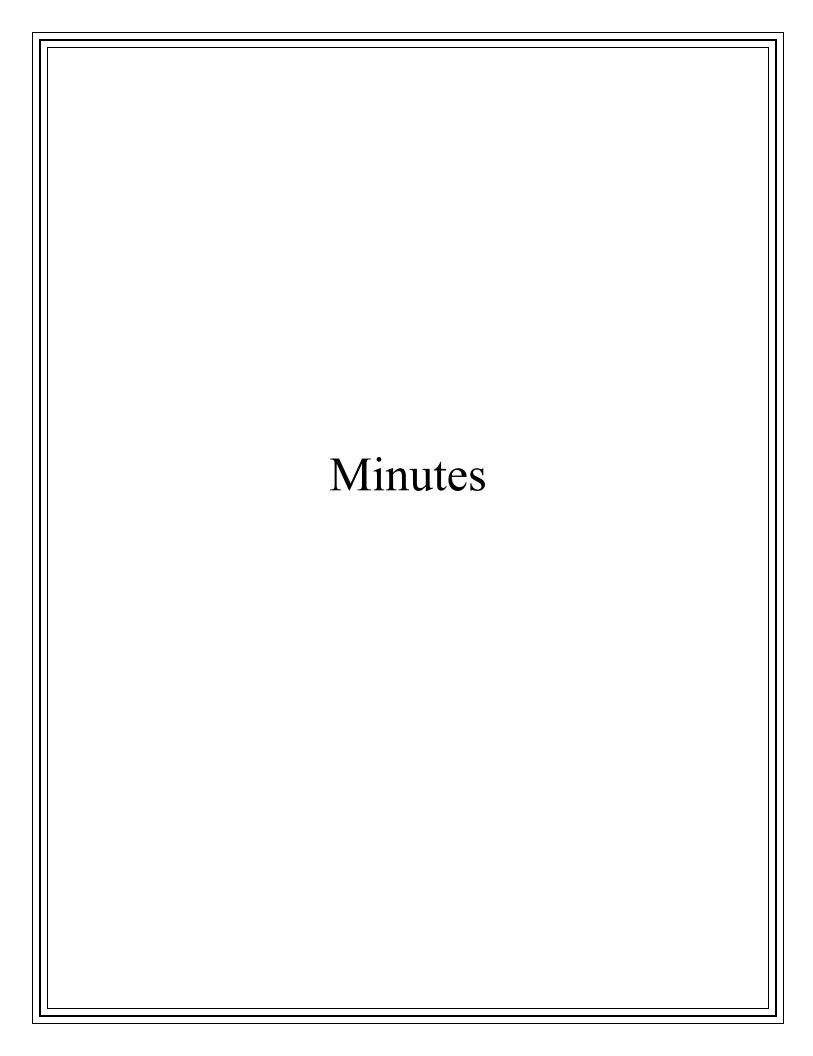

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

2023/2024 State Budget Updates

California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (Program)

Senate Bill (SB) 114 was signed by the Governor on July 10, 2023. This bill provided additional time for the General Fund apportionments to the Program for the 2021/2022 and the 2022/2023 fiscal years to be encumbered or expended until June 30, 2027 for the 2021/2022 fiscal year and extend encumbrance until June 30, 2028 for the 2022/2023 fiscal year. The bill specified the intent to provide \$550,000,000 from the General Fund in the 2024/2025 fiscal year, rather than the originally planned 2023/2024 fiscal year.

Funding for School Facility Program (SFP)

SB 114 approved an appropriation of \$1,960,500,000 from the General Fund to the SAB to provide funding for SFP new construction and modernization projects for the 2023/2024 fiscal year. The bill also declared intent to provide \$875,000,000 from the General Fund to the SAB in the 2024/2025 fiscal year.

Other Impacts to School Facility Program

SB 114 removed the requirement included in the State Controller's Office's K-12 Audit Guide that savings from projects receiving funding from the Charter School Facility Program, Career Technical Education Facilities Program, and/or financial hardship assistance must be returned to the State.

<u>California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Apportionments</u>

The second filing round for the expanded California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program occurred from February 1, 2023 through March 2, 2023. As of March 14, 2023, OPSC received a total of 446 applications from 208 applicants requesting an estimated \$1,479.2 million. There is approximately \$367 million available to allocate to eligible applications in this round.

OPSC intends to present the first funding requests from this round at the September 23, 2023 meeting for the SAB's consideration.

The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, September 27, 2023 at 3 p.m. The location of the meeting will be determined and announced at a later date.

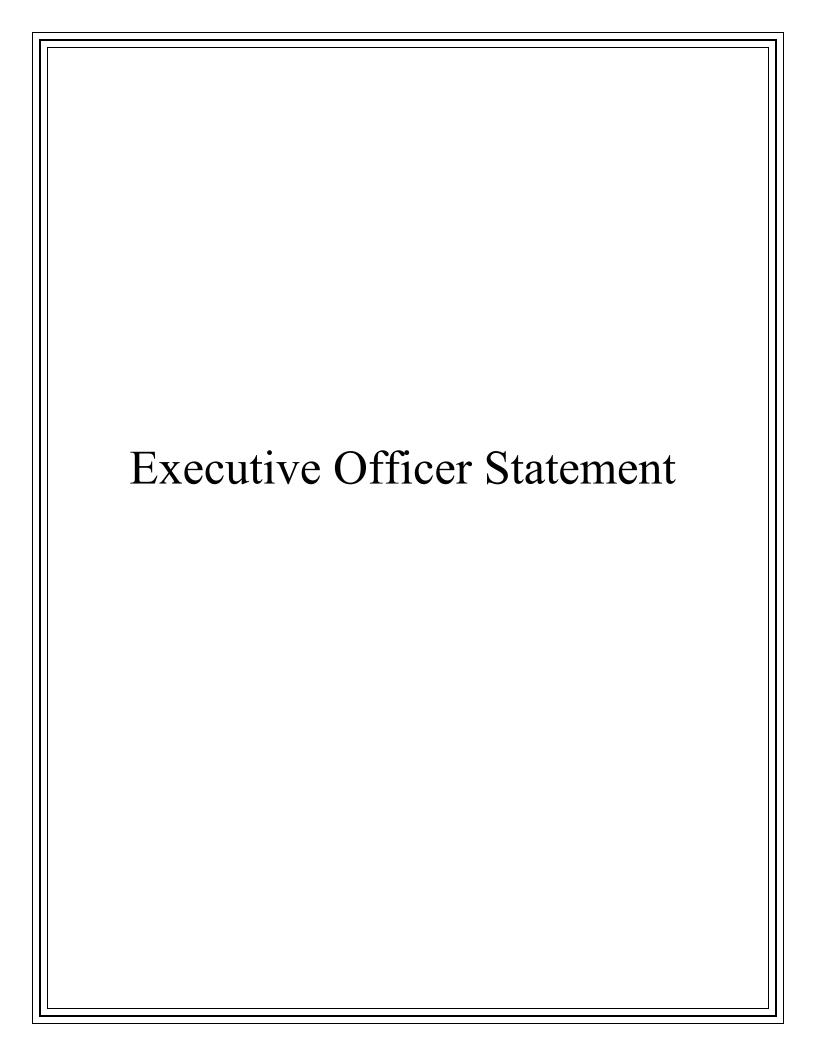

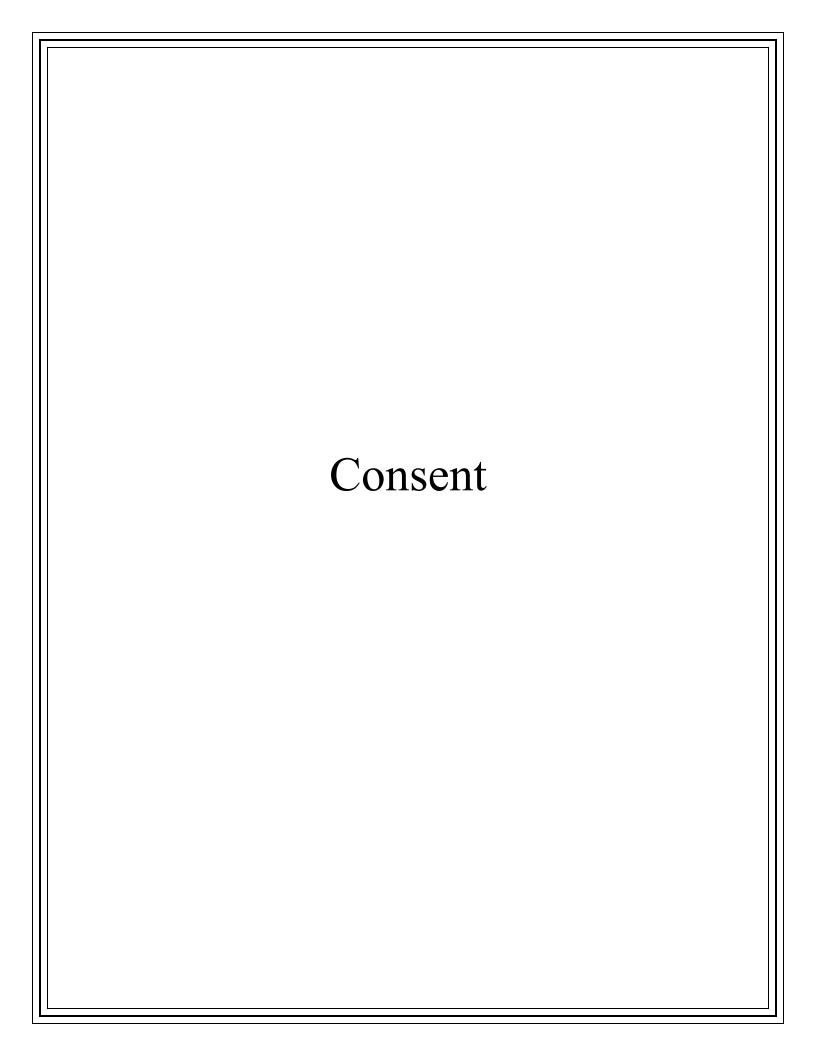
SECOND ROUND APPORTIONMENTS FOR CALIFORNIA PRESCHOOL, TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN AND FULL DAY KINDERGARTEN

The second filing round for the expanded California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program occurred from February 1, 2023 through March 2, 2023. OPSC received a total of 446 applications from 208 applicants requesting an estimated \$1,479.2 million. There is approximately \$367 million available to allocate to eligible applications in this round.

Most of the funding requests from this round are presented in today's agenda for the Board's consideration. OPSC intends to present the remaining fund requests from this round at the November meeting.

NEXT MEETING

The October 2023 SAB meeting will be cancelled. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 29, 2023 at 1 p.m. The location of the meeting will be determined and announced at a later date.

State of California State Allocation Board School Facility Program

This Resolution of the State Allocation Board (hereafter referred to as the "Board") is applicable to the appropriate sections of the Education Code and is described and filed in the office of the Executive Officer and will be made available to all interested parties as the Resolution pertains to the documents attached hereto. Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on September 27, 2023.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
- 2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
- 3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds and/or General Fund proceeds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3rd Street, 4th Floor, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
- 5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY ADJUSTMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To adjust the baseline eligibility for new construction and modernization projects under the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998.

DESCRIPTION

The districts listed on Attachment A have received eligibility approval for new construction. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.51.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting, September 27, 2023

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM APPORTIONMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for Apportionment.

DESCRIPTION

On September 21, 2022, the Board took action, due to the availability of General Fund proceeds, to return to making direct Apportionments while keeping the same benefits of the quick distribution of funds, as the priority funding system, by adopting proposed emergency regulations that revised the fund release deadlines from 18 months to either 180 calendar days for non-financial hardship school districts or 365 calendar days for school districts that qualify for financial hardship. The SFP new construction and modernization projects presented on the Attachment are in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) and are Ready for Apportionment. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

SFP Regulation Section 1859.90 states:

- "(a) With the exception of an apportionment made pursuant to Sections 1859.81.1(e) or 1859.81.2, apportionments provided through the Priority Funding Process and subject to 1859.90.2, or of an Inactive Apportionment subject to Section 1859.96, the OPSC will release State funds that the Board has apportioned to the district after submittal, by the district, of the Form SAB 50-05 and a Grant Agreement, pursuant to Section 1859.90.4.
- (b) With the exception of an apportionment made for a Type II Joint-Use Project, not part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, pursuant to Article 12 of these Regulations, a district must submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement, within 180 calendar days of the Apportionment of the SFP grant for the project or within 365 calendar days for Apportionments that include financial hardship assistance. If the district does not submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement within the above specified time, the entire New Construction Adjusted Grant, or Modernization Adjusted Grant or Type I or II, part of a qualifying SFP Modernization, or Joint-Use Project apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action, and the pupils housed in the project, if applicable, will be

added back to the district's baseline eligibility. The district may refile a new application for the project subject to district eligibility and available State funds at the time of resubmittal.

BACKGROUND

As part of the Governor's approved Budget Act for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, one-time General Fund dollars were appropriated to the Board in the amount of \$1.3 billion for new construction and modernization projects under the SFP. As a result of receiving funding for the SFP that is not contingent on bond sales, the Board was able to return to using an existing regulatory process that allows for Apportionments to be made on a flow basis outside the current Priority Funding process, which is designed to accommodate twice yearly bond sales. Making Apportionments on a flow basis will enable school districts to more quickly and efficiently access much needed cash for construction projects. In order to ensure that cash moves quickly once allocated to school districts, regulations were changed to shorten the deadlines for fund release from 18 months to either 180 calendar days or 365 calendar days for districts that qualify for financial hardship.

School districts must submit the Grant Agreement and a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) 180 calendar days from Board approval for non-financial hardship projects and 365 calendar days from Board approval for financial hardship projects.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
- 2. Specify that the projects are subject to the fund release deadlines as outlined in SFP Regulation Section 1859.90.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request for the State Allocation Board (Board) to approve a three-year extension beyond the five years permitted by School Facility Program (SFP) regulations in order to continue to provide interim housing for the two SFP projects at Central High School, Applications Number 50/63115-00-002 and 57/63115-00-005.

DESCRIPTION

The District submitted two applications seeking SFP New Construction and Modernization funding for a project involving the demolition of several classrooms and then the construction of a new two-story classroom building at Central High School. The District's local school board awarded a contract on March 14, 2017 for a five-year lease of 18 portable classrooms to provide housing for students displaced by the demolition in the project. The District experienced several delays throughout the project process that has prevented the District from fully occupying the new classroom building and, as such, has resulted in the District still using the interim housing portable classrooms.

Per SFP Regulations, a District's baseline eligibility for new construction must be adjusted to account for any classrooms added to a site after a District's new construction baseline eligibility was determined by the Board, with a few notable excepted types of classrooms. One of these excepted types of classrooms is a portable classroom(s) that needs to be leased beyond five years to provide interim housing during the construction of a project as long as the cumulative lease term does not exceed a specified time period "as determined by the SAB [the Board] not to exceed three years" for each project.

Given the District's current use of the interim housing portable classrooms, the District is requesting a three-year extension, beyond the five years permitted, to provide interim housing before the classrooms must be accounted for on the District's baseline eligibility for new construction.

If the District's request is approved, the District will have until March 14, 2025 to end the leasing of the portables.

BACKGROUND

Application for Funding History

Central Union High School is a high school serving Ninth Grade through Twelfth Grade. This school is in Central Union High School District, which is a 9-12 school district located in Imperial County. The District currently serves a student population of 4,093.

On October 31, 2018, the District submitted a SFP modernization application (Application Number 57/63115-00-005) and a SFP new construction application (Application Number 50/63115-00-002) to OPSC. The District received an Apportionment in the amount of \$8,209,061.00 for the modernization application on October 26, 2022 and an Apportionment in the amount of \$19,772,174.00 for the new construction application on February 22, 2023.

The two applications share one plan set consisting of the demolition of 10 portable classrooms and one building with seven classrooms, followed by the construction of one two-story building with 31 classrooms to be used for STEM instruction. The scope of the modernization application involved the like-for-like replacement of seven classrooms, and the scope of the new construction application involved the replacement of 10 portable classrooms with 10 permanent classrooms, as well as the addition of 14 permanent classrooms. The remaining classroom was deemed ineligible for SFP funding and was locally funded by the District.

Project History

The District's local school board entered into an agreement to lease 18 relocatable classrooms for a five-year period on March 14, 2017. The District obtained plan approval from the Division of the State Architect (DSA) on October 30, 2018 after several revisions and difficulties in the design process. The District then encountered several delays throughout the construction of the project, leading the new building to be completed in early March 2022 and certified by DSA in January 2023.

Although the new building was complete, several issues arose that still prevents the District from being able to occupy the entire building. Specifically, there were operational issues with the building's elevator, technology, and drainage, a leak in the water purification system that went into two classrooms, and a need to redesign a robotics classroom so that the equipment was properly anchored. Thus, the District still uses the interim housing portable classrooms to house the displaced students.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

District Position

Citing construction delays and various issues preventing the full occupancy of the new STEM building, the District requests the Board to allow for a three-year extension beyond the five-year period allowed in SFP Regulation Section 1859.51(i)(5) for a district to have portable classrooms on a site to provide interim housing during a project without the District's new construction baseline having to be adjusted for added capacity. If the District's request is approved, the District will have until March 14, 2025 to end the leasing of the portables.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

The full text of the District's request is included as Attachment B.

Staff Position

To house students displaced by the 17 demolished classrooms, the District's local school board entered into an agreement to lease 18 relocatable classrooms for a five-year period on March 14, 2017. The District had originally anticipated completing construction for the project on August 31, 2020, well within the five-year period allowed in SFP Regulation Section 1859.51(i)(5). However, the District encountered delays throughout the entire project, from the design phase to the construction phase. The various delays led to the new STEM building not being ready for occupancy until March 1, 2022 and not ready for full occupancy in the current day.

Given all these delays, the District still needs the portable classrooms to provide interim housing until the new STEM building can be fully occupied. The District currently is actively working toward resolving all outstanding issues in the new STEM building and fully occupying the building by the end of the 2023/2024 fiscal year.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.51(i)(5) states that portable classrooms that need to be leased beyond five years to provide interim housing can be excluded from the District's baseline eligibility for new construction as long as "the cumulative lease term does not exceed a specified time period as determined by the SAB [the Board] not to exceed three years on each qualifying project". This regulation renders the District's request permissible under the Program if the Board approves the request. The request cannot be resolved administratively as the SFP Regulations explicitly requires Board approval.

Staff has reviewed the lease documentation and letters from the contractors and believes that the District did experience unforeseen issues that impacted their ability to complete the project and fully occupy the new STEM building within five years. Additionally, the District states that the interim housing will no longer be in use by the time the three-year extension request concludes on March 14, 2025. Staff believes that the District's request for a three-year extension is allowable under SFP Regulations and ensures that they can adequately house the site's students until the new STEM building can be made fully available. Staff supports the appeal request.

BOARD OPTIONS

Under the Rules and Procedures of the State Allocation Board, "Staff is providing the following option for the Board's consideration. A positive vote by six members is required for the Board to take action that is an alternative to Staff's administrative action. Absent a positive vote by six members of the Board, Staff's administrative action will stand, and the school district's appeal will be considered closed."

Board Option: Grant the District's appeal as shown on Attachment B.

BOARD ACTION

In considering this Item, the Board approved the District's appeal request which provided a three-year extension beyond the five years permitted by SFP regulations in order to continue to provide interim housing for the two SFP projects at Central High School, Applications Number 50/63115-00-002 and 57/63115-00-005. In addition, this approval includes that the interim housing will no longer be in use by the time the three-year extension request concludes on March 14, 2025.

ATTACHMENT A AUTHORITY

Education Code (EC) Section 17070.35.

- (a) In addition to all other powers and duties as are granted to the board by this chapter, other statutes, or the California Constitution, the board shall do all of the following:
 - (1) Adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, for the administration of this chapter. However, the board shall have no authority to set the level of the fees of any architect, structural engineer, or other design professional on any project. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted as emergency regulations, and the circumstances related to the initial adoption are hereby deemed to constitute an emergency for this purpose. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted by November 4, 1998. If the initial regulations are not adopted by that date, the board shall report to the Legislature by that date, explaining the reasons for the delay.
 - (2) Establish and publish any procedures and policies in connection with the administration of this chapter as it deems necessary.
 - (3) Determine the eligibility of school districts to receive apportionments under this chapter.
 - (4) Apportion funds to eligible school districts under this chapter.
- (b) The board shall review and amend its regulations as necessary to adjust its administration of this chapter to conform with the act that amended this section to add this subdivision. Regulations adopted pursuant to this subdivision shall be adopted by November 5, 2002, and shall be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code). The adoption of any emergency regulation pursuant to this subdivision filed with the Office of Administrative Law shall be deemed to be an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, or general welfare. Notwithstanding subdivision (e) of Section 11346.1 of the Government Code, any emergency regulation adopted pursuant to this section shall remain in effect for no more than 365 days unless the board has complied with Sections 11346.2 to 11348, inclusive, of the Government Code.

Education Code Section 17071.30.

For purposes of determining the existing school building capacity, each applicant school district shall include each portable classroom, whether owned or leased, except as otherwise provided in subdivision (a) or (b).

(a) Portable classrooms leased pursuant to Chapter 14 (commencing with Section 17085) shall be excluded from the existing school building capacity. Portable classrooms obtained by an applicant district pursuant to subdivision (b) of Section 17088.5 shall be excluded from the existing school building capacity, except as to any portable classroom or classrooms for which the district rejected the board's offer to purchase pursuant to that subdivision. Portable classrooms leased for a period of less than five years prior to the date of application shall not be included in existing

- school building capacity.
- (b) The number of portable classrooms, reduced by the number of portable classrooms used as interim housing for modernization projects, that exceed 25 percent of the number of permanent classrooms available to the district shall not be included in the existing building capacity.

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.2 states in part:

"Interim Housing" means the rental or lease of classrooms used to house pupils temporarily displaced as a result of the modernization of classroom facilities.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.51. Adjustments to the New Construction Baseline Eligibility.

The baseline eligibility for new construction determined on the Form SAB 50-03 will be adjusted as follows:

- (i) Reduced by the number of pupils housed, based on loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2)(A), in any Classroom Provided after the baseline eligibility was determined by the Board with the exception of those pupils housed or to be housed in a classroom:

- (5) That is a portable classroom that needs to be leased beyond five years to provide interim housing in a modernization or new construction project provided the cumulative lease term does not exceed a specified time period as determined by the SAB not to exceed three years on each qualifying project. For this purpose, a project means all work contained in a single set of construction plans.

SAB 189 Central Union High School District Appeal Description

The Central Union High School District submitted two School Facility Program (SFP) applications to the Office of Public School Construction on October 26, 2022. Two funding applications, modernization and new construction, were submitted to OPSC with one set of plans. The new construction project scope included the replacement of 10 portables classrooms with 10 permanent classrooms along with the addition of 14 classrooms for a total of 24 classrooms. The modernization scope included the demolition and replacement of 7 permanent classrooms. All replacement and new classrooms were constructed in a 31 classroom 2-story permanent building at Central High School.

The District moved forward with student interim housing with a Board awarded agreement for 18 modular classrooms with Williams Scotsman on March 14, 2017. The following month, a modified agreement with Williams Scotsman was awarded by the Board on April 11, 2017. The modifications included a slight cost reduction for interim housing along with the addition of restroom/teacher workroom modulars. Next, the Board awarded the utility improvement agreement with Oakview Construction on April 25, 2017 which provided the necessary utilities to make the interim housing functional. The Notice to Proceed was issued for Oakview on May 15, 2017. It was not until August, 2017 that students began occupying the interim classrooms.

The District had anticipated receiving DSA plan approval for the STEM Building in early Fall 2017. However, after several months of revisions/modifications and difficulties with outside architects contracted by DSA to review the District's application, the plans were approved on October 30, 2018, a 12 month delay. This also created a delay on moving forward with bids and Notices to Proceed as DSA plan approval was pending.

The District's construction management company, Nielsen Construction, generated a construction timeline for the project. The original timeline is included in the Monthly Construction Report 2018-06 – CUHS December Final, attached. The original completion date for the STEM Building was August 31, 2020. Due to delays in the start of construction and the Covid-19 pandemic that hit in March, 2020, the STEM Building was not ready for occupancy until March 1, 2022, an 18-month delay. While the building was ready for occupancy, classroom availability became limited due to the following issues: technology not fully operational, elevator not operational, drainage issues, water purification system leaks and roof flashing repairs needed.

Due to construction delays and limited STEM Building access described above, the District respectfully requests the State Allocation Board (SAB) approve a three (3) year extension beyond the five (5) years permitted in order to provide interim housing for the 50/63115-00-002 and 57/63115-00-005 projects at the next available SAB meeting in order to fully complete the STEM Building. The interim housing will be returned prior to the extension request of March 14, 2025.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

Pursuant to Regulation Section 1859.105 (a)(4), other evidence satisfactory to the Board detailing the reason(s) and circumstance(s) beyond the control of the district that precludes substantial progress being made. If the Board determines that substantial progress has been made pursuant to Education Code Section 17076.10(b), the Board shall condition its finding of substantial progress upon the district's commitment to complete and submit satisfactory evidence that the district meets the provisions of Section 1859.105(a)(1) through (a)(3) within the period not to exceed 18 months from the date of the Board's determination of substantial progress.

STAFF COMMENTS

The Attachment represents the project applications in which the districts have received an adjusted grant apportionment and a subsequent fund release. These districts have submitted acceptable explanations of why a substantial progress extension is required. Staff recommends approval of the request for additional time to submit evidence that substantial progress has been met on the adjusted grant.

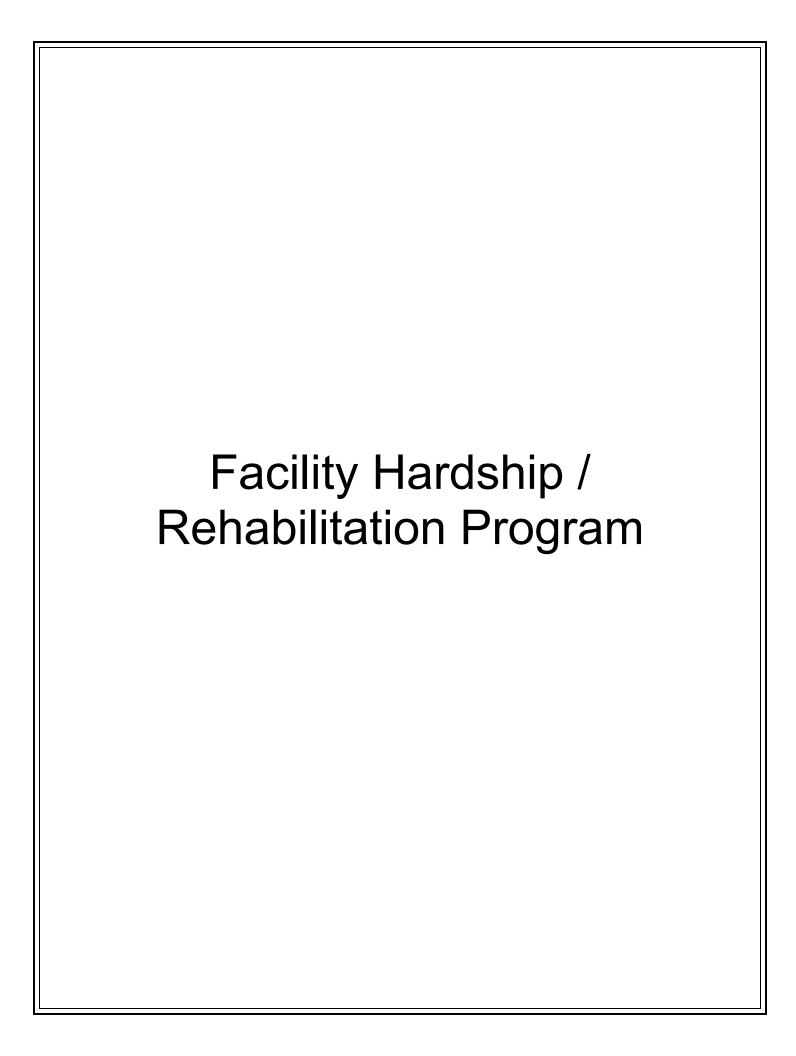

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

A report by Sebastopol Construction Services (SCS), Inc., dated July 23, 2023, noted that site visits to the Anderson Valley Junior-Senior High site were conducted on January 3 and January 6, 2023 to locate the site's existing septic system and assess the functionality of the system. During the site visit, the SCS crew observed "Wastewater from the septic tank was not being conveyed to the leach field, instead, it was accumulating in the transmission line trench" and "this situation caused sewer back-ups at the septic tank and potentially led to wastewater surfacing in the baseball field." The report further added "The current situation due to the wastewater disposal system backing up and potentially surfacing combined with a lack of toilets is a health and safety risk for the AVHS students and staff" and provided minimum recommendations for repairing the septic system. In the review of the industry specialist's report, the Mendocino County Public Health Department concurred on July 28, 2023 that the failing septic system risks are, but not limited to, "... exposure of students and staff to wastewater and fecal matter on the baseball field, which can cause the spread of bacteria and disease..." Additionally, the Public Health Department also concurred that the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety risks related to the failing septic system for the High School are" those specified actions set forth in the Industrial report..."

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The minimum work necessary to mitigate the health and safety threat includes the replacement of the transmission line from the septic tank to the distribution boxes, cleaning out the diversion boxes and repairing/replacing the missing baffles, cleaning out the manholes, hydro-jetting the leach lines to ensure the lines are clear of debris and are able to receive wastewater, and repairing any broken leach line pipes.

The project was completed in April, 2023.

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

A report by Sebastopol Construction Services (SCS), Inc., dated February 19, 2023, noted that a site visit to the Anderson Valley Elementary site was conducted on August 6, 2022 to review the condition of the existing failing septic system serving the elementary school site. During the site visit, the SCS crew observed "At the Distribution box, the leach lines were each put under a 120 gallon load test and two of the nine were found to be in failure" and, further, "...there are multiple deficiencies with the septic system." Additionally, the report adds that "Due to the recent sewage back-ups experienced by the school, the septic tanks are also backing up into the access risers/lids" and that the SCS crew further observed "...the tanks are overflowing onto the asphalt with wastewater." The report concludes that "the history of septic system malfunction has created an unnecessary and imminent health and safety risk" and provides minimum recommendations for repairing the failing system.

In the review of the industry specialist's report, the Mendocino County Public Health Department concurred on April 13, 2023 that the failing septic system risks are, but not limited to, "...exposure of students and staff to wastewater and fecal matter on the play area, which can cause the spread of bacteria and disease, and the potential safety risk of children falling though deteriorating manholes." Additionally, the Public Health Department also concurred that the minimum work required to mitigate the health and safety risks related to the failing septic system is "Design Option 1 – Atgrade Mound System, as set forth in the Industrial Specialist report and approved by the County of Mendocino Environmental Health Department on March 2, 2023..."

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The minimum work necessary to mitigate the health and safety threat includes the installation of an at-grade mound system, a 10,000-gallon primary septic tank and a 5,000-gallon sump tank to mitigate the health and safety issues outlined above.

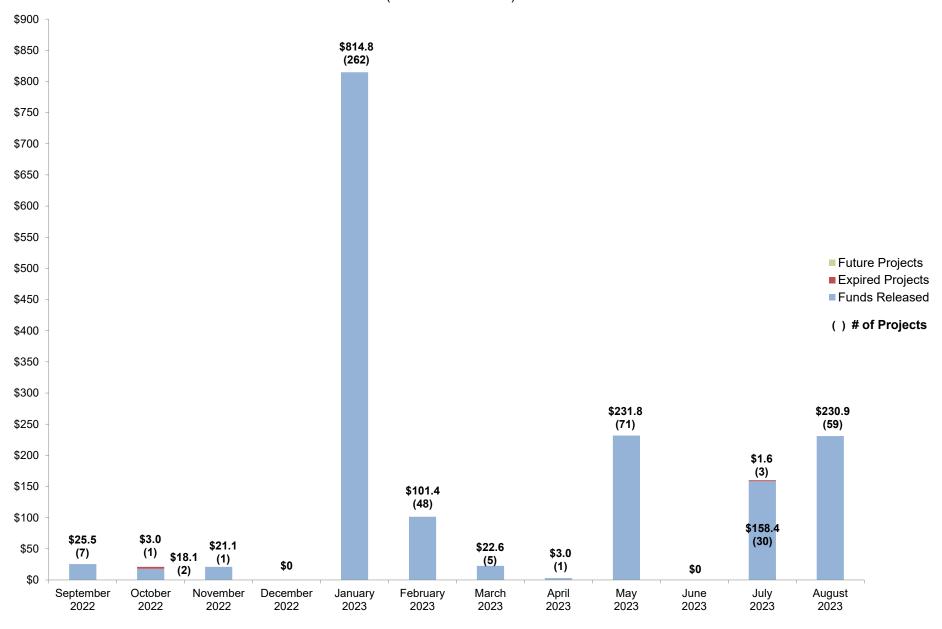




STATUS OF FUND RELEASES

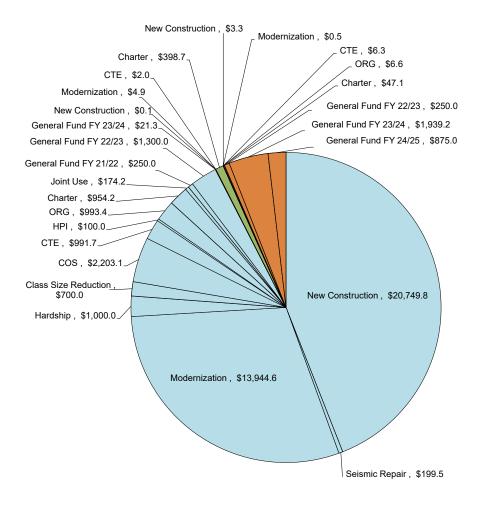

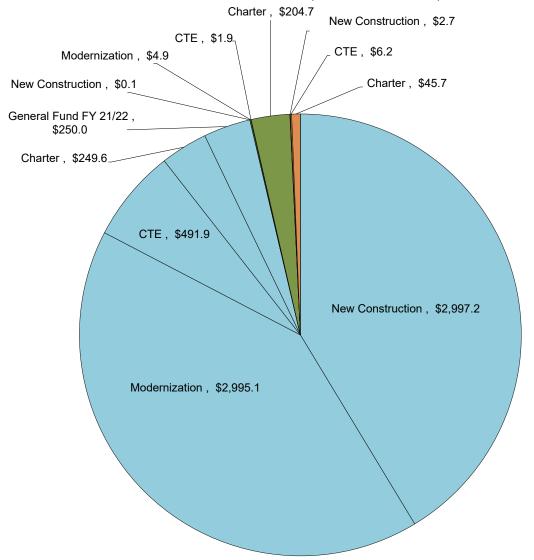

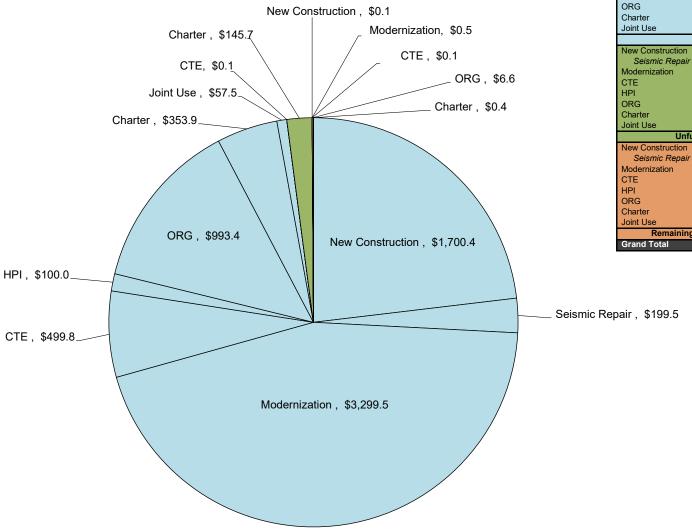
Proposition 51 Bond Authority - \$7.250 billion (in millions of dollars)



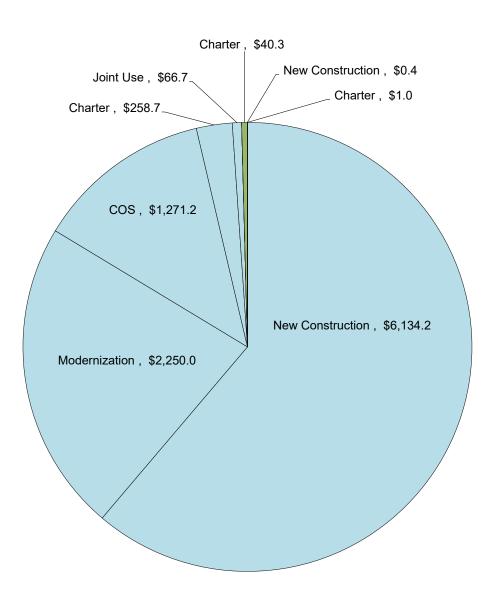

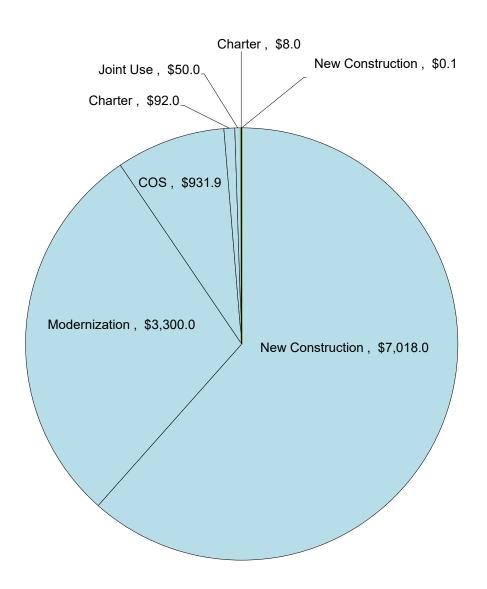


Proposition 55 Bond Authority - \$10.023 billion (in millions of dollars)

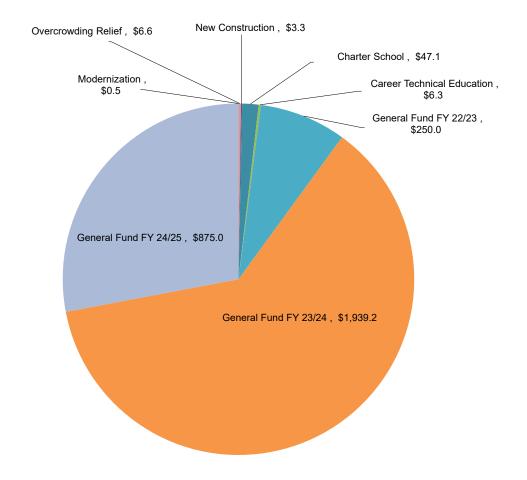

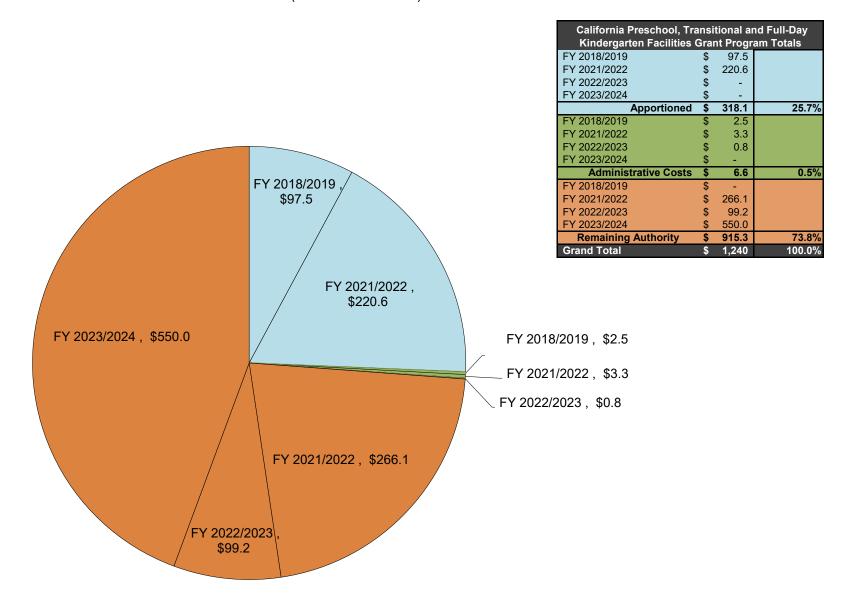

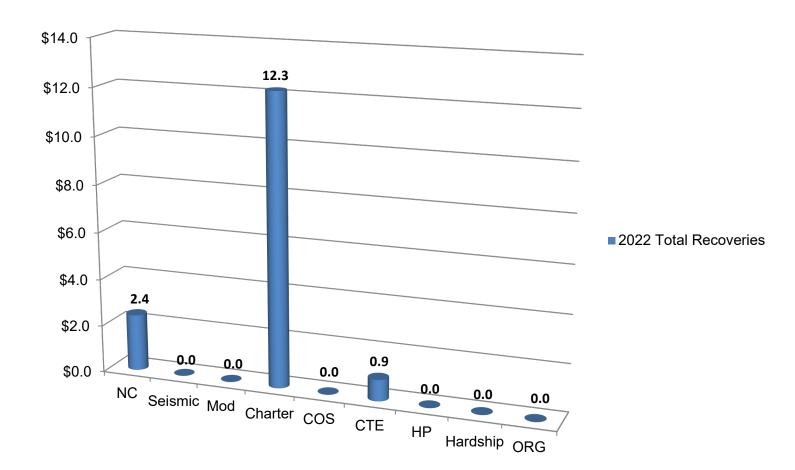
California Preschool, Transitional and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program - \$1,240 million

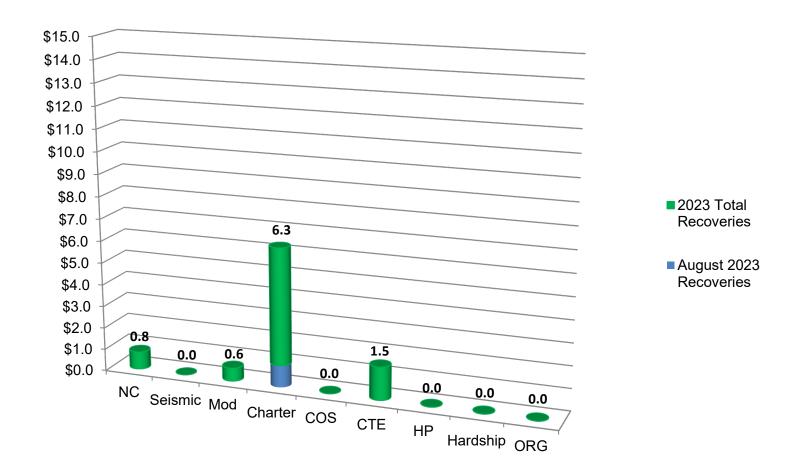

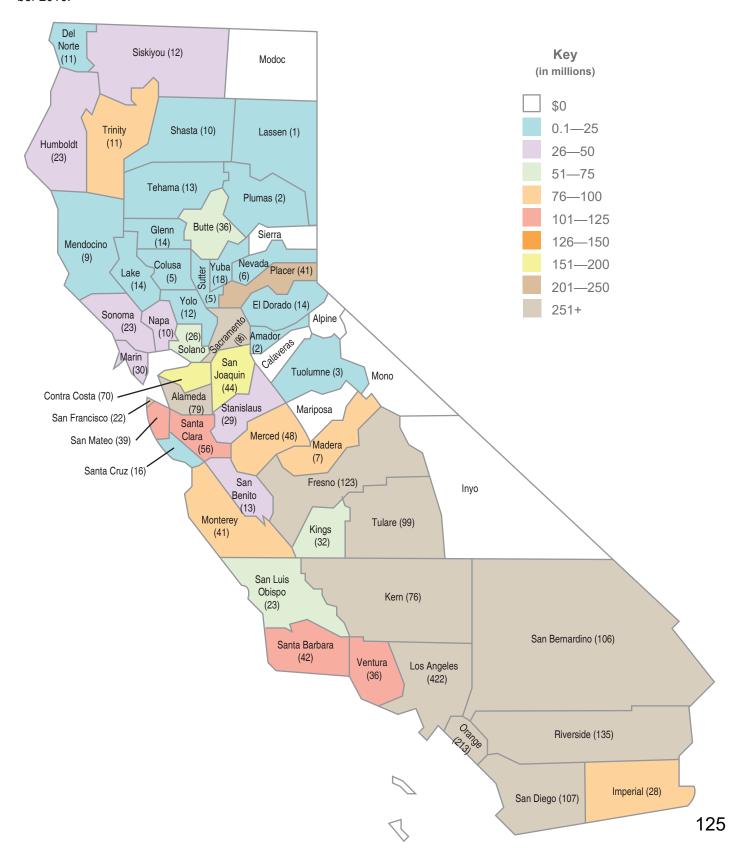

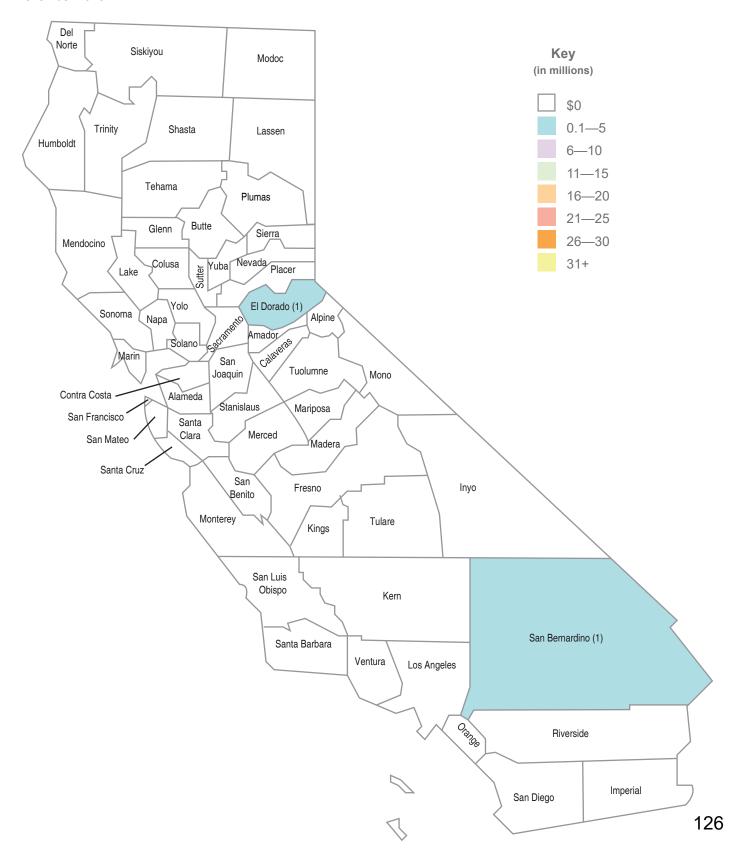
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Apportionments by County

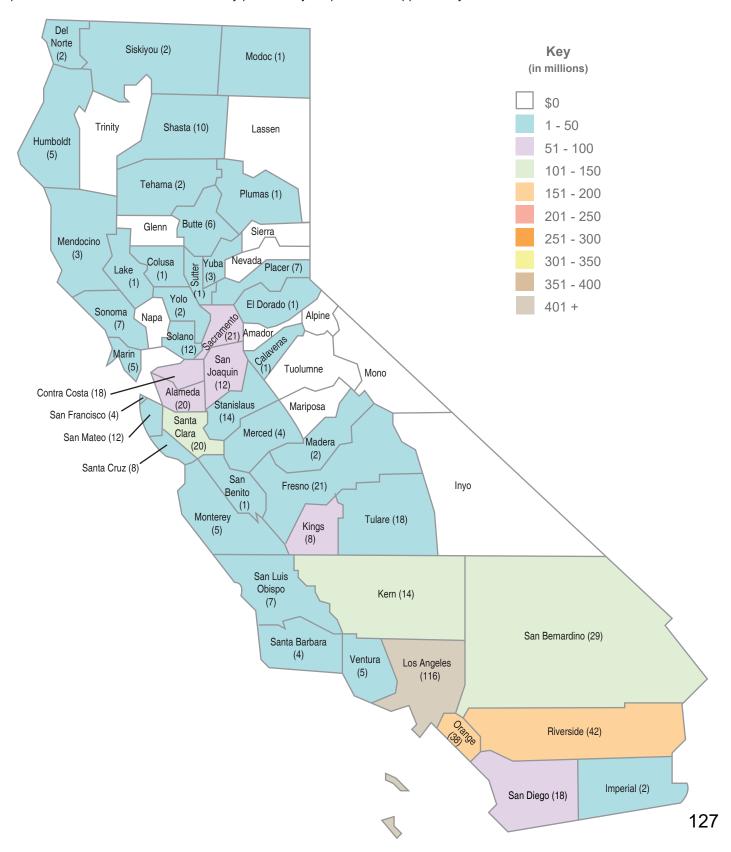
School Facility Program Proposition 51 Unfunded Approvals by County

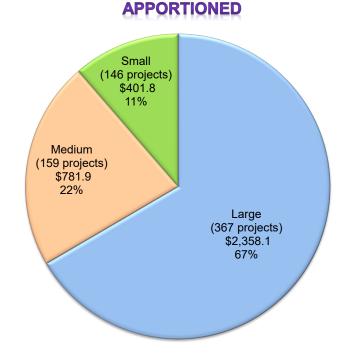

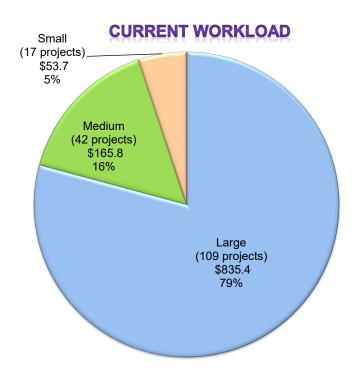

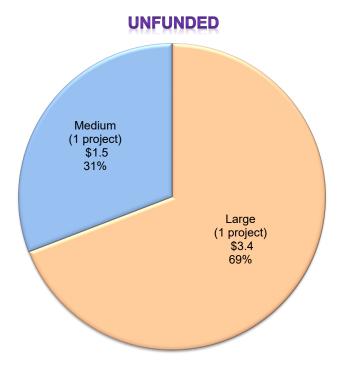

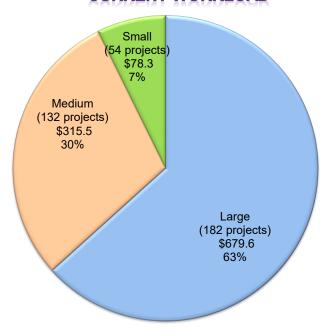

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting, September 27, 2023

ADDITIONAL GRANT FOR GENERAL SITE DEVELOPMENT

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek approval from the State Allocation Board (Board) to extend the General Site Development grant for two years.

DESCRIPTION

The regulations authorizing the General Site Development grant will expire on January 1, 2024. This item provides the Board the option to extend the authority to provide the grant until January 1, 2026.

<u>AUTHORITY</u>

Education Code 17070.35 states:

- (a) In addition to all other powers and duties as are granted to the board by this chapter, other statutes, or the California Constitution, the board shall do all of the following:
- (1) Adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, for the administration of this chapter. However, the board shall have no authority to set the level of the fees of any architect, structural engineer, or another design professional on any project. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted as emergency regulations, and the circumstances related to the initial adoption are hereby deemed to constitute an emergency for this purpose. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted by November 4, 1998. If the initial regulations are not adopted by that date, the board shall report to the Legislature by that date, explaining the reasons for the delay.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>

When an applicant applies for School Facility Program (SFP) New Construction funding, supplemental site grants such as Service Site Development, Off-Site Development, Utilities, and General Site Development, may be requested. A description of what is included in each of these grant categories follows.

Service Site Development prepares the site for building or infrastructure construction and is performed within school property lines. Including such items as site demolition, rough grading, soil compaction, drainage and eligible erosion control.

Off-Site Development prepares the perimeter of two sides of the site including street grading and paving, storm drainage lines, curbs, gutters, sidewalks, and street lighting. These improvements are commonly dedicated for public use.

Utility costs involve the installation of water, sewer, gas, electricity, and communication lines necessary to serve the master-planned capacity of the site.

General Site Development includes, but is not limited to, finish grading, on-site hard surfaced areas for foot traffic, driveways, walkways, outdoor instructional play facilities, permanent playground equipment, athletic fields, and landscaping.

In December 2005, the Board requested that the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) create a committee to look at the adequacy of new construction grants. Specifically, the Board asked that the committee address two issues: the equity of the SFP new construction base grant compared to the equivalent allowances provided under the Lease Purchase Program (LPP) when the State converted programs in 1998; and, if the grants are sufficient to build a completely new school.

In response, OPSC assembled the Grant Adequacy Ad Hoc Committee (Committee), which included representatives from several school districts, architectural, construction and construction management firms, consultants, the California Building Industry Association, the Department of Finance, the California Department of Education, and OPSC staff. The Committee took a two-step approach to the Board's request, and its first step concentrated on determining if the SFP new construction base grant was equitable at the time of conversion from the LPP.

The report back to the Board in April 2006 identified that additional analysis was warranted to fully explore the complexities of the funding model and how the additional grants may make up for differences seen when comparing the SFP base grant to the LPP base grants. However, thru analysis, the Committee was unable to definitively conclude if the general site allowance is included in the SFP base grant. The Board requested that OPSC return the following month to present a proposal and recommendations regarding general site additional grants.

In May 2006 an item was presented to the Board for consideration of adding an additional grant for general site development. In the report, OPSC staff stated that "if general site development costs were factored into the development of the new construction base grant, then the new construction base grant does not take into account the size of the site." Because larger sites would incur more costs related to general site development, it was considered a reasonable conclusion that the general site costs were not fully factored into the development of the SFP new construction base grant. The Board adopted a temporary general site grant until a complete analysis of the new construction base grant could be completed.

At the May 28, 2008 meeting, Staff presented an item to seek direction on applications that were received by OPSC during the period of time where the regulations were expired from January 1, 2008, to March 2, 2008. Staff recommended that the Board apportion the projects with the General Site Development grant included. Staff cited the December 2007 meeting where the Board indicated that "it wanted the general site development allowance to be seamless with no gaps in funding." The Board approved Staff's recommendation.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.76(d) implementing this additional grant was effective on September 5, 2006, with a suspension date of "no later than January 1, 2008, unless otherwise extended by the amendments as adopted by the Board."

Subsequent Extensions

At the December 2007 meeting, the Board made its first extension of the General Site Development Grant. Since then the Board has approved single year extensions every year with two exceptions. In July 2011, the Board approved a two-year extension; and in June 2018, the Board approved a five-year extension.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

Approval of an extension of two years to the General Site Development grant regulation would prevent a lapse in regulatory authority and would continue to allow applications to be processed with the grant, provided that the regulation extension is approved by the Board, filed with the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) and in effect before the existing regulations expire. Funding applications received after January 1, 2024 would not be able to request this supplemental grant without the extension.

Summary

Staff recommends extending the General Site Development grant two years to sunset on January 1, 2026.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Adopt the proposed regulations as shown in the Attachment, which extends the General Site Development grant for two years to January 1, 2026.
- 2. Authorize the Executive Officer to file the proposed regulations with the OAL on an emergency basis and make the regulations permanent.

This Item was approved by the State Allocation Board on September 27, 2023.

School Facility Program Regulatory Amendments

Section 1859.76. New Construction Additional Grant for Site Development Costs.

In addition to any other funding authorized by these Regulations, the Board shall provide funding equal to 50 percent of the following approved site development and applicable design costs:

. . .

- (d) General Site Development costs within school property lines for an addition to an existing school site project wherein additional acreage is acquired, with the exception of existing school site acreage that is leased pursuant to Section 1859.22, or a new school project, determined as follows:
- (1) \$19,200 per Useable Acre as approved by the CDE. This sum may be increased by the percentage identified in Section 1859.83(b). The per acre amount shown above shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71.
- (2) 6 percent of the State and district share for Elementary School Pupils and Middle School Pupils and 3.75 percent of the State and district share for High School Pupils of the New Construction Grant. For purposes of this calculation, the percentage amount for Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs and Non-Severely Disabled Individuals with Exceptional Needs pupils shall be based on the type of project selected by the district on the Form SAB 50-04.
- (3) 6 percent of the State and district share for Elementary School Pupils and Middle School Pupils and 3.75 percent of the State and district share for High School Pupils of the funding provided by Sections 1859.71.2, 1859.72, 1859.73, 1859.73.2, 1859.82, 1859.83(a), (b) and (c) and 1859.125(a)(1) through (a)(2).

Subsection (d) of this section shall be suspended no later than January 1, 20242026, unless otherwise extended by amendments as adopted by the Board.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting September 27, 2023

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CALIFORNIA PRESCHOOL, TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN AND FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN FACILITIES GRANT PROGRAM

PURPOSE

To present the State Allocation Board (Board) with policy recommendations to modify funding deadlines and requirements for projects Apportioned during the third and fourth funding rounds of the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (Program) and propose regulatory amendments.

DESCRIPTION

In 2018, the Program provided one-time grants to construct or retrofit school facilities for the purpose of providing full-day kindergarten classrooms to house existing kindergarten students. With the enactment of the Assembly Bill (AB) 130 in 2021, the Program now provides funding to construct new school facilities and retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of expanding existing programs or providing new programs for California preschool, transitional kindergarten, and full-day kindergarten pupils.

Projects being funded under the expanded Program in the third and fourth funding rounds are experiencing more complexities than the projects funded during the first and second funding rounds. The expansion of the grade levels that the Program can serve have resulted in projects generally becoming larger and more complex. School districts are also facing lingering impacts on construction timelines and access to materials, due in part to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Program's current fund release and project completion timelines and requirements have remained unchanged from the original adoption of the Program's regulations in 2018.

Staff is presenting proposed amendments to the Program's regulations, forms, and grant agreement in order to provide additional time to meet fund release and project completion deadlines. Staff is also recommending that the Board allow the additional time allowed to meet these two deadlines be applied to school districts funded during the third and fourth funding rounds. This item seeks Board approval for the following amended documents:

- Proposed Program Regulations (Attachment C)
- Application for Funding (Form SAB 70-01) (Attachment D)
- Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 70-02) (Attachment E)
- Expenditure Report (Form SAB 70-03) (Attachment F)

BACKGROUND

Program History

Overview of the Advanced Fund Release for Design Conversion Process

The Board originally had three years to encumber funds when the Program was first established in 2018. After a series of stakeholder meetings, Staff drafted the establishing program regulations in a manner that would allow the Board to promptly expend the Program funds within this given time frame. Regulatory amendments later adopted by the Board, after three stakeholder meetings, to incorporate the statutory changes enacted through AB 130 kept the same fund release and project completion deadlines listed below.

The regulations set the following deadlines by which school districts must meet full fund release requirements, which include obtaining plan approvals by the Division of the State Architect (DSA) and the California Department of Education (CDE) as well as award a contract(s) for the completion of the project:

- School districts that received new construction or retrofit grants *without* an advance release of funds must submit a *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 70-02) and all required submittals within 180 days of the first Apportionment.
- School districts that receive new construction or retrofit grants *with* an advance release of funds must submit a Form SAB 70-02 and all required approvals within 12 months of the first Apportionment.

Program Regulation Section 1860.16 currently states that, if the required submittals are not submitted to OPSC within the appropriate timeline, "the Apportionment shall be rescinded, and the Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant will return to the Program for reallocation."

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

First and Second Funding Round Applications

The applications Apportioned during the first and second funding rounds were subject to the more narrowed scope of the original Program wherein one-time grants were provided for the purpose of only providing full-day kindergarten classrooms to house existing kindergarten students. The narrowed scope played a part in the relatively smaller scope of first and second round Apportioned applications, with the average project size being two classrooms.

The majority of applications Apportioned during the first and second funding rounds that requested an advance release of design funds successfully submitted the approvals and Form SAB 70-02 required for a full fund release. However, most of these school districts ended up doing so outside of the originally allotted 12-month deadline stated in Regulation Section 1860.16. The few applications that did not submit the required documents for full fund release were withdrawn by the Districts on their own accord.

The school districts with these Apportioned applications were working on meeting the full fund release requirements during the period that the State of Emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic was in place. The pandemic added many challenges for school districts trying to meet original deadlines for school construction projects funded by the Board. Many of these school districts submitted formal extension requests for the Program's full fund release deadline, with most requesting to extend the deadline by several months. The majority of the requests were administratively approved by the Office of Public School Construction's (OPSC) Executive Officer pursuant to California Code of Regulations Section 1580, which grants the Executive Officer the authority to extend impacted program deadlines when a State of Emergency is declared by the Governor.

Third Funding Round Applications

Applications submitted during the third funding round were under the expanded Program that allowed funding for facilities to not only house existing full-day kindergarten students but also to support existing or expand programs for California preschool students and transitional kindergarten students. There have been several factors that have added challenges for the school districts with Apportioned third funding round applications trying to meet the Program's full fund release requirements within the original 12-month deadline.

These factors include expanding the grade level eligibility of the Program, which has led to an increase in the number of classrooms being requested. On average, applications Apportioned in the third round requested funding for four classrooms, which is double the average number of classrooms requested by applications Apportioned in the first and second round. More classrooms require more planning in order to determine design and the broader impacts on the site and the community. Additionally, these school districts still face lingering impacts from COVID-19, such as complications with material availability and supply chains as well as workload backlogs throughout the design and construction industry. The school districts who opted for modular construction to meet Program deadlines also were impacted by the implementation of changes to the California Building and Energy Code at the beginning of this year because the code updates, while regularly occurring, do require updated approvals for modular designs, which elongate the design and approval timeframes.

Citing the issues described above, four school districts with projects Apportioned and submitted during the third funding round have each submitted an appeal request for a 12-month extension to the full fund release deadline. Other school districts with Apportioned third funding round applications have also communicated similar concerns to OPSC. As shown on Attachment B, only three out of the 69 projects Apportioned in the third funding round have submitted a Form SAB 70-02 and met the requirements for full fund release with deadlines quickly arriving in September, October, and November of 2023.

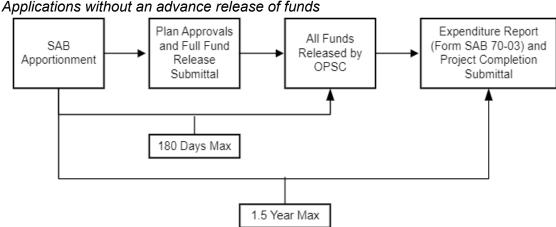
STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

Policy Recommendation and Proposed Regulatory Amendments

Staff is making a policy recommendation that the Board allow the extended fund release and project completion deadlines listed below be applied to applications Apportioned in the third funding round that were received from April 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022, and to applications that will be Apportioned in the fourth funding round that were received from February 1, 2023 through March 2, 2023. Staff also proposes the following amendments to Program regulations, which will apply future funding rounds:

- Amend the current deadline that school districts must submit the required plan approvals and Form SAB 70-02 for full fund release from 180 days or 12 months, depending on the type of application, from the first Apportionment to 18 months from the first Apportionment.
- Amend the current deadline by which school districts must meet project completion requirements and submit an *Expenditure Report* (Form SAB 70-03) from one year from the date of the final fund release to three years from the date of the first Apportionment.
- Provide an option for school districts to submit other evidence in writing to the Board
 demonstrating that substantial progress has been made on the project if they are
 unable to submit a request for full fund release within 18 months. However, in no
 instance will a district have more than a combined three years from first Apportionment
 to request the release of funds and complete the project.

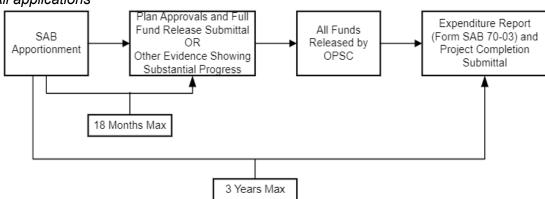
<u>Current Fund Release and Project Completion Deadlines – 1.5 year to 2 years</u>

<u>Proposed Fund Release and Project Completion Deadlines – Extended to 3 years</u> *All applications*



Providing additional time for school districts to meet full fund release and project completion requirements will help school districts meet deadlines for the larger and more complicated projects under the expanded Program. Extending these deadlines may also enable school districts to choose permanent construction because school districts will have significantly more time to design and complete projects. The lengthened deadlines will better align the Program with the timelines used for School Facility Program projects wherein school districts have 18 months to show substantial progress on their project and have a project completion deadline of three years for elementary school projects. Incorporating the proposed amendments into Program Regulations, Forms, and Grant Agreement allow this policy to apply to all future applications seeking Program funding.

Conforming Regulation Updates

The proposed amendments to Program regulations, forms, and grant agreement also incorporate changes implemented by the passage of Senate Bill 114 that extends the amount of time that Program funds shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the Board. These proposed changes will also address several appeals filed by a number of districts seeking to extend the deadlines for the projects awarded in the third funding round and alleviate potential concerns for projects awarded in future funding rounds.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Allow the proposed extensions to Program deadlines as outlined in the proposed amendments to Regulation Section 1860.16 to apply to Apportioned applications received during the third funding round (applications received from April 1, 2022 through April 30, 2022) as well as the Apportioned applications that were received during the fourth funding round (applications received from February 1, 2023 through March 2, 2023).
- 2. Adopt the proposed amendments to Program regulations, forms, and grant agreement as shown in Attachments C through G.
- 3. Authorize the Executive Officer to file the proposed Regulatory Amendments with the Office of Administrative Law (OAL) and make the Regulation permanent.

This Item was approved by the State Allocation Board on September 27, 2023.

Education Code (EC) Section 17375.

- (a) (1) The California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program is hereby established, under the administration of the State Allocation Board pursuant to the requirements of this section, to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing transitional kindergarten classrooms and full-day kindergarten classrooms pursuant to Section 8973, and for the construction of new preschool classrooms, the modernization of existing preschool classrooms, or the modernization of existing kindergarten and grade 1 to 12, inclusive, classrooms that would be converted to provide California state preschool programs operated by school districts on a public schoolsite, pursuant to this section.
- (2) Moneys appropriated pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, hereby created in the State Treasury, administered by the State Allocation Board.
- (3) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section, as it read on December 31, 2020.
- (4) (A) For the 2021–22 fiscal year, the sum of four hundred ninety million dollars (\$490,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2027.
- (B) For the 2022–23 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund in the 2021–22 fiscal year to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2028.
- (C) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate an additional five hundred fifty million dollars (\$550,000,000) in the 2024–25 fiscal year from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds intended to be appropriated in this subparagraph will be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2030.
- (D) (i) Of the moneys allocated to a school district from the appropriation made pursuant to this paragraph, savings and interest achieved upon full completion of an approved project, and as a result of a school district's efficient and prudent expenditure of the moneys allocated, may be used for professional development or instructional materials to build capacity for the implementation of a California state preschool program, a transitional kindergarten program, a full-day kindergarten program, or high priority

capital outlay purposes identified by the school district and in accordance with subdivision (f), associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement.

- (ii) Notwithstanding any other law, for purposes of the funds appropriated in support of this paragraph only, a school district may retain and use savings and interest pursuant to clause (i) even if it receives financial hardship assistance pursuant to Section 17075.10.
- (iii) Savings and interest retained by a school district shall be expended within one year of project completion or returned to the state as required by associated regulations and any accompanying grant agreement.
- (5) New school facilities built pursuant to this section shall not be included in the eligibility determination used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10).
- (b) (1) The State Allocation Board shall award grants to school districts that lack the facilities to provide transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten as required for eligibility pursuant to Sections 17071.25 and 17072.10, that lack facilities that satisfy the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, or that lack the facility capacity to increase California state preschool program services.
- (2) Priority for grants shall be given to school districts that meet either of the following criteria:
- (A) The school district is financially unable to contribute a portion of, or all of, the local matching share required pursuant to paragraph (3) for a project, and meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Sections 17075.10 and 17075.15. For purposes of this section, paragraph (5) of subdivision (d) of Section 17075.15 shall not apply.
- (B) (i) For school districts seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved community with a high population of pupils who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 42238.01.
- (ii) For school districts seeking a preschool facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved area, as defined in Section 8205, that is prioritized to receive funds for the California state preschool program according to the prioritization process described in Section 8210.
- (3) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10 and as specified in paragraph (4), a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for new construction shall provide 50 percent of the cost of

the project, and a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for a retrofit project shall provide 40 percent of the cost of the project.

- (4) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, a school district shall provide 25 percent of the cost of the project, whether the project is for new construction or retrofit, if the school district does either of the following:
- (A) Converts a part-day kindergarten program to a full-day kindergarten program. A school district that was awarded a grant from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) and met the requirements of this paragraph shall have its grant amount adjusted from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (4) of subdivision (a) to reflect the requirements of this paragraph.
- (B) Commencing with the 2021–22 fiscal year, offers, or expands enrollment in, a California state preschool program or transitional kindergarten program.
- (5) (A) A school district seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account shall provide the Office of Public School Construction with schoolsite enrollment data for the year in which its application is processed and the three immediately preceding years. The Office of Public School Construction shall use this data to verify the schoolsite's overall need for funding pursuant to this section based on the schoolsite's enrollment patterns. As part of this verification, the Office of Public School Construction, in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall determine if the schoolsite's need for funding shall be limited to retrofit projects.
- (B) For a school district seeking a new construction grant for preschool classrooms from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, the school district shall demonstrate that its existing classrooms, including outdoor play areas and equipment, are insufficient to meet the needs of providing preschool, and that the school district's projected enrollment in the preschool program exceeds the current preschool program classroom capacity at the applicable schoolsite. A school district shall use both of the following to demonstrate enrollment for purposes of determining eligibility:
- (i) The most recent childcare needs assessment conducted by its regional local planning council for preschool age children.
- (ii) A current or future contract with the State Department of Education to operate a preschool program.
- (6) A school district, county office of education, or community college district seeking a preschool facilities grant shall hold title to the real property where the facilities will be located.

- (c) The State Allocation Board shall disburse grant funds to school districts with approved applications for new construction or retrofit projects, to the extent funds are available for the state's applicable matching share, if the school district has provided its applicable local matching share, unless the school district meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, and upon certification by the school district that the school district has entered into a binding contract for completion of the approved project.
- (d) The State Allocation Board shall allocate funds to school districts using the same maximum grant eligibility amounts that are used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10), as set forth in Sections 17072.10 and 17072.11 for new construction, and as set forth in Section 17074.10 for retrofit projects.
- (e) As a condition of receiving grant funds pursuant to this section, and before the release of those funds, the school district shall do all of the following:
- (1) Execute and submit a grant agreement consistent with the applicable sections of the grant agreement specified in Section 1859.90.4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (2) For a school district applying for grant funds for a transitional kindergarten facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to offer, or expand enrollment in, a transitional kindergarten program.
- (3) For a school district applying for grant funds for a California state preschool program facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to expand enrollment in a preschool program and apply for expanded program service funding, and certify that the school district has or will apply for a contract to operate a preschool program before occupying the to-be-constructed or retrofitted facility.
- (f) (1) A school district may use grant funds awarded for new construction on costs necessary to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils in an approved project, which shall include only the following:
- (A) The costs of design, engineering, testing, inspections, plan checking, construction management, site acquisition and development, evaluation and response action costs relating to hazardous substances at a new or existing schoolsite, demolition, construction, landscaping, necessary utility costs, utility connections and other related fees, equipment including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, furnishings, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.

- (B) The costs of acquiring an existing government-owned or privately owned building, or a privately financed school building, and the necessary costs of converting the government-owned or privately owned building for public school use.
- (2) (A) A school district may use grant funds awarded for a retrofit project to retrofit an existing school facility to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils, which shall only include the costs of design, engineering, testing, inspection, plan checking, construction management, demolition, construction, necessary utility costs, utility connection and other related fees, the purchase and installation of air-conditioning equipment and insulation materials and related costs, furniture and equipment, including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, fire safety improvements, playground safety improvements, the identification, assessment, or abatement of hazardous asbestos, seismic safety improvements, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.
- (B) Grant funds awarded for a retrofit project shall not be used for costs associated with acquisition and development of real property or for routine maintenance and repair.
- (3) A school district shall not use funds to purchase or install portable classrooms. For purposes of this article, "portable classroom" means a classroom building of one or more stories that is designed and constructed to be relocatable and transportable over public streets, and for a single-story portable classroom, is designed and constructed for relocation without the separation of the roof or floor from the building and when measured at the most exterior walls, has a floor area that does not exceed 2,000 square feet.
- (g) For a modernization grant pursuant to this article to retrofit an existing preschool classroom, including outdoor play areas and installed equipment, the applicable classroom shall comply with all of the following:
- (1) The Field Act, as set forth in Article 3 (commencing with Section 17280) and Article 6 (commencing with Section 17365).
- (2) The California Building Standards Code, as set forth in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (3) The regulations for early learning and care programs as set forth in Chapter 19 (commencing with Section 18000) of Division 1 of Title 5 of, and Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 101151) of Division 12 of Title 22 of, the California Code of Regulations, as applicable.
- (4) Written approval from the State Department of Education that the building plans comply with the standards set forth in Subchapter 1 (commencing with Section 14001) of Chapter 13 of Division 1 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

- (h) The State Allocation Board may adopt regulations to implement this section. Any regulations adopted pursuant to this section may be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Title 2 of the Government Code). The adoption of these regulations shall be deemed to be an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, or general welfare.
- (i) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district shall be subject, with regard to this section, to an audit conducted pursuant to Section 41024.
- (j) The Office of Public School Construction shall report to the Director of Finance, and shall post on its internet website, information regarding the use of grant funds that have been made available to school districts during each fiscal year grant funds are disbursed pursuant to this section. A final report shall also be issued after projects have been audited pursuant to Section 41024 and any savings have been spent or returned to the state.
- (k) The Department of General Services may charge its administrative costs against the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, which shall be subject to the approval of the Department of Finance and which shall not exceed 2.5 percent of the account. These administrative funds shall be subject to the encumbrance or expenditure availability for the appropriations described in paragraph (4) of subdivision (a).
- (I) Funds made available to school districts pursuant to this article shall supplement, not supplant, existing funds available for school facilities construction.
- (m) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
- (1) "Kindergarten" includes transitional kindergarten, as defined in Section 48000.
- (2) "Preschool classroom" means a preschool classroom used or proposed to be used for instructional purposes in a California state preschool program.
- (3) "Preschool program" means a full-day California state preschool program pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 8207) of Chapter 2 of Part 6.
- (4) "Schoolsite" or "site" means the project site for which the school district is applying for grants under this article.
- (5) "School district" means as follows:
- (A) For transitional kindergarten and full-day kindergarten facilities grants, "school district" means a school district.
- (B) For preschool facilities grants, "school district" means a school district, county office of education, or a community college district that operates a preschool program on behalf of, or in lieu of, a school district or county office of education.

(Amended by Stats. 2023, Ch. 48, Sec. 15. (SB 114) Effective July 10, 2023.)

EC Section 8973.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the kindergarten schoolday in an early primary program conducted pursuant to Section 8972 may exceed four hours, exclusive of recesses, provided that both of the following conditions are met:

- (a) The governing board of a school district declares that the extended-day kindergarten program does not exceed the length of the primary schoolday.
- (b) The extended-day kindergarten program takes into account ample opportunity for both active and quiet activities within an integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate educational program.

EC Section 8974.

School districts with early primary programs shall provide educational continuity from preschool through kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive, by accomplishing the following:

- (a) Establish connections with public preschool programs, including state preschool, state child development, and federal Head Start programs, to establish a more effective transition of children from preschool to kindergarten.
- (b) Promote connections among early primary programs that provide before- and afterschool services.
- (c) Promote joint activities for teachers and administrators of public preschool programs, including state preschool, state child development, and federal Head Start, and kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive, in areas such as program planning and staff development training related to developmentally appropriate curriculum and assessment practices for young children.

EC Section 8207.

(a) The Superintendent shall administer all California state preschool programs. Those programs shall include, but not be limited to, part-day and full-day age and developmentally appropriate programs, offered through childcare centers and family childcare home education networks, that are designed to facilitate the transition to kindergarten for three- and four-year-old children in educational development, health services, social services, nutritional services, parent education and parent participation, evaluation, and staff development. Preschool programs for which federal reimbursement is not available shall be funded as prescribed by the Legislature in the Budget Act, and unless otherwise specified by the Legislature, shall not use federal funds made available through Title XX of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 1397).

- (b) A part-day California state preschool program shall operate for a minimum of (1) three hours per day, excluding time for home-to-school transportation, and (2) a minimum of 175 days per year, unless the contract specifies a lower number of days of operation.
- (c) A full-day California state preschool program shall operate for a minimum of 246 days per year, unless the contract specifies a lower number of days of operation.
- (d) Any agency described in subdivision (a) of Section 8205 as an "applicant or contracting agency" is eligible to contract to operate a California state preschool program.
- (e) Public funds shall not be paid directly or indirectly to an agency that does not pay at least the minimum wage to each of its employees.
- (f) Federal Head Start funds used to provide services to families receiving California state preschool services shall be deemed nonrestricted funds.
- (g) School districts and charter schools that administer a California state preschool program may place four-year-old children in a transitional kindergarten program classroom in accordance with subdivisions (h) to (j), inclusive, of Section 48000.
- (h) California state preschool programs shall include all of the following:
- (1) Age- and developmentally appropriate activities for children.
- (2) Supervision.
- (3) Parenting education and parent engagement.
- (4) Social services that include, but are not limited to, identification of child and family needs and referral to appropriate agencies.
- (5) Health services.
- (6) Nutrition.
- (7) Training and career ladder opportunities, documentation of which shall be provided to the department.
- (i) The Superintendent shall adopt rules and regulations related to the administration of this chapter, including rules and regulations related to eligibility, enrollment, and priority of services. Regulations shall also include the recommendations of the State Department of Health Care Services relative to health care screening and the provision of health care services. The Superintendent shall seek the advice and assistance of these health authorities in situations where service under this chapter includes or requires care of children who are ill or have exceptional needs.

EC Section 1596.7925.

(a) On or before July 1, 2019, the State Department of Education shall adopt new health and safety regulations under Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations that apply to California state preschool programs that meet the conditions specified in subdivision (o)

of Section 1596.792. The regulations shall require those programs to have all of the following:

- (1) Outdoor shade that is safe and in good repair.
- (2) Drinking water that is accessible and readily available throughout the day.
- (3) Safe and sanitary restroom facilities with one toilet and handwashing fixture for every 15 children.
- (4) Restroom facilities that are only available for preschoolers and kindergartners.
- (5) Visual supervision of children at all times.
- (6) Indoor and outdoor space that is properly contained or fenced and provides sufficient space for the number of children using the space at any given time. Playground equipment must be safe, in good repair, and age appropriate.
- (b) The State Department of Education may adopt emergency regulations pursuant to Section 11346.1 of the Government Code to satisfy the requirements of this section. The adoption of emergency regulations shall be deemed an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare.
- (c) A violation of regulations adopted pursuant to subdivision (a) or (b) shall not be subject to Section 1596.890.

5 CCR § 18140

§ 18140. General Provisions.

- (a) The regulations in article 4 apply only to Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) operating part-day or full-day California State Preschool Programs (CSPPs) that choose to be exempt from title 22 of California Code of Regulations (22 CCR) pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 1596.792(o).
- (b) LEAs operating part-day or full-day CSPP classrooms may choose for any or all classrooms to be exempt from 22 CCR licensing requirements as long as they continue to meet all legal and contractual requirements of the CSPP, which includes adequate standards of Program Quality, pursuant to subchapter 12 of chapter 19, of this division, as well as meet the following conditions:
- (1) The LEA has a contract to perform CSPP services and performs those services directly, and not through a subcontractor;
- (2) The LEA is performing such services in a school building, as defined by Education Code section 17283, and the school building in which the services are performed has been determined to be compliant with the provisions of the Field Act, pursuant to title 1, division 1, part 10.5, chapter 3, articles 3 and 6 of the Education Code, according to the Division of the State Architect;

- (3) The school building in which services are performed is maintained in good repair as defined by Education Code section 17002 and is subject to a yearly facility inspection pursuant to Education Code section 1240 and the information is included on the LEA's School Accountability Report Card.
- (4) The LEA facility meets the requirements for kindergarten classrooms in accordance with chapter 13 (commencing with section 14000) of division 1 of title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5 CCR).
- (c) Any LEA operating a CSPP classroom pursuant to this article may only serve four-year-old children as defined in Education Code section 8208 in the exempted classrooms. CSPP classrooms with any child younger than four years of age shall meet 22 CCR licensing requirements.
- (d) The California Department of Education (CDE) shall make a determination whether an LEA meets the requirements of this article at the time of initial funding and thereafter yearly as part of the continued funding process. At any time, the CDE may make a finding that an LEA does not meet the requirements for license exemption and shall notify the LEA of such finding. The LEA may appeal this finding pursuant to 5 CCR section 18308.
- (e) The CDE shall immediately notify the California Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division, regarding any change in the licensing status of an LEA and/or if a determination is made that an LEA does not meet the requirements of Health and Safety Code section 1596.792(o) and this article and should be subject to licensing.

Subgroup 5.8. Regulations Relating to the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program

Article 1. California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program

Section 1860. Purpose.

These Subgroup 5.8 regulations implement the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (Program), which establishes a State program to provide funding to School Districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities, for the purpose of providing full-day kindergarten and transitional kindergarten classrooms as specified in Education Code (EC) Section 8973; and, for the construction of new preschool classrooms, the modernization of existing preschool classrooms, or the modernization of existing kindergarten and grade 1 to 12, inclusive, classrooms that would be converted to provide California state preschool programs operated by school districts on a public schoolsite.

Section 1860.1. General Services Director.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 15490(c), the Director of General Services shall provide assistance to the State Allocation Board (Board) as the Board requires.

Section 1860.2. Definitions.

For the purpose of these Subgroup 5.8 regulations, the terms set forth below shall have the following meanings:

- "Application" means a request pursuant to the Program to apply for grant funding for a school project.
- "Apportionment" means a reservation of funds by the Board for the purpose of funding Approved Applications for New Construction or Retrofit to an applicant school district.
- "Approved Application" means a School District has submitted a Form SAB 70-01 and all documents to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) that are required to be submitted with the Form SAB 70-01 as identified in the Specific Instructions Section of Form SAB 70-01.
- "Board" means the State Allocation Board as established by Section 15490 of the Government Code.
- "CALPADS" means the enrollment information provided through the California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System data as reported to the California Department of Education.
- "California Department of Education (CDE)" means the offices within that department that have responsibility for school facilities matters.
- "Certification" means the act of affirmatively representing, asserting or verifying circumstances, data or information as required by the Program or this subgroup.
- "Class B Construction Cost Index" is a construction factor index for structures made of reinforced concrete or steel frames, concrete floors, and roofs, and accepted and used by the Board.
- "Classroom" means a teaching station that was constructed or reconstructed to serve as an area in which to provide pupil instruction but shall not include portable buildings unless it is an existing classroom that is being retrofitted but not replaced.

- "Classroom Provided" means a classroom acquired by lease, lease-purchase, or purchase for which a contract has been signed for the construction or acquisition of the classroom.
- "County Fund" means the fund established in the county treasury within each county for each school district in the county.
- "District Representative" means a member of a school district staff or other agent authorized to serve as District
- Representative to execute and file an application with the Board on behalf of the district and/or act as a liaison between the Board and the district.
- "Division of the State Architect (DSA)" means the State office within the Department of General Services that reviews school building plans and specifications for structural, fire safety and access compliance.
- "Encumbered for Specific Purposes" means a commitment of funds by the school district to meet a legally binding obligation.
- "Executive Officer" means the individual appointed by the Governor to direct the Office of Public School Construction, and who concurrently serves as Executive Officer to the Board.
- "Facility" means all or a portion of any real property, site improvements, utilities and/or buildings or other improvements contained in the project.
- "Field Act Facility" means a school building meeting the requirements contained in Education Code Section 17280, et seq. "Financial Hardship" means State funding for all or a portion of the district's matching share required by Section 1860.11 and 1860.13.
- "Form SAB 70-01" means the Application for Funding, Form SAB 70-01 (Rev. 09/223), which is incorporated by reference.
- "Form SAB 70-02" means the *Fund Release Authorization*, Form SAB 70-02 (Rev. 01/2209/23), which is incorporated by reference.
- "Form SAB 70-03" means the *Expenditure Report*, Form SAB 70-03 (Rev. 09/223), which is incorporated by reference.
- "Full-Day Kindergarten Classroom" means a teaching station that meets the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.
- "Full-Day Kindergarten Program" means an early primary program that exceeds four hours, exclusive of recesses, and meets the conditions of EC Section 8973.
- "Fund" means the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account established pursuant to Education Code Section 17375(a).
- "Governmental Agency" shall include but is not limited to a public entity as defined in Government Code Section 7260(a) including California federally recognized or historically established tribal governments.
- "Grant Agreement" means *Grant Agreement* (Rev. 01/2209/23), for the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program, which is incorporated by reference.
- "In Escrow, Governmental Entities" means the approval and signature of instrument(s) that will convey a specified school parcel or site from the public/government entity including the federal government for a determinable sum, and for a determinable date of acquisition which may be based on the School District's receipt of funding from the State.
- "In Escrow, Non-Governmental Entities" means the deposit of signed instrument(s) and/or funds with instructions with a title company or escrow agent to carry out the provisions of an agreement or contract to acquire a specified school parcel or site for a determinable sum, and for a determinable date of acquisition which may be based on the School District's receipt of funding from the State.
- "Instrument" means a written, legally enforceable agreement, approved and signed by all parties to the escrow, for the conveyance to the district of real estate for a specified parcel or site, that includes a compensation clause and either a purchase option agreement, a purchase agreement, promissory note, lease agreement, installment sales contract, gift, or other real estate conveyance valid in the State of California for property conveyed from a public/government entity, including the federal government.
- "Interim Housing" means the rental or lease of classrooms used to house pupils temporarily displaced as a result of the retrofit of classroom facilities.
- "Low Income" shall be the percentage of pupils deemed eligible for Free and Reduced Price School Meals as identified in the Free and Reduced Price School Meals data on file at the CDE. The data on file with CDE shall be determined to be the information collected for the month of October, prior to application submittal, and any errors and omissions amendments to that information for that time period that have been received and approved by the CDE.
- "New Construction" means a construction project to adequately house kindergarten pupils in an approved project, which shall include the costs of design, engineering, testing, inspections, plan checking, construction management, site acquisition and development, evaluation and response action costs relating to hazardous substances at a new or existing schoolsite, demolition, construction, landscaping, necessary utility costs, utility connections and other related fees, equipment including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, furnishings, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.

- "New Construction Grant" means the funding provided pursuant to EC Section 17375(f)(1) and Sections 1860.9 through 1860.10.3.
- "Office of Public School Construction (OPSC)" means the State office within the Department of General Services that assists the Board as necessary and administers the Program on behalf of the Director.
- "Part-Day Kindergarten Program" means an early primary program that does not exceed four hours, exclusive of recesses, pursuant to EC Section 46111.
- "Phase One Environmental Site Assessment (POESA)" means a preliminary assessment of a property to determine whether there has been or may have been a release of a hazardous material, or whether a naturally occurring hazardous material is present, based on reasonably available information about the property and the area in its vicinity. A Phase One Environmental Site Assessment shall meet the most current requirements adopted by the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) for Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments: Phase One Environmental Site Assessment Process or meet the requirements of Part 312 (commencing with Section 312.1) of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations. That ASTM Standard Practice for Environmental Site Assessments or the requirements of Part 312 (commencing with Section 312.1) of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations shall satisfy the requirements of this article for conducting a Phase One Environmental Site Assessment unless and until the Department of Toxic Substances Control adopts final regulations that establish guidelines for a Phase One Environmental Site Assessment for purposes of school sites that impose different requirements.
- "Piggyback Contract" means a contract for acquisition of personal property, without advertising for bids, as authorized by Public Contract Code Section 20118.
- "Portable Classroom" means a classroom building of one or more stories that is designed and constructed to be relocatable and transportable over public streets, and with respect to a single story portable classroom, is designed and constructed for relocation without the separation of the roof or floor from the building and when measured at the most exterior walls, has a floor area not in excess of 2,000 square feet.
- "Preschool Classroom" means a preschool classroom used or proposed to be used for instructional purposes in a California state preschool program.
- "Preschool Program" means a full-day California state preschool program pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 8207) of Chapter 2 of Part 6.
- "Project" means the purposes for which the Grantee has applied for the Grants detailed in these Subgroup 5.8 regulations.
- "Program" means the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program.
- "Property" includes all property, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible, or any interest therein necessary or desirable for carrying out the purposes of these Subgroup 5.8 regulations.
- "Pupil" means a student enrolled in any grade Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten through grade twelve.
- "Ready for Apportionment" means a final review of an Approved Application has been completed by OPSC and it has been determined that it meets all requirements of law for an Apportionment and OPSC will recommend approval to the Board.
- "Remedial Action Plan (RAP)" means a plan approved by the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 25356.1.
- "Response Action (RA)" means the removal of hazardous materials and solid waste, the removal of hazardous substances, and other remedial actions in connection with hazardous substances at the site.
- "Retrofit" means a construction project to retrofit an existing school facility to adequately house kindergarten pupils, which shall only include the costs of design, engineering, testing, inspection, plan checking, construction management, demolition, construction, necessary utility costs, utility connection and other related fees, the purchase and installation of air-conditioning equipment and insulation materials and related costs, furniture and equipment, including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, fire safety improvements, playground safety improvements, the identification, assessment, or abatement of hazardous asbestos, seismic safety improvements, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.
- "Retrofit Grant" means the funding provided pursuant to Education Code Section 17375(f)(2) and Section 1860.12.
- "School District" shall have the meaning set forth in Education Code Sections 81 through 87, inclusive. "School District" shall not include county offices of education, charter schools, joint powers authorities, or the State Department of Education. For preschool facilities grants only, "school district" includes county offices of education, or a community college district that operates a preschool program on behalf of, or in lieu of, a school district or county office of education.
- "Small School District" means a School District with current districtwide enrollment, including pupils enrolled in grades K-12, continuation high pupils and special day class pupils, that is 2,500 or less.
- "Transitional Kindergarten" means a program that provides education continuity from preschool to kindergarten pursuant to EC Section 8974.

"Useable Acres" means the gross acreage of a school site less any portion of the site publicly dedicated for off-site street improvements and any portion of the site not available for school purposes as determined by the CDE because of topological impediments or because of other unique circumstances.

Section 1860.3. General.

A School District seeking funding for a new construction or retrofit project pursuant to the provisions of Education Code Section 17375 shall complete and file with OPSC, the Form SAB 70-01 and all necessary documents, as defined by Approved Applications.

- (a) Assembly Bill 1808 created the Program, effective June 27, 2018, and allocated \$100 million to provide one-time grants as specified in EC Section 17375 and Program regulations. New Construction Grant and Retrofit Grant funding may be provided for a project if the district entered into a construction contract for that project on or after June 27, 2018.
- (b) The Program is revised through Assembly Bill 130, effective July 9, 2021, which makes \$490 million available to provide one-time grants as specified in EC Section 17375. The Board shall only provide funding if construction contracts, for the construction or retrofit of the classrooms in a full-day kindergarten project, were signed on or after July 1, 2018. The Board shall only provide funding if construction contracts, for the construction or retrofit of the classrooms in a preschool or transitional kindergarten project, were signed on or after July 1, 2021.
- (c) The Program is amended under Assembly Bill 181, effective June 30, 2022, and allocated an additional \$100 million to the Program. Subject to Legislature appropriation, an additional \$550 million is allocated to the Program in the 2023/2024/205 fiscal year.

Section 1860.4. Funding Guidelines

- (a) For the funding provided pursuant to Section 1860.3(a), funds available for the Program from the 2018-2019 Budget Act must be encumbered by the Board by June 30, 2021. Funds that are not completely encumbered or that return to the Program through project rescissions may be applied as follows:
- (1) Any funds that return on or before June 30, 2021, shall be returned to the Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Account and may be used to provide additional Apportionments.
- (2) Any funds that return, or remain unencumbered by the Board, after June 30, 2021, shall be returned to the General Fund.
- (b) For the funding provided pursuant to Section 1860.3(b), funds available for the Program from the 2021-22 Budget Act must be encumbered by the Board by June 30, 2024 June 30, 2027. Funds that are not completely encumbered or that return to the Program through project rescissions may be applied as follows:
- (1) Any funds that return on or before June 30, 2024 June 30, 2027, shall be returned to the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Account and may be used to provide additional Apportionments.
- (2) Any funds that return or remain unencumbered by the Board, after June 30, 2024 June 30, 2027, shall be returned to the General Fund.
- (c) For the funding provided pursuant to Section 1860.3(c), funds available for the Program from the 2022-23 Budget Act must be encumbered by the Board by June 30, 2025 June 30, 2028. Funds that are not completely encumbered or that return to the Program through project rescissions may be applied as follows:
- (1) Any funds that return on or before June 30, 2025 June 30, 2028, shall be returned to the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Account and may be used to provide additional Apportionments.
- (2) Any funds that are returned and remain unencumbered by the Board, after June 30, 2025 June 30, 2028, shall be returned to the General Fund.

- (d) For the funding provided pursuant to Section 1860.3(c), funds available for the Program from the 2023-24 Budget Act must be encumbered by the Board by June 30, 2026 June 30, 2030. Funds that are not completely encumbered or that return to the Program through project rescissions may be applied as follows:
- (1) Any funds that return on or before June 30, 2026 June 30, 2030, shall be returned to the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Account and may be used to provide additional Apportionments.
- (2) Any funds that are returned and remain unencumbered by the Board, after June 30, 2026 June 30, 2030, shall be returned to the General Fund.
- (e) New school facilities built in accordance with the Program shall not be included in the eligibility determination used for the purposes of the School Facilities Program pursuant to EC Section 17071.25.
- (f) A school district shall not use Program funds to purchase, or install, Portable Classrooms.

Section 1860.5. Full-Day Kindergarten Program Eligibility Criteria.

- (1) The School District has a school board resolution providing approval to provide full-day kindergarten instruction at the project school site or will have approval to provide full-day kindergarten instruction at the completion of the project.
- (2) The School District lacks the facilities to provide full-day kindergarten instruction at the project school site.

A project school site will be considered lacking full-day kindergarten facilities if the current kindergarten enrollment exceeds the existing kindergarten classroom capacity prior to the construction of the project. Classrooms constructed as kindergarten classrooms or altered to house kindergarten students, regardless of current use, will be included when determining the existing kindergarten classroom capacity, as determined by CDE. For purposes of determining classroom capacity, a loading standard of 25 kindergarten pupils per classroom will be used and all kindergarten classrooms will be loaded for full-day instruction unless the School District indicates that an existing classroom(s) will continue to be used for non-full-day instruction at the completion of the project.

- (b) OPSC shall consult with CDE prior to determination of the Approved Application's need for funding based on the schoolsite's enrollment pattern.
- (c) The Approved Application shall include the following documentation:
- (1) A description of the proposed project including, but not limited to, the following information:
- (A) The total number of preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten classrooms on the site prior to the Program project.
- (B) The current enrollment at the site using California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System data as reported to the California Department of Education (CALPADS), at the time of application submittal, pursuant to EC Section 48000. To determine the appropriate enrollment reporting year, refer to the following:

If a School District is requesting a 50-year old utilities grant, identify the age of the building(s).

- (d) Program funding must construct or retrofit facilities that result in classroom(s) that meets the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (1) For new construction projects, classrooms must be not less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas.
- (2) For retrofit projects, classrooms must not be less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas unless both of the following are met:
- (A) The project qualifies for an exemption through CDE pursuant to Title 5, Section 14030(r) of the California Code of Regulations to retrofit a classroom that will be less than 1,350 square feet.
- (B) The classroom shall not be less than 1,250 square feet.

Section 1860.5.1. Transitional Kindergarten Program Eligibility Criteria.

- (1) The School District has a school board resolution providing approval to provide full-day transitional kindergarten instruction on or after July 9, 2021.
- (2) The School District lacks the facilities to provide full-day transitional kindergarten instruction at the project school site. A project school site will be considered lacking transitional kindergarten facilities if the calculated transitional kindergarten need, exceeds the existing transitional kindergarten classroom capacity prior to the construction of the project.
- (3) The maximum calculated transitional kindergarten need shall be determined by one of the following:
- (A) Calculating the mean of the first grade, second grade, and third grade enrollment at the time of application submittal. The mean shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number.
- (B) Calculating the mean of the transitional kindergarten enrollment at the time of application plus two prior enrollment years. The mean shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number.
- (4) Classrooms constructed as kindergarten or transitional kindergarten classrooms or altered to house kindergarten students, regardless of current use, will be included when determining the existing kindergarten and transitional kindergarten classroom capacity, as determined by CDE. For purposes of determining classroom capacity, a loading standard of 25 kindergarten pupils per classroom will be used and all transitional kindergarten classrooms will be loaded for full-day instruction unless the School District indicates that an existing classroom(s) will continue to be used for nonfull-day instruction at the completion of the project.
- (5) The School District will use Program funds to offer or expand its full-day Transitional Kindergarten Program.
- (b) OPSC shall consult with CDE prior to determination of the Approved Application's need for funding based on the schoolsite's enrollment pattern.
- (c) The Approved Application shall include the following documentation:
- (1) A description of the proposed project including, but not limited to, the following information:
- (A) The total number of preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten classrooms on the site prior to the Program project.
- (B) The current enrollment at the site using California Longitudinal Pupil Achievement Data System data as reported to the California Department of Education, at the time of application submittal, including transitional kindergarten students pursuant to EC Section 48000. To determine the appropriate enrollment reporting year, refer to the following:

- (F) Site map that includes labelling of all facilities and their current use, identifies all classrooms constructed or previously retrofitted to house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten students, and identifies any facilities that will be retrofitted in the project. If a School District is requesting a 50-year old utilities grant, identify the age of the building(s).
- (G) Program funding must construct or retrofit facilities that result in classroom(s) that meets the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specific in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (1) For new construction projects, classrooms must be not less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas.
- (2) For retrofit projects, classrooms must not be less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas unless both of the following are met:
- (A) The project qualifies for an exemption through CDE pursuant to Title 5, Section 14030(r) of the California Code of Regulations to retrofit a classroom that will be less than 1,350 square feet.
- (B) The classroom shall not be less than 1,250 square feet.

Section 1860.5.2. California Preschool Program Eligibility Criteria.

- (1) The School District has a school board resolution providing approval to provide full-day preschool instruction on or after July 9, 2021.
- (2) The School District has provided the most recent childcare needs assessment conducted by its regional local planning council for preschool age children.
- (3) A current or future contract with the California Department of Education to operate a preschool program.
- (4) The School District lacks the facilities to provide full-day preschool instruction at the project school site. A project school site will be considered lacking preschool facilities if the calculated preschool need, exceeds the existing preschool classroom capacity prior to the construction of the project.
- (5) The maximum calculated preschool need shall be determined by one of the following:
- (A) Calculating the mean of the first grade, second grade, and third grade enrollment at the time of application submittal. The mean shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number.
- (B) Calculating the mean of the preschool enrollment at the time of application plus two prior enrollment years. The mean shall be rounded up to the nearest whole number.
- (6) Classrooms constructed as preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten classrooms or altered to house preschool, transitional kindergarten, or kindergarten students, regardless of current use, will be included when determining the existing preschool, transitional kindergarten, and/or kindergarten classroom capacity, as determined by CDE. For purposes of determining classroom capacity, a loading standard of 25 preschool pupils per classroom will be used and all preschool classrooms will be loaded for full-day instruction unless the School District indicates that an existing classroom(s) will continue to be used for non-full-day instruction at the completion of the project.
- (7) The School District will use Program funds to expand its full-day Preschool Program.
- (b) OPSC shall consult with CDE prior to determination of the Approved Application's need for funding to see if the project type shall be limited to retrofit funding based on the schoolsite's enrollment pattern.
- (c) The Approved Application shall include the following documentation:
- (1) A description of the proposed project including, but not limited to, the following information:
- (A) The total number of preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten classrooms on the site prior to the Program project.

- (B) The total number of preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten classrooms on the site after the completion of the Program project.
- (2) The current enrollment at the site, at the time of application submittal, including preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten students pursuant to EC Section 48000. To determine the appropriate enrollment reporting year, refer to the following:

- (d) Program funding must construct or retrofit facilities that result in classroom(s) that meets the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (1) For new construction projects, classrooms must be not less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas.
- (2) For retrofit projects, classrooms must not be less than 1,350 square feet, including restrooms, storage, teacher preparation, wet and dry areas unless both of the following are met:
- (A) The project qualifies for an exemption through CDE pursuant to Title 5, Section 14030(r) of the California Code of Regulations to retrofit a classroom that will be less than 1,350 square feet.
- (B) The classroom shall not be less than 1,250 square feet.

Section 1860.6. Application Submittals.

The Board shall accept Approved Applications for Program funding during specified funding rounds:

- (a) Approved Applications for Program funding for the first funding round must be received by OPSC on or after January 2, 2019, and on or before January 31, 2019. Applications that do not receive an Apportionment during this round will be returned to the School District.
- (b) Approved Applications for Program funding for the second funding round must be received by OPSC on or after May 1, 2019, and on or before May 30, 2019. Applications that do not receive an Apportionment during this round will be returned to the School District.
- (c) Approved Applications for Program funding for the third funding round must be received by OPSC on or after April 1, 2022, and on or before April 30, 2022. Applications during this round will be retained until December 31, 2022. Applications that do not receive an Apportionment by December 31, 2022, will not be processed.
- (d) Approved Applications for Program funding for the fourth funding round must be received by OPSC on or after February 1, 2023 and on or before March 2, 2023. Applications during this round will be retained until the earlier of June 30, 2024, or the next funding round. Applications that do not receive an Apportionment by June 30, 2024, will not be processed.
- (e) Additional filing rounds may be established by the SAB as necessary.

Section 1860.7. Application Types.

The following Application types may be requested with the submittal of a Form SAB 70-01. To become an Approved Application, the School District must also submit all necessary documents, as defined by Approved Applications:

(a) A New Construction Grant may be requested if the following conditions exist:

- (1) The School District has received final plan approval by DSA and CDE for the project.
- (2) The School District has received final site approval by the CDE if the project includes site acquisition.
- (3) The School District has a final appraisal, if the project includes site acquisition.
- (4) The School District has entered into escrow, if the project includes site acquisition.
- (b) A New Construction Grant with an advance fund release(s) for design and/or site acquisition may be requested with the submittal of the Form SAB 70-01, and preliminary appraisal if purchasing a site.
- (c) A Retrofit Grant may be requested if the School District has received final plan approval by the DSA and CDE for the project.
- (d) A Retrofit Grant with an advance fund release for design may be requested with the submittal of the Form SAB 70-01.
- (e) The Board shall only provide funding if construction contracts, for the construction or retrofit of the classrooms in a full-day kindergarten project, were signed on or after July 1, 2018.
- (f) The Board shall only provide funding if construction contracts, for the construction or retrofit of the classrooms in a preschool or transitional kindergarten project, were signed on or after July 1, 2021.
- (g) Applications may not request funding for more than four preschool classrooms per school site.
- (h) Applications may not request funding for more than four transitional kindergarten classrooms per school site.
- (i) Districts that receive an advance fund release must submit an updated Form SAB 70-01 once CDE and DSA plan approvals have been obtained.

Section 1860.9. New Construction Apportionment Determination.

- (b) For applications funded with 2018 grant amounts, \$14 for each pupil if the project includes an automatic fire detection and alarm system and is requested by the School District on the Form SAB 70-01.
- (c) For applications funded with 2018 grant amounts, \$194 for each pupil if the project includes an automatic sprinkler system and is requested by the School District on the Form SAB 70-01.
- (d) An amount equal to 35 percent of the amount determined in (a) for costs associated with site development, demolition, landscaping and other costs incurred when adding a preschool, transitional kindergarten, or kindergarten classroom(s) to a site, utility costs, utility connections and other related fees necessary for the Program project, if requested by the applicant on the Form SAB 70–01.
- (e) An amount equal to 12 percent of the amount determined in (a) for each pupil housed in a multilevel building that will house pupils in all levels of the building if the usable site acreage is less than 75 percent of the site size recommended by CDE, pursuant to Title 5, California Code of Regulations, Section 14010(a), for the master-planned project capacity, if requested by the School District on the Form SAB 70-01.
- (f) For applications funded with 2018 grant amounts, \$7,074 for Small School Districts for the cost necessary for project assistance, as defined in Education Code Section 17072.10(e).
- (g) Each eligible classroom in the project shall receive funding based on 25 pupils per classroom. The grant amounts shown in (a), (b), (c) and (f) above shall be adjusted annually based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January, pursuant to Education Code Section 17072.10.

Section 1860.10. New Construction Additional Grant for Site Acquisition Cost.

The Board shall provide funding, in addition to any other funding authorized by these Regulations, for the lesser of one half of the actual cost of the site or one-half of the appraised value of the site acquired adjacent to an existing Schoolsite as described in (a) and (b) of this Section.

- (a) Actual Site Cost
 - The actual cost of the site shall be the purchase price as shown on the escrow documents or other appropriate documents such as court orders in condemnation or as specifically identified in agreements when the site is transferred in lieu of other legally required payments or fees due to the district. The actual cost shall be adjusted for the following:
- (1) Increased by the approved relocation expenses that conform to Title 25, California Code of Regulations, Section 6000, et seq. The reasonable and necessary relocation costs for purchasing fixtures and equipment, personal property, new machinery/equipment and the installation of any improvements at the replacement residence or business location may be included as relocation assistance.
- (2) Site Other Increased by four percent of the actual amount determined in (a) above, but not less than \$50,000. This amount shall provide an allowance for any appraisal, escrow, survey, site testing, CDE review/approvals and the preparation of the POESA and the PEA.
- (3) Increased by DTSC costs for review, approval, and oversight of the POESA and the PEA.
- (b) Appraised Value of the Site
 - The value determined by an appraisal made or updated no more than six months prior to purchase of the site. The appraisal may be reviewed by OPSC for conformance with Section 1860.10.1. The approved appraised value shall be adjusted for the following:
- (1) Increased by the approved relocation expenses that conform to Title 25, California Code of Regulations, Section 6000, et seq. The reasonable and necessary relocation costs for purchasing fixtures and equipment, personal property, new machinery/equipment and the installation of any improvements at the replacement residence or business location may be included as relocation assistance.
- (2) Increased by four percent of the appraised value determined in (b) above, but not less than \$50,000. This amount shall provide an allowance for appraisals, escrow, survey, site testing, CDE review/approvals and the preparation of the POESA and the PEA.
- (3) Increased by DTSC costs for review, approval, and oversight of the POESA and the PEA.
- (c) If actual DTSC, hazardous waste removal, and relocation costs are not available at the time of Apportionment, an amount equal to 15 percent of the amount determined in 1860.9(a) will be provided for DTSC costs and the School District may provide an estimated amount for Hazardous waste removal and relocation expenses. These costs will be reviewed by OPSC prior to the final fund release and an adjustment shall be made, if necessary.
- (d) The actual site cost or the appraised value of the site shall be reduced, on a prorated basis, by the percentage of the excess acreage of the site that exceeds the eligible acreage shown below for a kindergarten classroom project, or as approved by CDE, pursuant to Title 5, California Code of Regulations Section 14010(a):

Section 1860.10.1. Site Acquisition Guidelines.

To receive the funding authorized by Section 1860.10, the School District must certify on the Form SAB 70-01, that the appraisal of the property was made utilizing the following criteria:

- (a) The land improvements and appurtenances, excluding fixtures, equipment, and personal property, were appraised in an as is condition with the following exceptions:
- (1) The site shall be appraised as if it were a clean site, safe of all toxic contaminants in accordance with Title 5, California Code of Regulations commencing with Section 14001.
- (2) The site valuation included only proposed site improvements associated with grading the site to a mass graded or super pad condition, defined as a site graded to construction readiness without foundation or paving and proposed utilities stubbed to the site. Any proposed site improvements or utilities not covered by a performance bond equal to 100 percent of the estimated cost of the site improvements and utilities must be completed prior to the close of escrow and detailed separately in the report.
- (b) Consideration in the appraisal was made for net useable acreage and severance damages.

- (c) The School District or its legal counsel has contracted for appraisal services.
- (d) The appraiser has certified to the School District that the appraisal complies with the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practices as promulgated by the Appraisal Standards Board of the Appraisal Foundation.
- (e) The amount of a court award for a site acquired in condemnation may be used in lieu of the appraised value determined in (a) through (d) above.

Section 1860.10.2. New Construction Additional Grant for Hazardous Waste Removal on an Acquired Site.

The Board shall provide funding, in addition to any other funding authorized by these Regulations, for the allowable costs of hazardous materials/waste removal and/or remediation costs. The allowable site costs shall not exceed 50 percent of one and one half times the value of an appraisal that conforms to Section 1860.10.1 for the costs in subsections (a), (a)(1) and (a)(2) plus the additional costs included in subsections (b) and (c). The costs in subsections (b) and (c) are in addition to 50 percent of one and one half times the appraisal value cap:

- (a) The costs associated with the site acquisition and to implement the RA as determined necessary in the PEA that has been approved by DTSC subject to the following:
- (1) The costs for preparation of the RA.
- (2) DTSC costs for review and oversight of the preparation and implementation of the RA. The costs may not include continuous operational and maintenance costs associated with the RA.
- (b) Fifty percent of the approved relocation expenses that conform to Title 25, Division 1, Chapter 6, Subchapter 1, California Code of Regulations, (Section 6000, et seq.). The reasonable and necessary relocation costs for purchasing fixtures and equipment, personal property, new machinery/equipment and the installation of any improvements at the replacement residence or business location may be included as relocation assistance.
- (c) Site Other Not less than 50 percent of \$50,000 or 50 percent of four percent of the appraised value. This amount shall provide an allowance for any appraisal, escrow, survey, site testing, CDE review/approvals and the preparation of the POESA and the PEA.
- (d) The limitation of 50 percent of one and one half times the value of an appraisal for costs in subsections (a), (a)(1), and (a)(2) may be exceeded when the Board finds that unforeseen circumstances exist, and when both of the following exist:
- (1) CDE determines that the site is adjacent to the existing Schoolsite and is the best available site for meeting the educational and safety needs of the School District.
- (2) Substantiation that the costs are limited to the minimum required to complete the evaluation and RA approved by DTSC.
- (e) The actual site cost or the appraised value of the site shall be reduced, on a prorated basis, by the percentage of the excess acreage of the site that exceeds the eligible acreage shown below for a kindergarten classroom project, or as approved by CDE, pursuant to Title 5, California Code of Regulations Section 14010(a):

Section 1860.10.3. New Construction Additional Grant for Hazardous Waste Removal Required on an Existing School Site.

- (a) The Board shall provide funding, in addition to any other funding authorized by these Regulations, for the necessary hazardous waste materials/waste removal and/or remediation costs on an existing school site where the New Construction funding will be used if all the following are met:
- (1) The New Construction funding request is for additional school facilities on an existing school site.
- (2) The New Construction Grant request does not include a funding request for initial site acquisition costs allowed pursuant to Sections 1860.10.
- (3) The existing school site where the New Construction Grant will be expended has a functioning school on the site or the site had a closed school that will again be used as a functioning school.
- (4) The hazardous material cleanup costs are required by DTSC.

- (b) If all the criteria in subsection (a) are met, the allowable hazardous waste removal cleanup costs shall be one half of all the following:
- (1) The costs for preparation of the POESA, the PEA and the RA.
- (2) The costs to implement the RA as determined necessary in the PEA that has been approved by DTSC subject to the following:
- (A) The costs may include DTSC costs for review and oversight of the preparation and implementation of the RA.
- (B) The costs may not include continuous operational and maintenance costs associated with the RA.
- (c) In advance of the New Construction Adjusted Grant, districts performing a RA on additions to existing school sites shall be eligible for the costs associated with evaluation and RA required by DTSC.

Section 1860.14. Hardship Assistance and Financial Hardship

A School District shall qualify for hardship assistance by demonstrating a Financial Hardship, as provided in this Section, which prevents the School District from funding all or a portion of the matching share requirement for a Program grant.

A School District is eligible for a financial hardship grant to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of subsections (a), (b), and (c) below:

- (a) The School District has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the School District meets at least one of the following:
- (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District, issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the District's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.
- (2) The School District had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the School District's matching share requirement for the Program project(s).
- (3) The School District's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less
- (4) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.
- (b) The School District is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the School District's financial records by OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the School District's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, such as bridge financing, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds and sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement, and bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the School District's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.

- (c) If the School District meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the School District's matching share less funds deemed available in (b).
- (1) Once a School District has been notified that OPSC is scheduled to begin processing the School District's Form SAB 70-01, the School District must submit documentation to support the Financial Hardship request within 30 calendar days.
- (2) If the School District does not submit documentation within 30 calendar days, the School District will be ineligible to receive a Financial Hardship grant for their project(s) and preference points as provided in Section 1860.15.

Section 1860.15. Application Funding Criteria.

- (a) Financial Hardship: 40 points if a School District demonstrates it meets the requirements under Section 1860.14.
- (b) Low Income: Up to 40 points based on the percentage of pupils at the School District meeting the definition of Low Income.
- (1) Community Colleges applying for preschool classroom grants shall base Low Income on the School District's percentage of students eligible for free and reduced price meals that the site resides in.

- (c) The Board shall apportion projects in the following order:
- (1) School Districts will be funded based on the total preference points, determined by the sum of subdivisions (a) and (b) above. If School Districts submit multiple applications in the same funding round, OPSC will use the priority order assigned to each application by the School Districts on the Form SAB 70-01 and then fund Approved Applications in the following order:
- (A) School Districts shall have their first priority projects funded in order based on total preference points until all School Districts have had their first priority project funded, or until all funds are exhausted for that funding round, whichever comes first.
- (B) School Districts with the same total preference points will be funded in order of the higher Low Income percentage reported to one decimal place. The School District with the higher Low Income percentage will be funded first.
- (C) If School Districts have the same total preference points and the same Low Income percentage reported to one decimal place, projects will then be placed into a lottery system to determine the School District funding order.
- (2) If sufficient funding remains after funding first priority projects pursuant to 1860.15(c)(1)(A), School Districts with multiple Approved Applications will be funded in the following order:
- (A) The School District with the highest total preference points shall have their remaining projects funded in priority order until all projects are funded, or until all funds are exhausted for that funding round, whichever comes first. Funding shall then be provided to the School District with the next highest total preference points.
- (B) A tie breaker will be used for School Districts with the same total preference points by using the exact Low Income percentage to one decimal place, as identified in the most recent Free and Reduced Price School Meals data on file at the CDE. The School District with the higher Low Income percentage will be funded first.
- (C) If School Districts with the same total preference points are still tied after the review of the Low Income percentages, projects will be placed into a lottery system to determine School District funding order. The highest remaining priority project for each School District participating in the lottery will be funded until all projects from each School District participating in the same lottery round have been funded, or until all funds are exhausted for that funding round, whichever comes first.
- (3) If the Board does not have sufficient funding to fully apportion a School District's Approved Application, that School District may elect to either:
- (A) Accept partial funding for the project. If partial funding is accepted, the Apportionment shall become the full and final apportionment for the project.
- (B) Decline to accept funding for the project. If partial funding is declined, the Board may offer partial funding to the next Approved Application, based on funding order determined in (c)(1) and (c)(2) above.

Section 1860.16. Fund Release Process.

OPSC will release State funds that have been Apportioned by the Board pursuant to Sections 1860.9,1860.10, 1860.10.2, 1860.10.3 and 1860.12 when the following requirements have been satisfied:

- (a) For an advance fund release for design costs, 40 percent of the grant determined in 1860.9(a) or 25 percent of the grant determined in 1860.12(a) will be released once an executed design, or design and site, Grant Agreement, as required by Section 1860.17, has been received by OPSC.
- (b) For an advance fund release for two percent site other costs, funds will be released once an executed site, or design and site, Grant Agreement, as required by Section 1860.17, has been received by OPSC.
- (c) For an advance fund release for site acquisition costs, other than two percent site other, funds will be released once an executed site, or design and site, Grant Agreement, as required by Section 1860.17, has been received by OPSC and the following requirements have been met:
- (1) The School District has entered escrow for the site.
- (2) There has been a final appraisal of the site.
- (3) The School District received either contingent or final site approval from the California Department of Education.
- (4) A complete Form SAB 70-02 has been received by OPSC.

- (d) For New Construction Grant or Retrofit Grant funding, all unreleased funds will be released once an executed full grant agreement, as required by Section 1860.17, has been received by OPSC and the following requirements have been met:
- (1) The School District's applicable matching share has already been deposited or expended by the School District for the project, unless the School District meets the requirements for Financial Hardship pursuant to Section 1860.14.
- (2) The School District has entered into a binding contract(s) for the completion of the project at least 90 percent of the building construction activities for the project.
- (3) The plans and specifications applicable to the state funded project have been approved by DSA.
- (4) If the project includes site acquisition, there has been a final appraisal of the site, the site received written final approval by CDE and the School District has entered escrow for the site.
- (5) A complete Form SAB 70-02 has been received by OPSC.
- (e) For New Construction Grant or Retrofit Grant funding, without a request for an advance release of funds pursuant to Sections 1860.7(a) and 1860.7(c), a complete Fund Release Request (Form SAB 70-02) with all required approvals must be submitted within 180 days 18 months of the first Apportionment. If a complete Form SAB 70-02 is not received within 180 days 18 months of the first Apportionment, the Apportionment shall be rescinded without further board action.
- (f) For an Apportionment received pursuant to Section 1860.7(b) and 1860.7(d), where submittal of the necessary CDE plan approval and/or DSA-approved plans and specifications were not required at the time the Board granted an Apportionment, the School District has up to 4218 months to submit the required approvals and a complete Fund Release Request (Form SAB 70-02) from the date of the first Apportionment. The School District may submit in writing other evidence satisfactory to the Board of circumstances beyond the control of the School District that precludes the School District from submitting the required CDE plan approval, DSA-approved plans and specifications, and a complete Form SAB 70-02 within 18 months from the date of the first Apportionment. If the required submittals or other evidence in writing are not received within 4218 months of the first Apportionment, the Apportionment shall be rescinded and the Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant will return to the Program for reallocation without further Board action.

 (1) School Districts submitting other evidence shall have up to three years from the date of the first Apportionment to submit the required approvals and a complete Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 70-02). This shall not extend the deadline in Section 1860.18.
- (g) Subject to available funds, site acquisition grants shall be adjusted based on actual costs prior to the release of funds.
- (h) Prior to fund release, OPSC will verify that the School District has included multilevel classrooms in the plans for the project, if multilevel funding was requested.
- (i) Financial hardship approval status by OPSC for a design and/or site advance will apply to any subsequent funding phases for the project(s) during the same application filing round, as established in Section 1860.6.

- (A) Any interest earned on State funds for a project that received Financial Hardship grant funding, that is not expended or encumbered on eligible project expenditures prior to completion of the project, as specified in Section 1860.18, must be returned to the State.
- (B) A School District is only required to return unexpended or unencumbered funds up to the amount of Financial Hardship grant funding provided by the Board.
- (b) For the funding provided pursuant to Section 1860.3(b) and 1860.3(c) all School Districts may expend or encumber the savings, and interest earned on State funds, as follows:
- (1) Professional development to build capacity for the implementation of a California state preschool program, transitional kindergarten program or a full-day kindergarten program for the classrooms included in the project.
- (2) Instruction materials to build capacity for the implementation of a California state preschool program, transitional kindergarten program or a full-day kindergarten program for the classrooms included in the project.
- (3) Other high priority capital facility needs of the School District, that are allowable expenditures in accordance to the Grant Agreement.
- (4) Any savings, including interest, unexpended or unencumbered after one year from the completion of the project, as specified in Section 1860.18, must be returned to the State.

(AB 130) Education Code Section 17375, and this Agreement.

The Grantee shall not make any change to the Project that would require a Change of Scope, without the State Allocation Board first approving the change to the Project.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF GRANT

A. Definitions

Terms not defined below shall have the same meaning as set forth in Program Regulation (Regulation) Section 1860.2.

- "Agreement" means a contract to do or not to do a certain thing and refers to this Grant Agreement.
- "Audit report" means the annual compliance reviews and fiscal reviews of the Grantee's finances, in accordance with the Guide for Annual Audits of K-12 Local Education Agencies and State Compliance Reporting.
- "Capital Outlay," for the purposes of the Grantee using Savings, pursuant to California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Regulation Section 1860.19, means capital assets in accordance with Section G of this Agreement.
- "Change of Scope" means the addition or deletion of any work that would change the approved Grant amount for the Project or require updated state agency approval(s). This includes, but is not limited to, changes to site acquisition acres, or buildings, including full-day kindergarten classrooms, and any changes to the size of those buildings, the type of building (e.g., portable, modular, or permanent), or the location on the school site of those buildings.
- "Expenditure Report" means the Form SAB 70-03 *Expenditure Report* and all required supplementary documentation, including but not limited to a detailed listing of Project expenditures organized by fund source and provided at an object-code-level of accounting detail, pursuant to the California School Accounting Manual, that shall include fields to identify information including, but not limited to dates, payees, warrant numbers, and the description and purpose of the expenditures as described in Regulation Section 1860.18.
- "Application for Funding" means the Form SAB 70-01, *Application for Funding*, and all required supplementary documentation pursuant to the Program and Regulation Section 1860.7 "Fund Release Authorization" means the Form SAB 70-02, *Fund Release Authorization*, and all required supplementary documentation, which includes but is not limited to this Agreement, pursuant to the Program and the Regulations.
- "Grants" means all eligible program grants provided by the Board to the Grantee in this Agreement.
- "Grantee" means the School District (as defined in Regulation Section 1860.2 whose representative has signed this Agreement for Grants.
- "Grantee Representative" means the authorized representative of a School District (as defined in Regulation Section 1860.2 who signed this Agreement for Grants.
- "Ineligible Expenditure" means an expenditure of Grants not in accordance with this Agreement or the applicable laws and regulations governing the use of Grants.
- "Instructional Materials" for the purposes of the Grantee using Savings, pursuant to California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Regulation Section 1860.19, means instructional materials to build capacity for the implementation of a California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Program and in accordance with Section G of this Grant Agreement.

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"Local auditor" means an auditor hired at the Grantee's expense who conducts annual compliance reviews and fiscal reviews of the Grantee's finances, in accordance with the Guide for Annual Audits of K-12 Local Education Agencies and State Compliance Reporting. "Preschool Classroom" means a preschool classroom used or proposed to be used for instructional purposes in a California state preschool program.

"Preschool Program" means a full-day California state program pursuant to Article 7 (commencing with Section 8235) of Chapter 2 of Part 6.

"Professional Development" for the purposes of the Grantee using Savings, pursuant to California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Regulation Section 1860.19, means professional development to build capacity for the implementation of a California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Program and in accordance with Section G of this Grant Agreement.

"Other Sources of Funds" means cash, the Grantee's matching funds, or in-kind contributions that are required or used to complete the Project beyond the Grants provided by this Agreement.

"Project" means the purposes for which the Grantee has applied for the Grants detailed in this Agreement.

"Regulations" means the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program regulations (California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Division 2, Chapter 3, Subchapter 4, Group 1, Subgroup 5.8, commencing with Regulation Section 1860).

"Savings" means Grants not used by the Grantee for the Project, pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.19, achieved by the Grantee's efficient and prudent expenditure of Grants. (Authority: Regulation Section 1860.2)

B. Term of Grant Agreement

The Grantee and the Executive Officer, or designee, of the Office of Public School Construction shall be the parties to this Agreement. This Agreement must be entered into by both parties prior to, and as a condition of, the release of any funding for the Project. This Agreement becomes effective on the date the Board approves the Project for Apportionment. This Agreement terminates once (1) all Grants and the Grantee's matching funds, including interest generated by the Grants, is expended, and when all of the Parties' obligations under this Grant Agreement are fully satisfied, or (2) if the Board rescinds the Apportionment, or (3) if the Grantee withdraws its Application for Funding.

C. Project Execution

- 2. Prior to the release of any funding for the Project, Office of Public School Construction staff has completed the following steps to finalize the Project funding amount outlined in this Agreement, as necessary:
 - The Application for Funding was accepted on (date) and deemed to meet the definition of an Approved Application. The Grantee was provided written notification of any deficiencies and given 24 hours to remedy the identified deficiency(s) in order to retain the date upon which it was received.
 - Upon confirmation of an Approved Application, Office of Public School Construction staff reviewed the Application for Funding for compliance with California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program Regulations and verified eligibility for all available program grants. The Grantee was provided written notification of all deficiencies and/or changes necessary and given 15 calendar days to respond and remedy the identified deficiencies and/or changes necessary.

 - Upon confirmation of an Approved Application, and before occupancy of V. classrooms in the project the district will meet Health and Safety Code (HSC) Division 2, Chapter 3.5 Article 2 and obtain and be approved for licensure by the California Department of Social Services, unless the district qualifies as a license-exempt program.
 - νi. Before occupancy of classrooms in the project the district will meet Title 22, Division 12, Chapter 1 and obtain and be approved for licensure by the California Department of Social Services, unless the district qualifies as a license-exempt program.

The Grantee will retain the opportunity to submit a valid Fund Release Authorization within 180 days18 months of the first Apportionment if the Project had Division of the State Architect Approval at the time of Apportionment and 1218 months from the first Apportionment if the Project did not have Division of the State Architect approval at the time of Apportionment. However, if the Grantee does not submit a valid Fund Release Authorization by the applicable deadline, the Apportionment shall be rescinded by the Board without further board action.

 - d) Copy of SAB Board item(s) (Approval of Project Apportionment)
 - e) DSA Approval Letter, if for New Construction Grant or Retrofit Grant Apportionment
 - f) Preliminary or Final CDE Approval Letter, as applicable
 - g) Architect Final Billing
 - h) Proof of Routine Restricted Maintenance Account
 - i) Project-specific accounting records, such as a general ledger, as described in Spending Funds (Section F, paragraph 1), for all sources of funding
 - j) Final construction billing and invoices,

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- k) Any and all change orders
- I) Proof the School District implemented California preschool, transitional kindergarten and/or full-day kindergarten program
- m) If the Grantee's matching funds have already been expended for this Project or have been deposited in the County School Facility Fund, the Grantee shall provide accounting records, such as a general ledger, for all sources of funding, verifying those previous expenditures or deposits. If the matching funds have been or will be spent from a Certificate of Participation (COP), then the Grantee shall indicate the fund that the proceeds from the COP were originally deposited into or will be deposited into. Applicable statutes include, but are not limited to, Government Code, Section 1090 and Public Contract Code, Sections 10410 and 10411, for State conflict of interest requirements.

- 1. Employees of the Grantee: Employees of the Grantee shall comply with all applicable provisions of law pertaining to conflicts of interest, including, but not limited to any applicable conflict of interest provisions of the California Political Reform Act, Cal. Gov't Code § 87100 et seq.
- Employees and Consultants to the Grantee: Individuals working on behalf of the Grantee may be required by the Department to file a Statement of Economic Interests (Fair Political Practices Commission Form 700) if it is determined that an individual is a consultant for Political Reform Act purposes.

K. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement or the application thereof is held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Agreement are severable.

L. Disputes

 Any claim that the Grantee may have regarding performance of this agreement including, but not limited to, claims for additional compensation or extension of time, shall be submitted to the Office of Public School Construction. The Office of Public School Construction and Grantee shall then attempt to negotiate a resolution of such claim and process an amendment to this Agreement to implement the terms of any such resolution.

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Office of Public School Construction Application Number:

2. Any claim that the Grantee may have regarding the audit report's Project expenditure determination shall be adjudicated by the Education Audit Appeals Panel, consistent with Education Code Section 41344.

M. Electronic Filing

Any communication under this Grant Agreement shall be in writing and may be transmitted by electronic means. Communication sent electronically will be effective on the date of transmission.

N. Supplement, Not Supplant

The terms and conditions of this Agreement are intended to supplement, not supplant, the laws and regulations that apply to this Project. The Grantee understands and agrees to adhere to all laws and regulations that apply to this Project, even if those laws and regulations are not specifically cited in this Agreement, consistent with Education Code Section 17375(I).

O. Exact Duplicate

This Agreement is an exact duplicate (verbatim) of the Agreement provided by the Office of Public School Construction. In the event a conflict should exist, the language in the Agreement provided by the Office of Public School Construction will prevail.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE OFFICER State Allocation Board Meeting, September 27, 2023

CALIFORNIA PRESCHOOL, TRANSITIONAL KINDERGARTEN AND FULL-DAY KINDERGARTEN FACILITIES GRANT PROGRAM APPORTIONMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (Program) Apportionments for the fourth funding cycle.

DESCRIPTION

The applications that are included on Attachment B underwent a thorough review process by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) and have been determined to meet all Program requirements.

This item requests the State Allocation Board (Board) to approve 84 projects totaling \$346,557,573.80 for Apportionment for the Program grants as shown on Attachment B.

AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

Assembly Bill (AB) 1808, added Article 1 (commencing with Education Code Section 17375) to Chapter 3 of Part 10.5 of Division 1 of Title 1 of the Education Code (EC) to create the Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program (FDKFGP). AB 1808 provided \$100 million for FDKFGP from the General Fund. FDKFGP allows school districts that lack the facilities to provide full-day kindergarten to apply for one-time grants to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing full-day kindergarten classrooms.

AB 130, Education Finance: Education Omnibus Trailer Bill, was approved by the Governor and Chaptered on July 9, 2021. This bill appropriated an additional \$490,000,000 from the General Fund for the 2021-22 fiscal year to the Board to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing California preschool, transitional kindergarten and full-day kindergarten programs.

AB 181, Education Finance: Education Omnibus Trailer Bill, was approved by the Governor and Chaptered on June 30, 2022. For the 2022-23 fiscal year, this bill appropriated an additional \$100 million from the General Fund of the 2021-22 fiscal year to the Board to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing California preschool, transitional kindergarten and full-day kindergarten programs. The bill also states the intent to appropriate an additional \$550 million from the General Fund to the Program in the 2023-24 fiscal year.

The third funding round for the Program approved 72 projects for \$224,960,572.67 in 2022.

The fourth funding round for the Program opened on February 1, 2023, and closed on March 2, 2023. OPSC received 446 applications, requesting \$1,467,165,743.00 in funding.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

In this item, Staff is presenting 84 projects for funding approval. The remaining applications that can be funded within available program funding authority will be presented at a future Board meeting.

Funding Order

Due to the number of applications and respective grant amounts, funding order was based on total preference points for each school district and their first priority project. In accordance with Program Regulation Section 1860.15, the applications were ranked by preference points. Approved Applications receive preference points based on the total of (a) and (b) up to a maximum of 80 points, as follows:

- (a) 40 points if a school district demonstrates it meets the requirements for financial hardship.
- (b) Up to 40 points based on the percentage of pupils in the school district who are eligible for Free and Reduced-Price School Meals, as identified in the most recent data on file at the California Department of Education (CDE).

Once the preference points were determined, all approved applications were prioritized based on the following order per Program regulations:

- 1. School districts will have their first priority projects funded in order based on total preference points until all school districts have had their first priority project funded.
- 2. School districts with the same total preference points will be funded in order of the higher Low Income percentage reported to one decimal place. The school district with the higher Low Income percentage will be funded first, as identified in the most recent Free and Reduced Price School Meals data on file at the CDE. If school districts have the same total preference points, and the same Low Income percentage reported to one decimal place, projects will then be placed into a lottery system to determine the school district funding order.
- 3. The school district with the highest total preference points shall have their remaining projects funded in priority order until all of the school district's projects are funded, or until all funds are exhausted for that funding round, whichever comes first. Funding shall then be provided to the school district with the next highest total preference points.
- 4. A tie breaker will be used for school districts with the same total preference points by using the exact Low Income percentage to one decimal place. The school district with the higher Low Income percentage will be funded first.
- 5. If school districts with the same total preference points are still tied after the review of the Low Income percentages, projects will be placed into a lottery system to determine school district funding order. The highest remaining priority project for each school district participating in the lottery will be funded until all projects from each school district participating in the same lottery round have been funded, or until all funds are exhausted for that funding round, whichever comes first.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

Receiving an Apportionment

Under current regulations, school districts who receive a Program Apportionment *without* an advance release of funds must submit a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 70-02) within 180 days of Apportionment. School districts who receive a Program Apportionment *with* an advance release of funds must submit a valid Form SAB 70-02 with all required approvals within 12 months of Apportionment. Failure to submit the Form SAB 70-02 and required approvals within the prescribed period will result in the rescission of the project without further Board action.

Under current regulations, a school district that has received funds in accordance with the Program must submit a valid *Expenditure Report* (Form SAB 70-03) within 12 months of the final fund release or at the completion of the project, whichever occurs first. A final savings report stating any use of savings shall be due 12 months after the first expenditure report. Any savings remaining at the end of the 12 months must be returned to the State.

All school districts that receive a Board approval for an Apportionment must execute and submit a Grant Agreement prior to any release of funds. Cash proceeds are immediately available upon project Apportionment.

Potential Changes to Fund Release and Project Reporting Timelines In today's Board agenda, Staff is presenting proposed regulation changes that would increase the timelines associated with the following requirements after receiving an Apportionment, by making the following changes:

- Program Apportionments for projects *without* an advance release of funds would have 18 months, rather than 180 days, to submit a valid Form SAB 70-02.
- Program Apportionments for projects with an advance release of funds would have 18 months, rather than 12 months, to obtain all project approvals and submit a valid Form SAB 70-02.
- A valid Form SAB 70-03 must be submitted within three years from the date of the first Apportionment, rather than one year from the date of the final fund release.

If approved, Staff proposes these timelines also apply to any projects Apportioned or submitted as part of the third or fourth Program funding round.

Summary

Staff recommends approval of the 84 Program projects on Attachment B for Apportionment. The remaining applications that can be funded within available program funding authority will be presented at a future Board meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Approve the Program projects in the amount of \$346,557,573.80 as shown on Attachment B for Apportionment.
- 2. For an Apportionment with request for an advance fund release for design, pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.16(f), the school district must submit a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 70-02) within 12 months of the first Apportionment.
- 3. For an Apportionment without a request for an advance fund release for design, pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.16(f), the school district must submit a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 70-02) within 180 days of the first Apportionment.

17375.

- (a) (1) The California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program is hereby established, under the administration of the State Allocation Board pursuant to the requirements of this section, to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing transitional kindergarten classrooms and full-day kindergarten classrooms pursuant to Section 8973, and for the construction of new preschool classrooms, the modernization of existing preschool classrooms, or the modernization of existing kindergarten and grade 1 to 12, inclusive, classrooms that would be converted to provide California state preschool programs operated by school districts on a public schoolsite, pursuant to this section.
- (2) Moneys appropriated pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, hereby created in the State Treasury, administered by the State Allocation Board.
- (3) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section, as it read on December 31, 2020.
- (4) (A) For the 2021–22 fiscal year, the sum of four hundred ninety million dollars (\$490,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2027.
- (B) For the 2022–23 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund in the 2021–22 fiscal year to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2028.
- (C) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate an additional five hundred fifty million dollars (\$550,000,000) in the 2024–25 fiscal year from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds intended to be appropriated in this subparagraph will be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2030.
- (D) (i) Of the moneys allocated to a school district from the appropriation made pursuant to this paragraph, savings and interest achieved upon full completion of an approved project, and as a result of a school district's efficient and prudent expenditure of the moneys allocated, may be used for professional development or instructional materials to build capacity for the implementation of a California state preschool program, a

transitional kindergarten program, a full-day kindergarten program, or high priority capital outlay purposes identified by the school district and in accordance with subdivision (f), associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement.

- (ii) Notwithstanding any other law, for purposes of the funds appropriated in support of this paragraph only, a school district may retain and use savings and interest pursuant to clause (i) even if it receives financial hardship assistance pursuant to Section 17075.10.
- (iii) Savings and interest retained by a school district shall be expended within one year of project completion or returned to the state as required by associated regulations and any accompanying grant agreement.
- (5) New school facilities built pursuant to this section shall not be included in the eligibility determination used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10).
- (b) (1) The State Allocation Board shall award grants to school districts that lack the facilities to provide transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten as required for eligibility pursuant to Sections 17071.25 and 17072.10, that lack facilities that satisfy the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, or that lack the facility capacity to increase California state preschool program services.
- (2) Priority for grants shall be given to school districts that meet either of the following criteria:
- (A) The school district is financially unable to contribute a portion of, or all of, the local matching share required pursuant to paragraph (3) for a project, and meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Sections 17075.10 and 17075.15. For purposes of this section, paragraph (5) of subdivision (d) of Section 17075.15 shall not apply.
- (B) (i) For school districts seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved community with a high population of pupils who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 42238.01.
- (ii) For school districts seeking a preschool facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved area, as defined in Section 8205, that is prioritized to receive funds for the California state preschool program according to the prioritization process described in Section 8210.
- (3) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10 and as specified in paragraph (4), a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for new construction shall provide 50 percent of the cost of

the project, and a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for a retrofit project shall provide 40 percent of the cost of the project.

- (4) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, a school district shall provide 25 percent of the cost of the project, whether the project is for new construction or retrofit, if the school district does either of the following:
- (A) Converts a part-day kindergarten program to a full-day kindergarten program. A school district that was awarded a grant from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) and met the requirements of this paragraph shall have its grant amount adjusted from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (4) of subdivision (a) to reflect the requirements of this paragraph.
- (B) Commencing with the 2021–22 fiscal year, offers, or expands enrollment in, a California state preschool program or transitional kindergarten program.
- (5) (A) A school district seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account shall provide the Office of Public School Construction with schoolsite enrollment data for the year in which its application is processed and the three immediately preceding years. The Office of Public School Construction shall use this data to verify the schoolsite's overall need for funding pursuant to this section based on the schoolsite's enrollment patterns. As part of this verification, the Office of Public School Construction, in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall determine if the schoolsite's need for funding shall be limited to retrofit projects.
- (B) For a school district seeking a new construction grant for preschool classrooms from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, the school district shall demonstrate that its existing classrooms, including outdoor play areas and equipment, are insufficient to meet the needs of providing preschool, and that the school district's projected enrollment in the preschool program exceeds the current preschool program classroom capacity at the applicable schoolsite. A school district shall use both of the following to demonstrate enrollment for purposes of determining eligibility:
- (i) The most recent childcare needs assessment conducted by its regional local planning council for preschool age children.
- (ii) A current or future contract with the State Department of Education to operate a preschool program.
- (6) A school district, county office of education, or community college district seeking a preschool facilities grant shall hold title to the real property where the facilities will be located.

- (c) The State Allocation Board shall disburse grant funds to school districts with approved applications for new construction or retrofit projects, to the extent funds are available for the state's applicable matching share, if the school district has provided its applicable local matching share, unless the school district meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, and upon certification by the school district that the school district has entered into a binding contract for completion of the approved project.
- (d) The State Allocation Board shall allocate funds to school districts using the same maximum grant eligibility amounts that are used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10), as set forth in Sections 17072.10 and 17072.11 for new construction, and as set forth in Section 17074.10 for retrofit projects.
- (e) As a condition of receiving grant funds pursuant to this section, and before the release of those funds, the school district shall do all of the following:
- (1) Execute and submit a grant agreement consistent with the applicable sections of the grant agreement specified in Section 1859.90.4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (2) For a school district applying for grant funds for a transitional kindergarten facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to offer, or expand enrollment in, a transitional kindergarten program.
- (3) For a school district applying for grant funds for a California state preschool program facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to expand enrollment in a preschool program and apply for expanded program service funding, and certify that the school district has or will apply for a contract to operate a preschool program before occupying the to-be-constructed or retrofitted facility.
- (f) (1) A school district may use grant funds awarded for new construction on costs necessary to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils in an approved project, which shall include only the following:
- (A) The costs of design, engineering, testing, inspections, plan checking, construction management, site acquisition and development, evaluation and response action costs relating to hazardous substances at a new or existing schoolsite, demolition, construction, landscaping, necessary utility costs, utility connections and other related fees, equipment including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, furnishings, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.

- (B) The costs of acquiring an existing government-owned or privately owned building, or a privately financed school building, and the necessary costs of converting the government-owned or privately owned building for public school use.
- (2) (A) A school district may use grant funds awarded for a retrofit project to retrofit an existing school facility to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils, which shall only include the costs of design, engineering, testing, inspection, plan checking, construction management, demolition, construction, necessary utility costs, utility connection and other related fees, the purchase and installation of air-conditioning equipment and insulation materials and related costs, furniture and equipment, including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, fire safety improvements, playground safety improvements, the identification, assessment, or abatement of hazardous asbestos, seismic safety improvements, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.
- (B) Grant funds awarded for a retrofit project shall not be used for costs associated with acquisition and development of real property or for routine maintenance and repair.
- (3) A school district shall not use funds to purchase or install portable classrooms. For purposes of this article, "portable classroom" means a classroom building of one or more stories that is designed and constructed to be relocatable and transportable over public streets, and for a single-story portable classroom, is designed and constructed for relocation without the separation of the roof or floor from the building and when measured at the most exterior walls, has a floor area that does not exceed 2,000 square feet.
- (g) For a modernization grant pursuant to this article to retrofit an existing preschool classroom, including outdoor play areas and installed equipment, the applicable classroom shall comply with all of the following:
- (1) The Field Act, as set forth in Article 3 (commencing with Section 17280) and Article 6 (commencing with Section 17365).
- (2) The California Building Standards Code, as set forth in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations.
- (3) The regulations for early learning and care programs as set forth in Chapter 19 (commencing with Section 18000) of Division 1 of Title 5 of, and Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 101151) of Division 12 of Title 22 of, the California Code of Regulations, as applicable.
- (4) Written approval from the State Department of Education that the building plans comply with the standards set forth in Subchapter 1 (commencing with Section 14001) of Chapter 13 of Division 1 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

- (h) The State Allocation Board may adopt regulations to implement this section. Any regulations adopted pursuant to this section may be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Title 2 of the Government Code). The adoption of these regulations shall be deemed to be an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, or general welfare.
- (i) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district shall be subject, with regard to this section, to an audit conducted pursuant to Section 41024.
- (j) The Office of Public School Construction shall report to the Director of Finance, and shall post on its internet website, information regarding the use of grant funds that have been made available to school districts during each fiscal year grant funds are disbursed pursuant to this section. A final report shall also be issued after projects have been audited pursuant to Section 41024 and any savings have been spent or returned to the state.
- (k) The Department of General Services may charge its administrative costs against the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, which shall be subject to the approval of the Department of Finance and which shall not exceed 2.5 percent of the account. These administrative funds shall be subject to the encumbrance or expenditure availability for the appropriations described in paragraph (4) of subdivision (a).
- (I) Funds made available to school districts pursuant to this article shall supplement, not supplant, existing funds available for school facilities construction.
- (m) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:
- (1) "Kindergarten" includes transitional kindergarten, as defined in Section 48000.
- (2) "Preschool classroom" means a preschool classroom used or proposed to be used for instructional purposes in a California state preschool program.
- (3) "Preschool program" means a full-day California state preschool program pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 8207) of Chapter 2 of Part 6.
- (4) "Schoolsite" or "site" means the project site for which the school district is applying for grants under this article.
- (5) "School district" means as follows:
- (A) For transitional kindergarten and full-day kindergarten facilities grants, "school district" means a school district.
- (B) For preschool facilities grants, "school district" means a school district, county office of education, or a community college district that operates a preschool program on behalf of, or in lieu of, a school district or county office of education. (Amended by Stats. 2023, Ch. 48, Sec. 15. (SB 114) Effective July 10, 2023.)

EC Section 8973.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the kindergarten schoolday in an early primary program conducted pursuant to Section 8972 may exceed four hours, exclusive of recesses, provided that both of the following conditions are met:

- (a) The governing board of a school district declares that the extended-day kindergarten program does not exceed the length of the primary schoolday.
- (b) The extended-day kindergarten program takes into account ample opportunity for both active and quiet activities within an integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate educational program.

EC Section 8974.

School districts with early primary programs shall provide educational continuity from preschool through kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive, by accomplishing the following:

- (a) Establish connections with public preschool programs, including state preschool, state child development, and federal Head Start programs, to establish a more effective transition of children from preschool to kindergarten.
- (b) Promote connections among early primary programs that provide before- and afterschool services.
- (c) Promote joint activities for teachers and administrators of public preschool programs, including state preschool, state child development, and federal Head Start, and kindergarten and grades 1 to 3, inclusive, in areas such as program planning and staff development training related to developmentally appropriate curriculum and assessment practices for young children.

EC Section 8207.

- (a) The Superintendent shall administer all California state preschool programs. Those programs shall include, but not be limited to, part-day and full-day age and developmentally appropriate programs, offered through childcare centers and family childcare home education networks, that are designed to facilitate the transition to kindergarten for three- and four-year-old children in educational development, health services, social services, nutritional services, parent education and parent participation, evaluation, and staff development. Preschool programs for which federal reimbursement is not available shall be funded as prescribed by the Legislature in the Budget Act, and unless otherwise specified by the Legislature, shall not use federal funds made available through Title XX of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Sec. 1397).
- (b) A part-day California state preschool program shall operate for a minimum of (1) three hours per day, excluding time for home-to-school transportation, and (2) a

minimum of 175 days per year, unless the contract specifies a lower number of days of operation.

- (c) A full-day California state preschool program shall operate for a minimum of 246 days per year, unless the contract specifies a lower number of days of operation.
- (d) Any agency described in subdivision (a) of Section 8205 as an "applicant or contracting agency" is eligible to contract to operate a California state preschool program.
- (e) Public funds shall not be paid directly or indirectly to an agency that does not pay at least the minimum wage to each of its employees.
- (f) Federal Head Start funds used to provide services to families receiving California state preschool services shall be deemed nonrestricted funds.
- (g) School districts and charter schools that administer a California state preschool program may place four-year-old children in a transitional kindergarten program classroom in accordance with subdivisions (h) to (j), inclusive, of Section 48000.
- (h) California state preschool programs shall include all of the following:
- (1) Age- and developmentally appropriate activities for children.
- (2) Supervision.
- (3) Parenting education and parent engagement.
- (4) Social services that include, but are not limited to, identification of child and family needs and referral to appropriate agencies.
- (5) Health services.
- (6) Nutrition.
- (7) Training and career ladder opportunities, documentation of which shall be provided to the department.
- (i) The Superintendent shall adopt rules and regulations related to the administration of this chapter, including rules and regulations related to eligibility, enrollment, and priority of services. Regulations shall also include the recommendations of the State Department of Health Care Services relative to health care screening and the provision of health care services. The Superintendent shall seek the advice and assistance of these health authorities in situations where service under this chapter includes or requires care of children who are ill or have exceptional needs.

EC Section 1596.7925.

- (a) On or before July 1, 2019, the State Department of Education shall adopt new health and safety regulations under Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations that apply to California state preschool programs that meet the conditions specified in subdivision (o) of Section 1596.792. The regulations shall require those programs to have all of the following:
- (1) Outdoor shade that is safe and in good repair.

- (2) Drinking water that is accessible and readily available throughout the day.
- (3) Safe and sanitary restroom facilities with one toilet and handwashing fixture for every 15 children.
- (4) Restroom facilities that are only available for preschoolers and kindergartners.
- (5) Visual supervision of children at all times.
- (6) Indoor and outdoor space that is properly contained or fenced and provides sufficient space for the number of children using the space at any given time. Playground equipment must be safe, in good repair, and age appropriate.
- (b) The State Department of Education may adopt emergency regulations pursuant to Section 11346.1 of the Government Code to satisfy the requirements of this section. The adoption of emergency regulations shall be deemed an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, or general welfare.
- (c) A violation of regulations adopted pursuant to subdivision (a) or (b) shall not be subject to Section 1596.890.

5 CCR § 18140

§ 18140. General Provisions.

- (a) The regulations in article 4 apply only to Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) operating part-day or full-day California State Preschool Programs (CSPPs) that choose to be exempt from title 22 of California Code of Regulations (22 CCR) pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 1596.792(o).
- (b) LEAs operating part-day or full-day CSPP classrooms may choose for any or all classrooms to be exempt from 22 CCR licensing requirements as long as they continue to meet all legal and contractual requirements of the CSPP, which includes adequate standards of Program Quality, pursuant to subchapter 12 of chapter 19, of this division, as well as meet the following conditions:
- (1) The LEA has a contract to perform CSPP services and performs those services directly, and not through a subcontractor;
- (2) The LEA is performing such services in a school building, as defined by Education Code section 17283, and the school building in which the services are performed has been determined to be compliant with the provisions of the Field Act, pursuant to title 1, division 1, part 10.5, chapter 3, articles 3 and 6 of the Education Code, according to the Division of the State Architect:
- (3) The school building in which services are performed is maintained in good repair as defined by Education Code section 17002 and is subject to a yearly facility inspection pursuant to Education Code section 1240 and the information is included on the LEA's School Accountability Report Card.

- (4) The LEA facility meets the requirements for kindergarten classrooms in accordance with chapter 13 (commencing with section 14000) of division 1 of title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5 CCR).
- (c) Any LEA operating a CSPP classroom pursuant to this article may only serve four-year-old children as defined in Education Code section 8208 in the exempted classrooms. CSPP classrooms with any child younger than four years of age shall meet 22 CCR licensing requirements.
- (d) The California Department of Education (CDE) shall make a determination whether an LEA meets the requirements of this article at the time of initial funding and thereafter yearly as part of the continued funding process. At any time, the CDE may make a finding that an LEA does not meet the requirements for license exemption and shall notify the LEA of such finding. The LEA may appeal this finding pursuant to 5 CCR section 18308.
- (e) The CDE shall immediately notify the California Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division, regarding any change in the licensing status of an LEA and/or if a determination is made that an LEA does not meet the requirements of Health and Safety Code section 1596.792(o) and this article and should be subject to licensing.

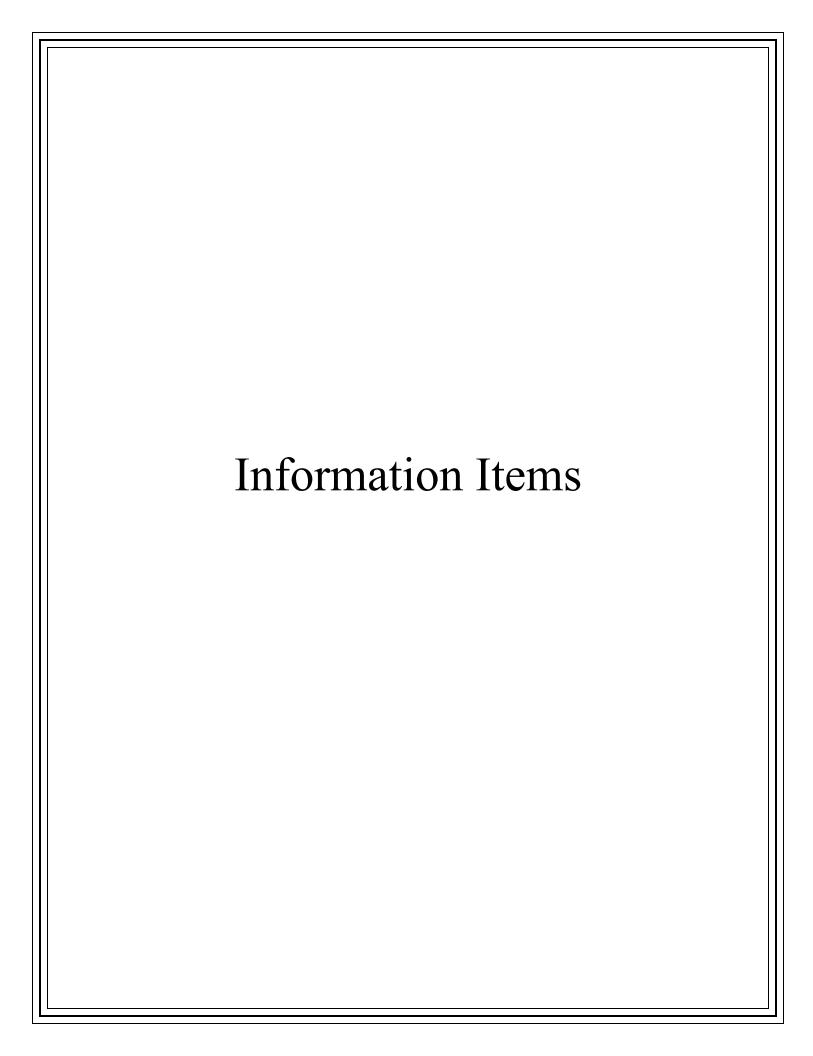

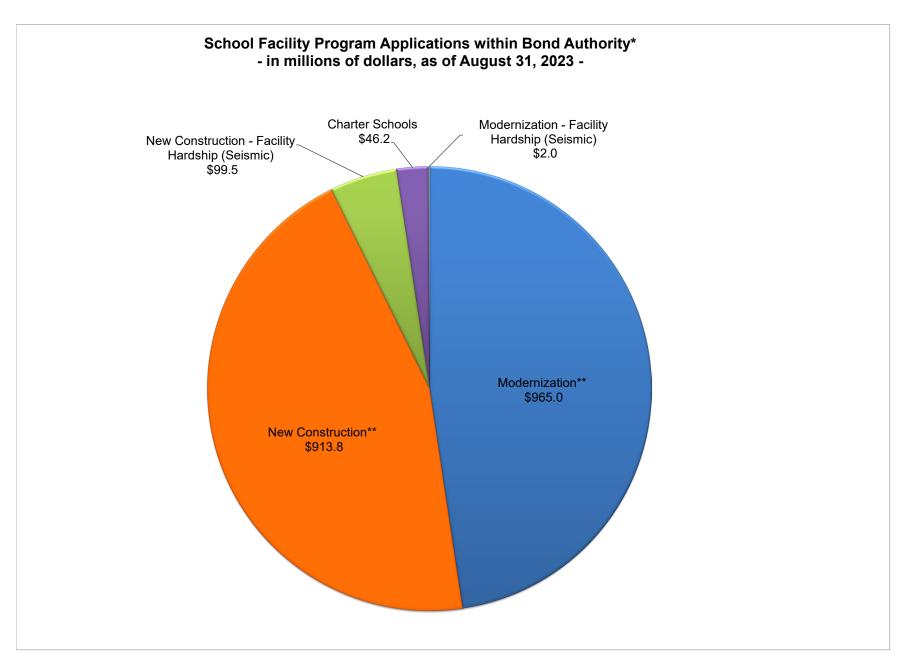

Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82.2 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

- (b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:
- (1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.
- (2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.
- (3) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).
- (4) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.
- (5) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.
- (6) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.
- (7) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82.2. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

- (c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:
- (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.
- (2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).
- (3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.

status.

- (4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.
- (5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

(A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship

- (B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-
- 12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.
- (d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).
- (e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).
- (1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the

provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.

- (2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must re-qualify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.
- (3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

- (f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.
- (g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.
- (h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.
- (1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.
- (2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar
- days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:
- a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.
- b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.
- (3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.
- (4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
