Upon notice duly given, the meeting of the State Allocation Board (SAB) was held at the Department of Healthcare Services, located at 1500 Capitol Mall, in the Auditorium, in Sacramento, California on February 28, 2024 at 4:00 p.m.

Mr. Chris Ferguson, the SAB Chair, announced that this meeting was being held in person for anyone who would like to provide public comment in person. This meeting was also conducted by way of Zoom meeting for members of the public participating remotely. The meeting was physically webcast from the Department of Healthcare Services, located at 1500 Capitol Mall, in the Auditorium, in Sacramento.

The Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

Construction Cost Indices Updates

At its January 24, 2024 meeting, the SAB directed staff to research alternative construction cost indices that could be used for the annual adjustment to School Facility Program (SFP) grants.

EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S STATEMENT (cont.)Construction Cost Indices Updates (cont.)

The SAB requested that its legal counsel provide an opinion on the SAB's ability to make an additional adjustment to SFP grants later in the year, and directed staff to provide updates on these efforts as well as updates related to a potential statewide school facilities bond.

The February 28, 2024 SAB agenda included the requested legal analysis from counsel. In response to the SAB's direction, staff met with stakeholders and have begun to evaluate and compare several indices. An item presenting the results of staff's research will be presented at a future SAB meeting.

Statewide School Facilities Bond Update*Proposed Legislation*

The Governor stated that the Administration expects to enter into negotiations with the Legislature on education facilities bond proposals to reach agreement on a bond proposal to be considered in the November 2024 election. There are two such bond bills pending in the Legislature, and staff will provide updates over the coming months:

- Assembly Bill 247 – Education finance: school facilities: Transitional Kindergarten through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2024 (Muratsuchi, Fong, Wilson, et al.)
- Senate Bill 28 – Education finance: school facilities: Public Preschool, K-12, and College Health and Safety Bond Act of 2024 (Glazer)

Processing Timelines and Status of Funds

OPSC has been processing approximately \$1.5 billion in SFP projects annually. If project processing continues at this rate, the currently authorized funding for New Construction and Modernization projects (after Unfunded Approvals) may be exhausted by January 2025.

In the Information section of each Agenda, the list of Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority is published and represents applications received, but not reviewed, by OPSC. As of January 31, 2024, there is approximately \$1.05 billion in requests for New Construction and \$1.84 billion in requests for Modernization on this list.

The Executive Officer indicated that there was a high-level overview of the three levels of developer fees and the conditions under which they could be assessed by school districts, included in the Executive Officer's Statement in the February 28, 2024 SAB Agenda.

School Districts Impacted by Recent Storms

OPSC is available to meet with school districts that experienced damage to their school sites as a result of the recent storms and severe flooding. The costs may be beyond what is covered by insurance, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). OPSC encourages school districts impacted by the recent storms to reach out to OPSC's Facility Hardship Program Team to discuss potential funding options. The SAB's counsel, Mr. Egan, presented the legal analysis based on the two questions raised at the January 24, 2024 SAB meeting:

1. Can the Board adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, in addition to the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?
2. If the Board does adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, could the Board retroactively apply that additional adjustment to projects previously approved with the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?

He explained in detail his legal opinion that the SAB does not have the ability to adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the same year. Mr. Egan further concluded that since the SAB

Executive Officer Statement

EXECUTIVE OFFICER STATEMENT
State Allocation Board Meeting, April 3, 2024

UPCOMING PRIORITY FUNDING ROUND

The State Treasurer's Office opened a bond sale on March 26. The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) anticipates receiving proceeds of the bond sale. As such, OPSC anticipates presenting projects on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) at the May State Allocation Board (Board) meeting for Priority Funding apportionments. OPSC will notice the apportionments prior to the May meeting after the State Treasurer's Office provides confirmation to OPSC of the amounts to be received.

CONSTRUCTION COST INDICES UPDATES

At the January 24, 2024 Board meeting, the Board directed staff to research alternative construction cost indices that could be used for the annual adjustment to School Facility Program (SFP) grants and directed staff to provide updates on these efforts as well as updates related to a potential statewide school facilities bond.

In response to the Board's direction for staff to research alternative construction cost indices, staff has continued to meet with stakeholders and research is still underway to evaluate and compare several indices. An item presenting the results of staff's research will be presented at a future Board meeting.

STATEWIDE SCHOOL FACILITIES BOND UPDATES

Proposed Legislation

The Governor has stated that this spring, the Administration expects to enter into negotiations with the Legislature on their education facilities bond proposals to reach agreement on a bond proposal to be considered in the November 2024 election.

Currently, there are two education facilities bond bills pending in the Legislature. Staff continues to monitor these bills and will provide further updates over the coming months.

Assembly Bill 247 – Education finance: school facilities: Transitional Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2024 (Muratsuchi, Fong, Wilson, et al.)

Senate Bill 28 – Education finance: school facilities: Public Preschool, K-12, and College Health and Safety Bond Act of 2024 (Glazer)

NEXT MEETING

There will be no meeting on Wednesday, April 24, 2024. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, May 22, 2024. The time and location of the meeting will be determined and announced at a later date.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM

This Resolution of the State Allocation Board (hereafter referred to as the "Board") is applicable to the appropriate sections of the Education Code and is described and filed in the office of the Executive Officer and will be made available to all interested parties as the Resolution pertains to the documents attached hereto. Said documents were acted upon by the Board at its meeting on April 3, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project's cost prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds and/or General Fund proceeds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants, in accordance with applicable, laws and regulations.
4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3rd Street, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY ADJUSTMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To adjust the baseline eligibility for new construction and modernization projects under the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998.

DESCRIPTION

The districts listed on Attachment A have received eligibility approval for new construction. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.51.

The districts listed on Attachment B have received eligibility approval for modernization. There has been a change in their baseline in accordance with the California Code of Regulations relating to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, Section 1859.61.

SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM APPORTIONMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for Apportionment.

DESCRIPTION

On September 21, 2022, the Board took action, due to the availability of General Fund proceeds, to return to making direct Apportionments while keeping the same benefits of the quick distribution of funds, as the priority funding system, by adopting proposed emergency regulations that revised the fund release deadlines from 18 months to either 180 calendar days for non-financial hardship school districts or 365 calendar days for school districts that qualify for financial hardship. The SFP new construction and modernization projects presented on the Attachment are in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) and are Ready for Apportionment. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date.

AUTHORITY

SFP Regulation Section 1859.90 states:

- “(a) With the exception of an apportionment made pursuant to Sections 1859.81.1(e) or 1859.81.2, apportionments provided through the Priority Funding Process and subject to 1859.90.2, or of an Inactive Apportionment subject to Section 1859.96, the OPSC will release State funds that the Board has apportioned to the district after submittal, by the district, of the Form SAB 50-05 and a Grant Agreement, pursuant to Section 1859.90.4.
- “(b) With the exception of an apportionment made for a Type II Joint-Use Project, not part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, pursuant to Article 12 of these Regulations, a district must submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement, within 180 calendar days of the Apportionment of the SFP grant for the project or within 365 calendar days for Apportionments that include financial hardship assistance. If the district does not submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement within the above specified time, the entire New Construction Adjusted Grant, or Modernization Adjusted Grant or Type I or II, part of a qualifying SFP Modernization, or Joint-Use Project apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action, and the pupils housed in the project, if applicable, will be

added back to the district's baseline eligibility. The district may refile a new application for the project subject to district eligibility and available State funds at the time of resubmittal.

.... "

BACKGROUND

As part of the Governor's approved Budget Act for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, one-time General Fund dollars were appropriated to the Board in the amount of \$1.3 billion for new construction and modernization projects under the SFP, as well as \$1,960.5 million was appropriated from the Governor's approved Budget Act for the 2023-2024 fiscal year. As a result of receiving funding for the SFP that is not contingent on bond sales, the Board was able to return to using an existing regulatory process that allows for Apportionments to be made on a flow basis outside the current Priority Funding process, which is designed to accommodate twice yearly bond sales. Making Apportionments on a flow basis will enable school districts to more quickly and efficiently access much needed cash for construction projects. In order to ensure that cash moves quickly once allocated to school districts, regulations were changed to shorten the deadlines for fund release from 18 months to either 180 calendar days or 365 calendar days for districts that qualify for financial hardship.

School districts must submit the Grant Agreement and a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) 180 calendar days from Board approval for non-financial hardship projects and 365 calendar days from Board approval for financial hardship projects.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
2. Specify that the projects are subject to the fund release deadlines as outlined in SFP Regulation Section 1859.90.

The Applicant is required to submit a signed Grant Agreement for the project prior to or concurrent with a valid Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 50-05). Failure to submit an executed Grant Agreement and valid Form SAB 50-05 prior to the deadline shall result in the Apportionment being rescinded without further board action.

The Applicant is responsible for ensuring that the project is compliant with Prevailing Wage Monitoring and/or Labor Compliance Program requirements at the time construction contracts are executed and/or construction commenced.

CHARTER SCHOOL FACILITIES PROGRAM **EXTENSION TO CONVERSION DEADLINE**

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present Chico Unified School District's (Applicant) request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline for its Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) hybrid new construction and rehabilitation project.

DESCRIPTION

Applicants participating in the CSFP must convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment (PSCA) to an adjusted grant apportionment within a four-year period pursuant to School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.166. This item requests a one-year extension to the conversion deadline for the Applicant's hybrid new construction and rehabilitation project, application numbers 54/61424-00-006 and 007, pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.166.1.

AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

BACKGROUND

The CSFP provides PCSAs (reservations of bond authority) for new construction and rehabilitation projects. The PCSA for a CSFP project must be converted within a four-year period to an adjusted grant apportionment meeting all the SFP Regulation requirements, unless a single one-year extension is granted by the State Allocation Board (Board).

Applicants may request the Board to approve a single one-year extension. The request will be approved when the Applicant meets the criteria in (a) or (b):

- a) The charter school has provided evidence of both of the following:
 - The California Department of Education (CDE) has made a contingent or final approval of the proposed site; and,
 - The Division of the State Architect (DSA) has confirmed that the final plans for the project have been submitted to the DSA for review and approval.
- b) Other evidence satisfactory to the Board justifying the extension.

STAFF ANALYSIS/COMMENTS

The project will consist of rehabilitating district-owned facilities at a site owned by the Chico Unified School District and constructing additional facilities that will add capacity to the site. The project has been delayed due to the pandemic and cashflow issues. The Applicant has received final plan approval from the Division of the State Architect

and anticipates receiving final plan approval from the California Department of Education in March 2024. The Applicant plans to submit a complete conversion application after the November 2024 election, which will provide bond funding for the Applicant match. The current conversion deadline for the project was February 26, 2024. The request for the one-time, one-year extension was received by OPSC on January 19, 2024. If approved, the new deadline will be February 26, 2025.

Staff has reviewed the Applicant's request (Attachment B) and determined that it provides satisfactory evidence to justify the extension. Staff supports the Applicant's request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Applicant's request for a one-year extension to the conversion deadline. Require that the PCSAs for application numbers 54/61424-00-006 and 007 be converted to final apportionments by February 26, 2025, or the PCSAs will be rescinded, and the bond authority returned to the CSFP.

AUTHORITY

School Facility Program (SFP) Section 1859.166. Time Limit on Preliminary Charter School Apportionment.

- (a) A complete request to convert a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment to a Final Charter School Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.165 shall be made within four years of the date of the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment unless the Charter School received approval of an extension pursuant to Section 1859.166.1.
- (b) If (a) is not met, and the Charter School has not received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:
 - (1) the Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the Charter School, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (2) the SFP New Construction Eligibility will be increased by the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 for the school district that physically contains the Charter School within its geographical boundaries.
 - (c) If (a) is not met, and the Charter School has received an advance release of funds as provided in Section 1859.164.2, the following will occur:
 - (1) The Preliminary Charter School Apportionment shall be rescinded and any remaining Preliminary Charter School Apportionment, not released to the Charter School, shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (2) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(a) shall be reduced to cost incurred and closed-out pursuant to Section 1859.106 with a corresponding SFP new construction baseline eligibility adjustment for the pupils assigned to the Preliminary Charter School Application. The adjustment to the baseline eligibility shall be based on the ratio of the number of unhoused pupils pursuant to Section 1859.162.2 and the project capacity which generated the project funding to the eligible expenditures. Any funds released are subject to the fifty percent local matching share requirement as required by EC 17078.54(d). Funds returned pursuant to Section 1859.106 shall be transferred to the Unrestricted Charter School Fund within the appropriate Charter School Facility Account, and;
 - (3) Funds released pursuant to Section 1859.164.2(b) shall be subject to the provisions of Section 1859.171.

SFP Section 1859.166.1. Preliminary Charter School Apportionment Time Limit Extension.

A Charter School that has received a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment may request a single one-year extension of the time limit prescribed in Section 1859.166(a). The Board shall approve the request provided the criteria in (a) or (b) are met:

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request to amend the equipment list of a previously approved Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) funding application.

DESCRIPTION

At the April 28, 2021, meeting, the State Allocation Board (Board) approved an apportionment for \$3 million for this CTEFP project that included \$316,566 in grants for equipment. After that approval, the District submitted a *School District Appeal Request* (Attachment A) to amend the originally approved equipment list associated with the project. Staff has reviewed the District's request and supports the change of equipment items.

AUTHORITY

School Facilities Program Regulation Section 1859.193 states, in part "Equipment purchased under the Career Technical Education Facilities Program must have an average useful life expectancy of at least ten years pursuant to Education Code 17078.72(a)."

BACKGROUND

The CTEFP provides a maximum of \$3 million in grants for new construction projects and \$1.5 million for modernization projects, inclusive of equipment. Statute requires that equipment has an average useful life expectancy of ten years. To be complete, grant applications must include a detailed cost estimate of construction, site development, and an itemized equipment list.

The District submitted a CTEFP Funding Application during Cycle 5 for new CTE facilities in the Arts, Media, and Entertainment Industry Sector on February 14, 2019. The project was approved for placement on the Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans) on May 22, 2019 and received an Apportionment as a reservation of funds May 27, 2020 (Attachment B). The \$3 million awarded for the project was the maximum grant allowed by statute, which included grants for construction of a new facility and equipment for the program. As a reservation of funds, the District was provided 12 months from the Apportionment date to submit the required California Department of Education and Division of the State Architect plan approvals to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC). Following these approvals, and due to previously approved equipment items being no longer available for purchase, the District determined that it needed to amend the originally approved equipment list. Thus, on October 23, 2023, the District submitted the attached *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189), which is included as Attachment A.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

DISTRICT POSITION

As noted in its Form SAB 189, the District requests “equipment substitutions for an SAB-approved Production Managerial Arts funding application.”

District states that “the equipment substitutions found in this equipment scope revision are attributed to discontinued models that can no longer be purchased” and that “the vendor who quoted the equipment in the original application has provided recommendations for these discontinued models.”

Request Adjustment to Eligible Cost Categories:

The District is submitting a revised Form SAB 50-10 to adjust the Eligible Costs (Section 9). The previously approved SAB 50-10 had a 50 Percent Equipment cost of \$316,566.48 and a 50 Percent Construction cost of \$2,683,433.52 for a total Eligible Project Cost (50%) of \$3,000,000.00. The District is requesting to decrease the 50 percent equipment cost to \$234,515.08 to reflect the current cost of equipment, equipment substitutions, and quantity reductions. Accordingly, the District is requesting to increase the 50 Percent Construction cost to \$2,765,484.92 so that the Eligible Project Cost (50%) and CTEFP grant continues to total \$3,000,000.00.

In support of its request, the District has submitted the following documentation:

1. Complete list of previously SAB Approved Items.
2. Original Vendor Quote.
3. Proposed Substitute Items.
4. Updated Vendor quote.
5. Approval of Substituted Items by Grant High School Video Production Academy Collaborative.
6. Substantiation of 10-year average life expectancy: No additional documentation is provided with this appeal because the District requested that OPSC consider the prior acceptance of the 10-year average useful life of the original items (which are no longer available) to apply to the proposed equipment substitute items.

The full text of the District's appeal request is included as Attachment A.

STAFF POSITION

The District requests to amend the originally approved equipment item list of its CTEFP funding application (55/64733-00-022) and to adjust the previously approved eligible costs to align the funding allocations with the proposed equipment list. OPSC staff reviewed the District's request and determined that all items on the District's proposed list of replacement items could be approved as presented. In addition, if the Board were to approve the proposed equipment list, the total funding amount would remain the same, but the allocations for construction and equipment would be adjusted commensurate with the newly approved equipment list.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

The District advised OPSC that the proposed equipment list is not an expansion of the originally approved list. The District demonstrates in the attachment that the original items were kits that included multiple items, and are now broken out into their individual components and discontinued items are being replaced with the more current models. Some quantities are changed to meet these changes as well. The proposed equipment list itemizes the replacement components for the original items as recommended by the vendor and approved by the Grant High School Video Production Academy Collaborative.

In order to satisfy the average 10-year life expectancy substantiation requirement, in the Form SAB 189 the District requests OPSC consider the prior acceptance of the 10-year average useful life of the original items (which are no longer available) to apply to the proposed new equipment substitute items. Given the substitute items directly replace the discontinued models/kits contained on the original approved equipment list, OPSC accepted the District's prior 10-year average useful lifespan substantiation for the new proposed equipment items.

The proposed amended list represents a reduction in the total equipment allocation. Because the project was awarded the maximum amount allowed by statute of \$3 million, the change in equipment requested would not have altered the Apportionment if it had been done prior to approval. The original Apportionment is included as Attachment A for reference. Due to the lesser cost of the proposed equipment items, the District is requesting that the project allocations between construction and equipment be adjusted so that the funds not spent on equipment be applied to the construction costs, because the combined total with both state and district matching share exceeds the program cap of \$6 million. The change in allocations is represented in Attachment C. OPSC supports the District's request.

Conclusion

Staff supports the District's request to substitute the proposed equipment items from the originally approved list.

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

A report by Costa & Associates, dated April 27, 2018, identifies several structural deficiencies in the Auditorium and Gymnasium Building located at the North Hollywood Senior High School site. The report references material insufficiencies such as with the wall anchorage, cross ties, spans, and shear walls. All the material insufficiencies identified in the report renders the Auditorium and Gymnasium Building at high risk of collapse in the event of seismic activity. The building qualifies for the SMP based on the qualifying criteria in Education Code Section 17075.10 and SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2.

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The scope of this project includes the demolition and replacement of the Auditorium and Gymnasium Building at the North Hollywood Senior High School site. This scope of work is part of a comprehensive modernization project in which many of the buildings on the site will be demolished and replaced.

STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

The District anticipates completing construction of the comprehensive modernization project in April 2026.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA

GOVERNMENT/STATE LEVEL CONCURRENCE

The Auditorium and Gymnasium Building was classified as a Most Vulnerable Category 2 Building type as defined in SFP regulations and has met qualifying criteria of the SMP. The Division of the State Architect (DSA) has approved the District for Phase One (Eligibility Evaluation) and Phase Two (Replacement Option Analysis and Design Criteria) as well as providing final plan approval. These approvals enable the District to apply for funding from the Board.

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(a) states:

A school district may apply for hardship assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances. Extraordinary circumstances may include, but are not limited to, the need to repair, reconstruct, or replace the most vulnerable school facilities that are identified as a Category 2 building, as defined in the report submitted pursuant to Section 17317, determined by the department to pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of a seismic event.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82 states, “A school district may apply for Facility Hardship, including Seismic Mitigation, Program assistance in cases of extraordinary circumstances that have caused an imminent health and safety threat.”

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2 states that “A school district is eligible for funding to repair, reconstruct, or replace the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings which were originally constructed to be used as School Facilities and pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in the event of seismic activity. Program eligibility is determined by the Division of the State Architect while determination of grant funding is determined by the Board based on the following criteria.

Notwithstanding Sections 1859.93 and 1859.93.1, all applications for the seismic mitigation of the Most Vulnerable Category 2 Buildings shall be funded in the order of receipt of an Approved Application for funding. Any grants provided for the purpose of this section shall be provided as a new construction project and allocated on a 50 percent state share basis.”

SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2(a) states,

- (a) Seismic mitigation projects must meet all of the following requirements:
 - (1) The construction contract was executed on or after May 20, 2006;
 - (2) The project funding provided shall be for the minimum work necessary to obtain DSA approval;
 - (3) The School Building is designed for occupancy by students and staff; and
 - (4) The DSA concurs with a report by a structural engineer, which identifies structural deficiencies that pose an unacceptable risk of injury to its occupants in a seismic event. The structural engineers report shall conform to the guidelines prepared by the DSA, in accordance with Education Code Section 17310.

DESCRIPTION

DESCRIPTION OF HEALTH AND SAFETY THREAT

A report by Saiful/Bouquet Structural Engineers, dated May 11, 2020, identifies several structural deficiencies in the Shop Building 3 located at the Venice Senior High School site. The reports reference material insufficiencies with the load path, wall anchorage and support systems, diaphragm spans, coupling beams, and foundation dowels. All the material insufficiencies identified in the report renders the Shop Building 3 at high risk of collapse in the event of seismic activity. The building qualifies for the SMP based on the qualifying criteria in Education Code Section 17075.10 and SFP Regulation Section 1859.82.2.

SCOPE OF PROJECT

The scope of this project includes the demolition and replacement of the Shop Building 3 at the Venice Senior High School site. This scope of work is part of a comprehensive modernization project in which many of the buildings on the site will be demolished and replaced.

STATUS OF SCHOOL SITE

The District completed construction of the comprehensive modernization project in October 2023.

QUALIFYING CRITERIA

GOVERNMENT/STATE LEVEL CONCURRENCE

The Shop Building 3 was classified as a Most Vulnerable Category 2 Building type as defined in SFP regulations and has met qualifying criteria of the SMP. The Division of the State Architect (DSA) has approved the District for Phase One (Eligibility Evaluation) and Phase Two (Replacement Option Analysis and Design Criteria) as well as providing final plan approval. These approvals enable the District to apply for funding from the Board.

Staff accepted detailed reports from industry specialists and DSA approval in lieu of a site visit.







 (in millions of dollars)





(in millions of dollars)










School Facility Program Proposition 51 Apportionments by County







Gross Construction Expenditures by School Facility Program Service Region




School Facility Program Gross Construction Expenditures by County





















Number of Projects




State Funding (in millions)

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request for approval of Financial Hardship status based upon "other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the State Allocation Board."

DESCRIPTION

On November 17, 2023, the District submitted a *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189) (Attachment A) for a Financial Hardship status request for Financial Hardship funding for their design funding requests for a New Construction project and a Modernization project at the Lassen View Elementary School site.

The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) reviewed the request and determined the District is levying the maximum developer fee under the law, but does not meet the qualifying criteria for Financial Hardship funding for the following reasons:

- The District has long-term debt at zero percent of debt capacity, which is below the 60 percent threshold,
- The District has not passed a Proposition 39 bond measure within the last two years, and
- The District has a debt capacity of \$5,088,582, which is in excess of the \$5 million threshold.

As a result, the District is not eligible for Financial Hardship assistance under standard criteria. The District is therefore requesting consideration for Financial Hardship status based on "other evidence."

The total District matching share for the two applications is \$886,329.67. The District has \$29,134.00 available to contribute toward its projects and \$0.00 available as contribution due to expenditures. If the appeal request is approved, the total Financial Hardship grant would be \$857,195.67. If the appeal request is not approved, the District states that they would not be able to move forward with the projects.

BACKGROUND

Application for Funding History

Lassen View Elementary School is an elementary school serving Kindergarten through Eighth Grade. This school is in Lassen View Union Elementary School District, which is a one-school school district located in the town of Los Molinos in Tehama County. The District currently serves a student population of 358. The District notes that the school site has a number of modernization needs, including but not limited to, an outdated fire alarm system, safety fences, aging facilities and site components.

On February 3, 2021, the District submitted a design funding request for a School Facility Program (SFP) new construction application (Application Number 50/71563-00-002) and a design funding request for a SFP modernization application (Application Number 57/71563-00-001) to OPSC. The District submitted design funding requests to obtain costs needed to develop plans and obtain required approvals from the Division of the State Architect, which is a requirement for full funding grant requests to be reviewed and approved.

Attempts to Obtain Local Match

Since the establishment of the SFP in 1998, the District has attempted one bond initiative. This one attempt occurred on March 3, 2020 for a \$2.7 million bond that failed with 57 percent of the voters voting “no.” The detailed results of the bond initiative attempted are listed below.

District's Position

Lassen View Union Elementary School District is seeking Financial Hardship status under “other evidence.” The District highlights the following points in their request for Financial Hardship under “other evidence.”

- The District’s debt capacity is less than \$89,000 over the \$5 million threshold to be eligible for Financial Hardship assistance. The threshold of this eligibility criteria “is antiquated and in need of adjustment as inflation continues to increase.”
- The District recently tried to obtain its local match by attempting a bond initiative in March 2020. The bond initiative failed when over 57 percent of voters voted “no.”

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

- Proceeds from Developer Fees are minimal due to a lack of new development in the community due to county demographics. The Developer Fee funds that have been available will be depleted due to costs associated with installing new buildings.
- The District has significant facilities needs that cannot be fully addressed without state funds. The facilities needs listed include replacing an outdated fire alarm system, installing safety fences to protect the school site from traffic, improving air conditioning in the gymnasium, and modernizing aging portable and permanent buildings and school site components.

The full text of the District's appeal request is included as Attachment A.

Staff's Position

The District has requested consideration under the "other evidence" of reasonable effort provision in the Financial Hardship regulations, which requires Board approval. Staff is providing the following overview of the District's ability to meet the standard Financial Hardship criteria for the Board's consideration of its request and is seeking direction from the Board.

Financial Hardship Qualification and History of "Other Evidence" Appeals

School districts may qualify for the Financial Hardship program by levying the maximum developer fees allowed by law and by meeting one of the four criteria outlined in regulation. The District is levying developer fees justified by their developer fee study and meets this qualifying criterion. However, the District does not meet any of the secondary criteria, as illustrated below:

There have been 16 prior requests for Financial Hardship status under “other evidence” considered by the Board. There are no set criteria to qualify for Financial Hardship status under “other evidence.” Each district presented unique circumstances surrounding its request. Of these requests, eight were approved as requested and three partially approved. The remaining five were not approved.

A full summary of all prior “other evidence” appeals and their outcomes is included as Attachment C.

District Funding Request

Based on the above criteria, OPSC has determined that the District does not meet the minimum qualifications for Financial Hardship status under the standard provisions in SFP Regulation Section 1859.81.

Because the District is appealing the decision of the initial Financial Hardship review, Staff proceeded with Phase II of the Financial Hardship review to determine the amount of local funds that would be potentially available for the project, and the amount of Financial Hardship assistance necessary should the Board grant the District’s appeal.

Staff has confirmed that the District has \$29,134.00 available to contribute toward its projects and \$0.00 available as contribution due to expenditures to contribute towards the two applications. The total District’s share for the new construction application and the modernization application is \$886,329.67. If the District’s appeal is approved, the District would contribute \$29,134.00 towards the projects and the total Financial Hardship grant would be \$857,195.67. The projects are detailed in the table below.

Summary

SFP Regulation Section 1859.81(c) states that “all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project” must be made for a district to qualify for Financial Hardship status.

The District has a total bonding capacity of \$5,088,582, which is in excess of the \$5 million threshold set in statute. The \$5 million threshold has existed since the inception of the SFP and cannot be adjusted by the Board as it would require a statutory change. Provisions to increase the threshold and adjust it annually are currently included in the two bond bills proposed in the current Legislative session.

The District’s current bonded indebtedness is at zero percent, below the 60 percent requirement of SFP Regulation Section 1859.81(c)(1). The District’s low

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

indebtedness provides the District more flexibility in terms of utilizing long-term loan instruments in an effort to meet the District's match obligation for the two projects. However, the District does note in its appeal request that the District's entire budget for the 2023/2024 school year is approximately \$5,100,000. The District's budget may itself limit the District's ability to assume long-term debt while also maintaining its long-term financial stability.

The District has not passed a successful Proposition 39 bond within the past two years. In its appeal, the District notes that its attempt to pass a local bond in March 2020 failed with 57.43 percent of voters voting "no." The District's March 2020 effort was the District's only bond attempt since the establishment of the SFP in 1998. In its appeal, the District argues that it does not believe it is likely that the local community would pass a bond initiative due to the community's demographics and history, but that it will consider attempting another bond "if needed." By not attempting a bond initiative in three years and not currently planning on seeking one in the near future, this may not present a strong case that the District has made all reasonable efforts to obtain local funds and provide its matching share.

If the Board approves the District's request for Financial Hardship status, it may wish to consider pairing the approval with a requirement that the District attempt a bond initiative in an additional effort to fund its matching share for the future full funding grant requests. The District would use the design funding to demonstrate to the community what the bond funds would be used for and how local funds would allow the District to obtain state funding to cover a portion of the project's construction phase. This is consistent with past actions taken by the Board on previous appeals for Financial Hardship status under "other evidence" and would ensure that the District makes all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project for the construction phase of the projects, as required in statute to qualify for Financial Hardship assistance.

Conclusion

Staff is unable to administratively approve the District's request. Typically, Staff only supports requests for Financial Hardship status under "other evidence" in unique or severe circumstances and is therefore seeking Board direction.

Consistent with past actions taken by the Board on several previous appeals seeking Financial Hardship status under "other evidence," the Board may consider approving the District's appeal request for the design funding requests only and require that the District must attempt to pass a local bond measure before the District would be approved for Financial Hardship status for future full funding requests for the projects. The ability to fund the District's future full funding requests will depend upon the availability of state funds for SFP applications.

Absent an approval of the District's appeal, the two design funding requests will have to be returned to the District due to the Financial Hardship review determination that the District did not meet at least one of the qualifying criteria in

SFP Regulation Section 1859.81(c), which is a requirement to be eligible to receive a separate apportionment for design costs.

BOARD OPTIONS

Pursuant to the Rules and Procedures of the State Allocation Board, "Staff is providing the following options for the Board's consideration. A positive vote by six members is required for the Board to take action that is an alternative to Staff's administrative action. Absent a positive vote by six members of the Board, Staff's administrative action will stand and the school district's appeal will be considered closed."

Board Option: Grant the District's appeal and approve the District's request for Financial Hardship status based on "other evidence" for two design funding requests. Approve the Apportionment for the new construction application (Application Number 50/71563-00-002), in the total amount of \$1,277,332, as shown on Attachment D1. Approve the Apportionment for the modernization application (Application Number 57/71563-00-001), in the total amount of \$582,741.67, as shown on Attachment D2.

If the Board grants the District's appeal for financial hardship based on other evidence for design funding only, Staff recommends the District be required to attempt to pass a local bond measure before the District could submit an appeal for Financial Hardship status for future full funding grant requests for the projects.

Dear Mr. Flanagan,

This letter is in regards to our application for Financial Hardship that you requested on October 11, 2023. We work with SchoolWorks as our consultant and in their process of filling out the application, it was determined that our bonding capacity is now over \$5,000,000. Since the capacity has reached that amount, it now disqualifies us for Modernization and New Construction unless we are able to match approximately \$1.6 million dollars.

I am requesting an appeal to this decision. While I understand that there are regulations, I also believe that small school districts like ours are going to be negatively and unfairly affected by these rules and regulations. Listed below are reasons I believe we should be able to request an appeal:

1. Our yearly budget to run our entire school district is under \$5,000,000.
2. Our Developer Fee funds will be depleted between the costs of new buildings that were just installed and new TK/K buildings that we are having built with the approval of a grant.
3. Our portable buildings are close to 30 years old and are in need of replacement. Without modernization, we do not have the funds to purchase and install new ones.
4. The school district tried to pass a Bond in 2018 and only received 37% of the vote so the measure did not pass.
5. Our district does not have much new construction so the amount of Developer Fee funds are extremely limited. There are no new housing projects expected at any future time in which I am aware.
6. The Developer Fees our district does receive are the result of a local farming business adding buildings or renovations for current homes. Again, we have almost no new construction happening within our district.
7. Our district shares Developer Fee funds with the Red Bluff High School District so we receive even less money when fees are paid.
8. The \$5,000,000 threshold is antiquated and in need of adjustment as inflation continues to increase.

To summarize, if there is no way to appeal, our school, community, and students are going to be negatively impacted for many years to come. Some of our school buildings are 90 years old and we have many repair needs that we will never be able to afford without qualifying for modernization and new construction. I welcome the opportunity to plead our case with any person or entity in person. I strongly encourage DGS and OPSC to complete a review of our situation.

I am writing this letter to support our appeal meeting for this Thursday, December 14, 2023. On November 9, 2023, our Net Total Assessed Value surpassed the \$5,000,000 bonding capacity at around \$5,088,000. The district is now responsible to match the lesser amount and that amount is \$1.6 million dollars. As a district, we do not have the funds to match so that makes us ineligible to receive state funding to modernize our school. This fact is going to negatively impact our school and community for many years to come. Here are the reasons we believe our appeal should be upheld:

1. Lassen View Union Elementary School District tried to pass a school bond in March of 2020 and were defeated. Our consultant was very confident we would win after his firm conducted a poll and as you can see, we were defeated easily (57% No). After the election, many of the agricultural business owners in the area told Board members that they would never support additional property taxes through a school bond. These business owners employ a large number of people in our area. I strongly believe our chance of passing a bond in our conservative and agricultural community is very low.

A **bond issue** was on the ballot for [Lassen View Union Elementary School District](#) voters in Tehama County, California, on March 3, 2020.^[1] It was **defeated**.

A "yes" vote supported authorizing the district to issue up to \$2.7 million in bonds at an estimated tax rate of \$0.03 per \$100 in assessed value.

A "no" vote opposed authorizing the district to issue up to \$2.7 million in bonds at an estimated tax rate of \$0.03 per \$100 in assessed value.

A [55 percent supermajority vote](#) was required for the approval of Measure F.

2. Red Bluff High School (2017) and Shasta College (2016), which are part of our same district boundaries but cover a much larger area than our school district alone, have passed school bonds and residents are already paying school bond fees for two districts.
3. Our budget for the 23/24 school year is just under \$5.1 million dollars. 81% of our funding is spent on staffing alone. We have had to increase our staffing due to the pandemic and the additional academic and emotional needs of students. I reached out to Rich DuVarney, our County Superintendent and fiscal oversight officer, for his thoughts and this was his response:


Thanks for the conversation regarding the request from OPSC to provide a \$1.6 million dollar match for your facilities project.

Even if your district was flush with cash (which it isn't) and could afford to put up a \$1.6 million dollar match, I would be strongly opposed to spending that kind of money when your total annual budget is barely over \$5 million dollars. I don't believe any small school district should even be asked for a match of that magnitude. I know the district desperately needs those facilities. I just hope OPSC can understand that this is an impossible ask.

4. Of our 365 students, 103 are from outside of the district boundaries on an interdistrict transfer. These are non-voting members of our school community if we were to attempt another school bond. We

currently have 67 students on a waiting list to attend our school but do not have the facilities to enroll them.

5. Our list of projects for modernization is long.
 - a. Antiquated fire alarm- One of the first items that would need to be updated and upgraded is our fire alarm system. The estimated amount by our Architect and Engineering firm we use (Semingson A&E) is \$322,000 to upgrade when we receive modernization funding.




- b. Our school is located directly on Highway 99. The speed limit at our entrance/exit is 55 miles per hour. We have had two car accident situations that could have been deadly where cars have come off the highway and onto our grass area. One car glanced off a pine tree and demolished our school sign. If this accident happened literally twenty-four hours later, our grass area would have been full of vehicles for Back-to-School Night. The second situation happened when a car was driving northbound and for reasons unknown, exited the highway onto the grass area, drove through our entrance/exit area and onto the other side of the grass area buffer between the highway and the school at 2:40pm (right between our two dismissal times of 2:15 and 3:00). If there was a car waiting to leave the school at the stop sign, it would have been t-boned by a car driving about 55 miles per hour.



The bark at the base of this pine tree was hit by a car that exited the highway, drove through our grass area about 100 yards, bounced off this tree and took out the sign next to it (that we have rebuilt obviously). If this accident were literally 24 hours later, the whole grass area would have been full of cars for Back to School Night.



This is the entrance/exit of our school onto Highway 99. If there were a car at the stop sign, it would have been t-boned at about 55 mph last spring by a car that lost control on the grass and skidded across this area.



A safety fence of some kind on the grass area near the highway would make it much safer.

Another concern with the highway so close is for our students who elope. We do not have safety fencing between our school and Highway 99 and students can easily get to the highway.

- c. Air Conditioning in the Gym- We have heat and a swamp cooler in our gym. Los Molinos is located in the Sacramento Valley and temperatures during the summer months can get up to 110 degrees and most of the summer months are in the high 90's and 100's. A swamp cooler is completely ineffective when it is that hot. At the beginning and end of each school year, we have to limit our Physical Education classes due to the extreme heat outside and in the gym. With the Expanded Learning Opportunity Program funding, we are also now running a program through June and half of July. This last year, we could not use the gym in the afternoon for enrichment and exercise due to the temperature inside. Air conditioning is needed for the gym. In addition, we have a venting system that interferes with basketball and volleyball games and makes a lot of unwanted noise during our Christmas Program and Middle School graduation when the tube fills with air.



d. We have 5 portable classrooms that were placed here in the 1996-97 school year which makes them about 26 years old today. The exteriors are deteriorating and we had to jack up a building recently because the boards used to elevate the building eroded. We are also having issues with critters burrowing and getting under the portables.



e. Our gutters around the entire school need replacement and upgrade.



f. Our cafeteria refrigerator and freeze are having major safety issues. When the pad was poured in the early 1990's, it was not done well. Today, the foundation is failing. Without complete replacement, the door to the freezer is unsafe and closes automatically without propping something against it. The freezer condensation also causes the door safety to stick on the inside. Plus, the flooring inside the kitchen office has deteriorated substantially and needs replacement. The inside area of the refrigerator and freezer is also small. When we receive a shipment, both are impacted. With the shortages of certain foods, we would like to order more food when it is available but cannot due to the lack of freezer storage. When we fix the foundation, we would like to build a bigger pad for larger refrigerator and freezer room.




- g. Our cafeteria-serving window is too small for our student enrollment. To be more efficient, a larger area is needed but would be a major project due to its location on a weight-bearing wall.



- h. The walkway overhang in two of our wings are being destroyed by birds. Despite numerous attempts to repair and keep the birds out, they destroy the wood and nest each year. The whole structure needs to be replaced.



- i. Restrooms- Our restrooms are in desperate need of modernization. The plumbing needs upgrading and the facilities need a major makeover. One of our bathrooms is a portable that is 26 years old. We are doing what we can to keep them functional but it is a challenge. The flooring has been cleaned and sealed but it does little good for aesthetics. I can't include the smell of the restrooms in pictures but I can guarantee that it is not pleasant.





j. Classroom windows and flooring- Our windows are single-paned throughout the school and need to be upgraded for energy efficiency. We did qualify for a grant through AB841 for HVAC and Plumbing but the funding will not be close to enough to bring them up to standard. We also have deterioration of the wood window base in some areas.



Classroom flooring- Many of our classroom floors are in need of replacement. We were able to replace our worst classroom floors with COVID-relief funds (and those funds are gone) but still have the

majority of two wings to replace (including the portables that need to be replaced). I do not want to spend money on flooring for rooms that will hopefully be replaced soon.



As you can see, there is quite a bit of need to modernize and update our school. With the assistance of SchoolWorks, Lassen View submitted new construction and modernization design funding applications in February of 2021. If the State had requested our financial hardship documents 4 months earlier we would have qualified for design funding.

As a small school district, with one school and 365 students, we do not have the capability of contributing \$1.3 million dollars for design funding let alone the matching funds for construction. No match at all would be needed if our bonding capacity were \$89,000 less than it is. We tried to pass a school bond and were unsuccessful in March of 2020 and it was not even close. Our chance of passing a school bond in the future is not very good but we will try again in 2024 if needed. The longer we wait for funding, the worse our facilities are going to get and the cost of doing projects is going to continue to increase. As superintendent of this school district, I appeal to you for our students, staff, and community. Thank you for your consideration.

AUTHORITY

Education Code (EC) Section 17075.10(b)(1)(B) states that "...the school district has made all reasonable efforts to impose all levels of local debt capacity and development fees, and that the school district is, therefore, unable to participate in the program pursuant to this chapter except as set forth in this article."

EC Section 17075.15(d) states:

Further, the regulations shall also specify a method for determining required levels of local effort to obtain matching funds. The regulations shall include consideration of at least all of the following factors:

- (1) Whether the school district has passed a bond measure within the two-year period immediately preceding the application for funding under this article, the proceeds of which are substantially available for use in the project to be funded under this chapter, but remains unable to provide the necessary matching share requirement.
- (2) Whether the principal amount of the current outstanding bonded indebtedness issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities for the school district and secured by property within the school district or by revenues of, or available to, the school district, which shall include general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos bonds, school facility improvement district bonds, certificates of participation, and other debt instruments issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities for the school district and for which owners of property within the school district or the school district are paying debt service is at least 60 percent of the school district's total bonding capacity, as determined by the board.
- (3) Whether the total bonding capacity, as defined in Section 15102 or 15106, as applicable, is five million dollars (\$5,000,000) or less, in which case, the school district shall be deemed eligible for financial hardship.
- (4) Whether the application for funding under this article is from a county superintendent of schools.
- (5) Whether the school district submits other evidence of substantial local effort acceptable to the board.
- (6) The value of any unused local general obligation debt capacity, and developer fees added to the needs analysis to reflect the district's financial hardship, available for the purposes of school facilities financing."

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.81(c) states:

(c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:

- (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital

outlay school facility purposes.

- (2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).
- (3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.
- (4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.
- (5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.81.1 states, in part, the following:

A district that meets the financial hardship criteria in Section 1859.81 is eligible for the following: [...]

(e) For new construction projects, the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed 40 percent of the new construction grant less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a), plus \$150,000 for new school projects and \$250,000 for new construction addition projects that will be pursuing high performance incentive grants as indicated on the school district governing board resolution that shall be submitted to the OPSC as part of a funding request pursuant to this Section. For modernization projects, the Board will apportion an amount not to exceed the following:

- (1) If the Approved Application is received on or before April 29, 2002, 20 percent of the modernization grant less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a).
- (2) If the Approved Application is received after April 29, 2002, 25 percent of the modernization grant less any district funds available for the project pursuant to Section 1859.81(a), plus \$250,000 for projects that will be pursuing high performance incentive grants as indicated on the school district governing board resolution that shall be submitted to the OPSC as part of a funding request pursuant to this Section.

The amount apportioned is an estimate of the funds needed for design, engineering, and other pre-construction project costs.

Qualifying districts may request a separate apportionment for the design and for site acquisition for the same new construction project. Those projects requesting an Overcrowding Relief Grant, pursuant to Section 1859.180, do not qualify for these separate apportionments.

The amount provided as a separate apportionment shall be offset from the New Construction Adjusted Grant or the Modernization Adjusted Grant amount the district would otherwise be eligible for pursuant to Sections 1859.70, 1859.71.6, 1859.77.4 and 1859.81 when the district submits Form SAB 50-04. A district seeking a separate apportionment for site acquisition or design costs shall submit Form SAB 50-04. If a new construction project received a previous design

apportionment, the district may request an additional design apportionment for that project up to the 40 percent maximum design apportionment allowed pursuant to this Section.

The Form SAB 50-04 that is subsequently submitted for the New Construction Adjusted Grant must be for at least 50 percent of the New Construction Grant the district requested as a separate design apportionment.

The Form SAB 50-04 that is subsequently submitted for the Modernization Adjusted Grant must be for at least 80 percent of the Modernization Grant the district requested as a separate design apportionment that was received on or before April 29, 2002.

The Form SAB 50-04 that is subsequently submitted for the Modernization Adjusted Grant must be for at least 60 percent of the Modernization Grant the district requested as a separate design apportionment that was received after April 29, 2002.

When the Board is accepting applications pursuant to Section 1859.95, the funding of the new construction or modernization grant may be made from funds set aside by the Board for financial hardship. The amount provided as a separate apportionment shall be adjusted at a future date to assure that hardship funding for the project does not exceed the amount the district was otherwise eligible to receive.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.90(b) states the following:

(b) With the exception of an apportionment made for a Type II Joint-Use Project, not part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, pursuant to Article 12 of these Regulations, a district must submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement, within 180 calendar days of the Apportionment of the SFP grant for the project or within 365 calendar days for Apportionments that include financial hardship assistance. If the district does not submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement within the above specified time, the entire New Construction Adjusted Grant, or Modernization Adjusted Grant or Type I or II, part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, or Joint-Use Project apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action, and the pupils housed in the project, if applicable, will be added back to the district's baseline eligibility. The district may refile a new application for the project subject to district eligibility and available State funds at the time of resubmittal.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the District's request for accelerated processing and funding of a School Facility Program (SFP) application for New Construction funding based on an alternative eligibility methodology.

DESCRIPTION

On September 8 and 9, 2020, the North Complex West Zone Fire destroyed the entirety of the District's Berry Creek Elementary School site, which contained all the facilities for the entire District. With no facilities to house its pupils, the District had to relocate its students to two neighboring districts.

On February 23, 2024, the District submitted a SFP application for New Construction funding at Berry Creek Elementary, Application Number 50/73379-00-002 and a *School District Appeal Request* (Form SAB 189) (Attachment A) for State Allocation Board (Board) approval of the following:

1. Request funding be based on the 2019/2020 enrollment year that was in effect at the time of the fire in early September 2020.
2. Request funding be based on the District's current need to house pupils displaced by the fire, rather than on the projected need to house new pupils.
3. Request approval to process and provide an expedited Apportionment for a SFP project at Berry Creek Elementary School, Application Number 50/73379-00-002, in advance of the current projects on the Workload List and the Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority (ARBBA) List.
4. Request exemption from the regulatory requirement to include any classroom(s) for which a contract was signed for the construction or acquisition of facilities in the District's gross classroom inventory.
5. Request that the design funding previously approved for the project under Application Number 51/73379-00-001 be offset from the approval of Application Number 50/73379-00-002, as the design made from the proceeds of that approval constitutes the work that will be completed in this application.

To date, the District has been authorized to receive approximately \$12.9 million in insurance proceeds to address the estimated reconstruction costs. Insurance proceeds are designed to cover costs to rebuild based on the facilities that were existing at the time of the loss. The District has indicated that this amount is not sufficient to cover the total project cost and that SFP funds are necessary to complete the rebuild of the site.

The District is requesting that the Board approve an alternative eligibility methodology for this application based on 2019/2020 enrollment and the District's lack of any facilities to house its displaced students, rather than the typical methodology used for SFP New Construction applications that is based on five or 10-year enrollment projections starting with the enrollment year when the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) began processing the application.

DESCRIPTION (cont.)

Due to the unique circumstances brought about by the North Complex West Zone Fire and the District having no other facilities to house students, Staff supports approval of the District's requests to base funding on the current need to house pupils displaced during the 2019/2020 enrollment year and for expedited processing in advance of the current projects on the workload list and ARBBA List and an Apportionment for the District's SFP New Construction project, Application Number 50/73379-00-002.

Approval of the District's request would provide \$4,134,296.80 in additional state funding to the District.

BACKGROUND

District and Project History

Berry Creek Elementary School is an elementary school serving Kindergarten through Eighth Grade. This school is in Pioneer Union Elementary School District, which is a one-school school district located in Butte County.

On August 17, 2020, a lightning storm sparked several wildfires, one of which was called the Bear Fire. On September 5, 2020, the Bear Fire merged with several other wildfires into a complex known as the North Complex Fire. On September 8 and 9, 2020, the North Complex West Zone Fire, a part of the North Complex Fire, quickly spread throughout Butte County and destroyed the town of Berry Creek, including the Berry Creek Elementary School.

Being a one-school district, the District lost all facilities and had to relocate its students in neighboring school districts. The District's students were first relocated to Oroville Unified School District for two years and then were relocated to Bangor Unified School District to better accommodate its Transitional Kindergarten and Kindergarten needs. Both of these school districts are located more than 30 minutes away from the Berry Creek area. In their appeal, the District notes that its chronic absenteeism has increased "because of parents not feeling comfortable sending their children that far to school" when there are adverse weather conditions.

On January 11, 2021, the District submitted a design funding request for a SFP application for Facility Hardship Program Replacement funding (Application Number 51/73379-00-001) to access funds needed to begin the design process to rebuild the site. At the February 24, 2021 meeting, the Board approved an immediate Apportionment for design funding, providing \$239,755.20 in state funding. After obtaining all required plan approvals, the District submitted the full-funding phase of Application Number 51/73379-00-001 on October 23, 2023. During the course of processing this application, the District opted to pause the processing of the Facility Hardship Program application and, instead, submit a SFP application for New Construction funding (Application Number 50/73379-00-002) and an accompanying appeal request for immediate processing and funding of the new application.

To date, the District has been authorized to receive approximately \$12.9 million in insurance proceeds to address the estimated reconstruction costs. Insurance proceeds are designed to cover costs to rebuild based on the facilities that were existing at the time of the loss.

BACKGROUND (cont.)

Status of the Project

The District has obtained required plan approvals from the Division of the State Architect (DSA) and the California Department of Education (CDE). The District also awarded a lease-leaseback contract broken into three portions. To date, the Board of Education has only approved the portion of the contract for site work and superstructure because the District currently lacks the funding to cover the contract portions covering construction of the classroom building and the Administration building. The District hopes to begin site work in the near future and work toward having students occupy the classroom building for the 2024/2025 school year.

The SFP New Construction application was submitted on February 23, 2024 and is on the ARBBA List. If the Board approves the District's appeal, the application would be eligible to receive \$4,134,296.80 in additional state funding.

New Construction Eligibility and Funding Overview

The process to attain state funding for a New Construction project is a two-step process consisting of an application for eligibility and an application for funding. Applications for eligibility are approved by the Board to establish that the school district has met the criteria outlined in law and regulation to receive state funding assistance for the construction of new school facilities. Once the New Construction eligibility is determined, a "baseline" is created that remains in place as the basis of all future New Construction funding applications. New Construction eligibility then determines the number of pupil grants a school district has available and can request in a New Construction funding application.

Normally, the underlying concept behind eligibility for New Construction as established in statute is that a school district must demonstrate that existing school building capacity within the district is insufficient to house the district's anticipated future enrollment, five years or 10 years from now, by using three to 18 years of historical enrollment. Per Education Code (EC) Section 17071.10, a school district's school building capacity is calculated on a one-time basis. Statute requires that a school district's New Construction eligibility be updated in order to ensure that the district still has an unmet need for additional classroom capacity. The eligibility baseline is adjusted to account for enrollment changes, addition of facilities, and a few other exceptions enumerated in SFP Regulation Section 1859.51.

Upon passage of the Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2016 (Proposition 51), the Board endeavored to ensure that new bond funds were provided only for New Construction projects with current projected unhoused pupil needs at the time the applications were processed. At the June 5, 2017 meeting, the Board took action to require districts to update New Construction eligibility for the enrollment year in which the application is processed by OPSC to demonstrate a current need for additional classrooms. At the same meeting, the Board stated that it would consider appeals relating to eligibility on a case-by-case basis.

Pursuant to statute, small school districts with a districtwide enrollment of less than 2,501 pupils do have the ability to utilize a "three-year eligibility lock" wherein the district may lock its New Construction eligibility for a three-year period after the district's eligibility was last approved by the Board. The eligibility lock gives small districts stability because many may face erratic enrollment and even small fluctuations in enrollment may dramatically impact the district's eligibility due to the low enrollment numbers.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

District Position

In its appeal request, the District states the following:

“The rebuilding project is crucial for the community’s well-being, as the school is considered a “Necessary Small School” and plays a central role in community activities. The district is navigating a lease-leaseback contract and has received approval for site work and superstructure but lacks funding for classroom construction. Given the urgency and the community’s need for a focal point, the district requests an expedited review to proceed with the rebuilding efforts.”

The full text of the District’s request is included as Attachment A.

Staff Position

The District is requesting accelerated processing and funding of the newly submitted SFP application for New Construction funding based on an alternative eligibility methodology. Staff agrees that the standard eligibility methodology does not adequately account for the unique circumstances brought about by the North Complex West Zone Fire and the District’s lack of other facilities to house students. At the time of the fire in 2019-20, the District had enrollment of 56 students attending Berry Creek Elementary. Since the fire, the District has had no facilities to house students, impacting enrollment. Currently, 30 students are enrolled in the District, all of whom are temporarily housed in a neighboring school district’s facilities. Due to these unique circumstances, the enrollment for the District cannot be accurately projected and Staff considers the District’s request to provide funding based on the need to house the student enrollment at the site at the time when the fire occurred reasonable.

EC Section 17072.35 states that “[a] grant for new construction may be used for any and all costs necessary to adequately house *new pupils* [emphasis added] in any approved project....” Due to the District’s unique circumstances in which all facilities were destroyed and no classroom space exists, the District’s projected need to house “new pupils” cannot be accurately determined and the District has a new need to house pupils that currently do not have facilities in the District to house them.

District’s Request – Alternative Eligibility Methodology

The District’s first, second, and fourth requests seek approval of an alternative eligibility methodology on which to base funding for this SFP New Construction application. These requests are as follows:

- Request funding be based on the 2019/2020 enrollment period that was in effect at the time of the North Complex West Zone Fire, rather than the enrollment period in which the application was processed (2023/2024).
- Request funding be based on the District’s current need to house pupils displaced by the fire, rather than on the projected need to house new pupils.
- Request exemption from the regulatory requirement to include any classroom(s) for which a contract was signed for the construction or acquisition of facilities in the District’s gross classroom inventory.

New Construction funding is typically based on the concept of providing housing for a school district’s projected need to house future students five or 10 years from now. A school district’s school building housing capacity is determined on a one-time basis. The projected

need is determined using three to 18 years of enrollment history beginning with the enrollment year in which OPSC processes the application. As required in statute and regulations, a district's New Construction eligibility must be adjusted to account for changes in enrollment and facilities added, and may also be adjusted for other factors such as: errors, omissions or regulatory amendment changes to SFP. Through this requirement, districts are afforded an opportunity to demonstrate continued district-wide unhoused pupil need for additional classroom capacity, and the requirement also ensures continued district compliance with the intent and spirit of the statute and supporting regulations.

However, the unique circumstance that the District finds itself in was not accounted for in this standard methodology established by the Education Code and further developed in SFP Regulations.

Firstly, the requirement that the calculation of a school district's school building capacity be completed on a one-time basis does not account for a devastating scenario in which all facilities within a school district are destroyed by a natural disaster, leaving the school district with very few options and means to house its current pupils. Adjustments to a school district's eligibility baseline to account for changes to enrollment and facility capacity are incorporated in the SFP, but an adjustment to account for significant loss of facilities due to a natural disaster does not currently exist in SFP Regulations.

Secondly, an enrollment projection does not properly account for a scenario in which the District has no facilities but has current enrollment needs. Due to declining enrollment directly impacted by the District's total loss of school facilities in the fire and the relocation of its pupils in school districts more than 30 minutes away from Berry Creek, the standard eligibility methodology based upon a five or 10-year enrollment projection would cause the District's New Construction eligibility baseline to fall into the negative and would not support any New Construction funding request. The issue of adequately housing pupils displaced due to lack of any facilities was not considered in the establishment of the standard eligibility methodology. Education Code, SFP Regulations, and prior Board actions have consistently demonstrated an intention of funding projects based on current enrollment and facility needs at the time of application processing. The District's request conforms with this intention because the District currently has unhoused pupil needs at the time of application processing due to the loss of all school facilities districtwide during the fire.

Thirdly, the requirement to update New Construction eligibility with enrollment projections based on the enrollment period in which OPSC is processing the funding application may not be the most appropriate measure of the District's facility needs and need for New Construction funding, given the unique circumstances of the District. The District argues that the enrollment at the time of the fire is the most appropriate measure of the District's facility needs. The impact of the fire on the District's enrollment has been significant given the devastation of all school facilities and nearly all homes and other structures in the Berry Creek area, as well as the challenges presented with relocation of its pupils in school districts more than 30 minutes away. Using the enrollment period active at the time of the fire may provide a more useful indicator of the District's true facility needs absent the drastic impacts of the fire. Additionally, the District's request to use enrollment from the enrollment period active at the time of the fire is consistent with the Board's past action on two appeals from Paradise Unified School District, which similarly experienced devastating destruction from wildfire.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

Lastly, the District's fourth request is for exemption from the requirements of SFP Regulation Section 1859.31(a), which requires school districts to include in their gross classroom inventory any classrooms "for which a contract was signed for the construction or acquisition of facilities or for which construction work has commenced at the time the SFP application for determination of eligibility is submitted to the OPSC." Typically, when a school district is establishing eligibility, all existing classrooms and classrooms already under construction contracts are considered part of the school district's gross classroom inventory. For purposes of this regulatory requirement, "acquisition of facilities" typically refers to the acquisition of portable and relocatable facilities, which are constructed offsite and then delivered to the school site; or modular facilities, which are largely constructed offsite and then assembled on site. In contrast, the District has purchased the facility superstructure through a California Multiple Award Schedule (CMAS) contract, which is more similar to purchasing equipment than acquiring portable, relocatable, or modular facilities. The District awarded a lease-leaseback contract with three parts, and to date, the local Board of Education has not approved the portion of the contract that includes the construction of the classroom building due to the current lack of funding. As the facility components are just sitting on the site, and approval of the construction portion of the contract has not yet occurred, Staff finds that a waiver of the requirements of Section 1859.31(a) is reasonable in the District's circumstance.

District's Request – Expedited processing and funding of an ARBBA List project

The District's third request is for the newly submitted SFP New Construction application that has been placed on the ARBBA List to be processed ahead of projects on OPSC's Workload List. Approving this request would mean funding this project ahead of other projects already submitted. This means some projects would no longer be funded within existing SFP resources. As of February 29, 2024, the ARBBA List currently has the following requests:

SFP Regulations provides the ability for only health and safety projects to be funded ahead of other projects. Although the District's project qualifies based on the type of loss for the SFP Facility Hardship program, the District has chosen to submit an application seeking SFP New Construction funding.

Staff acknowledges the devastation experienced by the town of Berry Creek and agrees that school facilities are a cornerstone of communities. Expediting the SFP New Construction application is necessary to house the current students since the District currently has no school facilities and is relying upon a neighboring district to house the students. This request is also consistent with the Board's past actions for Paradise Unified School District in January 2019 and September 2021. Given these reasons and the District's unique circumstances, Staff supports the request to accelerate processing and provide an Apportionment for the SFP New Construction application recently added to the ARBBA List in advance of the current projects on the Workload List and ARBBA List.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

District's Request – Offset Previous Design Funding

To ensure no duplicative funding is provided, the District's fifth and final request is to offset design funding previously approved for Application Number 51/73379-00-001 from the approval of this SFP New Construction application (Application Number 50/73379-00-002), as the design expenditures paid for by the proceeds of the former application constitute the work that will be completed in this SFP New Construction application. Staff supports this request and has accounted for this offset as shown in Attachment C.

Considerations and Conclusion

Staff notes that New Construction eligibility is typically not used in the manner proposed by the District. However, the District's very unique situation caused by the fire's destruction of all school facilities in the one-school district was not accounted for in the creation of the program and the methodology for the standard establishment of eligibility for New Construction projects. Staff agrees the District has a need to house pupils under unique circumstances which do not appear to have been contemplated previously.

Staff acknowledges the devastation experienced by the town of Berry Creek and the District. Staff agrees that school facilities are a cornerstone of communities and understands the unique challenge faced by the District.

BOARD OPTION

Pursuant to the Rules and Procedures of the State Allocation Board, "Staff is providing the following option for the Board's consideration. A positive vote by six members is required for the Board to take action that is an alternative to Staff's administrative action. Absent a positive vote by six members of the Board, Staff's administrative action will stand, and the school district's appeal will be considered closed."

Option: Approve the District's appeal request for the following and as reflected in Attachment C:

1. Request funding be based on the 2019/2020 enrollment year that was in effect at the time of the fire in early September 2020.
2. Request funding be based on the District's current need to house pupils displaced by the fire, rather than on the projected need to house new pupils.
3. Request approval to process and provide an expedited Apportionment for a SFP project at Berry Creek Elementary School, Application Number 50/73379-00-002, in advance of the current projects on the Workload List and ARBBA List.
4. Request exemption from the regulatory requirement to include any classroom(s) for which a contract was signed for the construction or acquisition of facilities in the District's gross classroom inventory.
5. Request that the design funding previously approved for the project under Application Number 51/73379-00-001 be offset from the approval of Application Number 50/73379-00-002, as the design made from the proceeds of that approval constitutes the work that will be completed in this application.

The Pioneer Union Elementary School District in Butte County is urgently seeking an expedited review and apportionment for New Construction funding to rebuild Berry Creek Elementary School. The school was destroyed in the North Complex West Zone Fire in 2020, and since then, students have been relocated twice, causing challenges for families and a rise in absenteeism. The district aims to construct classrooms to accommodate TK/K through 8th grade, with specialized spaces for various needs, including academic support and small group instruction. The rebuilding project is crucial for the community's well-being, as the school is considered a "Necessary Small School" and plays a central role in community activities. The district is navigating a lease-leaseback contract and has received approval for site work and superstructure but lacks funding for classroom construction. Given the urgency and the community's need for a focal point, the district requests an expedited review to proceed with the rebuilding efforts. On August 17, 2020 lightning strikes began multiple fires, one of which was named the Bear Fire. Later, on September 5, 2020 the Bear Fire merged with the Claremont Fire and became known as the North Complex Fire. The North Complex West Zone Fire, is the portion of the North Complex Fire that burned in Butte County, and destroyed the town and school of Berry Creek. Berry Creek Elementary School was relocated to Oroville (approximately 30 minutes away) after the North Complex Fire destroyed the school site. As a "one school district" we did not have alternatives to move within our district. Due to previous disasters in the county and strong relationships between superintendents, other districts made space available for us. Two years later due to TK/K requirements for more classrooms in Oroville, we needed to relocate to our current site in Bangor which was even farther than Oroville, (40 minutes away). These last four years have been extremely difficult for everyone especially after the trauma of the fire. Parents are terrified to have their children 40 minutes away from them in case of an emergency and they have experienced a massive emergency. Our "Chronic Absenteeism" has risen significantly because of parents not feeling comfortable sending their children that far to school when there are storm warnings, high winds, planned power outages etc.... In addition, Berry Creek Elementary School is considered a "Necessary Small School" and is the center of the community. We have applied for a California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP), which would expand the school to community services to our students in a very impactful way. In addition, we were recipients of a Literacy Grant which has a component of "Family Literacy". Our plan is to have ongoing access and events for our families

and students focused on Literacy Education. We cannot expect these events to happen if we are not in the community!

In rebuilding our site, we are planning on having 5 classrooms. Based on the new standards for TK and K we need one classroom that is devoted to their more active, experiential curriculum. The other classrooms will be 1-2, 3-5, and 6-8. We are the only one school district in our county that has three grades in a classroom. It is extremely difficult to teach three difficult curriculums in the same classroom at the same time. Each grade level needs their own visual supports and an area to learn their grade specific learning standards. Our teachers have done a fabulous job making this happen. We are also going to need a classroom for academic supports and small group instruction. We have a Resource Specialist, Psychologist, Counselor and Literacy Coach which need space to work with students on a daily basis. This has been our biggest issue for the last four years when we receive grants and programs, we don't have the space to implement them fully.

The North Complex Fires is referred to as the “Forgotten Fire” because it did not receive the funding or publicity of the Camp Fire. Berry Creek has a Post Office, a church, a store (which is rebuilding) and we need a school to bring the community together and have a place where they feel at home. The school will be the center of Community Meetings, Sporting Activities, Literacy Events, Parent Education Programs, Counseling Support, Celebration and Graduations. We are rebuilding the school with a vision of the future for our community.

Regarding Regulation Section 1859.31(a), the district purchased the superstructure of the building under a California Multiple Award contract, which is essentially an equipment purchase. Then, the district issued a Request for Proposals for a lease-leaseback (LLB) contract to place the building on the site. The LLB contract was broken down into 3 parts since there was not enough funding to complete the classrooms (LLB allows that type of flexibility). *The classroom construction portion of the project has not been approved by the Board of Education because of the lack of funding.* The site work and superstructure were approved so that we could continue working on the school with the goal of having students occupy the building for the 2024/25 school year starting in August, 2024. Thus, technically, a construction contract for the classrooms has not been issued.

The District is currently working with multiple agencies to rebuild their school. Due to the urgency of the District’s situation, the District is requesting an expedited review and apportionment in order to rebuild their school.

ATTACHMENT B

AUTHORITY

Education Code (EC) Section 17070.35 states:

- (a) In addition to all other powers and duties as are granted to the board by this chapter, other statutes, or the California Constitution, the board shall do all of the following:
 - (1) Adopt rules and regulations, pursuant to the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code, for the administration of this chapter. However, the board shall have no authority to set the level of the fees of any architect, structural engineer, or other design professional on any project. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted as emergency regulations, and the circumstances related to the initial adoption are hereby deemed to constitute an emergency for this purpose. The initial regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter shall be adopted by November 4, 1998. If the initial regulations are not adopted by that date, the board shall report to the Legislature by that date, explaining the reasons for the delay.
 - (2) Establish and publish any procedures and policies in connection with the administration of this chapter as it deems necessary.
 - (3) Determine the eligibility of school districts to receive apportionments under this chapter.
 - (4) Apportion funds to eligible school districts under this chapter.
- (b) The board shall review and amend its regulations as necessary to adjust its administration of this chapter to conform with the act that amended this section to add this subdivision. Regulations adopted pursuant to this subdivision shall be adopted by November 5, 2002, and shall be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the rulemaking provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code). The adoption of any emergency regulation pursuant to this subdivision filed with the Office of Administrative Law shall be deemed to be an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, or general welfare. Notwithstanding subdivision (e) of Section 11346.1 of the Government Code, any emergency regulation adopted pursuant to this section shall remain in effect for no more than 365 days unless the board has complied with Sections 11346.2 to 11348, inclusive, of the Government Code.

EC Section 17071.10 states:

- (a) The calculation determined by this article shall be made on a one-time basis, and will be used as the baseline for eligibility determinations pursuant to this chapter.
- (b) Each school district that elects to participate in the new construction program pursuant to this chapter shall submit to the board a one-time report of existing school building capacity.
- (c) Notwithstanding subdivisions (a) and (b), a school district newly formed, reorganized, or affected by reorganization, pursuant to an election that occurred on or after November 4, 1998, shall calculate or recalculate its existing school building capacity pursuant to regulations adopted by the State Allocation Board.

ATTACHMENT B

EC Section 17071.25 states:

- (a) The existing school building capacity in the applicant school district or, where appropriate, in the attendance area, at the time of initial application shall be calculated pursuant to the following formula:
 - (1) Identify by grade level all permanent teaching stations existing in the school district or, where appropriate, the attendance area. For the purposes of this section, "teaching station" means any space that was constructed or reconstructed to serve as an area in which to provide pupil instruction, but shall not include portable buildings, except as provided in Section 17071.30.
 - (2) (A) The assumed capacity of each calculated teaching station pursuant to paragraph (1) shall be 25 pupils for each teaching station used for kindergarten or for grades 1 to 6, inclusive, and 27 pupils for each teaching station used for grades 7 to 12, inclusive.
 - (B) On or after January 1, 2000, the board may adopt or amend regulations adjusting the assumed capacity set forth in this subparagraph as appropriate for each teaching station used for nonsevere or severe special day class purposes after considering the recommendations of the Legislative Analyst pursuant to Section 17072.15. These special day class capacity adjustments and any adjustment of existing school capacity related to changes in the assumed capacity of special day class teaching stations shall be approved by the Director of Finance prior to implementation.
 - (C) On or after January 1, 2001, the board may adopt regulations establishing assumed capacity standards after consideration of the recommendations developed by the Director of General Services for continuation high school, community day school, county community school, and county community day school, teaching stations pursuant to Section 17072.17. Teaching station assumed capacity adjustments pursuant to these regulations and any other adjustments of existing school capacity related to changes in the assumed capacity of continuation high school, community day school, county community school, and county community day school, teaching stations shall be approved by the Director of Finance prior to implementation.
 - (3) Multiply the assumed capacity of each teaching station as specified in paragraph (2) by the number of teaching stations calculated under paragraph (1).
 - (4) The result of this computation shall be the number of pupils housed by grade level in the existing school building capacity of the applicant school district.
- (b) The existing school building capacity of the applicant school district calculated under this section shall not include, in any school operated on a year-round schedule, any teaching station that has been in continuous use during the preceding five-year period primarily for the operation of a preschool program or programs.

EC Section 17071.75 states:

After a one-time initial report of existing school building capacity has been completed, the ongoing eligibility of a school district for new construction funding shall be determined by making all of the following calculations:

- (a) A school district that applies to receive funding for new construction shall use the following methods to determine projected enrollment:
 - (1) A school district that has two or more schoolsites each with a pupil population density that is greater than 115 pupils per acre in kindergarten and grades 1 to 6,

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inclusive, or a schoolsite pupil population density that is greater than 90 pupils per acre in grades 7 to 12, inclusive, as determined by the Superintendent using enrollment data from the California Basic Educational Data System for the 2004–05 school year, may submit an application for funding for projects that will relieve overcrowded conditions. That school district may also submit an alternative enrollment projection for the fifth year beyond the fiscal year in which the application is made using a methodology other than the cohort survival enrollment projection method as defined by the board pursuant to paragraph (2), to be reviewed by the Demographic Research Unit of the Department of Finance, in consultation with the department and the Office of Public School Construction. If the Office of Public School Construction and the Demographic Research Unit of the Department of Finance jointly determine that the alternative enrollment projection provides a reasonable estimate of expected enrollment demand, a recommendation shall be forwarded to the board to approve or disapprove the application, in accordance with all of the following:

- (A) Total funding for new construction projects using this method shall be limited to five hundred million dollars (\$500,000,000), from the Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2004.
- (B) The eligibility amount for proposed projects that relieve overcrowding is the difference between the alternative enrollment projection method for the year the application is submitted and the cohort survival enrollment projection method, as defined by paragraph (2), for the same year, adjusted by the existing pupil capacity in excess of the projected enrollment according to the cohort survival enrollment projection method.
- (C) The Office of Public School Construction shall determine whether each proposed project will relieve overcrowding, including, but not limited to, the elimination of the use of Concept 6 calendars, four track year-round calendars, or busing in excess of 40 minutes, and recommend approval to the board. The number of unhoused pupil grants requested in the application for funding from the eligibility determined pursuant to this paragraph shall be limited to the number of seats necessary to relieve overcrowding, including, but not limited to, the elimination of the use of Concept 6 calendars, four track year-round calendars, or busing in excess of 40 minutes, less the number of unhoused pupil grants attributed to that school as a source school in an approved application pursuant to Section 17078.24.
- (D) A school district shall use the same alternative enrollment projection methodology for all applications submitted pursuant to this paragraph and shall calculate those projections in accordance with the same districtwide or high school attendance area used for the enrollment projection made pursuant to paragraph (2).

(2) A school district shall calculate enrollment projections for the fifth year beyond the fiscal year in which the application is made. Projected enrollment shall be determined by utilizing the cohort survival enrollment projection system, as defined and approved by the board. The board may supplement the cohort survival enrollment projection with any of the following:

- (A) The number of unhoused pupils that are anticipated as a result of dwelling units proposed pursuant to approved and valid tentative subdivision maps.
- (B) Modified weighting mechanisms, if the board determines that they best represent the enrollment trends of the district. Mechanisms pursuant to this subparagraph shall be developed and applied in consultation with the

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Demographic Research Unit of the Department of Finance.

(C) An adjustment to reflect the effects on kindergarten and first grade enrollment of changes in birth rates within the school district or high school attendance area boundaries.

(3) (A) A school district may submit an enrollment projection for either a 5th year or a 10th year beyond the fiscal year in which the application is made. A school district that bases its enrollment projection calculation on a high school attendance area may use pupil residence in that attendance area to calculate enrollment. A school district that utilizes pupil residence shall do so for all high school attendance areas within the district. A pupil shall not be included in a high school attendance area enrollment projection based on pupil residence unless that pupil was included in the California Basic Educational Data System (CBEDS) report of the district for the same enrollment year. The board may require a district to provide a reconciliation of the districtwide CBEDS and residency data. The board also may adopt regulations to specify the format and certification requirements for a school district that submits residency data.

(b) (1) Add the number of pupils that may be adequately housed in the existing school building capacity of the applicant school district as determined pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 17071.10) to the number of pupils for whom facilities were provided from any state or local funding source after the existing school building capacity was determined pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 17071.10). For this purpose, the total number of pupils for whom facilities were provided shall be determined using the pupil loading formula set forth in Section 17071.25.

(2) Subtract from the number of pupils calculated in paragraph (1) the number of pupils that were housed in facilities to which the school district or county office of education relinquished title as the result of a transfer of a special education program between a school district and a county office of education or special education local plan area, if applicable. For this purpose, the total number of pupils that were housed in the facilities to which title was relinquished shall be determined using the pupil loading formula adopted by the board pursuant to subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 17071.25. For purposes of this paragraph, title also includes any lease interest with a duration of greater than five years.

(c) Subtract the number of pupils pursuant to subdivision (b) from the number of pupils determined pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (a).

(d) The calculations required to establish eligibility under this article shall result in a distinction between the number of existing unhoused pupils and the number of projected unhoused pupils.

(e) Apply the increase or decrease resulting from the difference between the most recent report made pursuant to Section 42268, and the report used in determining the baseline capacity of the school district pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 17071.25.

(f) For purposes of calculating projected enrollment pursuant to subdivision (a), the board may adopt regulations to ensure that the enrollment calculation of individuals with exceptional needs receiving special education services is adjusted in the enrollment reporting period in which the transfer occurs and three previous school years as a result of a transfer of a special education program between a school district and a county office of education or a special education local plan area. However, the projected enrollment calculation of a county office

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of education shall only be adjusted if a transfer of title for the special education program facilities has occurred. The regulations, if adopted, shall ensure that if a transfer of title to special education program facilities constructed with state funds occurs within 10 years after initial occupancy of the facility, the receiving school district or school districts shall remit to the state a proportionate share of any financial hardship assistance provided for the project pursuant to Section 17075.10, if applicable.

(g) For a school district with an enrollment of 2,500 or less, an adjustment in enrollment projections shall not result in a loss of ongoing eligibility to that school district for a period of three years from the date of the approval of eligibility by the board.

EC Section 17072.10 states:

(a) The board shall determine the maximum total new construction grant eligibility of an applicant by multiplying the number of unhoused pupils calculated pursuant to Article 3 (commencing with Section 17071.75) in each school district with an approved application for new construction, by the per-unhoused-pupil grant as follows:

- (1) Five thousand two hundred dollars (\$5,200) for elementary school pupils.
- (2) Five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) for middle school pupils.
- (3) Seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$7,200) for high school pupils.

(b) The board annually shall adjust the per-unhoused-pupil apportionment to reflect construction cost changes, as set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction as determined by the board.

(c) Regulations adopted by the board prior to July 1, 2000, that adjust the amounts identified in this section for qualifying individuals with exceptional needs, as defined in Section 56026, as amended after July 1, 2000, in consideration of the recommendations provided pursuant to Section 17072.15, shall continue in effect. An increase made to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts set forth in subdivision (a), on or after January 1, 2010, including, but not limited to, those made pursuant to Section 17072.11 on or after January 1, 2010, also shall be made to the per-unhoused-pupil who is a qualifying individual with exceptional needs grant amounts established pursuant to this subdivision. If an increase to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts differentiates among the pupil groups based on whether the pupils are elementary, middle, or high school pupils, the Office of Public School Construction shall recommend to the board, within 60 days of that increase, a methodology to adjust the per-unhoused-pupil grant amount for pupils who are qualifying individuals with exceptional needs so that those adjustments appropriately reflect the increases.

(d) The board may establish a single supplemental per-unhoused-pupil grant in addition to the amounts specified in subdivision (a) based on the statewide average marginal difference in costs in instances where a project requires multilevel school facilities due to limited acreage. The application of a school district shall demonstrate that a practical alternative site is not available.

(e) For a school district having an enrollment of 2,500 or less for the prior fiscal year, the board may approve a supplemental apportionment of up to seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) for any new construction project assistance. The amount of the supplemental apportionment authorized pursuant to this subdivision shall be adjusted in 2008 and every year thereafter by an amount equal to the percentage adjustment for class B construction.

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EC Section 17072.20 states:

- (a) An applicant school district that has been determined by the board to meet the eligibility requirements for new construction funding set forth in Article 2 (commencing with Section 17071.10) or Article 3 (commencing with Section 17071.75) may submit at any time a request to the board for a project apportionment for all or a portion of the funding for which the school district is eligible.
- (b) The application shall include, but shall not be limited to, the school district's determination of the amount of state funding that the district is otherwise eligible for relating to site acquisition, site development, new construction, and hardship funding provided pursuant to Article 8 (commencing with Section 17075.10), if any. The amount shall be reduced by the amount of the alternative fee collected pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 65995.7 of the Government Code if a reimbursement election or agreement pursuant to Section 65995.7 of the Government Code is not in effect.
- (c) The board shall verify and adjust, as necessary, and approve the district's application.

EC Section 17072.30(a) states:

- (a) Subject to the availability of funds, and to the determination of priority pursuant to Section 17072.25, if applicable, the board shall apportion funds to an eligible school district only upon the approval of the project by the Department of General Services pursuant to the Field Act, as defined in Section 17281, and certification by the school district that the required 50 percent matching funds from local sources have been expended by the district for the project, or have been deposited in the county fund, or will be expended by the district by the time the project is completed, in an amount at least equal to the proposed apportionment pursuant to this chapter, prior to release of the state funds.

EC Section 17072.32(a) states:

- (a) For any project that has received an apportionment pursuant to Section 17072.30, funding shall be released in amounts equal to the amount of the local match upon certification by the school district that the school district has entered into a binding contract for completion of the approved project.

EC Section 17072.35 states:

A grant for new construction may be used for any and all costs necessary to adequately house new pupils in any approved project, and those costs may only include the cost of design, engineering, testing, inspection, plan checking, construction management, site acquisition and development, evaluation and response action costs relating to hazardous substances at a new or existing schoolsite, demolition, construction, acquisition and installation of portable classrooms, landscaping, necessary utility costs, utility connections and other fees, equipment including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, furnishings, and the upgrading of electrical systems or the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology. A grant for new construction may also be used to acquire an existing government or privately owned building, or a privately financed school building, and for the necessary costs of converting the government or privately owned building for

public school use. A grant for new construction may also be used for the costs of designs and materials that promote the efficient use of energy and water, the maximum use of natural lighting and indoor air quality, the use of recycled materials and materials that emit a minimum of toxic substances, the use of acoustics conducive to teaching and learning, and other characteristics of high performance schools.

School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1895.2 defines the following:

“Application” means a request pursuant to the Act to receive an eligibility determination and/or funding for a school project.

“Existing School Building Capacity” means the district’s total capacity to house pupils as calculated pursuant to Sections 1859.30 through 1859.33.

“Form SAB 50-01” means the Enrollment Certification/Projection, Form SAB 50-01 (Revised 05/09), and, when utilizing HSAA residency reporting, the High School Attendance Area Residency Reporting Worksheet (New 06/08), which are incorporated by reference.

“Form SAB 50-02” means the Existing School Building Capacity, Form SAB 50-02 (Revised 05/09), which is incorporated by reference.

“Form SAB 50-03” means the Eligibility Determination, Form SAB 50-03 (Revised 03/09), which is incorporated by reference.

“New Construction Adjusted Grant” means the New Construction Grant, plus any other funding provided by these Regulations. “New Construction Eligibility” means the result of the calculation determined in Education Code Section 17071.75.

“New Construction Grant” means the funding provided pursuant to Education Code Section 17072.10(a) and Sections 1859.71 and 1859.71.1.

“Pupil” means a student enrolled in any grade Kindergarten through grade twelve.

“School Building Capacity” shall have the meaning set forth in Education Code Section 17070.15(l).

SFP Regulation Section 1589.20

A School District seeking a determination of eligibility for a SFP project shall complete and file the following documents with the OPSC:

(a) For new construction, either districtwide, HSAA, or Super HSAA, or for modernization projects, the Form SAB 50-03.

(b) For new construction projects, either districtwide, HSAA or Super HSAA, the Form SAB 50-01.

(c) For new construction projects, the Form SAB 50-02.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.21

A School District seeking funding for a modernization or new construction project shall complete and file with the OPSC, the Form SAB 50-04.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.30

For new construction projects the district shall complete, on a one-time basis, the classroom inventory pursuant to Sections 1859.31 and 1859.32 and report that inventory on the Form SAB 50-02. Completion of the calculations made on this Form shall represent the district’s new construction Existing School Building Capacity.

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SFP Regulation Section 1859.31

The district shall prepare a gross inventory consisting of all classrooms owned or leased in the district, the HSAA or Super HSAA as appropriate. For the purpose of this gross classroom inventory, the following shall be considered a classroom. Any classroom:

- (a) for which a contract was signed for the construction or acquisition of facilities or for which construction work has commenced at the time the SFP application for determination of eligibility is submitted to the OPSC;
- (b) constructed with funds from the LPP;
- (c) used for Special Day Class or Resource Specialist Programs;
- (d) that are standard classrooms, shops, science laboratories, computer laboratories, or computer classrooms;
- (e) acquired or created for Class Size Reduction purposes;
- (f) used for preschool programs;
- (g) converted to any non-classroom purpose including use by others;
- (h) with Housing and Community Development or Department of Housing insignia;
- (i) acquired for interim housing for a modernization project;
- (j) leased or purchased under the State Relocatable Program pursuant to Chapter 14 of Part 10 of the Education Code;
- (k) that have a waiver for continued use by the Board for Field Act exemptions;
- (l) used for Community School purposes;
- (m) included in a closed school.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.32

After the gross classroom inventory has been prepared pursuant to Section 1859.31, it will be reduced by the following. Any classrooms:

- (a) abandoned and approved for replacement as a hardship under the provisions of the LPP;
- (b) at a school operated on a year-round schedule that has been used continuously for at least 50 percent of the time for preschool programs in the five years preceding the receipt of the application for determination of eligibility;
- (c) included in any new construction LPP project that has not received a Phase C apportionment;
- (d) that is portable and owned or leased by the district for 20 years or more that was approved for abandonment in a LPP project and the plans for the project had DSA approval prior to November 4, 1998;
- (e) that is a trailer and is transported/towed on its own wheels and axles;
- (f) used exclusively for regional occupational centers, regional occupational programs, child care, preschool and/or Adult Education Programs, and was built or acquired with funds specifically available for those purposes;
- (g) of less than 700 interior square feet;
- (h) originally built for instructional use, but converted to one of the following:
 - (1) used continuously for school administration for at least five years prior to the submittal of the application to the OPSC for determination of eligibility.
 - (2) used continuously for central or main district administration for at least five years prior to the submittal of the application to the OPSC for determination of eligibility.
 - (3) used for school library purposes during the previous school year.
- (i) owned but leased to another district.

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- (j) any portable classroom excluded by Education Code Section 17071.30.
- (k) that is permanent space and leased for less than five years.
- (l) any permanent classroom contained in a project for which the construction contract was signed between August 27, 1998 and November 18, 1998 and for which the district did not have full project eligibility under the LPP.
- (m) that was acquired with joint-use funds specifically available for that purpose.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.33

The district shall identify by grade level, based on its most typical use for grades K-6, 7-8 or 9-12, or non-severe or severe Special Day Class education, each classroom included in the classroom inventory determined pursuant to Section 1859.31 and not excluded pursuant to Section 1859.32. These classrooms shall be reported on the Form SAB 50-02.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.35

The district's existing school building capacity shall be determined by totaling the amount calculated in (a) and (b).

(a) With the exception of classrooms for Special Day Class pupils for which the multiplier is indicated on the Form SAB 50-02, multiply the number of available classrooms in the district, the HSAA or the Super HSAA by the following: 25 for each K-6 classroom and 27 for each 7-12 classroom. Available classrooms shall be determined by the reduction of classrooms identified in Section 1859.32 from the gross classroom inventory prepared pursuant to Section 1859.31 and the inclusion of portable classrooms as provided pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.30 (a) or (b).

(b) Multiply the K-6 pupil capacity of the elementary district, the unified district, the HSAA or the Super HSAA in a unified district as determined by the results of the calculations in (a) at the time of the initial determination of eligibility by six percent. When the elementary or unified district meets the Substantial Enrollment Requirement (SER) or qualifies for a waiver of the SER authorized by Education Code Sections 17017.6 and 17017.7(c), the amount reported in (b) shall be zero. For High School Districts, the amount reported in (b) shall be zero.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.40

The district shall provide an enrollment Certification and report enrollment data, on the Form SAB 50-01. The information provided on this Form shall serve as the basis for determining a district's eligibility for New Construction funding. The enrollment projections generated by completing the Form SAB 50-01 shall be known as Cohort Projections for purposes of this section.

(a) In addition, a School District that meets the eligibility criteria as specified in Education Code Section 17071.75(a)(1) and has applied for determination of eligibility pursuant to Section 1859.20, may submit a request for review of an Alternative Enrollment Projection to the OPSC and the DRU.

(b) The request must contain all of the following to substantiate the Alternative Enrollment Projection methodology:

- (1) provide a description to the OPSC on how the district cannot adequately meet its housing needs at the impacted school sites, after considering all existing eligibility mechanisms available from the Cohort Projections;
- (2) a written explanation of the methodology for calculating the enrollment projections;

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- (3) an electronic copy of the calculations used in determining the enrollment projections;
- (4) a disclosure of any assumptions that support the calculations of enrollment projections;
- (5) a minimum of three years or more, as determined necessary by the DRU, of historical data used in calculating the enrollment projections. The data must be verifiable, annually based, and geographically organized if the school district's boundaries have changed since the 2000 Census conducted by the United States Census Bureau.
- (6) a list of source(s) used to collect all applicable data with contact information for each data source;
- (7) a separate enrollment projection for each grade level;
- (8) a district-wide enrollment projection for any district that reports district-wide enrollment on the Form SAB 50-01; or HSAA enrollment projection(s) for any district that reports enrollment for one or more HSAA(s) on the Form SAB 50-01; or Super HSAA enrollment projection(s) for any district that reports enrollment for one or more Super HSAA(s) on the Form SAB 50-01.

The eligibility generated by an Alternative Enrollment Projection shall be made available to eligible school districts pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75(a)(1), that received the OPSC's and the DRU's approval of the Alternative Enrollment Projection, until the combined Apportionments for all funding requests utilizing eligibility available from the Alternative Enrollment Projection reaches \$500 million or the Board has no funds to apportion from the Kindergarten-University Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2004.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.42

- (a) Fifth-year projected enrollment with the exception of Special Day Class enrollment shall be calculated pursuant to the cohort survival enrollment projection system which is described as follows:
 - (1) For all grades, using the current and three previous years of enrollment, determine the numerical change in enrollment between the current grade and the next lower grade in the previous year; determine the numerical change in enrollment between the previous year grade and the next lower grade in the second previous year; determine the numerical change in enrollment between the second previous year grade and the next lower grade in the third previous year. Determine the numerical change of kindergarten enrollment on the second previous and third previous year respectively. A district utilizing a fifth-year enrollment projection may calculate the kindergarten enrollment projection in accordance with Section 1859.42.1(b).
 - (2) Compute the annual change in enrollment as explained in (1) for each grade. The annual change shall then be weighted by multiplying the most recent annual change in enrollment by three, the next most recent annual change by two, and the earliest annual change by one, and dividing the sum of the annual weighted changes for each grade by six. The result shall be the average annual change.
 - (3) Calculate enrollment for each projection year by advancing the enrollment in each grade level through the five-year projection period, modifying the grade progression each year by the average annual change for each grade as computed in (2).

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(b) Tenth-year projected enrollment with the exception of Special Day Class enrollment shall be calculated pursuant to the cohort survival enrollment projection system which is described as follows:

(1) For all grades, using the current and seven previous years of enrollment, determine the numerical change in enrollment between:

(A) The current grade and the next lower grade in the first previous year;

(B) The first previous year grade and the next lower grade in the second previous year;

(C) The second previous year grade and the next lower grade in the third previous year;

(D) The third previous year grade and the next lower grade in the fourth previous year;

(E) The fourth previous year grade and the next lower grade in the fifth previous year;

(F) The fifth previous year grade and the next lower grade in the sixth previous year;

(G) The sixth previous year grade and the next lower grade in the seventh previous year;

(H) Determine the numerical change of kindergarten enrollment using the previous year's kindergarten enrollment in place of the next lower grade in the previous year for each step in (A) through (G), respectively.

(2) Compute the annual change in enrollment as explained in (1) for each grade. The annual change shall then be weighted by multiplying the most recent annual change in enrollment by seven, the next most recent annual change by six, the next most recent annual change by five, the next most recent annual change by four, the next most recent annual change by three, the next most recent annual change by two, and the earliest annual change by one, and dividing the sum of the annual weighted changes for each grade by 28. The result shall be the average annual change.

(3) Calculate enrollment for each projection year by advancing the latest enrollment in each grade through the ten-year projection period, modifying the grade progression each year by the average annual change for each grade as computed in (2).

(c) The projected enrollment of a HSAA or Super HSAA shall be computed in the same manner as that set forth in this section, except that the enrollment used in such computation shall be that of the HSAA or Super HSAA rather than the entire district.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.42.1

A district utilizing a fifth-year enrollment projection pursuant to Section 1859.42(a), except when reporting on a HSAA or Super HSAA basis pursuant to Section 1859.41.1(b), may supplement the enrollment projection with any of the following:

(a) The number of pupils as reported by the district on Form SAB 50-01, that will reside in dwelling units included in an approved and valid tentative or final subdivision map that exceed the number of pupils projected as a result of the cohort survival method for that tentative or final subdivision map. The augmentation shall be calculated as follows:

(1) Calculate a first year projection by advancing the current enrollment as reported on Form SAB 50-01 by one year for each grade level without applying

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the average annual change. For kindergarten, the first year projection shall be the same as the reported current enrollment.

(2) Subtract the current enrollment progressed one year for each grade level as determined in (1) from the one-year projection of enrollment for each grade level as determined in Section 1859.42(a). If the computation results in a negative number, the number shall be zero.

(3) Divide the current enrollment progressed one year for each grade level by the sum of the current enrollment progressed one year in all grade levels.

(4) Multiply the number of housing units in the approved and valid tentative or final subdivision maps by the pupil yield factor provided on the Form SAB 50-01.

(5) Multiply the number of pupils determined in (4) by the percentages determined in (3) for each grade.

(6) Subtract five times the value determined in (2) from the value determined in (5). If the computation results in a negative number, the number shall be zero.

(7) Add the value in (6) to the fifth year of projected enrollment as computed in Section 1859.42(a) to establish the augmented projection of enrollment.

(8) For districts with HSAA reporting, the augmentation as provided in this section may include only dwelling units located in the HSAA or Super HSAA.

(b) The number of children born as reported on the Form SAB 50-01 that will attend kindergarten within the district or HSAA in the enrollment year that begins during the fifth calendar year following the year in which the children were born, as determined through the birth-attendance rate. For the purposes of this section, children born in a given calendar year will be considered to all begin school in the same enrollment year. For the purposes of this section, the number of children born shall be referred to as births. The augmentation shall be calculated as follows:

(1) For current and each of the three previous years of enrollment reported on the Form SAB 50-01, determine the yearly birth-attendance rate by dividing the kindergarten enrollment by the number of births from the fifth preceding calendar year. Add the four yearly birth-attendance rates together and divide by four. The result will be the average birth-attendance rate.

(2) The number of births must be as reported by the Department of Health Services by place of residence. A district may utilize one of the following:

(A) Births as reported by County.

(B) Births as reported by Zip Code. The district must report the ZIP Codes the district or HSAA will serve for the current year and three previous years. If a district serves only a portion of a ZIP Code, and if less than 10 percent of the population of that ZIP Code resides within the portion served by the district, the district must report that ZIP Code, but may choose not to count the births within that ZIP Code for the purposes of this section.

(3) Calculate the kindergarten enrollment projection by multiplying the average birth-attendance rate by the number of births five years prior to the applicable projected enrollment year.

(4) For years in which the Department of Health Services has not yet reported the number of births, the number of births shall be determined by:

(A) Adding the three previous years' number of births and dividing by three.

(B) For years in which more than one year of births has not yet been reported, the first birth number shall be calculated per (A), and subsequent years shall be calculated using (A), with the previous averaged births acting as the previous year births.

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(c) Modified weighting that best represents the enrollment trends of the district to supplant the weighting method used to calculate the average annual change in Section 1859.42(a)(2). The modified weighting shall be calculated as follows:

(1) A district choosing to utilize a modified weighting method must submit enrollment data from 14 years immediately prior to those included on the Form SAB 50-01. In total, 18 consecutive years of enrollment must be submitted. Any enrollment information submitted in addition to the Form SAB 50-01 must meet all the requirements as provided for Parts A and C on the Form SAB 50-01.

(2) Utilizing the 18 years of enrollment data, calculate three sets of ten historical enrollment projections. These projections cannot be supplemented with (a) and (b) above and are made as follows:

(A) For each of the ten enrollment projections determine the numerical change in enrollment utilizing the calculations in Section 1859.42(a)(1), starting with the 14th previous year as the current year, progressing one year for each of the projections with the tenth projection being made with the fifth previous year as the current year. When calculating the ten enrollment projections, the five most recent enrollment years shall not be used.

(B) Compute the average annual change for each of the ten projections utilizing the calculations per Section 1859.42(a)(2). Calculate enrollment for each projection year by advancing the enrollment in each grade level through the five-year projection period, modifying the grade progression each year by the average annual change for each grade as computed in this paragraph. This set of ten projections shall be the “1-2-3” projections.

(C) Repeat (A) above, but calculate the average annual change by multiplying the most recent annual change in the enrollment by one, the next most recent annual change by two, and the earliest annual change by three, and dividing the sum of the annual weight changes for each grade by six. Calculate enrollment for each projection year by advancing the enrollment in each grade level through the five-year projection period, modifying the grade progression each year by the average annual change for each grade as computed in this paragraph. This set of ten projections shall be the “3-2-1” projections.

(D) Repeat (A) above, but calculate the average annual change by dividing the sum of the annual changes for each grade by three. Calculate enrollment for each projection year by advancing the enrollment in each grade level through the five-year projection period, modifying the grade progression each year by the average annual change for each grade as computed in this paragraph. This set of ten projections shall be the “1-1-1” projections.

(3) For the ninth previous year through the current year as reported on the Form SAB 50-01 determine the actual enrollment for that year per grade category. For the purposes of this section, grade category shall mean kindergarten through sixth grade, seventh grade through eighth grade, and ninth grade through twelfth grade. Determine the actual enrollment for each grade category by totaling the enrollment from the grades within that grade category.

(4) For each of the ten enrollment projections within each of the three projection types, “1-2-3”, “3-2-1” and “1-1-1”, determine the percentage of accuracy. The percentage of accuracy shall be the projected total enrollment for a grade category minus the actual total enrollment for that grade category five years after divided by the actual grade category total five years later and multiplied by 100, rounded to two significant figures.

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(5) Calculate the absolute value of the percentage of accuracy as determined in (4) above.

(6) Determine the (x,y) coordinate for each percentage of accuracy as determined in (5), with x being the distance from the y-axis and representing time, and y being the distance from the x-axis and representing the percentage of accuracy, as follows:

(A) The x coordinate shall be assigned based on 30 enrollment projections made in (2). Projections made with the fourteenth previous year as the current year shall have an x value of one, progressing one year for each of the projections with tenth projection being made with the fifth previous year as the current year and having an x value of ten.

(B) The y coordinate shall be the distance from zero as calculated in (5), above.

(7) Using Microsoft Office Excel 2003 or a similar tool, plot each point from (6) onto graphs. Districts must only generate graphs for the grade categories that are reported on the Form SAB 50-01. The points shall be graphed as follows:

(A) Graph one shall be all kindergarten through sixth grade comparisons for "1-2-3" projections.

(B) Graph two shall be all seventh grade through eighth grade comparisons for "1-2-3" projections.

(C) Graph three shall be all ninth grade through twelfth grade comparisons for "1-2-3" projections.

(D) Graph four shall be all kindergarten through sixth grade comparisons for "3-2-1" projections.

(E) Graph five shall be all seventh grade through eighth grade comparisons for "3-2-1" projections.

(F) Graph six shall be all ninth grade through twelfth grade comparisons for "3-2-1" projections.

(G) Graph seven shall be all kindergarten through sixth grade comparisons for "1-1-1" projections.

(H) Graph eight shall be all seventh grade through eighth grade comparisons for "1-1-1" projections.

(I) Graph nine shall be all ninth grade through twelfth grade comparisons for "1-1-1" projections.

(8) For each of the graphs in (7), using Microsoft Office Excel 2003 or a similar tool, determine the Linear Regression equation.

(9) For each projection type, "1-2-3", "3-2-1" and "1-1-1", determine the average Linear Regression equation:

(A) Each equation shall be in the format $y = (m * x) + b$, where m is the slope and b is the y-axis intercept.

(B) Determine the average m for each projection type by adding the m's together and dividing by the number of m's. The number should be one to three and equal to the number of grade categories a district reports on the Form SAB 50-01.

(C) Determine the average b for each projection type by adding the b's together and dividing by the number of b's. The number should be one to three and equal to the number of grade categories a district reports on the Form SAB 50-01.

(D) Generate the average Linear Regression equation as show in (A) above, for each projection type by creating three new equations using the average m and b from (B) and (C) above.

(10) Determine the modified weighting that best represents the trends of the district by:

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- (A) Calculate the three average Linear Regression equations by replacing the x variable with 15.
- (B) Determine the absolute value of y for the three results
- (C) The projection type with the result closest to zero, or the smallest number, shall be the modified weighting method that best represents the trends of the district. For the purposes of (c), this shall be the weighting method used when determining the district's projection in Section 1859.42(a)(2).
- (11) Additionally, a district may propose a fourth weighting method for consideration. The alternative weights shall be only positive whole numbers. The district must follow steps (2) through (10) in this Section using the proposed additional alternative weighting method and determine that the result of (10) is closer to zero than any of the three projection types, "1-2-3", "3-2-1" and "1-1-1".

SFP Regulation Section 1859.43

The district enrollment, as reported on the Form SAB 50-01, shall be used to calculate the district's projected Special Day Class enrollment. The OPSC shall use the following methodology to determine the district's projected enrollment:

- (a) For the purposes of this section the final year shall refer to the fifth or tenth-year as determined in projection method used for projecting non-Special Day Class enrollment in Section 1859.42. The projected enrollment of Special Day Class students served by a school district shall be computed by multiplying the total reported enrollment of Special Day Class students by the final-year projection of the same grade level of students as determined by Section 1859.42. The resulting value shall be divided by the current enrollment of the same students as provided on Form SAB 50-01.

- (b) The projected enrollment of Special Day Class students served by a county office of education shall be computed using either (1) or (2). A county office of education that utilized a fifth-year projection when projecting non-Special Day Class enrollment per Section 1859.42 must utilize a fifth-year projection for projecting its Special Day Class enrollment. A county office of education that utilized a tenth-year projection when projecting its non-Special Day Class enrollment per Section 1859.42 must utilize a tenth-year projection for its Special Day Class enrollment.

- (1) Fifth-year projection enrollment shall be calculated as follows:

- (A) Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment from the previous year to the current year; determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the second previous year to the previous year; determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the third previous year to the second previous year. To determine the average annual change, add the three percentage changes and divide by three.

- (B) The current Special Day Class enrollment provided by the county office of education as reported on Form SAB 50-01, shall be adjusted by the average annual percentage change in (A) for each year until the five-year projected enrollment has been determined.

- (2) Tenth-year enrollment projection shall be calculated as follows:

- (A) Calculate the average annual change as follows:

1. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment from the previous year to the current year;
2. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the second previous year to the previous year;

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3. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the third previous year to the second previous year;
4. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the fourth previous year to the third previous year;
5. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the fifth previous year to the fourth previous year;
6. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the sixth previous year to the fifth previous year;
7. Determine the percentage change in total Special Day Class enrollment in the seventh previous year to the sixth previous year.
8. To determine the average annual change, add the seven percentage changes and divide by seven.

(B) The current Special Day Class enrollment provided by the county office of education as reported on Form SAB 50-01, shall be adjusted by the average annual percentage change in 8. above, for each year until the tenth-year projected enrollment has been determined.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.50

The district shall calculate its eligibility determination by completion of the Form SAB 50-03. Eligibility determination for New Construction Grant(s) may be requested on either a district-wide basis, a HSAA or Super HSAA basis.

If a district requests to have its eligibility determination made on a district-wide basis, eligibility for future grants in the district must be filed on the same basis for a period of five years from the date the district received an apportionment that was justified by eligibility determined on a district-wide basis.

If a district requests to re-file its eligibility determination from district-wide to HSAA or Super HSAA after the five year time period has elapsed, the existing school building capacity in the HSAA or Super HSAA will be determined based on the classrooms available in the HSAA or Super HSAA at the time of the initial district-wide request for eligibility determination. Once the baseline eligibility has been determined for the HSAA or Super HSAA, it will be adjusted for classrooms constructed, funded or acquired in that HSAA or Super HSAA as provided by Section 1859.51.

If the district requests to have its eligibility determination made on a HSAA or Super HSAA, it must meet the criteria of Section 1859.41.

The calculated eligibility on the Form SAB 50-03, is the initial eligibility of the district, the HSAA or Super HSAA and shall be referenced as the baseline eligibility for future SFP funding. The baseline eligibility is the basis for filing Form SAB 50-04, for a new construction SFP grant.

If a special education program and the title to the related facilities is transferred between a school district and county office of education after the baseline eligibility was established by the Board, the following shall be required if the title transfer took place after January 1, 2007, or if requested by the school district and county office of education due to a title transfer that took place prior to January 1, 2007:

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- (a) The sending School District's existing school building capacity shall be adjusted pursuant to Section 1859.51(r).
- (b) The receiving School District's existing school building capacity shall be adjusted pursuant to Section 1859.51(i).
- (c) The sending School District's enrollment projection shall be adjusted pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75(f).
- (d) The receiving School District shall remit to the State a proportionate share of any financial hardship assistance provided for the project as described in Section 1859.106.

For purposes of this paragraph, the transfer of title to facilities shall also include:

- (1) A pre-existing lease, for the duration of more than five years whether in a single lease or cumulative total of several leases, of the receiving School District's facilities by the sending School District that is terminated after transfer of the special education program takes place.
- (2) A lease, for the duration of more than five years whether in a single lease or cumulative total of several leases, of the sending School District's facilities by the receiving School District.

There shall not be any further adjustments made as a result of any subsequent transfers of that program for a period of five years from the date of the initial transfer or before all applicable funds have been remitted to the State as a result of the initial transfer. Both School Districts shall submit a Form SAB 50-01 for enrollment changes immediately upon transfer of title.

A district affected by a reorganization election on or after November 4, 1998 may file an application for a determination of new construction baseline eligibility after a successful reorganization election.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.51

The baseline eligibility for new construction determined on the Form SAB 50-03 will be adjusted as follows:

- (a) Reduced by the number of pupils provided grants in a new construction SFP project and by the number of pupils that received a Preliminary Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.140 or a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment pursuant to Section 1859.162.2.
- (b) Reduced by the number of pupils housed, based on the loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2)(A), in a new construction LPP project funded under the provisions of the LPP pursuant to Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13.
- (c) Reduced by the number of pupils housed in additional classrooms constructed or purchased based on the loading standards, pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2)(A), in a modernization SFP project.
- (d) Adjusted as a result of the audit findings made pursuant to Sections 1859.90, 1859.90.3 and 1859.105.
- (e) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in subsequent enrollment reporting years for all districts using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection, except decreases as provided in (j) below.

For all funding requests received by OPSC on or after June 6, 2017, OPSC will notify the School District in writing that OPSC is scheduled to begin processing

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the School District's Form SAB 50-04 and that the School District shall submit the Form SAB 50-01 based on school district enrollment data, as shown in the table below:

OPSC Received Date of Form SAB 50-01	Enrollment Reporting Year
July 1 through October 31	Submit Prior Fiscal Year Enrollment Data
November 1 through June 30	Submit Current Fiscal Year Enrollment Data

OPSC may return the Form SAB 50-04 to the School District for failure to submit the Form SAB 50-01 within 90 calendar days of OPSC's notification.

- (f) Adjusted as a result of errors or omissions by the district or by the OPSC.
- (g) Adjusted as a result of amendments to these Regulations that affect the eligibility.
- (h) Increased by the number of pupils eligible for grants pursuant to Section 1859.82.1(b)(4)(A) or 1859.82.2(b)(4)(A).
- (i) Reduced by the number of pupils housed, based on loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2)(A), in any Classroom Provided after the baseline eligibility was determined by the Board with the exception of those pupils housed or to be housed in a classroom:
 - (1) That is a trailer and transportable/towed on its own wheels and axles.
 - (2) Of less than 700 interior square feet.
 - (3) That is a portable classroom, leased pursuant to Chapter 14 (commencing with Section 17085) of the Education Code.
 - (4) That is a portable classroom leased for a period of less than five years, whether in a single lease or cumulative total of several leases.
 - (5) That is a portable classroom that needs to be leased beyond five years to provide interim housing in a modernization or new construction project provided the cumulative lease term does not exceed a specified time period as determined by the SAB not to exceed three years on each qualifying project. For this purpose, a project means all work contained in a single set of construction plans.
 - (6) Where the contract for the lease, lease-purchase, purchase, or construction of the classroom was made prior to January 1, 2000.
 - (7) That is included in a SFP project where the district has funded a portion of the project beyond its required district contribution and the pupil capacity of the classroom does not exceed 150 percent of the number of pupils receiving a new construction grant (rounded up) for the SFP project.
 - (8) That was acquired with joint-use funds specifically available for that purpose.
 - (9) That was acquired with career technical education funds specifically available pursuant to Education Code Section 17078.72.
 - (10) That was built or acquired exclusively for regional occupational centers, regional occupational programs, child care, preschool and/or Adult Education Programs, and with funds specifically available for those purposes.
 - (11) That replaces a classroom, previously included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a project funded by the district without participation from the State and the district permanently removes the replaced facility from classroom use immediately after the replacement classroom is occupied.
 - (12) That was constructed with Overcrowding Relief Grant funds specifically available for that purpose.
- (j) For Small School Districts:

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(1) Decreased by any reduction in projected enrollment that follows a three-year period after the district's eligibility was approved by the Board, and either (A) or (B), as applicable:

(A) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in the 2016/2017 enrollment year using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection if the Form SAB 50-01 was received at OPSC by October 31, 2017.

(B) Increased/decreased by changes in projected enrollment in subsequent enrollment reporting years following 2016/2017 using a fifth-year projection or a tenth-year projection.

(2) If the Small School District does not submit an adjustment under (A) or (B) prior to OPSC notification of its schedule to begin processing the School District's request for new construction funding that was received by OPSC on or after November 1, 2012, then the requirements of (e) shall apply.

(k) Adjusted for any change in classroom inventory as a result of a reorganization election.

(l) For classroom loading standards adopted by the Board for non-severely disabled individuals with exceptional needs and severely disabled individuals with exceptional needs.

(m) As directed by the Board due to a finding of a Material Inaccuracy pursuant to Regulation Section 1859.104.1.

(n) Increased by the number of pupils that received a Preliminary Apportionment that was rescinded pursuant to Section 1859.148 or a Preliminary Charter School Apportionment that was rescinded pursuant to Section 1859.166.

(o) Adjusted for operational grant changes as determined/provided by the California Department of Education.

(p) For a HSAA district with Preliminary Apportionments within the 2002 or 2004 Critically Overcrowded School Facilities Account as follows:

(1) Decreased by the number of pupils that received a Preliminary Apportionment, distributed proportionately among HSAAAs in which the pupils used to justify the conversion of the Preliminary Apportionment were enrolled but did not reside.

(2) In the subsequent enrollment reporting year after verification of Occupancy of a project, increased by the number of pupils equal to the reduction due to Section 1859.51(p)(1), for the project which was occupied.

(3) Increased by the number of pupils equal to the reduction due to Section 1859.51(p)(1), for a Preliminary Apportionment rescinded pursuant to the provisions of Section 1859.148.

(q) Adjusted by the difference between the Alternative Enrollment Projection for the current enrollment reporting year and the projected enrollment determined pursuant to Section 1859.42 for the current enrollment reporting year, or by the eligibility remaining from this calculation that can no longer be utilized if the funds made available pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75(a)(1)(A) have been exhausted.

(r) Adjusted pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75(b)(2) by the number of pupils housed, based on the loading standards pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.25(a)(2)(A), in any classroom(s) where title was relinquished to the School District receiving the transferred classroom(s).

(s) Increased by the capacity of classrooms that meet all of the following:

(1) The classrooms are included in an Approved Application that have a qualifying health and safety threat pursuant to Sections 1859.82.1 or 185.9.82.2

that were originally included in the district's baseline eligibility, except the district did not have the current enrollment to support the replacement and funding of those classrooms.

(2) The classrooms are included in an Approved Application pursuant to Sections 1859.82.1 or 1859.82.2 and did not receive funding as part of that project and were demolished or removed from classroom use. Buildings removed from K-12 classroom use that remain on the school site will be identified on a list published on OPSC's website.

(3) The Board shall approve the adjustment upon receiving the local school board resolution acknowledging that the buildings have been removed from K-12 classroom use.

SFP Regulation Section 1859.51.1

For any pupils that were reduced from the district's New Construction Eligibility in accordance with Section 1859.51(i) due to the construction contract being signed prior to the submission of the Approved Application, the district may request an increase to the new construction baseline eligibility pursuant to one of the following:

(a) By the number of pupils in which the district received a second reduction of pupils due to receiving State funding for classrooms included in a construction contract signed more than 180 days from the date the Approved Application was received by the OPSC. This request may be submitted in writing to the OPSC by the authorized District Representative no later than 120 days after this proposed regulation is in effect.

(b) By the number of pupils previously reduced from the baseline due to the construction contract exceeding 180 days from filing an Approved Application for those classrooms in the project and that are included in a request for State funding pursuant to Section 1859.70.2.

(c) By the number of pupils previously reduced from the baseline due to the District reporting the signing of contracts for construction or acquisition of classrooms prior to filing an Approved Application for those classrooms and where those classrooms are included in a current request for State funding pursuant to Section 1859.70.



Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82.2 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

(b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:

- (1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.
- (2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.
- (3) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).
- (4) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.
- (5) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.
- (6) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.
- (7) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82.2. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

(c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:

- (1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.
- (2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).
- (3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.
- (4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.
- (5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

- (A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship status.
- (B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.
- (d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).
- (e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).

(1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the

provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.

(2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must re-qualify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.

(3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

(f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.

(g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.

(h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.

(1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.

(2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:

a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.

b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.

(3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.

(4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
