1 when the rest of our members join, we'll go ahead and see  
2 if they have any questions, and then establish a quorum  
3 and begin the vote.

4 So starting as a subcommittee, any questions on the  
5 minutes? Of course, we can't take a vote, but we'll just  
6 make sure there's no questions.

7 (No audible response)

8 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none. Any public comment on the  
9 minutes?

10 (No audible response)

11 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, we will go to the  
12 executive officer's report, please.

13 Ms. Silverman?

14 **MS. SILVERMAN:** Yes. Happy New Year, everybody --

15 **MS. MILLER:** Happy new year.

16 **MS. SILVERMAN:** -- and I'm glad we're starting the  
17 year, and its exciting news that we just want to give the  
18 Board an update about the apportionments they took action  
19 on in October, and also November. There was quite a bit  
20 of funds allocated. Over nearly \$803 million did go out  
21 in October. And we wanted to provide the Board an update  
22 that as of January 24th, we actually had over \$708  
23 million with fund release requests. And I know the  
24 deadline actually is -- was yesterday, and I'm sure I'll  
25 have some new updates, and I apologize. That update was

1 for the 708 million was as of Friday. So I'm sure  
2 definitely districts were coming in with their fund  
3 release documents, and any other documentation that they  
4 had to submit to our office.

5 And also, in November, we actually did release --  
6 apportioned nearly \$110 million. And as of Friday, we  
7 had over \$65 million of documentation released requesting  
8 to release the funds come into the office. So that's  
9 great news. So we're actually making a big progress with  
10 releasing the funds. So that's great news for the  
11 districts, and actually moving forward with the  
12 construction projects. So great news for that.

13 And then we also want to announce that we have the  
14 upcoming filing round for the California Preschool and  
15 Transitional Kindergarten and Full-day Kindergarten Grant  
16 Program. That program starts -- we start accepting  
17 applications February 1st. It closes March 2nd. So  
18 those folks who are seriously interested in applying for  
19 the program grants, we have \$350 million that's eligible.  
20 So please apply, and also apply on online feature. So  
21 it's very fast and convenient for districts to submit  
22 their application electronically.

23 We also hosted a webinar on January 18th, to give  
24 opportunities to share some of the successes we've had  
25 with applications, but also address some of the

1 challenges we had with some of the applications. So  
2 again, just more or less highlight how you can  
3 successfully access a program, avoid some of the  
4 shortcomings of the applications that we received in last  
5 filing round.

6 So we had 330 registered attendance, but we actually  
7 had about 243 actually participate in that Zoom training.  
8 And the goal of the training was to again, how to perfect  
9 your application when you come in through the door, and  
10 actually how to access the financial hardship program  
11 successfully. And again, we have it posted on YouTube.  
12 And again, we're encouraging folks to also apply online.  
13 And we actually have a walk -- you know, actually have a  
14 walk down feature of how to apply online. And so it was  
15 great news of providing districts that tutorial on how  
16 easy it is to apply for that application.

17 And the last announcement we wanted to share is we  
18 have a joint virtual office hours. We did put that  
19 announcement out a few weeks ago. Next Friday, February  
20 3rd, from 11 a.m. to noon, we are partnering with the  
21 Department of Education, and we're happy about that. The  
22 goal is to really have an open dialog with our districts  
23 about any topic. I know most people think that we have  
24 to have convenience of having a formal meetings via Zoom,  
25 or come into the office, but we want to make it informal

1 so they can ask any question about our program, or how to  
2 file an application, share successes. So we're looking  
3 forward to that. Our first virtual office hours, and  
4 we'll be posting additional times every month for the  
5 remaining portion of the year, and excited about that.

6 So what we'll report now, and how many, we have a  
7 ten best virtual workshop, and again, we're excited about  
8 that -- this opportunity. And our next meeting is  
9 February 22nd at 4 o'clock.

10 **MS. MILLER:** All right. Thank you. And amazing  
11 work. Oh.

12 **MS. JONES:** We have a quorum.

13 **MS. MILLER:** We have a quorum. So there is --  
14 apparently there was an issue with our public links, so  
15 I'm just going to keep everyone up to date. Thank you  
16 for joining The State Allocation Board. We started as a  
17 subcommittee at 4:03 p.m. We went through the executive  
18 directors' report. We did not take any action. And so  
19 we will offer an opportunity for public comment. If  
20 anyone has any public comment on the executive officer's  
21 report, I invite you to go to The State Allocation  
22 Board's website, or reach out to Ms. Kampmeinart or Ms.  
23 Silverman, the executive director.

24 And are there any comments on the minutes from  
25 anyone?

1 Ms. Lasso?

2 **MS. LASSO:** No, sorry, I didn't have a comment on  
3 the minutes. I had a comment on the director's report.

4 **MS. MILLER:** Oh, great. Okay. Please. So if you  
5 don't mind if we can establish a quorum, vote on the  
6 minutes, and then we'll go to questions on the executive  
7 officer's report. Does that work for you?

8 (No audible response)

9 **MS. MILLER:** Great. Thank you very much.  
10 So if -- Ms. Jones, if you don't mind establishing a  
11 quorum for us, please?

12 **MS. JONES:** I certainly will. Thank you.

13 **MS. MILLER:** Thank you.

14 **MS. JONES:** Senator Wilk?

15 **SENATOR WILK:** Present.

16 **MS. JONES:** Senator Laird?

17 **SENATOR LAIRD:** Present

18 **MS. JONES:** Assemblymember Bonta?

19 **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** (No audible response)

20 **MS. JONES:** Juan Mireles? Juan Mireles?

21 **MR. MIRELES:** Here.

22 **MS. JONES:** Okay. Thank you, Juan. Jeremy Smith?

23 **MR. SMITH:** Here.

24 **MS. JONES:** Ana Lasso?

25 **MS. LASSO:** Here.

1           **MS. JONES:** Gail Miller?

2           **MS. MILLER:** Here. And I will move -- so wait, we  
3 have a quorum.

4           **MS. JONES:** We have a quorum.

5           **MS. MILLER:** I will move --

6           UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I second that.

7           **MS. MILLER:** Thank you. I'll move approval of the  
8 minutes, if there are no more questions. Thank you.

9           May we take the roll, please?

10          **MS. JONES:** Senator Wilk?

11          **SENATOR WILK:** Aye.

12          **MS. JONES:** Senator Laird?

13          **SENATOR LAIRD:** Aye.

14          **MS. JONES:** Juan Mireles?

15          **MR. MIRELES:** Aye.

16          **MS. JONES:** Jeremy Smith.

17          **MR. SMITH:** Aye

18          **MS. JONES:** Ana Lasso?

19          **MS. LASSO:** Aye.

20          **MS. JONES:** Gail Miller?

21          **MS. MILLER:** Aye.

22                 So the minutes are approved. We'll keep that open  
23 for Assemblymember Bonta.

24                 Okay. Question on -- Ms. Lasso, on the executive  
25 officer's report, please?

1           **MS. LASSO:** Less a question and more a comment, and  
2 praise to both Ms. Silverman and Ms. Kampmeinart for  
3 taking the opportunity -- taking their staff and putting  
4 out the opportunity for folks to chime in, ask questions  
5 during these virtual office hours.

6           I don't know if I missed it, but will the office  
7 hours be hosted only by your office, or will you be  
8 collaborating with another department -- another  
9 department?

10          **MS. SILVERMAN:** We're collaborating with the CDE  
11 Department of Education.

12          **MR. MIRELES:** Proud partners.

13          **MS. SILVERMAN:** Yes.

14          **MR. MIRELES:** Very proud partners to collaborate.

15          **MS. MILLER:** Thank you.

16          **MS. LASSO:** So I just want to say thank you. This  
17 is just another example of how we're creating access and  
18 being innovative in how we get people together and being  
19 purposeful. So thank you so much.

20          **MS. MILLER:** Thank you for that comment, Ms. Lasso.  
21 Anyone else?

22          (No audible response)

23          **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, we'll now move to the  
24 financial reports, please. Ms. Silverman?

25          **MS. SILVERMAN:** Yes. On page 82, I know I was

1 excited about sharing all the funds that we've been  
2 releasing over the past few months. But this just  
3 highlights on page 82, the fund disbursements in  
4 November. I know we've -- well, we actually did in  
5 November, but we didn't have an opportunity to share. We  
6 did release nearly \$183 million in November, and over  
7 nearly \$106 million in December. And again, we'll be  
8 excited to report back next month about how we've been --  
9 released, the remaining funds for the October  
10 apportionment, and also share some updates on the release  
11 of funds for the October apportionments, as well.

12 And then on the status of funds, page 84 and 85. So  
13 it's typically in January. We don't have a lot of  
14 programs -- we actually don't present program grants. So  
15 that gives the Board an opportunity to reflect some  
16 construction cost index adjustments to those program  
17 grants for 2023. So what you see in a consent agenda is  
18 very limited, and it also -- it's about six projects that  
19 we have in the consent agenda that relates to close out  
20 adjustments and some rescissions.

21 So with that, I'll open it to any questions. We  
22 have about \$4.5 million posting in the consent agenda.

23 **MS. MILLER:** Great. Any questions? And we'll  
24 talk -- the last item on the agenda is obviously the  
25 annual cost increases for construction that Ms.

1 Kampmeinart will go over with us.

2 (No audible response)

3 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, we're going to move to the  
4 Sequoia USD appeal, please.

5 Ms. Kampmeinart?

6 **MS. JONES:** Excuse me, Madam Chair, just real quick.  
7 We didn't vote on the consent calendar, at all.

8 **MS. MILLER:** Oh, my goodness. I'm sorry. I will  
9 move the consent calendar. Thank you, Ms. Jones.

10 **MS. JONES:** Thank you.

11 **SENATOR LAIRD:** Do you need a second?

12 **MS. MILLER:** I do.

13 **SENATOR LAIRD:** Second.

14 **MS. MILLER:** I also need to find my head, if you  
15 want to help with that, okay?

16 Any public comment on the consent agenda?

17 (No audible response)

18 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, we have a motion by  
19 Miller, a second by Senator Laird. May we please take  
20 the roll?

21 **MS. JONES:** Yes. Senator Wilk?

22 **SENATOR WILK:** Aye.

23 **MS. JONES:** Senator Laird?

24 **SENATOR LAIRD:** Aye.

25 **MS. JONES:** Juan Mireles?

1           **MR. MIRELES:** Aye.

2           **MS. JONES:** Jeremy Smith?

3           **MR. SMITH:** Aye.

4           **MS. JONES:** Ana Lasso?

5           **MS. LASSO:** Aye.

6           **MS. JONES:** Gail Miller?

7           **MS. MILLER:** Aye.

8           So the consent agenda is approved, but we will wait  
9 for Assemblymember Bonta to complete it.

10          And now I can move to the appeal, right?

11          **MS. KAMPMEINART:** That's correct.

12          **MS. MILLER:** Okay. Thank you, Ms. Kampmeinart.

13          Sorry about that.

14          **MS. KAMPMEINART:** No problem. Excellent. So the  
15 appeal today is for Sequoia Union High School District,  
16 and it's for a new construction application for Tide  
17 Academy, which is a new 15-classroom high school.

18          And the District is requesting that the Board  
19 reinstate and provide an apportionment for this  
20 application based on a request for nine pupil grants of  
21 eligibility for severe special day class students. And  
22 using the grant amounts that were available in 2021,  
23 which was when the application was first reviewed.

24          And before I get too far into the details, I did  
25 want to share that staff supports this request. And were

1 it not for the timing issues with this application, the  
2 approval normally would have been done through the  
3 consent calendar portion of the agenda.

4 But for some background, the District originally  
5 submitted this application in July of 2018, and requested  
6 to use 405 pupil grants, 9/12 grade level. However, when  
7 OPSC was processing the application in July of 2021, the  
8 District had no eligibility at the 9 through 12 grade  
9 level, and only had eligibility for severe special day  
10 class pupils. And that's shown on page 123 of the  
11 agenda.

12 And eligibility information using enrollment from  
13 both the 2020 and -- 2020, 2021, and '21 -- excuse me.  
14 Let me try that again. Information from the 2020, 2021,  
15 and the 1920 school year was evaluated at the time that  
16 we originally processed the application, and that was due  
17 to the flexibility that the Board had provided back in  
18 August of 2021, when we were looking at the declines  
19 associated with COVID-19. However, neither of those  
20 years resulted in the eligibility that the District had  
21 originally requested.

22 They did submit an appeal prior to the one that  
23 we're currently talking about, and requesting to delay  
24 the processing of the application until the enrollment  
25 for the '21/'22 enrollment year could be considered. But

1 the District did experience some challenges in getting  
2 the information necessary to determine that eligibility,  
3 because they actually have a large number of feeder  
4 elementary school districts and charter schools that that  
5 information's necessary to accurately calculate the  
6 enrollment for the high school districts. And so that  
7 was -- unfortunately, they were not able to get that  
8 information at the time. So we did return the appeal,  
9 and invited the District to resubmit the appeal once they  
10 had the information available to them.

11 So this current appeal was submitted in August of  
12 '22, and that was after the District had determined that  
13 the '21/'22 enrollment year, and also the '22 and '23  
14 enrollment year did not result in eligibility that would  
15 support the original funding request.

16 But prior to resubmitting the appeal, the District  
17 had worked with the Department of Education to determine  
18 if one of the classroom spaces in the facility would meet  
19 the regulatory requirements to be usable as a space for  
20 the severe special day class students. And the design of  
21 the facility did support this option, so the District was  
22 able to receive an updated plan approval from the  
23 Department of Education, and it did confirm that one of  
24 those classroom spaces was considered usable for the  
25 severe special day class purposes.

1           And so what this update, what it allows, is for the  
2 District to access eligibility in the severe special day  
3 class category. And they did have that available back  
4 when the application was processed in 2021. So as that  
5 was -- as there was one space, one classroom available  
6 for this designation, they're eligible to use nine pupil  
7 grants at this severe special day class level for  
8 purposes of eligibility.

9           And again, had this path been chosen back in 2021,  
10 this would not have been terribly out of the ordinary.  
11 We would have just processed it as an administrative  
12 approval through the consent agenda. However, the issue  
13 we have is that we cannot administratively reinstate this  
14 application. So that's the ask before the Board today.  
15 And in reinstating the application, the Board -- we have  
16 on page 136 the funding item. So it is available for the  
17 Board to approve. So by approving the appeal, you'd be  
18 approving the request to reinstate the application, use  
19 the nine severe special day class students, and the 2021  
20 grant amounts, which we do feel we agree with the  
21 District that that's the appropriate grant amount to use,  
22 because that's when the application was originally  
23 eligible for processing. And yes, so that funding shell  
24 is available for -- on page 136 of the agenda, if the  
25 Board does opt to approve this appeal.

1           And I believe we also have the District on the Zoom  
2 meeting today, if there are questions, but I'd also be  
3 happy to address any questions, as well.

4           **MS. MILLER:** Great. Thanks, Ms. Kampmeintart.

5           And thank you, Ms. Leach, for being here. The  
6 superintendent of Sequoia Union High.

7           Anything you want to add, Ms. Leach?

8           **MS LEACH:** No. But if approval, I'd like -- I'd  
9 like to thank some people.

10          **MS. MILLER:** Thank you very much.

11          Any questions or public comments?

12          (No audible response)

13          **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, thank you to the team for  
14 working on this and bringing it to the Board.

15          Welcome, Ms. Bonta. Thank you for being here. Is  
16 there motion to approve this appeal?

17          **SENATOR WILK:** Wilk moves approval second.

18          **SENATOR LAIRD:** Second.

19          **MS. MILLER:** Thank you, Senator Wilk. Thank you,  
20 Senator Laird.

21          Ms. Jones, will you call the roll, please?

22          **MS. JONES:** Yes, I will. Senator Wilk?

23          **SENATOR WILK:** Aye.

24          **MS. JONES:** Senator Laird?

25          **SENATOR LAIRD:** Aye.

1           **MS. JONES:** Assemblymember Bonta?

2           **MS. MILLER:** Assemblymember, you're muted.

3           **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** Aye.

4           **MS. MILLER:** Thank you.

5           **MS. JONES:** Thank you. Juan Mireles?

6           **MR. MIRELES:** Aye.

7           **MS. JONES:** Jeremy Smith?

8           **MR. SMITH:** Aye.

9           **MS. JONES:** Ana Lasso?

10          **MS. LASSO:** Aye.

11          **MS. JONES:** Gail Miller?

12          **MS. MILLER:** Aye.

13                 The appeal is approved. Ms. Leach, do you want to  
14 make any comments to anyone on your team?

15          **MS. LEACH:** Yes. Thank you so much. Good  
16 afternoon, again. Crystal Leach, the superintendent of  
17 Sequoia Union High School District. I just want to thank  
18 OPSC and the appeals team, Brian LaPask, Michael  
19 Watanabe, and Alexandra Ruiloba for their help with this.  
20 Really guided us through -- through this. And we are  
21 just so thankful that we will be able to push these  
22 dollars back into -- back into our schools, and -- and  
23 good for our students. So thank you for all of the work  
24 that you all do.

25          **MS. MILLER:** All right. Thank you very much. And I

1 agree, thank you to the incredible OPSC team and to  
2 everything that you're doing at Sequoia for the students  
3 of California. We are really grateful. Thank you.

4 So our last item, and then we'll go back through the  
5 agenda. Assemblymember Bonta, the last item is the --  
6 I'll turn to Ms. Kampmeintart for the annual construction  
7 costs. And I just -- I do want to just note how hard  
8 the -- or is it Ms. -- sorry, Ms. Silverman. The annual  
9 adjustment to the school facility grant program, and the  
10 costs associated with it. And just a huge shout out  
11 again to the team for pulling these numbers together in  
12 order to continue to make awards, we needed these numbers  
13 to have a clear view of construction costs. And the work  
14 that went into ensuring that we had sufficient data to  
15 determine the cost increases was really significant. So  
16 very grateful to you. And as Ms. Silverman, right, is  
17 presenting this item to the Board?

18 **MS. SILVERMAN:** Yeah.

19 **MS. MILLER:** Okay.

20 **MS. SILVERMAN:** Either way. No, and I do want to  
21 acknowledge that there was a lot of effort. I appreciate  
22 the chair mentioning that, because yeah, without this  
23 data, we couldn't provide the increases to our grant. So  
24 I appreciate that. And thank you for allowing us to do  
25 this today.

1           So excited about presenting the adjustments for the  
2 annual increases. And as a result that we're presenting  
3 a 9.3 percent annual increase to the statewide cost index  
4 This reflects on the state school facility grant program.  
5 Grants, and is reflective of class B, and we wanted to  
6 just to highlight that annually, we do this every year.  
7 And this results in districts, for the last few years,  
8 obviously, getting several increases over the -- since  
9 2016, we've been using (indiscernible) as the adopted  
10 basis for using the indices for construction of class B.

11           And so what we wanted is just to highlight to the  
12 Board is these adjustments, all noted, take in  
13 consideration all of the people grant adjustments, and  
14 the supplementary grants that we do award, as well. So  
15 this index is compared and determined by the rate of  
16 change determined year over year. And so we compared for  
17 2023, the index for 2022, and compared that to the -- the  
18 data we have for 2023. And that percent -- that  
19 information is converted to a percentage.

20           So as a result, we're ask -- we're requesting the  
21 Board to adopt the 9.3 proposed percentage increase for  
22 the school facilities program grants, and also take in  
23 consideration of the chart information of the updated  
24 supplement of grants and per pupil grants for the  
25 program, and approve the grants for all projects moving

1 forward, and approve for the rest -- the remaining of the  
2 year for (indiscernible) Board school facility program  
3 grants. So with that, we're asking the Board to approve  
4 the increase.

5 **MS. MILLER:** Great. Thank you very much. Any  
6 questions?

7 (No audible answer)

8 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none. I will move approval of  
9 the increase. May we have a second, please?

10 **MS. LASSO:** Second.

11 **MS. MILLER:** Thank you, Ms. Lasso.

12 And any public comment?

13 (No audible answer)

14 **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, Ms. Jones, will you please  
15 take the role?

16 **MS. JONES:** Yes. Senator Wilk?

17 **SENATOR WILK:** Aye.

18 **MS. JONES:** Senator Laird?

19 **SENATOR LAIRD:** Aye.

20 **MS. JONES:** Assemblymember Bonta?

21 **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** Aye.

22 **MS. JONES:** Juan Mireles?

23 **MR. MIRELES:** Aye.

24 **MS. JONES:** Jeremy Smith?

25 **MR. SMITH:** Aye.

1           **MS. JONES:** Ana Lasso?

2           **MS. LASSO:** Aye.

3           **MS. JONES:** Gail Miller?

4           **MS. MILLER:** Aye.

5           Thank you, Ms. Jones. And the annual adjustment to  
6 the school facility program grants is adopted.

7           And then before we move back through the agenda,  
8 Assemblymember Bonta, we'll just turn it to Ms. Silverman  
9 to see -- to talk to us about the ninety-day workload.

10           **MS. SILVERMAN:** Yes. Questions on the 90-day  
11 workload and the appeals log? Opened up to any  
12 questions.

13           (No audible answer)

14           **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none, any public comment?  
15 Anyone wishing to comment, public comment, for any  
16 reason, please use the raise hand feature in Zoom.

17           (No audible answer)

18           **MS. MILLER:** Seeing none. We appreciate you all  
19 being here, and thank you very much. And we'll see you  
20 next month.

21           And Assemblymember Bonta, if you don't mind staying  
22 just for the few items, please? Thank you very much.  
23 Thank you to everyone.

24           **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** Thank you.

25           **MS. MILLER:** Okay. Ms. Jones, the floor is yours

1 for the open items.

2 **MS. JONES:** Thank you, Chair. Assemblymember Bonta,  
3 how do you vote on the minutes?

4 **MS. LASSO:**

5 **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** Aye.

6 **MS. JONES:** And on the consent calendar?

7 **ASSEMBLYMEMBER BONTA:** Aye.

8 And I believe you are all caught up.

9 **MS. JONES:** Yes, you are. Thank you, ma'am.

10 **MS. MILLER:** Perfect. Thank you, everyone. Happy  
11 New Year. Thank you for being here, and we'll see you  
12 next month. Take care, everyone.

13 **MS. JONES:** Take care.

14 **MS. MILLER:** Bye.
