The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has completed its review of Lucas Elementary, OPSC application number 50/71043-00-011. Review of the District's project financing, expenditures, and certifications to ensure compliance pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.35, 17074.25, and 17076.10 and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.106 was conducted. In addition, the review examined the District's compliance with applicable SFP Regulations in effect when the funding application was received by OPSC.

The project is a financial hardship new construction project that was funded on a 50 percent State and 50 percent financial hardship apportionment basis. The project has expended funds beyond the SFP grant and is considered overspent. Pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.81 any funds expended beyond the SFP grant on a financial hardship project are considered funds available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship review.

The District has stated that it will not submit another financial hardship project for State funding within three years from the date that the most recent State Allocation Board full funding apportionment was made.

The District relocation costs and DTSC fees are less than the total grant amounts. SFP Regulation Section 1859.106 states in part that "An adjustment in the SFP grant will be made for the following: (a) The difference in the value of the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs that were used to determine the New Construction Additional Grant and the actual amount paid by the district for the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs." The district has unused relocation and DTSC fee grants of \$120,827.38 and must return the State and financial hardship share of \$120,827.38. Pending final approval by the State Allocation Board at its next available monthly meeting, the District will be invoiced \$120,827.38 for the reduction in the site related grant apportionment.

OPSC has received the signed *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures* dated December 15, 2017 from the District. As the District has concurred with the review findings in the *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures*, the project is considered closed. Enclosed is the final report.

Line 15

Per Regulation Section 1859.106 (a) an adjustment must be made to the site grant between the value used to determine the grant and the actual amount paid for the site Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) and relocation costs. Therefore, \$120,827.38 is due back the State for the adjustment. NOTE: See Schedule 2 for calculation of adjustment to site grant.

Line 16:

The District relocation cost is less than the grant amount. SFP Regulation Section 1859.106 states in part that "An adjustment in the SFP grant will be made for the following. (a) The difference in the value of the relocation costs that were used to determine the New Construction Additional Grant and the actual amount paid by the district for the relocation costs." The District has an unused relocation grant of \$133,000.00 and would have to return the State and Financial Hardship share of \$133,000.00. However, an adjustment of \$12,172.62 for underfunded DTSC costs has been applied for a net amount of \$120,827.38

These are the final authorized amounts needed to bring the District's accounting records into compliance. Amounts shown supersede all authorized amounts shown on the Office of Public School Construction Fund Release documents.

Pursuant to the Board's action on May 22, 2013, the District is required to submit a complete Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 50-05) on or before August 20, 2013; otherwise, the apportionment will be rescinded without further Board action and will receive a new Unfunded Approval date of August 20, 2013.

The Form SAB 50-05 submittal must contain an original signature from a designated District Representative and must be physically received by the Office of Public School Construction at 707 Third Street, West Sacramento, CA 95605 prior to the close of business on August 20, 2013.

Assembly Bill 436 (Solorio), Chapter 378, Statutes of 2011, requires school districts to notify the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) of School Facility Program projects with a public works contract awarded on or after January 1, 2012. Except for projects exempt pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.3(b)(3), the DIR is required to provide prevailing wage monitoring services for the projects.

Amounts shown for financial hardship assistance are subject to adjustment as a result of a review of the District's financial records pursuant to Regulation Section 1859.81(a) at the time of apportionment.

The District qualifies for financial hardship pursuant to SFP Regulation Section 1859.81(c)(2). The District has demonstrated it is financially unable to provide all or a part of the matching funds and is levying the developer fees or equal alternative revenue source justified by law.

The District had a successful bond election for the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 (2000) within the previous two years (June 19, 2009).

The District shall ensure that it is in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and certifications it made on the program forms.

The California Department of Education approves the plans with the title sheet date of April 23, 2009, for the above referenced project. The plans were received on October 20, 2009. The plans meet the California Department of Education's standards for educational adequacy (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, et seq. and Education Code 17251(c) and (d)).

It is the responsibility of the school district to meet all requirements concerning toilet facilities, drinking water supply, sewage disposal, food service facilities and other plan elements having primary health and safety implications. The plans should be reviewed by the local health agency having jurisdiction and a written approval should be secured and filed in the school district's records. If the approved project involves work on an existing school building, it is the responsibility of the school district to meet all Federal, State and local requirements relating to the identification, remediation and/or removal of hazardous levels of lead and asbestos containing materials before or during construction. It is the responsibility of the district to complete all of the mitigation measures identified in the documents submitted to the California Department of Education for review.

The school site for this project is 10.49 usable acres. This represents 184.04% of the California Department of Education's recommended site size of 5.7 acres, as contained in the California Department of Education's "Guide to School Site Analysis and Development(2000)," for the current CBEDS enrollment of the site and the student capacity added by this project as calculated pursuant to SAB Regulation 1859.83(d).

The California Department of Education's recommended acres for the master plan capacity of the site is 10.5 acres, to be used for purposes of requesting funding from the State Allocation Board pursuant to SAB Regulations 1859.73, related to multi-story construction, and 1859.76(a)11, related to parking structures. This site is 99.9% of the California Department of Education's recommended master plan site size.

The Department of Toxic Substances Control has issued a determination letter dated September 21, 2009 indicating that lead-based paint and/or polychlorinated biphenalys (PCB) and/or organochlorine pesticides (OCP) are the only potential environmental conditions present that warrant further investigation and/or response action(s). The district has signed a commitment to complete the further investigation and/or response action(s) under an Oversight Agreement and/or a Cleanup Agreement between the district and DTSC prior to construction of the project.

For projects to be funded under the Leroy F. Greene School Facility Act of 1998, funding requests to the State Allocation Board must be submitted within two (2) years of the date of this letter. If the district is not seeking financial assistance from the State Allocation Board, the project must commence construction within two (2) years of the date of this letter. Regardless of the funding source, if, prior to construction, changes are made to the plans that would affect or alter the California Department of Education's original approval (including but not limited to changes in surrounding land uses, the master plan capacity of the project, changes in code and/or regulation, or a subsequent CEQA determination), the plan may be subject to reevaluation using the most recent standards.
