The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has completed its review of Sage Creek High, OPSC application number 50/73551-00-016. Review of the District's project financing, expenditures, and certifications to ensure compliance pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.35, 17074.25, and 17076.10 and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.106 was conducted. In addition, the review examined the District's compliance with applicable SFP Regulations in effect when the funding application was received by OPSC, dated April 9, 2012.

The project is a non-financial hardship new construction project that was funded on a 50 percent State and 50 percent District basis. The project has expended funds beyond the SFP grant and is considered overspent.

OPSC has received the signed *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures* dated November 7, 2017 from the District. As the District has concurred with the review findings in the *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures*, the project is considered closed. Enclosed is the final report.

The District received a Site Acquisition grant for \$654,348. OPSC has accepted the District's reported \$761,000 amount for the Site Acquisition. Pursuant to School Facility Program Section 1859.106(a), a grant adjustment for the \$96,652 difference between the two amounts must be made. Because this is a New construction project, the \$96,652 Site Acquisition adjustment results in an \$48,326 amount due to the District.

Line 2

The District received a Site DTSC Fee grant for \$33,994. OPSC has accepted the District's reported \$66,679 amount for the Site DTSC Fee. Pursuant to School Facility Program Section 1859.106(a), a grant adjustment for the \$32,685 difference between the two amounts must be made. Because this is a New construction project, the \$32,685 DTSC Fee adjustment results in an \$16,642 amount due to the District.

Line 3

The District received a Site Hazardous Waste grant for \$900,620. OPSC has accepted the District's reported \$829,479 amount for the Site Hazardous Waste. Pursuant to School Facility Program Section 1859.106(a), a grant adjustment for the \$71,140 difference between the two amounts must be made. Because this is a New construction project, the \$71,141 Hazardous Waste adjustment results in an \$71,141 amount due to the State.

The District did not receive a Site Relocation Grant.

Line 5

"Site Other" grant is equivalent to 4% of the increase or decrease of the Site Acquisition grant but not less than \$50,000. Four percent of \$751,000.00 is \$30,040. The \$30,040 is less than the \$50,000 minimum for the Site Other grant. The District received the \$50,000 minimum for the Site Other Grant. Therefore, no adjustment is necessary.

Pursuant to the Board's action on May 22, 2013, the District is required to submit a complete Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 50-05) on or before August 20, 2013; otherwise, the apportionment will be rescinded without further Board action and will receive a new Unfunded Approval date of August 20, 2013.

The Form SAB 50-05 submittal must contain an original signature from a designated District Representative and must be physically received by the Office of Public School Construction at 707 Third Street, West Sacramento, CA 95605 prior to the close of business on August 20, 2013.

Assembly Bill 436 (Solorio), Chapter 378, Statutes of 2011, requires school districts to notify the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) of School Facility Program projects with a public works contract awarded on or after January 1, 2012. Except for projects exempt pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.3(b)(3), the DIR is required to provide prevailing wage monitoring services for the projects.

The District shall ensure that it is in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and certifications it made on the program forms.

DESCRIPTION

A review of expenditures reported by the District has been made and the revisions indicated are necessary to close out this completed project. The District incurred additional eligible expenditures per SFP Regulation Sections 1859.74 and 1859.106 and may receive additional site acquisition and Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) funding in the amount of \$64,668. The District was also over-funded for hazardous waste costs in the amount of \$35,570. The District has concurred with these findings and is eligible for additional apportionments of the State share in the amount of \$29,098.

The California Department of Education approves the plans with the title sheet date of October 15, 2008, for the above referenced project. The plans were received on May 11, 2011. The plans meet the California Department of Education's standards for educational adequacy (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, et seq, and Education Code 17251(c) and (d)).

It is the responsibility of the school district to meet all requirements concerning toilet facilities, drinking water supply, sewage disposal, food service facilities and other plan elements having primary health and safety implications. The plans should be reviewed by the local health agency having jurisdiction and a written approval should be secured and filed in the school district's records. If the approved project involves work on an existing school building, it is the responsibility of the school district to meet all Federal, State and local requirements relating to the identification, remediation and/or removal of hazardous levels of lead and asbestos containing materials before or during construction. It is the responsibility of the district to complete all of the mitigation measures identified in the documents submitted to the California Department of Education for review.

The school site for this project is 48.92 usable acres. This represents 120.2% of the California Department of Education's recommended site size of 40.7 acres, as contained in the California Department of Education's "Guide to School Site Analysis and Development (2000)," for the current CBEDS enrollment of the site and the student capacity added by this project as calculated pursuant to SAB Regulation 1859.83(d).

The California Department of Education's recommended acres for the master plan capacity of the site is 64.7 acres, to be used for purposes of requesting funding from the State Allocation Board pursuant to SAB Regulations 1859.73, related to multi-story construction, and 1859.76(a)11, related to parking structures. This site is 89.43% of the California Department of Education's recommended master plan site size.
