The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has completed its review of Voices College-Bound Language Academy, OPSC application number 54/69450-00-001. Review of the District's project financing, expenditures, and certifications to ensure compliance pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.35, 17074.25, and 17076.10 and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.106 was conducted. In addition, the review examined the District's compliance with applicable SFP Regulations in effect when the funding application was received by OPSC, dated August 23, 2013.

The project is a non-financial hardship Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) project that was funded on a 50 percent State and 50 percent District basis. SFP Regulation Section 1859.169.1 states "Projects funded under the CSFP do not generate savings pursuant to Section 1859.103. In addition, State funds remaining at the completion of the project may not be used to satisfy the local matching share obligation. Remaining funds must be returned to the State." Accordingly, any CSFP project savings must be returned to the State. This CSFP project has savings in the amount of \$978,903.00.

The District hazardous waste/removal costs are less than the total grant amounts. SFP Regulation Section 1859.106 states in part that "An adjustment in the SFP grant will be made for the following: (a) The difference in the value of the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs that were used to determine the New Construction Additional Grant and the actual amount paid by the district for the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs." The District has unused hazardous waste/materials removal grants of \$56,100.00 and must return the State share of \$28,050.00.

The review also determined the District incurred additional eligible expenditures per SFP Regulation Sections 1859.74 and 1859.106 and may receive additional Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) funding in the amount of \$29,946.24.

The net amount of site related adjustment increase is \$3,792.48.

Pending final approval by the State Allocation Board at its next available monthly meeting, the net site grant adjustment of \$3,792.48 will be used to reduce the District's CSFP savings from \$978,903.00 invoice to \$975,110.52. The District will be invoiced \$975,110.52 for the reduction in the apportionment.

OPSC has received the signed *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures* dated November 28, 2018 from the District. As the District has concurred with the review findings in the *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures*, the project is considered closed. Enclosed is the final report.

Line 17-18:

The District hazardous waste/removal costs are less than the total grant amounts. The District has unused hazardous waste/materials removal grants of \$56,100 and must return the State. The review also determined the District incurred additional eligible expenditures per SFP Regulation Sections 1859,74 and 1859,106 and may receive additional Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) funding in the amount of \$59,892.48. The net site adjusment is \$3,792.48.

Line 19: Total Due to the State is \$975,110.52; adjusted grant be returned to the State and adjusted grant for the CSFA lease amount less site adjustments from the State and CSFA.

#### **Explanations:**

Line 1

Per Regulation Section 1859.74(a)(3) and 1859.106 the District's funding for "site DTSC fees" is limited to approved DTSC expenses. The district received a grant of \$26,682 for DTSC fee in this project. However, the DTSC fee inccured \$88,574.48, which was greater than the grant amount. The district is eligible for an additional of \$59,892.48.

#### Line 2

Per School Facility Program (SFP) Regulations Section 1859.74.2 and 1859.106(a), adjustment may be made to the difference between the actual costs and the grant amount for hazardous waste/material removal costs. The district received a grant amount of \$56,100 for Site Hazardous Removal, and the acutal costs spent was \$0. Therefore, the grant will be reduced by \$56,100.

### **Explanations:**

During the course of our review the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) identified the following items. While they are non-monetary in nature they still warrant a discussion.

The OPSC's oversight responsibilities focus on verifying that a project funded through the SFP comply with applicable state laws and program certifications, and expenditures made by districts comply with the Education Code Sections and SFP Regulation Sections.

Per Education Code Section 17070.75, any school district or County Office of Education with a School Facility Program (SFP) project funded after November 1998 is required to deposit funds into the Routine Restricted Maintenance Account (RRMA). The District must deposit funds into the RRMA beginning the fiscal year (FY) following the fiscal year any SFP project(s) receives a fund release for an adjusted grant apportionment.

Pursuant to Education Code Section 17070.766, for the 2008/2009 to 2014/2015 fiscal years (FY), the board shall require a school district to deposit into the RRMA, an amount equal to 1 percent of the total expenditures by a district from its general fund in the 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2013-14, and 2014-15 fiscal years respectively, but if the school district maintains its facilities in good repair, as defined in Section 17002, it shall be exempt from this 1 percent requirement. A school district may elect to deposit into the account an amount that is greater than the amount required by the board pursuant to this section. However, the District did not comply with the regulations; it did not have a RRMA nor made a deposit as regiured by the Education Codes above.

It should be noted for future projects that the District needs to comply with the regulation to avoid the material inaccuracy.

The California Department of Education approves the plans with the title sheet date of May 16, 2013 for the above referenced project. The plans were received on August 6, 2013. The plans meet the California Department of Education's standards for educational adequacy (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, 14001 et seq. and Education Code 17251(c) and (d)).

It is the responsibility of the school district to meet all requirements concerning toilet facilities, drinking water supply, sewage disposal, food service facilities and other plan elements having primary health and safety implications. The plans should be reviewed by the local health agency having jurisdiction and a written approval should be secured and filed in the school district's records. If the approved project involves work on an existing school building, it is the responsibility of the school district to meet all Federal, State and local requirements relating to the identification, remediation and/or removal of hazardous levels of lead and asbestos containing materials before or during construction. It is the responsibility of the district to complete all of the mitigation measures identified in the documents submitted to the California department of Education for review.

The school site for this project is 4.45 usable acres. This represents 63.57% of the California Department of Education's recommended site size of 7 acres as contained in the California Department of Education's "Guide to School Site Analysis and Development (2000)," for the current CBEDS enrollment of the site and the student capacity added by this project as calculated pursuant to SAB Regulation 1859.83(d).

The California Department of Education's recommended acres for the master plan capacity of the site is 8.9 acres, to be used for purposes of requesting funding from the State Allocation Board pursuant to SAB Regulations 1859.73, related to multi-story construction, and 1859.76(a)11, related to parking structures. This site is 89.89% of the California Department of Education's recommended master plan site size.

The 4.45 net useable acres includes 1.37 acres from the school site and 3.08 acres for a joint-use playfield.

The district has certified that this project is either exempt from, or has completed, the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) process.

The district has met the requirements of Education Code 17213.1 and/or 17213.2 regarding the preparation of a Preliminary Endangerment Assessment. The Department of Toxic Substances Control has issued a determination letter dated July 26, 2013 indicating that the implementation of the required response action(s) is feasible only through the design and construction of the proposed school facility project. The district has signed a commitment to complete the response action(s) as overseen by a Cleanup Agreement between the district and DTSC prior to occupancy.

For projects to be funded under the Leroy F. Greene School Facility Act of 1998, funding request to the State Allocation Board must be submitted within two (2) years of the date of this letter. If the district is not seeking financial assistance from the State Allocation Board, the project must commence construction within two (2) years of the date of this letter. Regardless of the funding source, if, prior to construction, changes are made to the plans that would affect or alter the California Department of Education's original approval (including but not limited to changes in surrounding land uses, the master plan capacity of the project, changes in code and/or regulation, or a subsequent CEQA determination), the plan may be subject to reevaluation using the most recent standards.
