The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has completed its review of South Region Elementary #6, OPSC application number 53/64733-00-658. Review of the District's project financing, expenditures, and certifications to ensure compliance pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.35, 17074.25, and 17076.10 and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.106 was conducted. In addition, the review examined the District's compliance with applicable SFP Regulations in effect when the funding application was received by OPSC, dated July 16, 2009.

The project is a non-financial hardship Critical Overcrowding School Facility Program project that was funded on a 50 percent State and 50 percent District basis. The project has expended funds beyond the SFP grant and is considered overspent.

The District site acquisition costs, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/removal costs are less than the total grant amounts. SFP Regulation Section 1859.106 states in part that "An adjustment in the SFP grant will be made for the following: (a) The difference in the value of the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs that were used to determine the New Construction Additional Grant and the actual amount paid by the district for the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs." The district has unused site acquisition, relocation, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal grants of \$341,209 and must return the State share of \$170,605.

OPSC has received the signed *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures* dated August 7, 2017 from the District. As the District has concurred with the review findings in the *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures*, the project is considered closed. Enclosed is the final report.

Lines 1 through 5 The Grant Adjustments in column A are based on the adjustments listed in Schedule 2, Lines 1 through 4. Columns B and C show the allocation of the adjustments between the District's 50% share and State's 50% share of the project.

The State's share of the decrease, appearing in Column B, Line 15 of the Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures, is \$170,605. Upon State Allocation Board (SAB) approval of the funding reduction, the District will be required to return \$170,605 to the State.

- Line 1 The District reported \$16,590,235 (rounded) in Site Purchase costs, which have been accepted as eligible costs. In accordance with SFP Regulation Section 1859.74, the Site Purchase funding must be decreased to equal the eligible costs. The required adjustment is a \$1 decrease in funding, from \$16,590,236 to \$16,590,235.
- Line 2 The District reported \$582,814 (rounded) in Relocation costs, which have been accepted as eligible costs. In accordance with SFP Regulation Section 1859.74, the Relocation funding must be decreased to equal the eligible costs. The required adjustment is a \$7,994 funding decrease, from \$590,808 to \$582,814.
- Line 3 The District reported \$5,393,835 (rounded) in Hazardous Waste Removal costs (excluding DTSC Fees). \$590,188 of this amount is Preliminary Endangerment Assessment (PEA) costs (per billings from CTI Environmental). Also, \$110,156 appears to be asbestos costs related to demolished buildings (which should be funded from asbestos funding included in the Service Site funding). The total costs not associated with Hazardous Waste grant funding is \$704,344 (\$590,188 + \$110,156), leaving \$4,689,491 eligible (\$5,393,835 \$704,344). In accordance with SFP Regulation Section 1859.74, the Hazardous Waste Removal funding must be decrease to equal the eligible costs. The required adjustment is a \$369,793 funding decrease, from \$5,059,284 to \$4,689,491.
- Line 4 The District reported \$126,925 (rounded) in DTSC oversight fees under the Hazardous Waste Removal category: however, the District did not provide descriptions that identified which of these expenditures was for DTSC oversight of the Phase One Environmental Site Assessment (POESA) and/or the PEA. All DTSC fees have been treated as oversight costs for preliminary assessments, instead of as Hazardous Waste Removal Costs. In accordance with SFP Regulation Section 1859.74, the DTSC funding must be increased by \$36,579, to equal the eligible DTSC oversight fees for POESA & PEA work.
- Line 5 The net affect of the adjustments in Lines 1 through 4 above is a \$341,209 reduction to Site Grants funding. This amount is reflected in Column B, Line 9 of the Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures.

The California Department of Education approves the plans with the title sheet date of March 3, 2008, for the above referenced project. The plans were received on June 9, 2008. The plans meet the California Department of Education's standards for educational adequacy (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, et seq. and Education Code 17251(c) and (d)).

It is the responsibility of the school district to meet all requirements concerning toilet facilities, drinking water supply, sewage disposal, food service facilities and other plan elements having primary health and safety implications. The plans should be reviewed by the local health agency having jurisdiction and a written approval should be secured and filed in the school district's records. If the approved project involves work on an existing school building, it is the responsibility of the school district to meet all Federal, State and local requirements relating to the identification, remediation and/or removal of hazardous levels of lead and asbestos containing materials before or during construction. It is the responsibility of the district to complete all of the mitigation measures identified in the documents submitted to the California Department of Education for review.

This letter revises and supercedes the letter issued on October 8, 2008.

The school site for this project is 5.66 usable acres. This represents 40.43% of the California Department of Education's recommended site size of 14 acres, as contained in the California Department of Education's "Guide to School Site Analysis and Development (2000)," for the current CBEDS enrollment of the site and the student capacity added by this project as calculated pursuant to SAB Regulation 1859.83(d).

The property approved for acquisition/and or use is 6 gross acres of which 5.66 are usable for school purposes. An additional 0 usable acres are available for school use through a joint use agreement. The total usable acres of 5.66 represents 36.99% of the California Department of Education's recommended master plan site size of 15.3 acres as contained in the California Department of

The district has met the requirement of Education Code 17213.1 and/or 17213.2 regarding preparation of a Preliminary Endangerment Assessment. The Department of Toxic Substances Control has issued a determination letter dated July 9, 2008 indicating that it has approved the draft or final cleanup plan for a response action required on this site and the district has signed a commitment to complete the response action and further investigations under a cleanup agreement with DTSC prior to occupancy.

For projects to be funded under the Leroy F. Greene School Facility Act of 1998, funding requests to the State Allocation Board must be submitted within two (2) years of the date of the initial approval letter. If the district is not seeking financial assistance from the State Allocation Board, the project must commence construction within two (2) years of the date of the initial approval letter. Regardless of the funding source, if, prior to construction, changes are made to the plans that would affect or alter the California Department of Education's original approval (including but not limited to changes in surrounding land uses, the master plan capacity of the project, changes in code and/or regulation, or a subsequent CEQA determination), the plan may be subject to reevaluation using the most recent standards.
