The Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has completed its review of Antonio Maria Lugo Academy, OPSC application number 54/64733-00-055. Review of the District's project financing, expenditures, and certifications to ensure compliance pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.35, 17074.25, and 17076.10 and School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.106 was conducted. In addition, the review examined the District's compliance with applicable SFP Regulations in effect when the funding application was received by OPSC, dated April 15, 2015.

The project is a non-financial hardship Charter School Facilities Program (CSFP) project that was funded on a 50 percent State and 50 percent District basis. SFP Regulation Section 1859.169.1 states "Projects funded under the CSFP do not generate savings pursuant to Section 1859.103. In addition, State funds remaining at the completion of the project may not be used to satisfy the local matching share obligation. Remaining funds must be returned to the State." Accordingly, any CSFP project savings must be returned to the State.

This CSFP project has savings in the amount of \$128,527.68. Pending final approval by the State Allocation Board at its next available monthly meeting, the District will be invoiced \$128,527.68 for the reduction in the apportionment.

The District DTSC fees are less than the total grant amounts. SFP Regulation Section 1859.106 states in part that "An adjustment in the SFP grant will be made for the following: (a) The difference in the value of the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs that were used to determine the New Construction Additional Grant and the actual amount paid by the district for the site, relocation costs, DTSC fees, and hazardous waste/materials removal costs." The District has unused DTSC fees grants of \$11,342.44 and must return the State share of \$5,671.22 and CFSA Lease amount of \$5,671.22, the total of \$11,342.44. Pending final approval by the State Allocation Board at its next available monthly meeting, the District will be invoiced \$11,342.44 for the reduction in the site related grant apportionment. The District will be invoiced total of \$139,870.12 (\$128.527.68 + \$11,342.44).

OPSC has received the signed *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures* dated February 12, 2019 from the District. As the District has concurred with the review findings in the *Summary of Project Financing and Expenditures*, the project is considered closed. Enclosed is the final report.

Pursuant to the Board's action on September 8, 2015, the District is required to submit a complete Fund Release Authorization (Form SAB 50-05) on or before December 7, 2015; otherwise, the apportionment will be rescinded without further Board action and will receive a new Unfunded Approval date of December 7, 2015.

The Form SAB 50-05 submittal must contain an original signature from a designated District or Charter School Representative and must be physically received by the Office of Public School Construction at 707 Third Street, West Sacramento, CA 95605 prior to the close of business on December 7, 2015.

Assembly Bill 436 (Solorio), Chapter 378, Statutes of 2011, requires school districts and charter schools to notify the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) of School Facility Program projects with a public works contract awarded on or after January 1, 2012. Except for projects exempt pursuant to Labor Code Section 1771.3(b)(3), DIR is required to provide prevailing wage monitoring services for the projects.

Senate Bill 854, Chapter 28, Statutes of 2014 repealed Labor Code (LC) Section 1771.3 which required school districts and charter schools to provide payment to Department of Industrial Relations (DIR) for prevailing wage monitoring. As a result, school districts and charter schools awarding a construction contract on or after June 20, 2014 are not mandated to provide payment for DIR monitoring and enforcement of prevailing wage requirements. Projects with an initial public works contract awarded on or after June 20, 2014 are not eligible to receive an additional grant for prevailing wage monitoring; however, school districts and charter schools are still required to notify DIR within five days of initial contract award pursuant to LC Section 1773.3(a)(1).

The Applicant previously received \$6,919,528.20 for advance design and site acquisition costs.

The Applicant shall ensure that it is in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and certifications it made on the program forms.

The plans meet the California Department of Education's standards for educational adequacy (California Code of Regulations, Title 5, et seg. and Education Code 17251(c) and (d)).

It is the responsibility of the school district to meet all requirements concerning toilet facilities, drinking water supply, sewage disposal, food service facilities and other plan elements having primary health and safety implications. The plans should be reviewed by the local health agency having jurisdiction and a written approval should be secured and filed in the school district's records. If the approved project involves work on an existing school building, it is the responsibility of the school district to meet all Federal, State and local requirements relating to the identification, remediation and/or removal of hazardous levels of lead and asbestos containing materials before or during construction.
