SCOPE

DGS Purchasing Standards provide the minimum criteria purchases must meet to be considered Environmentally Preferable (EPP), aka "green", by the state of California, to be used for incorporating requirements that meet the state's environmentally preferable goals, into procurements and policy.

Per Public Contract Code (PCC) §12400 through 12404, Environmentally Preferable Purchasing, the purchasing standard herein establishes minimum EPP requirements for transportation services, henceforth, Services.

Departments must adhere to all applicable laws, regulations, policies, best practices, and purchasing authority requirements, e.g. California Codes, California Code of Regulations, State Administrative Manual, Management Memos, and State Contracting Manual Volume 2 and 3, as applicable. ENVIRONMENTALLY PREFERABLE PURCHASING REQUIREMENTS

Products must be certified by a minimum of one third-party environmental certification per Table 1, and/or contain a minimum of 70% postconsumer recycled content (PCRC) to be considered EPP. Antifreeze, Engine and Lubricating Oils must contain a minimum of 70% PCRC to be considered State Agency Buy Recycled Campaign (SABRC) compliant.

- Choose Transportation Services from a certified partner listed on EPA's SmartWay
- Alternatively, A Supplier should supply shipping materials with the following postconsumer recycled content (PCRC):
 - Plastic Containers: Minimum 10% PCRC
 - Wooden Pallets: Minimum 95% PCRC
 - Plastic Pallets: 100% PCRC
 - Rubber Mats / Truck Bed Liners: Minimum 75% PCRC
 - Polyester Strapping: Minimum 50% PCRC
- Choose Motor Oil with at least 70% post-consumer recycled base stock
- Choose Coolants that contain one of two options:
 - o Antifreeze (AF) should be made utilizing 70% postconsumer material
 - Alternatively choose coolant composed of propylene glycol, refrigerant used should not be HFC-134a or other hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs)
- Choose Lubricants that have been re-refined/recycled incorporating 70% PCRC
- Alternatively, Lubricants should belong to the USDA's Bio Preferred Program:
 - o Engine Oils: 25% biobased content
 - Penetrating Lubricants: 68% biobased content
- Choose Maintenance Chemicals with low toxicity certified by Green Seal or UL ecolabel
- Alternatively, verify that the chemicals are certified by EPA's Safer Choice ecolabel
