## 1.0 SCOPE

DGS Purchasing Standards provide the minimum criteria purchases must meet to be considered Environmentally Preferable (EPP), aka “green”, by the state of California. Use the standard to incorporate into procurements and policy, requirements that meet the state’s environmentally preferable goals.

Per Public Contract Code (PCC) §12400 through 12404, Environmentally Preferable Purchasing, the purchasing standard herein establishes the following EPP requirements for computer hardware rental services, henceforth, the Service.

Departments must adhere to all applicable laws, regulations, policies, best practices, and purchasing authority requirements, e.g. California Codes, California Code of Regulations, State Administrative Manual, management memos, and the State Contracting Manual as applicable. ## 3.0 ENVIRONMENTALLY PREFERABLE PURCHASING REQUIREMENTS

Mobile suppliers are required to provide take-back services, per the Cell Phone Recycling Act of 2004.

The Service, to be considered EPP, shall meet at least one of the requirements below.

- The facilities where the Service is being generated are US EPA's Renewable Energy Certified or are Green-e Certified.
- Core products used in the Service are State Agency Buy Recycled Campaign (SABRC) compliant, containing a minimum of 10% post-consumer recycled content, such as for plastic or metal content.
- Core items used in the Service have at least one of the certifications listed in Table 1.
