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### TO: Procurement and Contracting Officers (PCOs)

**Purchasing Authority Contacts (PACs)** 

RE: Initial Procurement Guidance Applicable to ALL Purchases (IT & Non-IT) to Incorporate Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAl) Requirements

Purpose This Broadcast Bulletin (BB) provides initial procurement and contracting steps to implement item 3a of Executive Order (EO) N-12-23 signed on September 6, 2023, related to the use of Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI), by announcing new procurement policy and procedures applicable to all purchases of goods and services.

Policy The new policy, procedures, and requirements are effective March 21, 2024, and must be fully implemented on or before April 30, 2024.

At this time, the procurement requirements are applicable to <u>NEW</u> <u>solicitations</u> for the purchase of information technology (IT) goods and services, non-IT services, and non-IT goods, and are located in the following document:

<u>State of California Generative AI Toolkit for Procurement, Use, and</u> <u>Training (GenAI Toolkit)</u>

The procurement guidance in the above GenAI Toolkit has been incorporated into State Contracting Manual Volume 2 (SCM V2). Transactions subject to SCM V2 must adhere to new and updated SCM V2 policy and procedures as noted in this BB.

Transactions subject to California Department of Technology's (CDT's) procurement authority are also subject to the procurement requirements noted in the above GenAI Toolkit.

At a later date, DGS and CDT will issue updated guidance to address existing contracts that may include GenAI.

SCM V2 incorporates the GenAl Toolkit procurement requirements. Below is a summary of the new procurement policy, procedures, and requirements:

#### **GenAl Definition**

"Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI): The class of AI models that emulate the structure and characteristics of input data in order to generate derived synthetic content. This can include images, videos, audio, text, and other digital content." – State Administrative Manual (SAM) 4819.2

# **GenAl Disclosure Notification Clause**

All written solicitations (IT and non-IT goods and services, etc.) are required to include mandatory GenAl disclosure language that is provided in the GenAl Toolkit and SCM V2.

# GenAl Disclosure & Factsheet Form STD 1000

Bidders/offerors are required to complete and return form STD 1000 GenAl Disclosure & Factsheet at the time of bid/offer.

### Written Solicitation

Acquisitions for the purchase of GenAl technology or that include the purchase of services generated by GenAl, must be conducted using a written solicitation. Use of acquisition methods that do not require a written solicitation (e.g., Fair and Reasonable Acquisition Method) are prohibited for these purchases.

# **Department Chief Information Officer (CIO) Confirmation**

Prior to proceeding with a GenAl purchase or approving a contract that includes services generated by GenAl, procurement professionals must confirm with their department CIO that the purchase may proceed. Confirmation must be kept in the procurement/contract file and can be an email or a form created by the department.

Through June 30, 2024, CIO's must consult with CDT prior to proceeding with a GenAI purchase, including contracts that incorporate the use of GenAI by vendors [refer to Technology Letter (TL) 24-01].

Effective July 1, 2024, CIOs will be required to conduct a risk assessment and potential consultation with CDT before proceeding with a GenAI purchase (refer to TL 24-01).

# **GenAl Special Provisions**

CDT may identify the need to incorporate certain GenAl Special Provisions as a result of a CIO's consultation with CDT. The GenAl Special Provisions are applied on a case-by-case basis and not made available for use by departments without CDT's recommendation.

### **GenAl Procurement Reporting**

Following existing FI\$Cal State Contracting and Procurement Registration System (SCPRS) policy and procedures, identification of GenAI purchases is now required in the description field.

### **GenAl Procurement Training**

Each state entity's designated Purchasing Authority Contact (PAC) is required to complete mandatory GenAl procurement training.

Background EO N-12-23 signed on September 6, 2023, tasked DGS and CDT, under item 3: "To ensure State government fosters a safe and responsible innovation ecosystem that puts AI systems and tools to the best uses for Californians" by issuing procurement guidance through a consultative process to "address safety, algorithmic discrimination, data privacy, and notice of when materials are generated by GenAI" for GenAI purchases by January 2024. The EO allows revisions to occur after initial guidance is issued.

Procedure/ Chapter 23 "Generative Artificial Intelligence (GenAI)" has been added to SCM V2 and the following sections of SCM V2 have been updated to carry out new policy, procedures, and requirements:

**Section 100.3** – Purchasing Authority Standards *(updated to identify and include the mandatory GenAl procurement training for PACs)* 

Section 301 – Acquisition Planning (updated to refer readers to Chapter 23 Generative Artificial Intelligence when acquisitions include the purchase or use of GenAI)

<u>Section 2200.1 – FI\$Cal State Contract and Procurement</u> <u>Registration System (updated to identify and include mandatory</u> <u>GenAl procurement reporting)</u>

In addition to the above, departments must:

Create and implement internal policy and procedures to carry out the new requirements, as soon as possible and no later than April 30, 2024.

Ensure that current PACs complete the GenAl procurement training

before April 30, 2024 and email certificates of completion to DGS at <u>PAMS@dgs.ca.gov</u> before May 15, 2024.

The required GenAl procurement training will be available through the DGS California Procurement and Contracting Academy (CalPCA) on March 29, 2024. To register and complete the GenAl procurement training, visit CalPCA Online at <u>DGS CAL PCA</u>.

Newly designated PACs must complete the GenAl procurement training and submit certificates to DGS within 30 days of designation (SCM V2 Section 100.3).

PACs are encouraged to invite other procurement officials and employees involved in the procurement process (e.g., contract managers, CIOs, etc.) to complete the GenAI procurement training.
