RE: Information Technology Interagency Agreement Acquisition Method Dollar

**Threshold Increase** 

Purpose This Broadcast Bulletin communicates an increase in the dollar

threshold for the Information Technology (IT) Interagency Agreement

(IAA) acquisition method.

Policy Effective immediately, the IAA acquisition method dollar threshold for IT

transactions is increased to \$2,000,000.00 for Purchasing Authority Tiers 1, 2, and 3, except contracts with a California State University (CSU) or

University of California (UC).

Background The State Contracting Manual (SCM), Vol. 2, <u>Section 1509</u> provides

guidance and defines an IAA as an agreement between two or more state departments (Government Code, Section 11256) with one

performing work for the other state department(s).

Procedure/Process This increase pertains to item #8 "Interagency Agreement (IAA)(Limited to \$50,000.00 if IAA with CSU or UC)" on the Purchasing Authority

Approval Letters (PAAL). IT IAA Purchasing Authority for Tiers 1, 2, and 3 is increased from \$1,000,000.00 to \$2,000,000.00. This does not apply

to contracts with a CSU or UC, which remain at \$50,000.00.

PAALs for all four tiers are located on <u>Procurement Division's webpage</u>.

Individual departmental PAALs will be updated during Accreditation.

Implement this new dollar threshold by updating internal policy and procedures to reflect the IT IAA dollar threshold change.

For each transaction:

- Adhere to State Contracting Manual, Vol. 2. guidance.
- Apply applicable pre-procurement requirements (e.g., California)

Department of Technology (CDT) policy in the State Administrative Manual).

Confirm procurement authority; IT IAA transactions RELATED to non-delegated IT projects are subject to CDT's IT project procurement authority (see referenced policy in <u>BB P-10-18 Information Technology (IT) Project Procurement Authority - 2018 Legislation</u>).
