Applicants who meet the minimum qualifications as stated on this bulletin by the cut-off date may apply for and take this examination.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS**

One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of a Printing Trades Assistant I or equivalent.

### POSITION DESCRIPTION

#### Printing Trades Assistant II

Under supervision, is assigned a series of non-journey level tasks in the production areas of the Office of State Printing; operates complex non journey level equipment; and does other related work as required.

Positions exist in Sacramento and Yolo Counties.

### EXAMINATION SCOPE

This examination consists of the following components:

**Training and Experience (T&E) Evaluation** – Weighted 100% of the final score.

The examination will consist solely of a **T&E Evaluation**. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received. Applicants will receive their exam results within four (4) weeks of the cut-off date.

In addition to evaluating applicants' relative knowledge, skills, and ability, as demonstrated by quality and breadth of education and/or experience, emphasis in each exam component will be measuring competitively, relative job demands, each applicant's:

#### Knowledge of:

1. Printing plant equipment, machinery, operations, and terminology.
2. Types of paper stock and proper methods of paper movement and handling.
3. Ink colors and container sizes.

#### Ability to:

1. Read and write English at a level required for successful job performance.
2. Follow directions.
3. Lift 20 to 70 pounds.

### ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A departmental, open eligible list for the **Printing Trades Assistant II** classification will be established for:

#### Department of General Services

The names of successful competitors will be merged onto the eligible list in order of final score regardless of exam date. Eligibility expires **twelve (12) months** after it is established. Applicants must then retake the examination to reestablish eligibility.

Veterans' Preference will be granted for this examination. In accordance with Government Codes 18973.1 and 18973.5, whenever any veteran, or widow or widower

of a veteran achieves a passing score on an open examination, he or she shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligible list.

Possession of the entrance requirements does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described in this bulletin will be rated against a predetermined job-related rating, and all applicants who pass will be ranked according to their score.

Department of General Services reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all applicants will be notified.

**General Qualifications:** Applicants must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgement, the ability to work cooperatively with others, and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

**Eligible Lists:** Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

**High School Equivalence:** Equivalence to completion of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the competitor is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
