**DEPUTY EXECUTIVE OFFICER’S STATEMENT**

The Deputy Executive Officer informed the SAB of the following:

Governor’s Proposed 2024/2025 State Budget

Governor Newsom released his first budget proposal for the coming fiscal year. The impacts to the SAB were as follows:

- The proposed budget will reduce the planned investment for the School Facility Program (SFP) from \$875 million to \$375 million in one-time General Fund moneys.
- The proposed budget will delay the \$550 million planned for 2024/2025 to 2025/2026 for the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program.

The Governor also stated that this spring, the Administration expects to negotiate with the Legislature on their education facilities bond proposals to reach agreement on a bond proposal to be considered in the November 2024 election. These proposals are contingent on approval by the Legislature during the annual budget approval process.

Annual Adjustment to the SFP Grants and Index Adjustment on the Assessment for Development

The annual adjustment to SFP grants was presented as part of the Agenda. The recommended adjustment is a decrease of 1.33 percent and is based on the statewide cost index for Class B Construction. In addition to this item, the biennial index adjustment on the maximum Level I assessment for development item was presented. The recommended adjustment was an increase of 7.84 percent.

The next meeting was scheduled for Wednesday, February 28, 2024. The time and location of the meeting would be determined and announced at a later date.

# Executive Officer Statement

EXECUTIVE OFFICER STATEMENT  
State Allocation Board Meeting, February 28, 2024

**CONSTRUCTION COST INDICES UPDATES**

At the January 24, 2024 State Allocation Board (Board) meeting, the Board directed staff to research alternative construction cost indices that could be used for the annual adjustment to School Facility Program (SFP) grants, requested that the Board's legal counsel provide an opinion on questions related to the Board's ability to make an additional adjustment to SFP grants later in the year, and directed staff to provide updates on these efforts as well as updates related to a potential statewide school facilities bond.

Today's agenda includes a report presenting the requested legal opinion from the Board's legal counsel. In response to the Board's direction for staff to research alternative construction cost indices, staff have met with stakeholders and research is currently underway to evaluate and compare several indices. An item presenting the results of staff's research will be presented at a future Board meeting.

**STATEWIDE SCHOOL FACILITIES BOND UPDATES**

*Proposed Legislation*

The Governor has stated that this spring, the Administration expects to enter into negotiations with the Legislature on their education facilities bond proposals to reach agreement on a bond proposal to be considered in the November 2024 election.

Currently, there are two education facilities bond bills pending in the Legislature. Staff is monitoring these bills and will provide further updates over the coming months.

Assembly Bill 247 – Education finance: school facilities: Transitional Kindergarten Through Community College Public Education Facilities Bond Act of 2024 (Muratsuchi, Fong, Wilson, et al.)

Senate Bill 28 – Education finance: school facilities: Public Preschool, K-12, and College Health and Safety Bond Act of 2024 (Glazer)

*Processing Timelines and Status of Funds*

In recent years, the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) has processed approximately \$1.5 billion in School Facility Program projects annually, representing a monthly average of approximately \$125 million. If project processing continues at that rate, currently authorized funding for New Construction and Modernization projects (after Unfunded Approvals) may be exhausted by January 2025.

In the Information Items of the Agenda for each Board meeting, staff publishes the Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List. As of January 31, 2024, there is approximately \$1.05 billion in requests for New Construction and approximately \$1.84

billion in requests for Modernization on the Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List. This list represents applications received, but not reviewed, by OPSC.

### *Developer Fees*

Statute authorizes school district governing boards to levy developer fees for construction within district boundaries, as specified, for the purpose of funding the construction or reconstruction of school facilities. There are three levels of developer fees, which are levied on a per-square-foot basis:

- Level 1 Developer Fees – School district governing boards may adopt Level 1 developer fees after conducting a Justification Study that establishes the connection between the development in the district and the assessment of fees to pay for the cost of the facilities needed to house future students. Pursuant to Board action on January 24, 2024, the current maximum Level 1 developer fee assessment is \$5.17 per square foot for residential construction, and \$0.84 per square foot for commercial or industrial construction.
- Level 2 Developer Fees – School district governing boards may adopt Level 2 developer fees for residential construction within district boundaries if they meet specified requirements, including submittal of a timely application for SFP New Construction funding and adoption of a School Facility Needs Analysis. Level 2 developer fees are intended to provide up to 50 percent of the SFP New Construction project cost.
- Level 3 Developer Fees – School district governing boards may adopt Level 3 developer fees for residential construction within district boundaries if they meet requirements to adopt Level 2 developer fees and the Board is no longer approving apportionments for New Construction due to a lack of state funds available for this purpose. Level 3 developer fees are intended to provide up to 100 percent of the SFP New Construction project cost.

## **SCHOOL DISTRICTS IMPACTED BY RECENT STORMS**

OPSC can meet with school districts that experienced damage to their school sites as a result of the recent storms and severe flooding that may be beyond the costs covered by insurance, the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). OPSC encourages school districts impacted by the recent storms to reach out to OPSC's Facility Hardship Program Team to discuss potential funding options. More information about the Facility Hardship Program may be found on OPSC's [website](#).

## **NEXT MEETING**

The meeting originally planned for March 27, 2024 is being rescheduled. The meeting is now scheduled for Wednesday, April 3, 2024. The time and location of the meeting will be determined and announced at a later date. Additionally, there will be no meeting on Wednesday, April 24, 2024.

WHEREAS, the Board has previously approved or determined to be approvable a number of projects for construction or modernization eligibility of facilities for school districts and is making apportionments and/or unfunded approvals for the grant amounts for projects that meet the Board's criteria for the apportionment of grants pursuant to Education Code Sections 17072.10, 17078.52, 17078.70, 17079 or 17074.10 or Board Regulations 1859.81.1 or 1859.83;

WHEREAS, Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2 require the State (on whose behalf the Board is acting) to declare its reasonable intent to provide grant funding to school districts, in accordance with Board policy and law, for costs of the projects with proceeds of State bonds;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. This Resolution is adopted by the Board for the purposes of establishing compliance with Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2, and this Resolution does not bind the Board to make any additional apportionment, or bind the State to incur any indebtedness.
2. The Board anticipates that some or all of the school districts listed on the list of "Projects" referred to in this Resolution will pay certain capital expenditures in connection with some or all of the project costs prior to the issuance of bonds by the State to pay for the grants for the projects. The reimbursement of such costs is consistent with the State's budgetary and financial circumstances, and in accordance with Board policy, as no other funds or accounts of the State have been budgeted or are available to pay the costs of the projects on either a short-term or a long-term basis.
3. The Board, acting on behalf of the State, hereby declares that it is the State's official intent to use proceeds of general obligation bonds and/or General Fund proceeds that may become available for such purpose, consistent with the requirements of law that are in effect at the time the funds are available, to provide grants, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.
4. This Resolution shall be continuously available for inspection by the general public during normal business hours at the offices of the Board at 707 3<sup>rd</sup> Street, 4th Floor, West Sacramento, California, commencing within one week after the date of enactment of this Resolution.
5. Any eligibility determination does not constitute a commitment of future funding by the Board.

## SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM APPORTIONMENTS

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present to the State Allocation Board (Board) a list of School Facility Program (SFP) applications for Apportionment.

### DESCRIPTION

On September 21, 2022, the Board took action, due to the availability of General Fund proceeds, to return to making direct Apportionments while keeping the same benefits of the quick distribution of funds, as the priority funding system, by adopting proposed emergency regulations that revised the fund release deadlines from 18 months to either 180 calendar days for non-financial hardship school districts or 365 calendar days for school districts that qualify for financial hardship. The SFP new construction and modernization projects presented on the Attachment are in date order of a complete application being received by the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) and are Ready for Apportionment. The list also includes health and safety facility hardship applications for funding that have been processed and are ready for approval regardless of received date.

### AUTHORITY

SFP Regulation Section 1859.90 states:

“(a) With the exception of an apportionment made pursuant to Sections 1859.81.1(e) or 1859.81.2, apportionments provided through the Priority Funding Process and subject to 1859.90.2, or of an Inactive Apportionment subject to Section 1859.96, the OPSC will release State funds that the Board has apportioned to the district after submittal, by the district, of the Form SAB 50-05 and a Grant Agreement, pursuant to Section 1859.90.4.

(b) With the exception of an apportionment made for a Type II Joint-Use Project, not part of a qualifying SFP Modernization project, pursuant to Article 12 of these Regulations, a district must submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement, within 180 calendar days of the Apportionment of the SFP grant for the project or within 365 calendar days for Apportionments that include financial hardship assistance. If the district does not submit the Form SAB 50-05 and Grant Agreement within the above specified time, the entire New Construction Adjusted Grant, or Modernization Adjusted Grant or Type I or II, part of a qualifying SFP Modernization, or Joint-Use Project apportionment shall be rescinded without further Board action, and the pupils housed in the project, if applicable, will be

added back to the district’s baseline eligibility. The district may refile a new application for the project subject to district eligibility and available State funds at the time of resubmittal.

....“

## **BACKGROUND**

As part of the Governor’s approved Budget Act for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, one-time General Fund dollars were appropriated to the Board in the amount of \$1.3 billion for new construction and modernization projects under the SFP. As a result of receiving funding for the SFP that is not contingent on bond sales, the Board was able to return to using an existing regulatory process that allows for Apportionments to be made on a flow basis outside the current Priority Funding process, which is designed to accommodate twice yearly bond sales. Making Apportionments on a flow basis will enable school districts to more quickly and efficiently access much needed cash for construction projects. In order to ensure that cash moves quickly once allocated to school districts, regulations were changed to shorten the deadlines for fund release from 18 months to either 180 calendar days or 365 calendar days for districts that qualify for financial hardship.

School districts must submit the Grant Agreement and a valid *Fund Release Authorization* (Form SAB 50-05) 180 calendar days from Board approval for non-financial hardship projects and 365 calendar days from Board approval for financial hardship projects.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

1. Approve the SFP applications as presented on the Attachment.
2. Specify that the projects are subject to the fund release deadlines as outlined in SFP Regulation Section 1859.90.

1. Submittal of an approved New Construction or Modernization Adjusted Grant funding application.
2. Submittal of a Districts certification that the final building plans for the project have been submitted to and accepted by the Division of the State Architect (DSA) for review and approval.
3. Submittal of an approved separate site funding application pursuant to Section 1859.81.1(a) or an approved environmental hardship funding application pursuant to Section 1859.75.1.
4. Submittal to the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) of evidence satisfactory to the State Allocation Board (SAB) detailing the reason(s) that plans have not been completed and accepted by the DSA.

## AUTHORITY

Pursuant to Regulation Section 1859.105 (c)(4), sufficient evidence of substantial progress shall include other evidence satisfactory to the SAB detailing the reason(s) that plans have not been completed and accepted by the DSA. If the SAB determines that substantial progress has been made, the SAB shall condition its finding of substantial progress upon the District commitment to complete and submit an Approved Adjusted Grant application within 18 months from the date of the SAB's determination of substantial progress.

## STAFF COMMENTS

The Attachment represents the project applications in which the District received a design grant apportionment and a subsequent fund release. The District has submitted acceptable explanation of why a substantial progress extension is required. Staff recommends approval of the request for additional time to submit evidence that Substantial Progress has been met on the design grant.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approve the District's request for a determination of substantial progress with regard to the SFP applications, as indicated on the Attachment.
2. Failure to comply with either requirement as indicated on the Attachment will result in the project apportionments being reduced to costs incurred or rescinded.

This project is being amended as a result of the removal of the previously authorized additional grant for automatic sprinkler system, which was not included in the approved plans and specifications. Additionally, the District has withdrawn its request for site development in order to be compliant with the regulatory 60 Percent Commensurate requirement.

The District shall ensure that it is in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations and certifications it made on the program forms.

This project is subject to the Grant Agreement submittal pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.17.

The District is responsible for ensuring that the project is compliant with Prevailing Wage Monitoring and/or Labor Compliance Program requirements at the time construction contracts are executed and/or construction commenced.

The District qualifies for financial hardship pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.14(a)(1). The District has demonstrated it is financially unable to provide all or a part of the matching funds and is levying the developer fees or equal alternative revenue source justified by law. The District’s outstanding bonded indebtedness as of June 20, 2022 is at least 60 percent of its total bonding capacity.

Advance funds in the amount of \$584,920.00 were previously released to the District. The remaining funds in the amount of \$2,343,080.00 (\$2,928,000.00 less advance funds released and available district contribution) will be released by OPSC upon the receipt of a valid, signed Grant Agreement as specified in Regulation Section 1860.17 and a complete *Fund Release Request* (Form SAB 70-02).

Pursuant to Regulation Section 1860.19(b)(4), any savings, including interest, unexpended or unencumbered after one year from the completion of the project, as specified in Section 1860.18, must be returned to the State.

## SURPLUS SITE SALE PROCEEDS

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the Charter Oak Unified School District's (District) request to deposit proceeds from the sale of surplus real property (1503 Sunflower Ave), which was purchased with local funds, into the District's General Fund.

### DESCRIPTION

The District is requesting State Allocation Board approval for the transfer of surplus real property sale proceeds into its General Fund for one-time expenditures as identified on Attachment A. The District requests this approval under the authority of Education Code (EC) Section 17463.7.

### AUTHORITY

See Attachment B.

### BACKGROUND

EC Section 17463.7 eliminates the five-year lockout from the School Facility Program imposed under EC Section 17462 if the surplus property was purchased entirely with local funds. EC Section 17463.7 authorizes the use of surplus real estate sale proceeds for one-time general fund purposes as long as the costs are not related to a school district's on-going operations. The school district must also present a plan to its local governing board regarding the one-time expenditures and explain why these expenditures will not result in on-going fiscal obligations for the school district.

Under EC Section 17463.7, school districts are ineligible for School Facility Program financial hardship funding after the proceeds are deposited into the General Fund. In addition, a school district's financial hardship assistance shall be reduced by an amount equal to that of a school district's one-time expenditure(s). A school district must certify the following:

- that the site sale does not violate local bond restrictions; and
- that the real property is not suitable to meet projected school construction needs for the next ten years.

### STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

The District has submitted all required documents to support its request.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Approve the request to transfer surplus real property proceeds to the District's General Fund as identified on Attachment A.
2. Accept the District's governing board certifications as outlined in the narrative.

## ATTACHMENT B

### Authority

#### **California Education Code Section 17463.7**

(as of September 18, 2020)

- (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district may deposit the proceeds from the sale or lease of surplus real property, together with any personal property located on the property, purchased with nonstate funds, into the general fund of the school district and may use the proceeds for any one-time general fund purpose. If the purchase of the property was made using the proceeds of a local general obligation bond or revenue derived from developer fees, the amount of the proceeds of the transaction that may be deposited into the general fund of the school district may not exceed the percentage computed by the difference between the purchase price of the property and the proceeds from the transaction, divided by the amount of the proceeds of the transaction. For purposes of this section, proceeds of the transaction means either of the following, as appropriate:
- (1) The amount realized from the sale of property after reasonable expenses related to the sale.
  - (2) For a transaction that does not result in a lump-sum payment of the proceeds of the transaction, the proceeds of the transaction shall be calculated as the net present value of the future cashflow generated by the transaction.
- (b) The State Allocation Board shall reduce an apportionment of hardship assistance awarded to the particular school district pursuant to Article 8 (commencing with Section 17075.10), except an apportionment of hardship assistance awarded pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) of Section 17075.10, by an amount equal to the amount of the sale of surplus real property used for a one-time expenditure of the school district pursuant to this section.
- (c) Before a school district exercises the authority granted pursuant to this section, the governing board of the school district shall first submit to the State Allocation Board documents certifying both of the following:
- (1) The sale of real property pursuant to this section does not violate the provisions of a local bond act.
  - (2) The real property is not suitable to meet projected school construction needs for the next 10 years.
- (d) Before the school district exercises the authority granted pursuant to this section, the governing board of the school district shall adopt a plan at a public meeting for expending one-time resources pursuant to this section. The plan shall identify the source and the intended use of the surplus property proceeds and describe the reasons why the expenditure will not result in ongoing fiscal obligations for the school district.
- (e) (1) Except for the sale or lease of surplus real property that has previously operated, or was constructed to be operated, as an early childhood education facility or a school for elementary and secondary instruction, the governing board of a school district shall not be required to appoint a district advisory committee pursuant to Article 1.5 (commencing with Section 17387).
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature to allow a school district to meet the requirements to offer surplus properties set forth in the Education and Government Codes by making an offer simultaneously to all applicable entities.



## ATTACHMENT B

- (f) The Office of Public School Construction shall submit an interim and a final report to the State Allocation Board and the budget, education policy, and fiscal committees of the Legislature that identifies the school districts that have exercised the authority granted by this section, the amount of proceeds involved, and the purposes for which those proceeds were used. The interim report shall be submitted by June 1, 2022, and the final report shall be submitted by January 1, 2026.
- (g) For any transaction for the sale or lease of surplus property a school district initiates pursuant to this section before June 30, 2024, the proceeds from the sale or lease transaction that are received after June 30, 2024, shall be considered proceeds that can be deposited in accordance with this section.
- (h) Subdivisions (a) to (e), inclusive, shall become inoperative on July 1, 2024, subdivision (f) shall become inoperative on January 15, 2026, and this section as of January 1, 2027, is repealed.

Section 1700. Definitions.

For the purpose of the provisions of Education Code Sections 17462, and 17462.3, and 17463.7, the terms set forth below shall have the following meanings:

“Apportionment” means a reservation of funds for the purpose of the purchase of real property, modernization of real property, or construction of improvements on real property, that is approved by the Board for a school district, county office of education or Charter School.

“Board” means the State Allocation Board as established by Section 15490 of the Government Code.

“Charter School” shall mean a school as established in California pursuant to Education Code Section 47600, et seq.

“District Representative” means a member of the a school district, county office of education or Charter School staff or other agent authorized on behalf of the school district, county office of education or Charter School to serve as the “District Representative” to execute and file forms with the Board on behalf of the school district, county office of education, or Charter School and/or act as a liaison between the Board and the school district, county office of education or Charter School.

“Form SAB 308” means the *Return of Real Property Sale Proceeds Notification*, Form SAB 308 (New 06/14), which is incorporated by reference.

“Office of Public School Construction (OPSC)” means the State office within the Department of General Services that assists the Board as necessary on behalf of the Director.

“One-time Expenditures” means costs paid by the general funds of a school district that are nonrecurring in nature and do not commit the school district to incur costs in the future, and are exclusive of Ongoing Expenditures.

“Ongoing Expenditures” means costs paid by the general or special funds of a school district in support of employee salaries, benefits and other costs that are associated with ongoing and sustained operations and services except, if approved by the State Allocation Board, a single and one-time payment toward reducing a district’s existing unfunded liability for postemployment benefits other than pensions will be considered a one-time expenditure and not an ongoing expenditure if the following conditions are also met: (1) the unfunded liability was incurred prior to January 1, 2007, (2) the unfunded liability has been determined using actuarial measurement methods as defined in Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement 45, and (3) the payment is consistent with any plan made by the district according to Assembly Bill 1802, Chapter 79, Section 43(a)(6)(A), Statutes of 2006

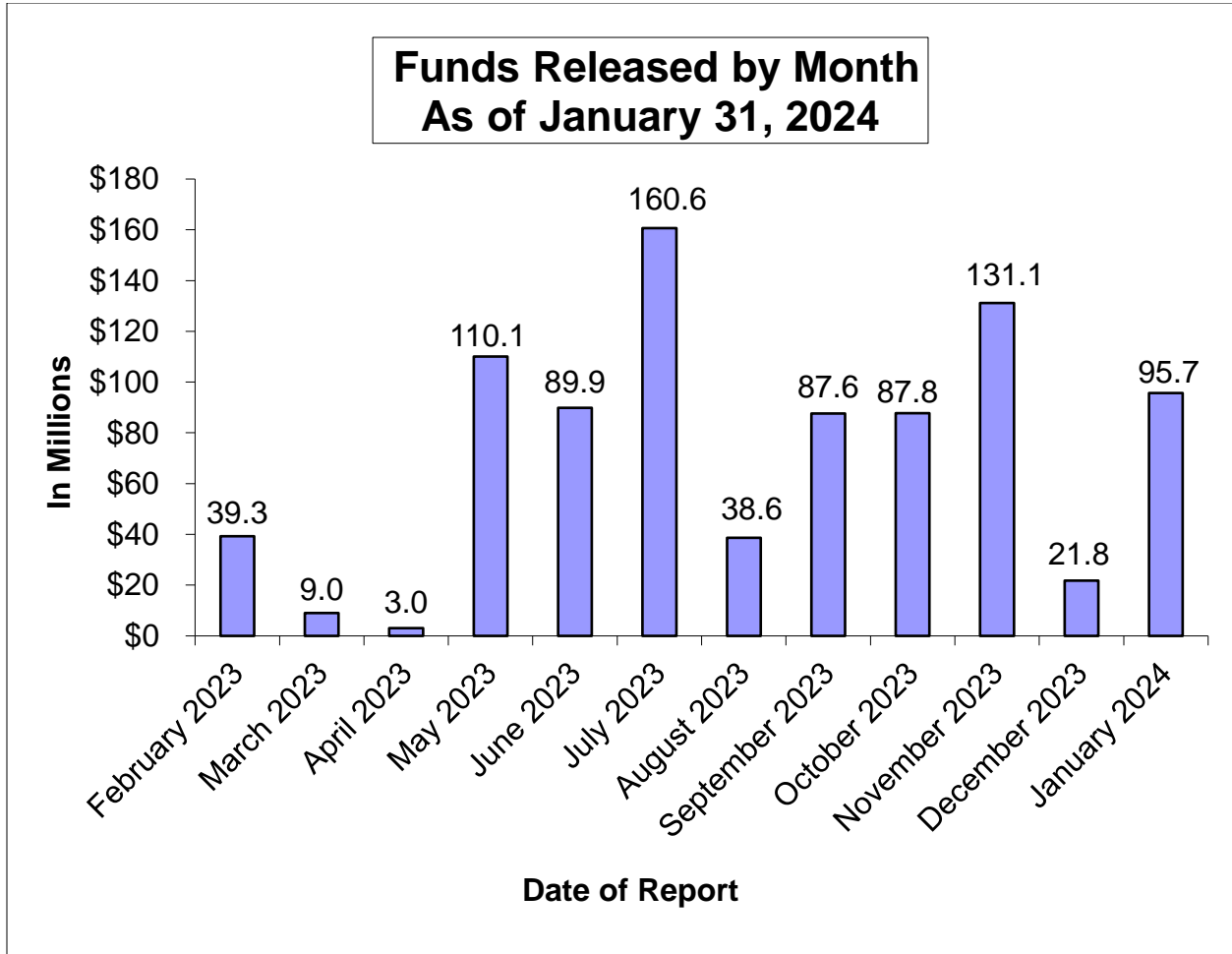

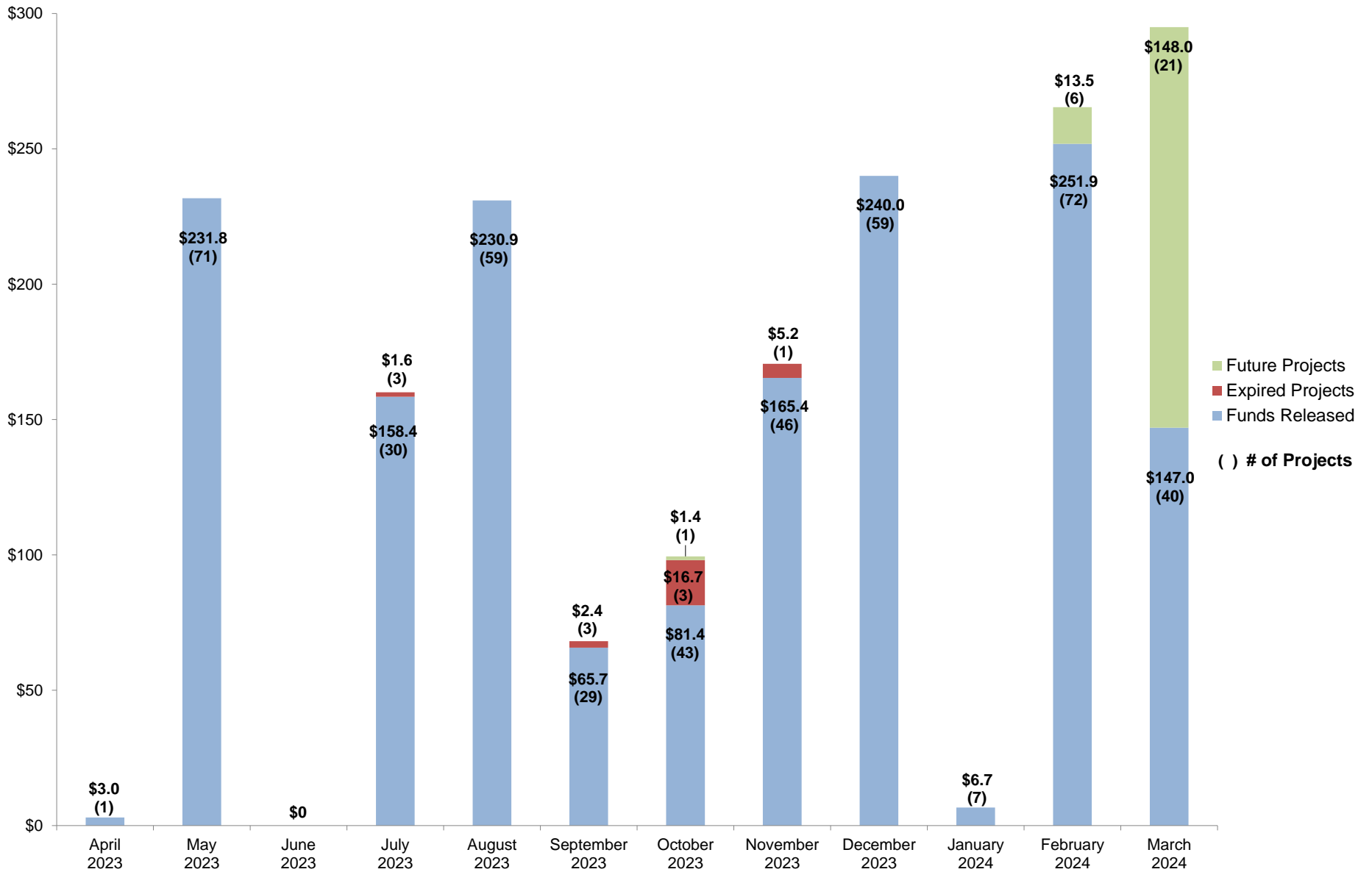

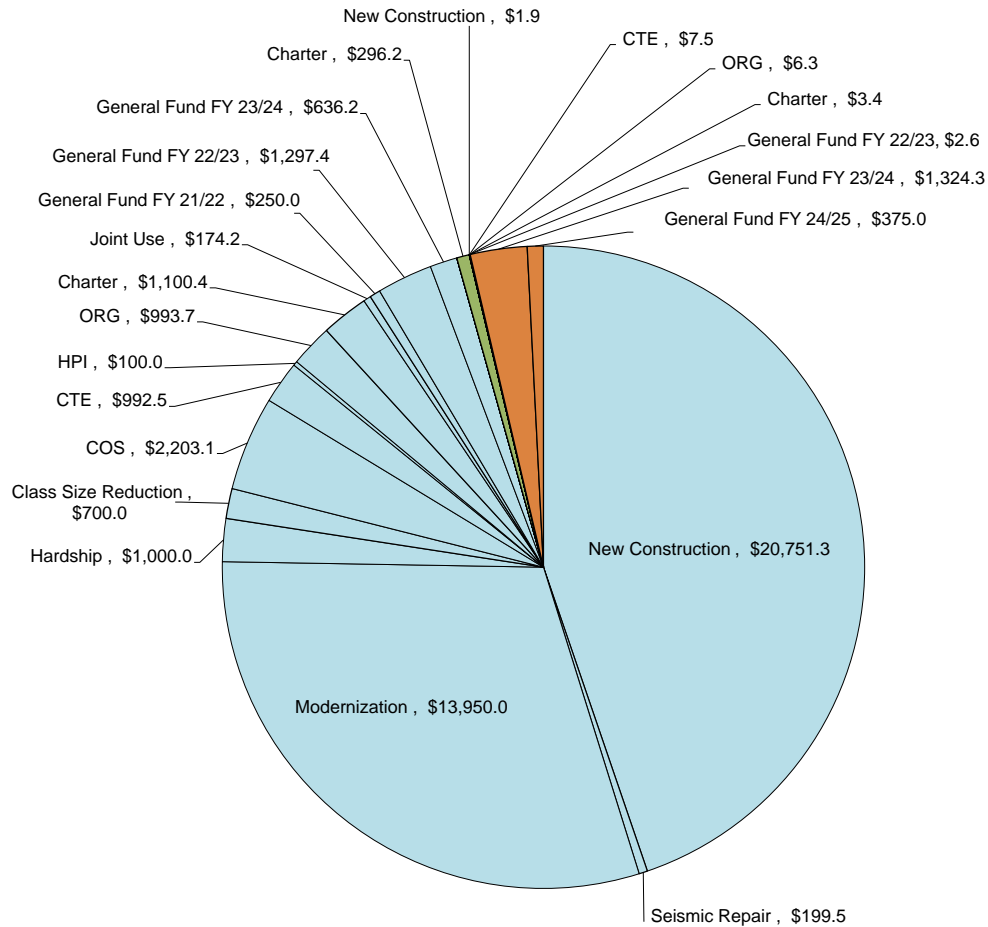

 (in millions of dollars)

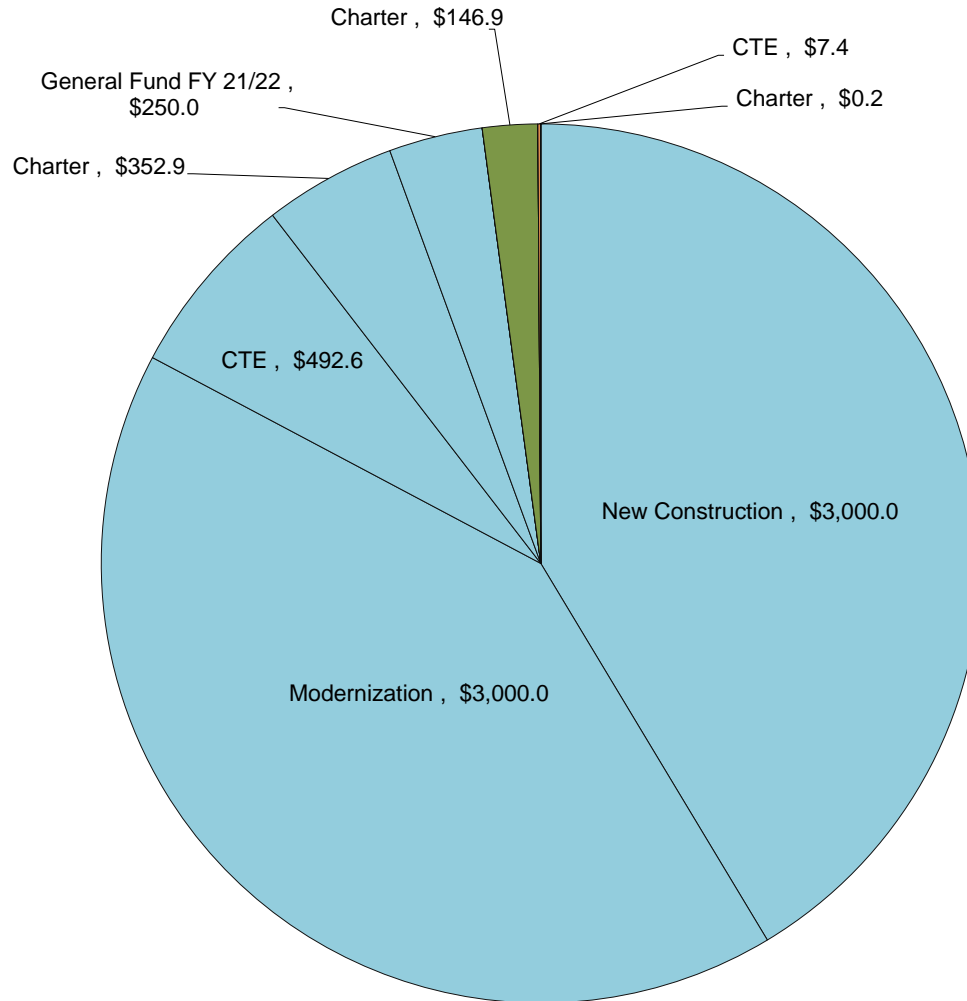

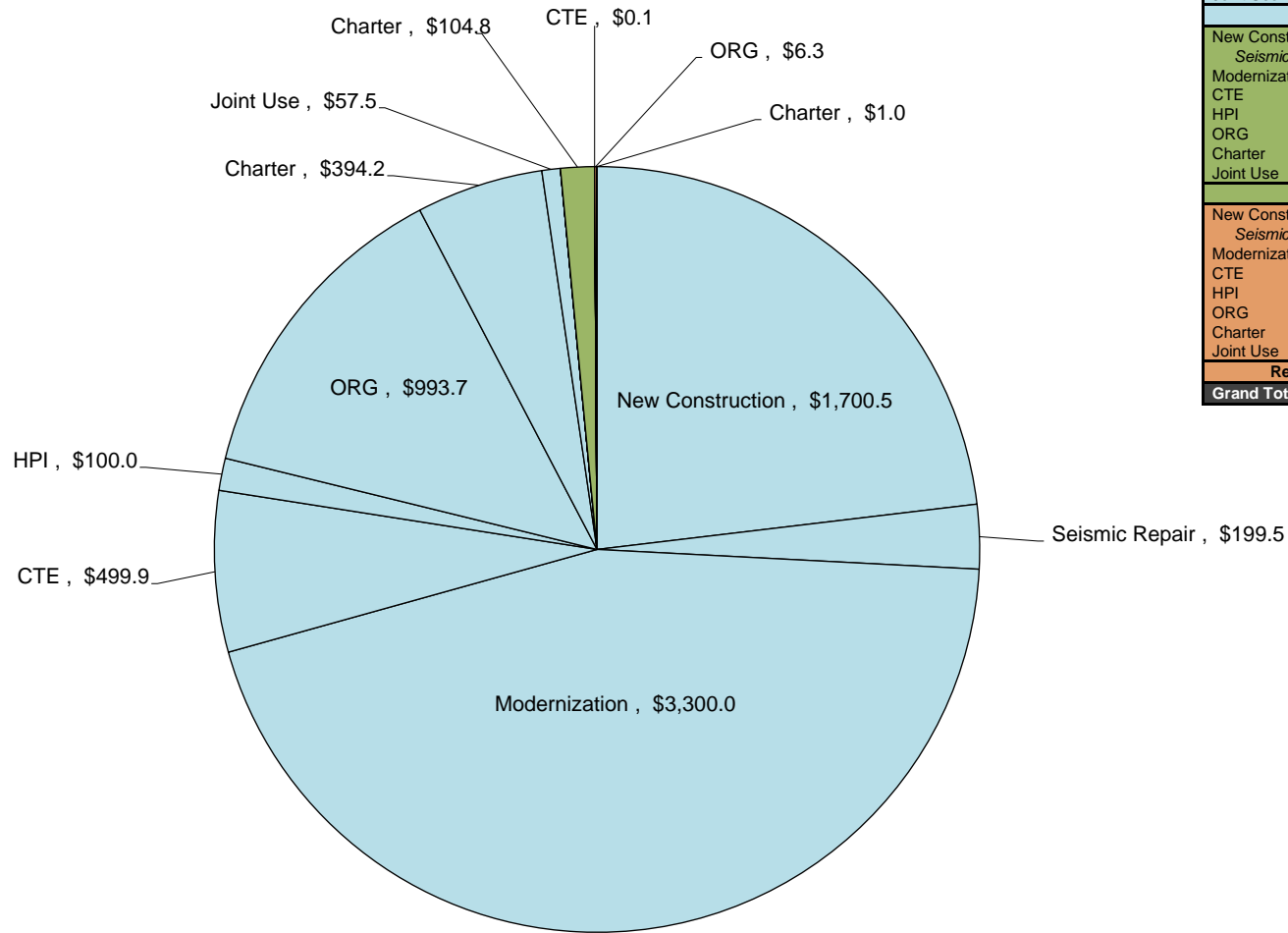

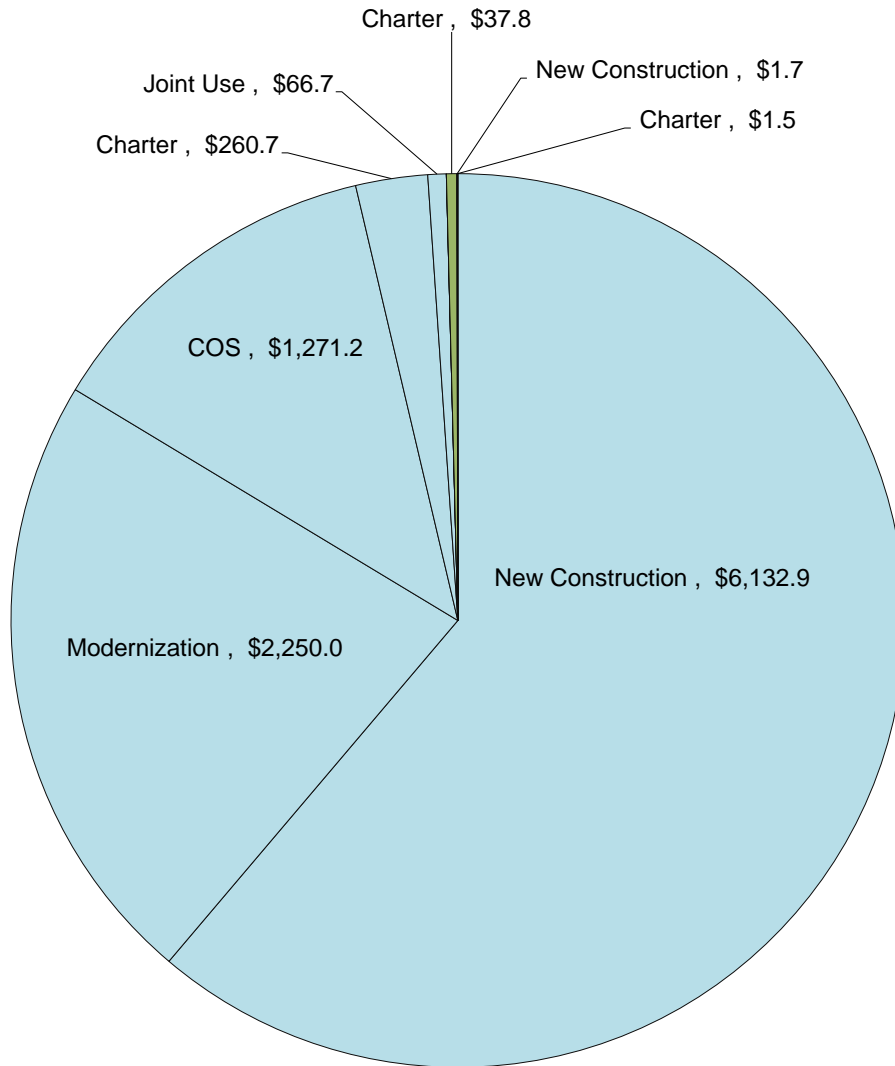

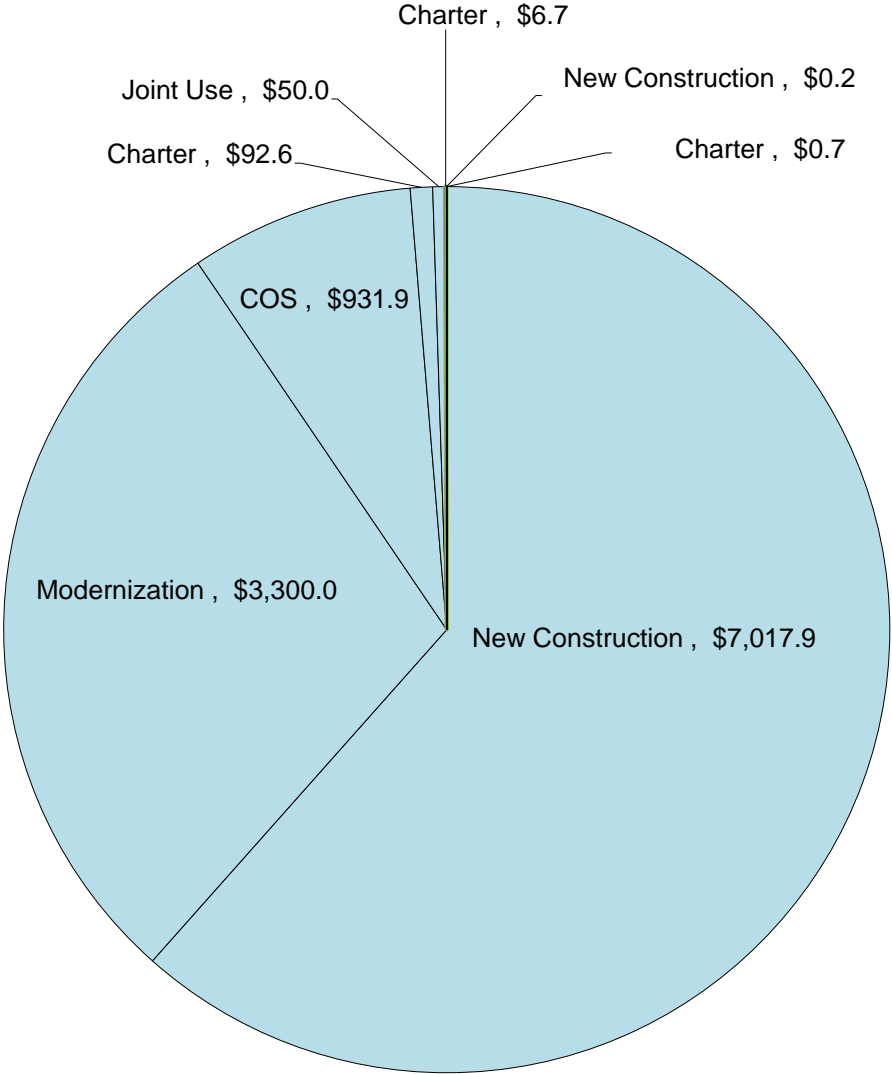

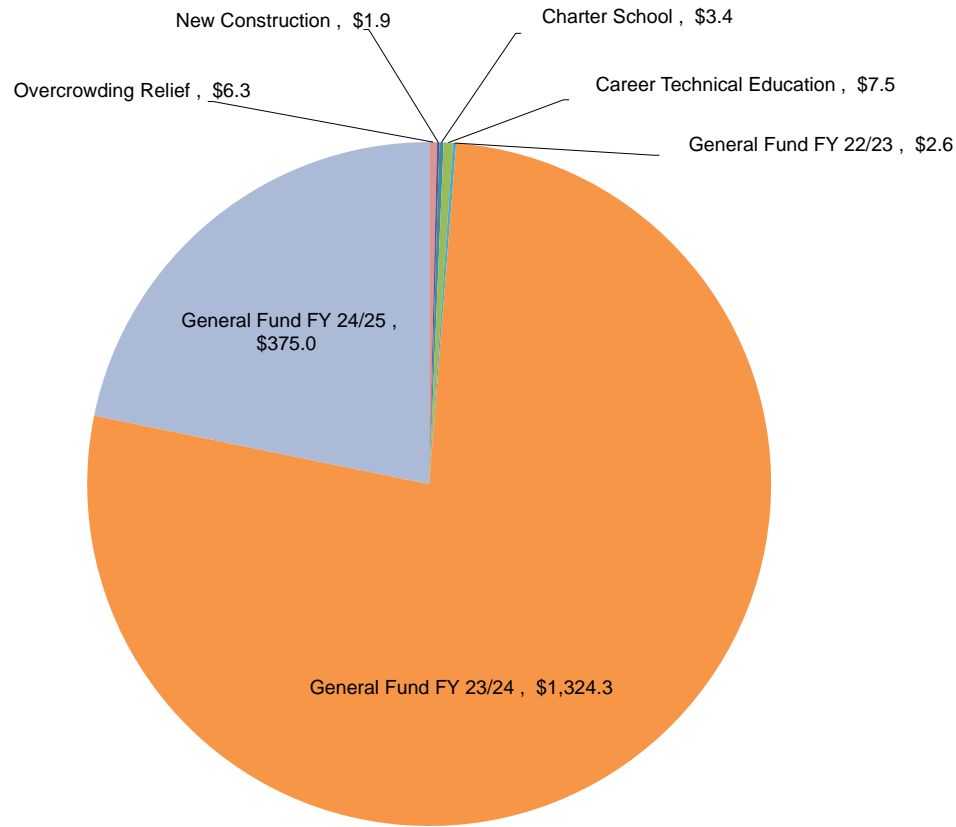

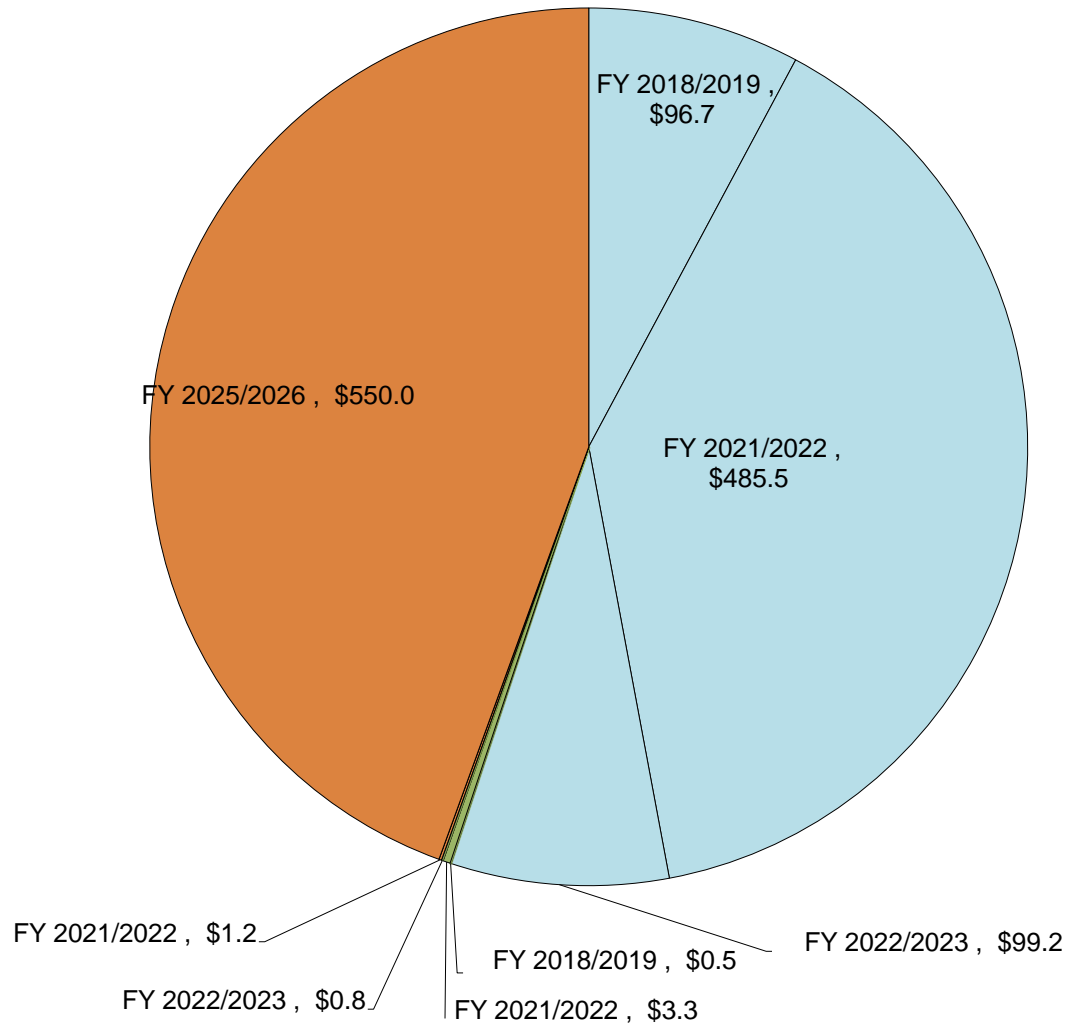

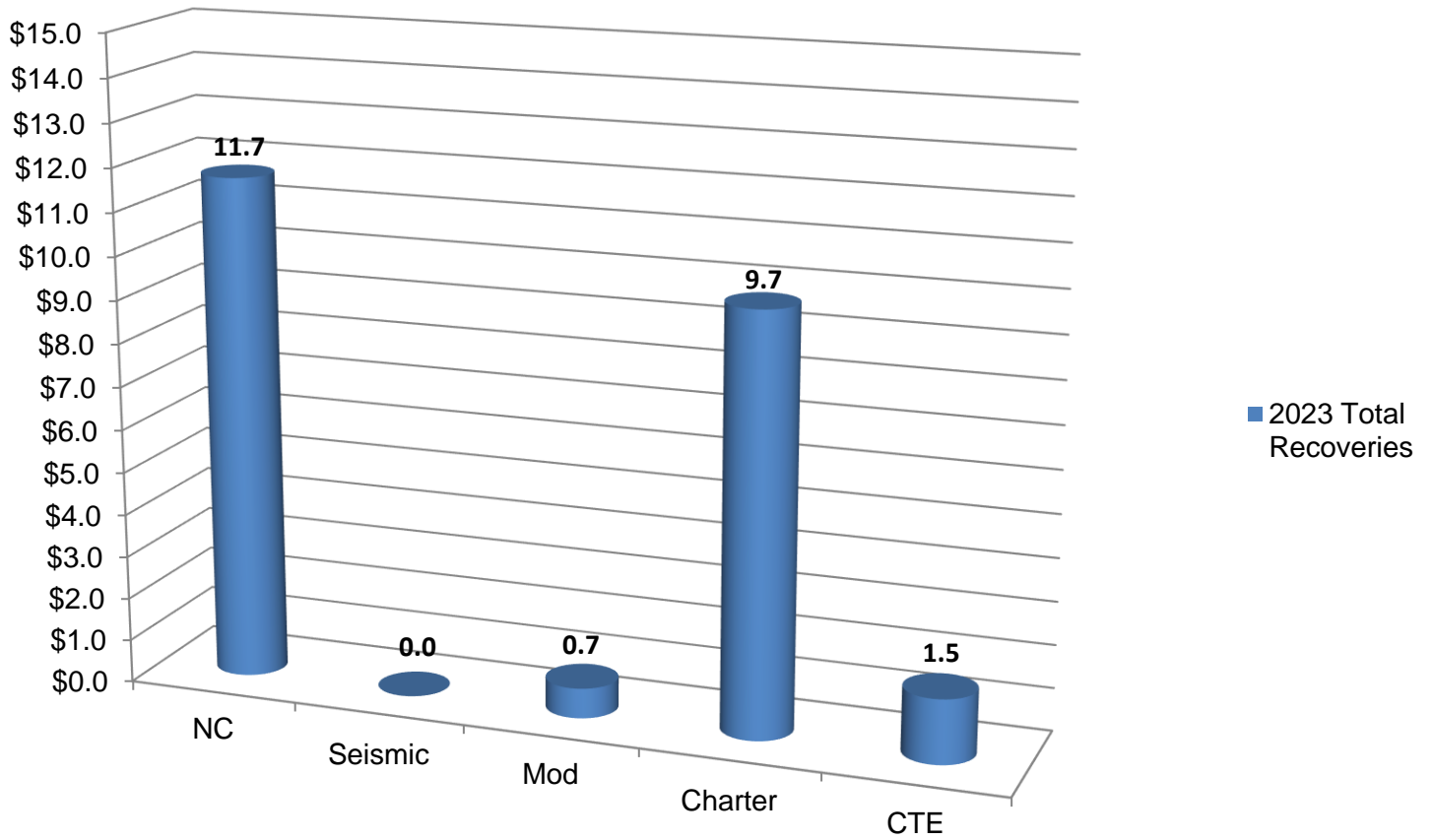

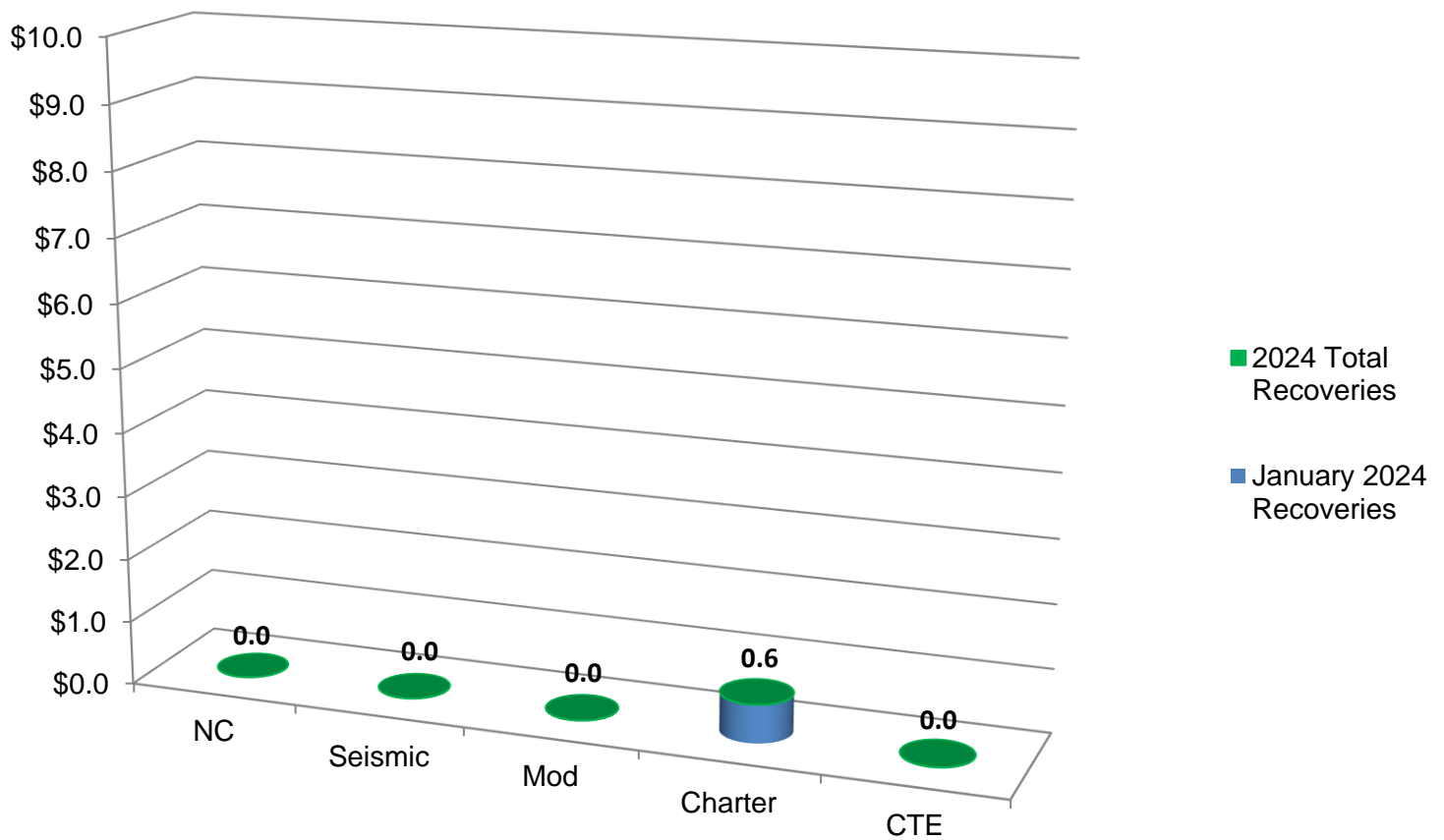

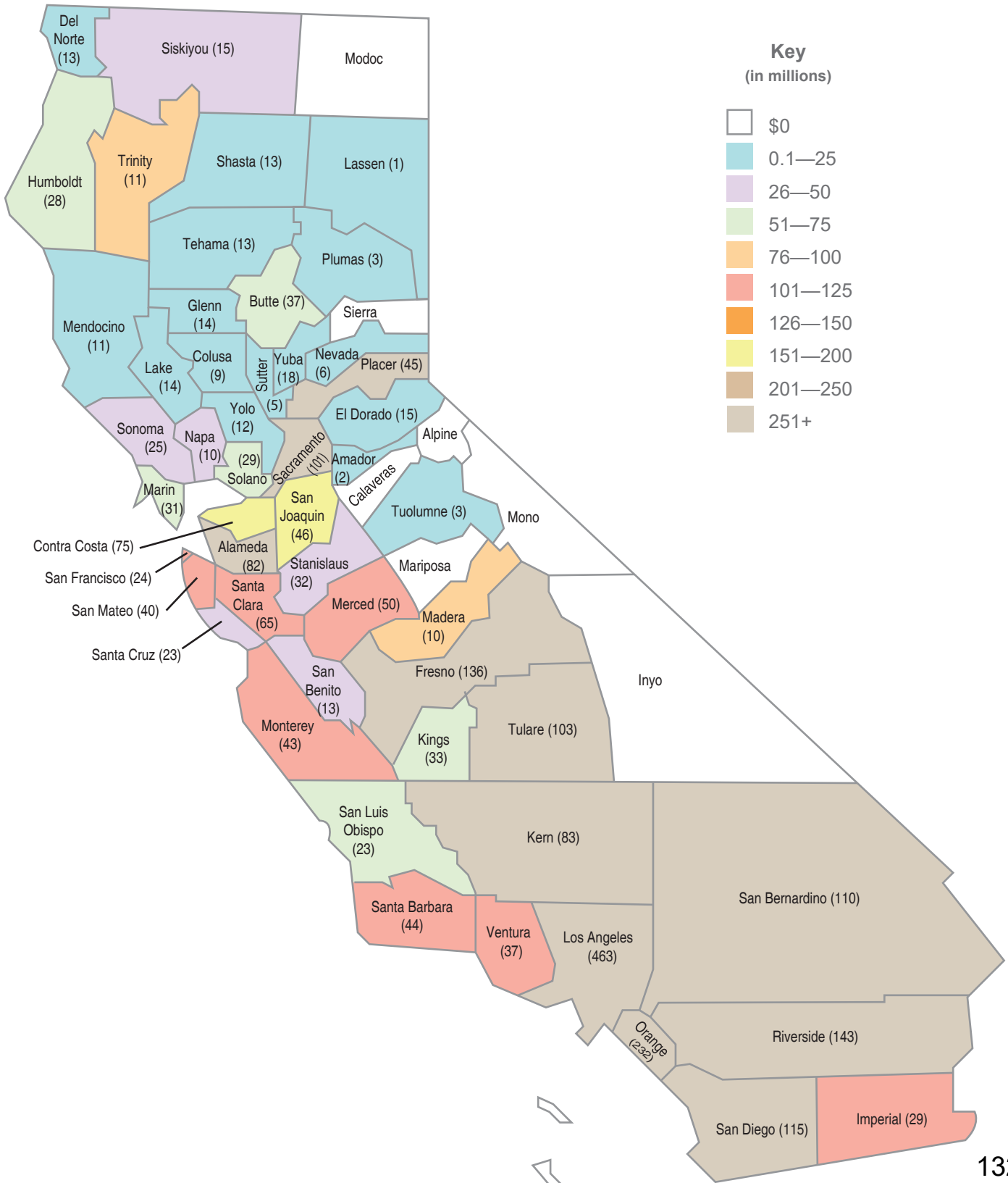

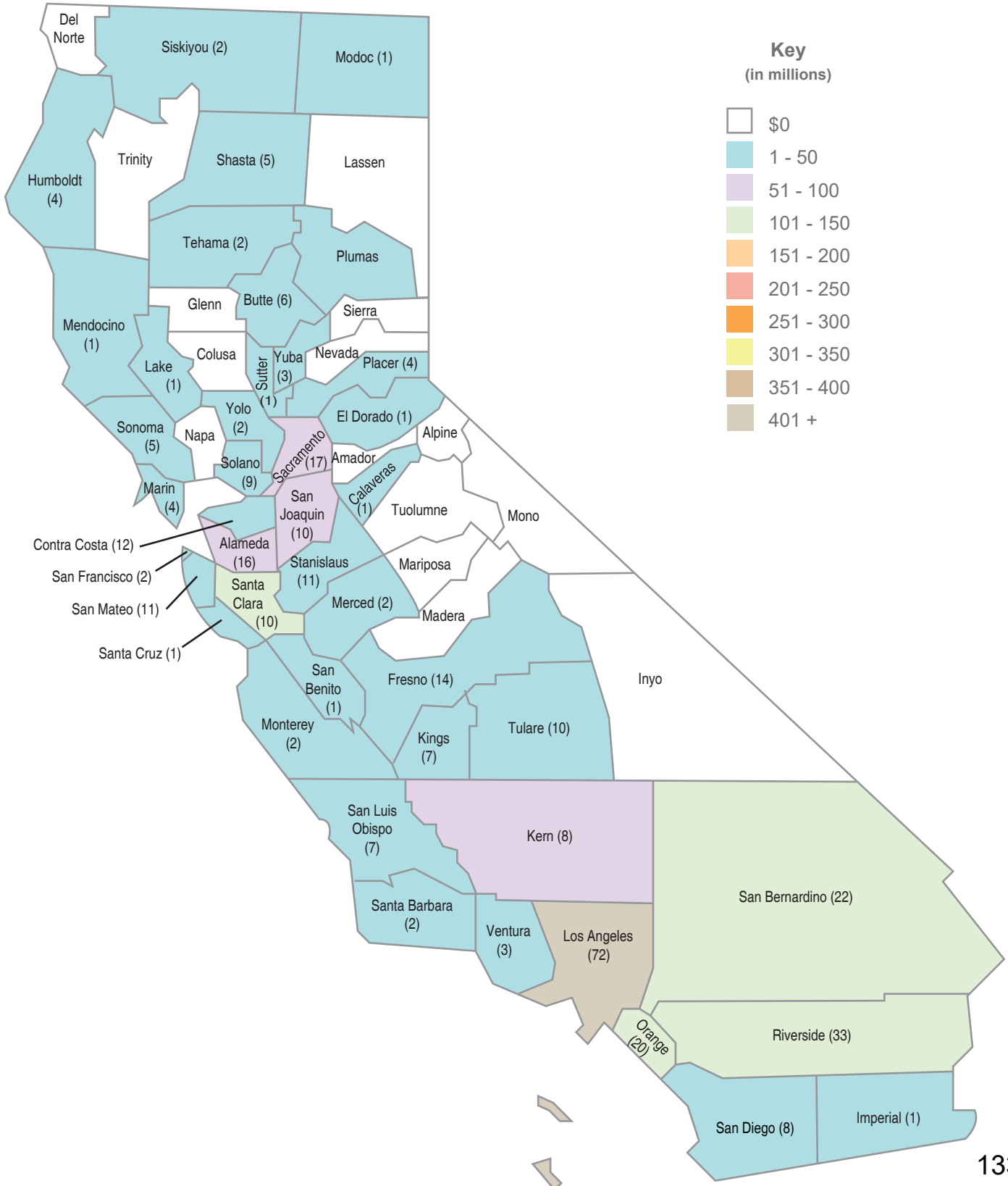
## School Facility Program Proposition 51 Apportionments by County

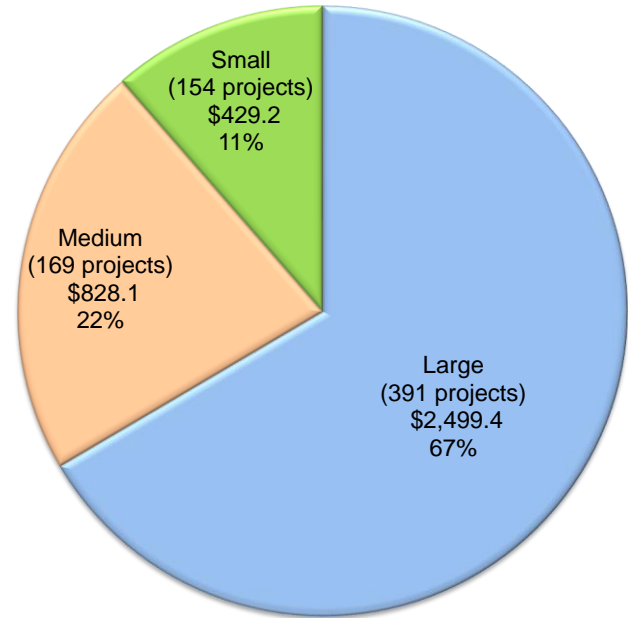

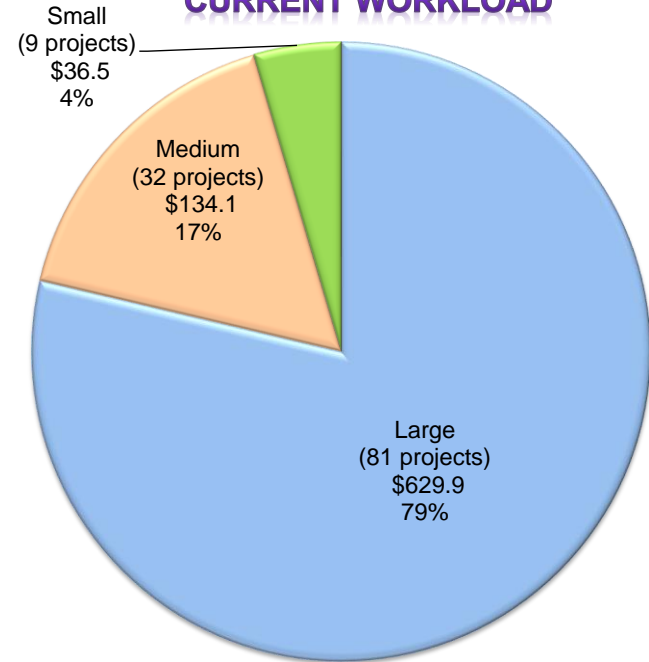

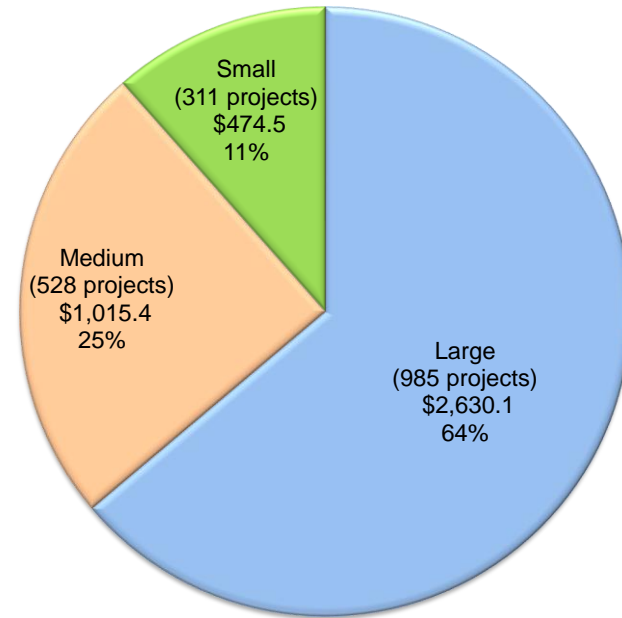

## LEGAL ANALYSIS REGARDING ADJUSTMENTS TO SCHOOL FACILITY PROGRAM GRANTS

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To present the State Allocation Board (Board) information on the Board's legal counsel's opinion regarding adjustments to the School Facility Program (SFP) grants.

### DESCRIPTION

This item presents the Board's legal counsel's opinion on the following questions:

1. Can the Board adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, in addition to the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?
2. If the Board does adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, could the Board retroactively apply that additional adjustment to projects previously approved with the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?

### AUTHORITY

See Attachment A.

### BACKGROUND

At the January 24, 2024 Board meeting, staff presented an item for the Annual Adjustment to SFP Grants. Staff recommended a 1.33 percent reduction to the SFP grants based on the RS Means Construction Cost Index (CCI), consistent with the Board's January 2016 adoption of the RS Means CCI.

A motion was made, and seconded, to approve staff's recommendation to adopt the decrease of 1.33 percent for the 2024 SFP grants based on the RS Means CCI. The Chair called for a roll-call vote and the motion was held open.

The Board discussed this item further and after a lengthy discussion, a second motion was made, and seconded, that consisted of three parts: 1) adopt the staff recommendation which provided a decrease of 1.33 percent for the 2024 SFP grants based on the RS Means CCI; 2) direct staff to research alternative indices, including costs and time to implement, to use for the construction cost adjustment and provide monthly status updates on both indices and also ongoing bond negotiations with the Legislature and Administration; and 3) request a legal opinion from the Board's counsel to determine: a) if the Board can adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year; and b) if the Board does adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, can the Board retroactively apply that additional adjustment to previously approved projects with the amount adopted by the Board at its January 24, 2024 meeting. The motion was approved by the Board.

## LEGAL ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

**Question 1** – Can the Board adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, in addition to the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?

Education Code section 17072.10(b), which governs New Construction grants, states “[t]he board **annually** shall adjust the per-unhoused-pupil apportionment to reflect construction cost changes, as set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction as determined by the board.” [Emphasis added.]

Education Code section 17074.10(b), which governs Modernization grants, contains similar language, stating “[t]he board shall **annually** adjust the factors set forth in subdivision (a) according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction, as determined by the board.” [Emphasis added.]

The accompanying regulations for both SFP grants are nearly identical, stating that the grant amounts for both “will be adjusted **annually** based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January.” (See SFP Regulation section 1859.71 for New Construction grants, and section 1859.78 for Modernization grants.) [Emphasis added.]

The court has held that where the language of a statute is unambiguous, the plain meaning controls. (*Bitner v. Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation* (2023) 87 Cal.App.5th 1048.) Here, annual is defined as either “[o]ccurring once every year; yearly,” as in “annual meeting,” or “[o]f, relating to, or involving a period of one year,” as in “annual income.” (Black’s Law Dictionary (11th ed. 2019).) A broad search of the references to “annual” also indicates that annual refers to occurrence once a year. As such, only one adjustment can be legally made per year.

Further, the regulations state that the adjustment will occur annually “as approved by the Board each January,” which further limits the Board’s action of making an adjustment to once a year, in January.<sup>1</sup>

The Board approved adjustments to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts twice in the same calendar year on one occasion in the history of the SFP. However, this is highly rare and was done to correct a clerical error. At its January 27, 2016 meeting, the Board unanimously selected the RS Means CCI as the index for annual adjustments on a permanent basis, and approved a 0.27 percent adjustment based on the RS Means CCI. However, it was discovered after the January 27, 2016 meeting that the source data RS Means provided to staff was incorrect, and the Board subsequently corrected the adjustment to 2.79 percent at the February 24, 2016 meeting through the consent agenda. Since this instance involved the correction of an error in the calculation of the adjustment, it does not have any application to our present situation.

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<sup>1</sup> There have been several past instances in which the Board approved adjustments to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts after January of that given year. This most recently occurred in 2022, when data was not submitted by RS Means until shortly before the January 26, 2022 Board meeting, rendering it impossible for the Board to act in January. Thus, the item was withdrawn and heard at the February 23, 2022 Board meeting. SFP grants were also adjusted in non-January months in 2016 (January and February), 2015 (April), 2009 (February), 2005 (March), and 1999 (February).

LEGAL ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

In 2005, the Board did consider two different indices at two different Board meetings, but only one motion for one index was made and approved. At the January 26, 2005 meeting, OPSC presented the annual adjustment for the SFP grants based on the Marshall & Swift 10 Western States index, which would have granted an 11.26 percent increase from 2004. During discussion on the item, a Board member noted that the Board had adopted amended regulations that would delete the specific reference to the 10 Western States index in SFP regulations; this would allow the Board to consider alternative indices. Since the regulation was still going through the administrative process, the member made what he termed a “complicated motion” – to make apportionments that were based on the 10 Western States index but were not “final until further adjustment is made based on the index approved by the Board following the Office of Administrative Law finalizing...construction cost index regulations approved by the Board in October of 2004.” Importantly, this motion ***did not*** move to approve the annual adjustment for the SFP grants based on the Marshall & Swift index for 10 Western States, but just moved to grant apportionments that were not final. This motion was seconded and approved; no other motion was made to approve the annual adjustment for the SFP grants at that meeting.

Subsequently, by the March 30, 2005 meeting, the regulations mentioned at the January 2005 meeting had been approved by the Office of Administrative Law. Thus, an item was presented at the March 30, 2005 meeting by OPSC, recommending that the Board adopt a different Marshall & Swift index, the Marshall & Swift 8 California Cities index, which focused only on construction costs in cities that were within California.<sup>2</sup> The Board moved to “adopt the M&S 8 California Cities Class B CCI for the 2005 grant amount adjustment, approve the index of 1.3 for the MS 8, ...direct staff to bring back January through March 2005 SFP projects to increase the grant amount,” and utilize the index for at least two years (through January 2007).

Thus, although OPSC presented two different indices at two different 2005 Board meetings, the Board only moved to approve ***one*** index and only ***one*** index was actually approved by the Board during that calendar year.

Since the statutes that allow an adjustment to the SFP grants state that the adjustments can only be done “annually” and “annual” is defined to only occur once per year, the Board does ***not*** have the ability to adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the same year. This is consistent with the Board’s prior practice, save for 2016 which involved the correction of an error.

***Question 2*** – If the Board does adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the year, could the Board retroactively apply that additional adjustment to projects previously approved with the adjustment adopted by the Board on January 24, 2024?

Since the Board does not have the ability to adopt an additional adjustment to the SFP grants later in the same year, this question is moot.

## ATTACHMENT A

### Education Code Section 17070.63

(a) The total funding provided under this chapter shall constitute the state's full and final contribution to the project and for eligibility for state facilities funding represented by the number of unhoused pupils for which the school district is receiving the state grant. As a condition of receipt of funds, a school district shall certify that the grant amount, combined with local funds, shall be sufficient to complete the school construction project for which the grant is intended.

(b) Any funds provided to a school district under any article in this chapter may not be counted towards the local match for receipt of funds under any other article in this chapter.

(c) Any savings achieved by the district's efficient and prudent expenditure of these funds shall be retained by the district in the county fund for expenditure by the district for other high priority capital outlay purposes.

(Added by Stats. 1998, Ch. 407, Sec. 4. Effective August 27, 1998.)

### Education Code Section 17072.10

(a) The board shall determine the maximum total new construction grant eligibility of an applicant by multiplying the number of unhoused pupils calculated pursuant to Article 3 (commencing with Section 17071.75) in each school district with an approved application for new construction, by the per-unhoused-pupil grant as follows:

- (1) Five thousand two hundred dollars (\$5,200) for elementary school pupils.
- (2) Five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) for middle school pupils.
- (3) Seven thousand two hundred dollars (\$7,200) for high school pupils.

(b) The board annually shall adjust the per-unhoused-pupil apportionment to reflect construction cost changes, as set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction as determined by the board.

(c) Regulations adopted by the board prior to July 1, 2000, that adjust the amounts identified in this section for qualifying individuals with exceptional needs, as defined in Section 56026, as amended after July 1, 2000, in consideration of the recommendations provided pursuant to Section 17072.15, shall continue in effect. An increase made to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts set forth in subdivision (a), on or after January 1, 2010, including, but not limited to, those made pursuant to Section 17072.11 on or after January 1, 2010, also shall be made to the per-unhoused-pupil who is a qualifying individual with exceptional needs grant amounts established pursuant to this subdivision. If an increase to the per-unhoused-pupil grant amounts differentiates among the pupil groups based on whether the pupils are elementary, middle, or high school pupils, the Office of Public School Construction shall recommend to the board, within 60 days of that increase, a methodology to adjust the per-unhoused-pupil grant amount for pupils who are qualifying individuals with exceptional needs so that those adjustments appropriately reflect the increases.

(d) The board may establish a single supplemental per-unhoused-pupil grant in addition to the amounts specified in subdivision (a) based on the statewide average marginal difference in costs in instances where a project requires multilevel school facilities due to limited acreage. The application of a school district shall demonstrate that a practical alternative site is not available.

(e) For a school district having an enrollment of 2,500 or less for the prior fiscal year, the board may approve a supplemental apportionment of up to seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500) for any new construction project assistance. The amount of the supplemental apportionment authorized pursuant to this subdivision shall be adjusted in 2008 and every year thereafter by an amount equal to the percentage adjustment for class B construction.

(Amended by Stats. 2009, Ch. 349, Sec. 1. (SB 334) Effective January 1, 2010. Section operative January 1, 2008, by its own provisions.)

#### Education Code Section 17072.11

(a) All of the following shall apply on and after July 1, 2006:

- (1) The per-unhoused-pupil grant eligibility determined under paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (a) of Section 17072.10 shall be increased by 7 percent.
- (2) The per-unhoused-pupil grant eligibility determined under paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) of Section 17072.10 shall be increased by 4 percent.
- (3) The board shall conduct an analysis of the relationship between the per-unhoused-pupil grant eligibility determined under this article and the per-pupil cost of new school construction for elementary, middle, and high school pupils.

(b) On or after January 1, 2008, the board shall increase or decrease the per-unhoused-pupil grant eligibility determined pursuant to subdivision (a) by amounts it deems necessary to cause the grants to correspond to costs of new school construction, provided that the increase in any fiscal year pursuant to this section shall not exceed 6 percent.

(Amended by Stats. 2007, Ch. 730, Sec. 9. Effective January 1, 2008.)

#### Education Code Section 17074.10

(a) The board shall determine the total funding eligibility of a school district for modernization funding by multiplying the following amounts by each pupil of that grade level housed in school buildings that satisfy the requirements of Section 17073.15:

- (1) Two thousand two hundred forty-six dollars (\$2,246) for each elementary pupil.
- (2) Two thousand three hundred seventy-six dollars (\$2,376) for each middle school pupil.
- (3) Three thousand one hundred ten dollars (\$3,110) for each high school pupil.

(b) The board shall annually adjust the factors set forth in subdivision (a) according to the adjustment for inflation set forth in the statewide cost index for class B construction, as determined by the board.

(c) The board may adopt regulations to be effective until July 1, 2000, that adjust the amounts identified in this section for qualifying individuals with exceptional needs, as defined in Section 56026. The regulations shall be amended after July 1, 2000, in consideration of the recommendations provided pursuant to Section 17072.15.

(d) It is the intent of the Legislature that the amounts provided pursuant to this article for school modernization do not include funding for administrative and overhead costs.

(e) For a school district having an enrollment of 2,500 or less for the prior fiscal year, the board may approve a supplemental apportionment of up to two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) for any modernization project assistance. The amount of the supplemental apportionment shall be adjusted in 2001 and every year thereafter by an amount equal to the percentage adjustment for class B construction.

(f) For a portable classroom that is eligible for a second modernization, the board shall require the school district to use the modernization funds to replace the portable classroom and to certify that the existing eligible portable classroom will be removed from any classroom use, unless the school district is able to document that modernizing the portable classroom is a better use of public resources. The capacity and eligibility of the school district shall not be adjusted for replacing a portable classroom pursuant to this subdivision and Section 17073.15.

(Amended by Stats. 2003, Ch. 587, Sec. 3. Effective January 1, 2004.)

#### School Facility Program (SFP) Regulation Section 1859.2

“Class B Construction Cost Index” is a construction factor index for structures made of reinforced concrete or steel frames, concrete floors, and roofs, and accepted and used by the Board.

#### SFP Regulation Section 1859.71

The new construction per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17072.10(a), will be adjusted annually based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January. The base Class B Construction Cost Index shall be 1.30 and the first adjustment shall be January, 1999.

The new construction per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17072.10(a), may be increased by an additional amount not to exceed six percent in a fiscal year, or decreased, based on the analysis of the current cost to build schools as reported on the Project Information Worksheet (Revised 05/10) which shall be submitted with the Forms SAB 50-05 and 50-06 and as approved by the Board.

For any changes or additions to the regulations adopted by the Board in 1999, those changes shall be adjusted in accordance with this Section at the time the regulations are adopted.

#### SFP Regulation Section 1859.78

The modernization per-unhoused-pupil grant amount, as provided by Education Code Section 17074.10(a), will be adjusted annually based on the change in the Class B Construction Cost Index as approved by the Board each January. The base Class B Construction Cost Index shall be 1.30 and the first adjustment shall be January, 1999.

## LOCAL AUDITS UPDATE

### PURPOSE OF REPORT

To inform the State Allocation Board (Board) of local audits certified by the State Controller's Office (SCO) for January 2023 through January 2024.

### DESCRIPTION

An audit of a local educational agency's expenditures by an independent auditor is required within one year of a project's final expenditure report, or once three years elapse from the date of the final fund release for an elementary school project or four years for a middle or high school project, whichever occurs first. All local audits are required to be submitted, reviewed, and certified by SCO. Once certified, a copy of the local audit report is forwarded to the Office Public School Construction (OPSC). Staff is informing the Board of how many audits have been certified by SCO from January 27, 2023, to January 26, 2024, and disclosing audit findings reported.

### AUTHORITY

Education Code (EC) Section 41024 states in part:

(a)(1)(5) Any project identified on a local educational agency's detailed list of expenditures pursuant to paragraph (1) that is reported complete during the 2017-18 fiscal year shall be audited in accordance with the audit guide required by Section 14502.1 for the 2018-19 fiscal year. All other completed projects shall be audited in accordance with the audit guide required by Section 14502.1 for the fiscal year in which the project is reported complete.

(c) (1) The auditor conducting the audit pursuant to this section shall file the audit with the Controller within 60 days of the completion of the audit. The Controller shall be allowed access to audit working papers. Adjustments pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) shall not be appealable to the Education Audit Appeals Panel pursuant to this section.

Education Code (EC) Section 17375 states in part:

(a)(1) The California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program is hereby established, under the administration of the State Allocation Board pursuant to the requirements of this section, to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing transitional kindergarten classrooms and full-day kindergarten classrooms pursuant to Section 8973, and for the construction of new preschool classrooms, the modernization of existing preschool classrooms, or the modernization of existing kindergarten and grade 1 to 12, inclusive, classrooms that would be converted to provide California state preschool programs operated by school districts on a public schoolsite, pursuant to this section.



## AUTHORITY (cont.)

(i) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district shall be subject, with regard to this section, to an audit conducted pursuant to Section 41024.

The full text of EC Sections 41024 and 17375 is included in Attachment A.

## BACKGROUND

Statute requires a local educational agency that receives any funds pursuant to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1) to annually report a detailed list of all expenditures of state funds, including interest, and of the local educational agency's matching funds for completed projects until all state funds, including interest, all of the local educational agency's matching funds, and savings achieved, including interest, pursuant to EC Section 17070.63, are expended in accordance with the requirements of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local educational agency.

In addition, statute requires that all School Facility Program (SFP) projects funded after July 1, 2017, have an audit conducted by a certified public accountant (CPA). The audit shall be completed within one year of project completion. The completed audit reports are submitted to SCO for review and certification. Staff analysis below summarizes information related to certified audit reports received for the 2023 calendar year as of January 26, 2024, and the dollar amount associated with any audit findings.

## STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS

Two hundred ninety-eight audit reports were received by SCO in the 2023 calendar year, of which, zero have been certified. Fifty-six reports from prior years that were previously rejected, or delinquent have been certified. A total of fifty-six reports have been certified during this reporting period (see Attachment B for a listing of the projects certified from January 27, 2023, through January 26, 2024). Two of the certified reports disclosed audit findings in the total amount of \$247,778 for ineligible costs to be returned to the state.

*Status of Audit Reports Submitted to SCO during 2023 calendar year as of January 26, 2024:*

- Fifty-six reports were certified by SCO during this period.
  - 0 audit reports from 2023.
  - Fifty-six audit reports from prior years.
- Two hundred ninety-eight reports are currently in the audit review process.
  - Two hundred twenty-one reports have been preliminarily accepted, and seventy-seven reports have been preliminarily rejected. Preliminarily accepted or preliminarily rejected are reports that have been completed and are pending sign off.

STAFF ANALYSIS/STATEMENTS (cont.)

- Twenty-eight reports from a prior year were rejected. The CPA firms have been notified about the necessary revisions/corrections that must be made for the report to be certified. Audit reports were rejected by SCO because they did not meet the reporting standards contained in the Guide for Annual Audits of K-12 Local Education Agencies and State Compliance Reporting, Appendix B or Appendix C (K-12 Audit Guide).

The information below summarizes the status of SCO audits for 2023.

\*Fifty-six audit reports were certified since January of 2023. Four of those audit reports were received in 2021 and fifty-two were received in 2022.

\*\*Two projects had ineligible expenditures totaling \$247,778 due back the state. One project had an expenditure for \$107,368 that was for another school site and the second project had \$140,410 in expenditures outside the scope of the grant agreement.

The following factors may have contributed to successful audit processes and audit reports which contained minimal audit findings:

- 1) The required grant agreement provides detailed and transparent guidance for the reporting of eligible expenditures, including appendices detailing specific types of eligible and ineligible expenditures.
- 2) OPSC participated in the K-12 Audit Guide Working Group and collaborated with representatives from SCO, the California Department of Education, the Education Audit Appeals Panel, and CPA firms in developing required audit procedures to be published in the K-12 Audit Guide.
- 3) As subject matter experts, OPSC provided continual technical assistance and answers to inquiries regarding the audits to CPAs, local educational agencies, and consultants through emails and phone calls throughout 2023.
- 4) Continued outreach and training provided by OPSC staff. The virtual training, FAQs (Frequent Asked Questions), and past workshops including the California CPA Foundation, the Small School Districts Association (SSDA), and the Coalition for Adequate School Housing (CASH) have provided education, training, and guidance related to the audit process.

## ATTACHMENT A

### AUTHORITY

Education Code Section 41024 states:

(a) (1) Commencing April 1, 2017, a local educational agency that receives any funds pursuant to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1) shall annually report a detailed list of all expenditures of state funds, including interest, and of the local educational agency's matching funds for completed projects until all state funds, including interest, all of the local educational agency's matching funds, and savings achieved, including interest, pursuant to Section 17070.63, are expended in accordance with the requirements of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998, associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local educational agency. A local educational agency's detailed list of expenditures shall identify expenditures on a project-by-project basis, reflect completed projects that were reimbursed within that fiscal year, and shall clearly indicate the list of projects that have been completed.

(2) For purposes of this section, the determination that a project is complete shall be in accordance with the regulations adopted pursuant to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1).

(3) The total amount of interest earned on the state funds shall be reported on the final expenditure report upon completion of a project. For the purposes of determining the total amount of interest earned on the state funds, interest shall be considered to accrue from the time state funds are deposited in the local educational agency's account until the time the local educational agency submits the final expenditure report to the Office of Public School Construction.

(4) Commencing April 1, 2017, a local educational agency participating in the school facilities program shall ensure that it retains all financial accounts, documents, and records necessary for an audit of completed projects pursuant to Section 16026 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations. For purposes of this paragraph and in compliance with any applicable state and federal standards, a local educational agency may maintain records electronically.

(5) Any project identified on a local educational agency's detailed list of expenditures pursuant to paragraph (1) that is reported complete during the 2017–18 fiscal year shall be audited in accordance with the audit guide required by Section 14502.1 for the 2018–19 fiscal year. All other completed projects shall be audited in accordance with the audit guide required by Section 14502.1 for the fiscal year in which the project is reported complete.

(6) The audit described in this section shall be completed within one year of project completion as determined by Section 1859.104 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.

(b) (1) Commencing with audits of the 2018–19 fiscal year, the Controller shall include instructions in the audit guide required by Section 14502.1 that include, but are not necessarily limited to, procedures for determining all of the following:

(A) Whether funds identified by a local educational agency on its detailed list of expenditures pursuant to paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) have been expended in accordance with the requirements of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1), associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local

educational agency. Any funds not expended in accordance with these requirements shall be disallowed and considered an audit finding.

(B) That savings achieved, including interest, pursuant to Section 17070.63, are used for other high priority capital outlay purposes identified by the local educational agency or returned to the Office of Public School Construction, and are used in accordance with the requirements of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1), associated regulations, and as specified in any accompanying grant agreement.

(C) Adjustments to the grant amounts received by a local educational agency for site acquisition costs based upon the local educational agency's final approved expenditures as required pursuant to Sections 1859.105 and 1859.106 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.

(D) Adjustments to the grant amounts received by a local educational agency associated with the substantial progress requirements reflected in the program reporting requirements pursuant to Section 1859.104 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.

(2) Any amounts or adjustments identified pursuant to subparagraphs (C) and (D) of paragraph (1) shall be identified within a local educational agency's audit, but shall not be considered an audit finding for purposes of this section.

(c) (1) The auditor conducting the audit pursuant to this section shall file the audit with the Controller within 60 days of the completion of the audit. The Controller shall be allowed access to audit working papers. Adjustments pursuant to paragraph (2) of subdivision (b) shall not be appealable to the Education Audit Appeals Panel pursuant to this section.

(2) Within 60 days of the receipt of the certified audit, and after determining that the audit conforms with the reporting standards contained in the audit guide, the Controller shall do both of the following:

(A) Provide the department a copy of the certified audit.

(B) Notify the Office of Public School Construction of any audit findings pursuant to this section and any amounts or adjustments identified pursuant to clause (iii) and provide the Office of Public School Construction with a copy of the certified audit identifying the amounts to be adjusted if, as a result of the audit conducted in accordance with the requirements of subdivisions (a) and (b), the auditor determines any of the following:

(i) A local educational agency has unspent funds for the project not identified as savings pursuant to Section 17070.63 that shall be returned pursuant to subparagraphs (C) and (D) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b), and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local educational agency.

(ii) A local educational agency is subject to an increase or decrease in funds provided pursuant to subparagraphs (C) and (D) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b), and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local educational agency.

(iii) A local educational agency did not expend funds in accordance with the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1) and any accompanying grant agreement signed by a local educational agency.

(3) Upon receipt of the certified audit, the Office of Public School Construction shall present any grant adjustments required pursuant to clauses (i) and (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) for a specified project to the State Allocation Board for an adjustment to the project apportionment. Funds identified for purposes of clauses (i) and (ii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) shall be apportioned from, or returned to, the appropriate funds, as established in the State Treasury pursuant to Section 17070.40 or 17070.41, as applicable. If a school district is required to return unspent funds, the fund source for returned funds shall be the county school facilities fund established pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 17070.43.

(4) A local educational agency may appeal the audit finding pursuant to the timelines and process established in subdivision (d) of Section 41344. The procedures set out in subdivision (d) of Section 41344.1 do not apply to the audit required by this section.

(5) The Office of Public School Construction shall ensure that the local educational agency has corrected the audit finding by implementing a required penalty payment of funds equal to the amount of funds disallowed in the audit finding pursuant to the process specified in subdivision (d).

(d) (1) If, as the result of the audit, a local educational agency is required to pay funds pursuant to clause (iii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c), the Office of Public School Construction shall recover the funds from the local educational agency.

(2) If the local educational agency has submitted an appeal to the Education Audit Appeals Panel pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 41344, the Office of Public School Construction shall not recover funds until following the determination of the appeal.

(3) A local educational agency may use any local fund source to pay the disallowed amount pursuant to clause (iii) of subparagraph (B) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (c) so long as there is no legal prohibition regarding the use of those funds for this purpose.

(4) A local educational agency may request from the Office of Public School Construction a repayment plan within 90 days of receiving the final audit report, or within 30 days of withdrawing or receiving a final determination regarding an appeal pursuant to subdivision (d) of Section 41344 and subdivision (b) of Section 41344.1, as applicable. The Office of Public School Construction and the Director of Finance, or their designees, jointly shall establish a plan for payment. The payment plan shall be established in accordance with the following:

(A) If the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction and the Director of Finance, in consultation with the department, concur that repayment of the disallowed amount in the current fiscal year would constitute a severe financial hardship for the local educational agency, they may jointly approve a plan of equal annual payments over a period of up to eight years. The plan may include interest on each year's outstanding balance at the rate earned on the state's Pooled Money Investment Account during that year. The executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction and the Director of Finance jointly shall establish this plan. At the time the local educational agency is notified, the Controller also shall be notified of the plan by the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction. The Controller shall withhold the annual amount established pursuant to the plan from the local educational agency's principal apportionment or Education Protection Account payments.

(B) Notwithstanding subparagraph (A), if the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction and the Director of Finance, in consultation with the department, concur that repayment of the disallowed amount over an eight-year period would require the local educational agency to request an emergency apportionment pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 41320) of, and Article 2.5 (commencing with Section 41325) of,

Chapter 3, they may approve a plan of equal annual payments over a period of up to 20 years. The plan shall include interest on each year's outstanding balance at the rate earned on the state's Pooled Money Investment Account during that year. The Controller shall withhold the annual amount established pursuant to the plan from the local educational agency's principal apportionment or Education Protection Account payments.

(C) If a payment plan submitted pursuant to this section is not approved by the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction and the Director of Finance, in consultation with the department, or is not requested by the local educational agency, the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction shall invoice the local educational agency for the entire disallowed amount. If the local educational agency does not remit payment for the invoice within 120 days of issuance, the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction shall request that the Controller withhold the entire disallowed amount from the local educational agency's principal apportionment or Education Protection Account payments.

(D) (i) Funds recovered by the executive officer of the Office of Public School Construction or withheld by the Controller pursuant to this section shall be deposited into the appropriate state school facilities fund, as established in the State Treasury pursuant to Section 17070.40 or 17070.41, as applicable.

(ii) Funds remitted to the Office of Public School Construction by a local educational agency from local fund sources, as authorized by paragraph (3), shall be deposited into the appropriate state school facilities fund, as established in the State Treasury pursuant to Section 17070.40 or 17070.41, as applicable.

(e) As used in this section, "audit or review" and "local educational agency" shall have the same meaning as the terms are defined in paragraphs (1) and (2) of subdivision (e) of Section 41344.

(f) The State Allocation Board shall not waive all or any part of this section, any grant agreement or provisions of a grant agreement signed by a local educational agency that receives any funds pursuant to the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10 of Division 1 of Title 1), or any regulation adopted that implements a provision of this section.

(g) In any appeal filed pursuant to Section 41344 and this section, the Office of Public School Construction, the Department of Finance, and the department may timely move to intervene as a party.

(h) If the Office of Public School Construction chooses not to intervene in an appeal, the administrative law judge conducting the hearing, or the Education Audit Appeals Panel, may request that the Office of Public School Construction issue and file in the appeal an objective interpretation of any applicable law, regulation, or term of the grant agreement within 30 days of the request or such longer period as the administrative law judge or the Education Audit Appeals Panel deems reasonable. The Office of Public School Construction's filing shall not argue or seek to resolve issues of fact, but may state how a particular law, regulation, or grant agreement term applies to competing factual contentions. The agent of the Office of Public School Construction shall be precluded from acting as a party once a request pursuant to this subdivision is made.

(i) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), this section shall not apply to any school facilities project that was apportioned before July 1, 2017.

*(Amended by Stats. 2023, Ch. 48, Sec. 20. (SB 114) Effective July 10, 2023.)*

Education Code Section 17375 states:

(a) (1) The California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Grant Program is hereby established, under the administration of the State Allocation Board pursuant to the requirements of this section, to provide one-time grants to school districts to construct new school facilities or retrofit existing school facilities for the purpose of providing transitional kindergarten classrooms and full-day kindergarten classrooms pursuant to Section 8973, and for the construction of new preschool classrooms, the modernization of existing preschool classrooms, or the modernization of existing kindergarten and grade 1 to 12, inclusive, classrooms that would be converted to provide California state preschool programs operated by school districts on a public schoolsite, pursuant to this section.

(2) Moneys appropriated pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, hereby created in the State Treasury, administered by the State Allocation Board.

(3) For the 2018–19 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section, as it read on December 31, 2020.

(4) (A) For the 2021–22 fiscal year, the sum of four hundred ninety million dollars (\$490,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2027.

(B) For the 2022–23 fiscal year, the sum of one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund in the 2021–22 fiscal year to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. The funds appropriated in this subparagraph shall be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2028.

(C) It is the intent of the Legislature to appropriate an additional five hundred fifty million dollars (\$550,000,000) in the 2024–25 fiscal year from the General Fund to the State Allocation Board to provide one-time grants as specified in this section. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funds intended to be appropriated in this subparagraph will be available for encumbrance or expenditure by the State Allocation Board until June 30, 2030.

(D) (i) Of the moneys allocated to a school district from the appropriation made pursuant to this paragraph, savings and interest achieved upon full completion of an approved project, and as a result of a school district's efficient and prudent expenditure of the moneys allocated, may be used for professional development or instructional materials to build capacity for the implementation of a California state preschool program, a transitional kindergarten program, a full-day kindergarten program, or high priority capital outlay purposes identified by the school district and in accordance with subdivision (f), associated regulations, and any accompanying grant agreement.

(ii) Notwithstanding any other law, for purposes of the funds appropriated in support of this paragraph only, a school district may retain and use savings and interest pursuant to clause (i) even if it receives financial hardship assistance pursuant to Section 17075.10.

(iii) Savings and interest retained by a school district shall be expended within one year of project completion or returned to the state as required by associated regulations and any accompanying grant agreement.

(5) New school facilities built pursuant to this section shall not be included in the eligibility determination used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10).

(b) (1) The State Allocation Board shall award grants to school districts that lack the facilities to provide transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten as required for eligibility pursuant to Sections 17071.25 and 17072.10, that lack facilities that satisfy the design requirements required for new kindergarten classrooms as specified in paragraph (2) of subdivision (h) of Section 14030 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, or that lack the facility capacity to increase California state preschool program services.

(2) Priority for grants shall be given to school districts that meet either of the following criteria:

(A) The school district is financially unable to contribute a portion of, or all of, the local matching share required pursuant to paragraph (3) for a project, and meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Sections 17075.10 and 17075.15. For purposes of this section, paragraph (5) of subdivision (d) of Section 17075.15 shall not apply.

(B) (i) For school districts seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved community with a high population of pupils who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 42238.01.

(ii) For school districts seeking a preschool facilities grant, the school district is located in an underserved area, as defined in Section 8205, that is prioritized to receive funds for the California state preschool program according to the prioritization process described in Section 8210.

(3) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10 and as specified in paragraph (4), a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for new construction shall provide 50 percent of the cost of the project, and a school district that applies for a grant pursuant to this section for a retrofit project shall provide 40 percent of the cost of the project.

(4) Except for school districts that meet the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, a school district shall provide 25 percent of the cost of the project, whether the project is for new construction or retrofit, if the school district does either of the following:

(A) Converts a part-day kindergarten program to a full-day kindergarten program. A school district that was awarded a grant from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (3) of subdivision (a) and met the requirements of this paragraph shall have its grant amount adjusted from funds appropriated pursuant to paragraph (4) of subdivision (a) to reflect the requirements of this paragraph.

(B) Commencing with the 2021–22 fiscal year, offers, or expands enrollment in, a California state preschool program or transitional kindergarten program.

(5) (A) A school district seeking a transitional kindergarten or full-day kindergarten facilities grant from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day



Kindergarten Facilities Account shall provide the Office of Public School Construction with schoolsite enrollment data for the year in which its application is processed and the three immediately preceding years. The Office of Public School Construction shall use this data to verify the schoolsite's overall need for funding pursuant to this section based on the schoolsite's enrollment patterns. As part of this verification, the Office of Public School Construction, in consultation with the State Department of Education, shall determine if the schoolsite's need for funding shall be limited to retrofit projects.

(B) For a school district seeking a new construction grant for preschool classrooms from moneys in the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, the school district shall demonstrate that its existing classrooms, including outdoor play areas and equipment, are insufficient to meet the needs of providing preschool, and that the school district's projected enrollment in the preschool program exceeds the current preschool program classroom capacity at the applicable schoolsite. A school district shall use both of the following to demonstrate enrollment for purposes of determining eligibility:

- (i) The most recent childcare needs assessment conducted by its regional local planning council for preschool age children.
- (ii) A current or future contract with the State Department of Education to operate a preschool program.

(6) A school district, county office of education, or community college district seeking a preschool facilities grant shall hold title to the real property where the facilities will be located.

(c) The State Allocation Board shall disburse grant funds to school districts with approved applications for new construction or retrofit projects, to the extent funds are available for the state's applicable matching share, if the school district has provided its applicable local matching share, unless the school district meets the requirements for financial hardship pursuant to Section 17075.10, and upon certification by the school district that the school district has entered into a binding contract for completion of the approved project.

(d) The State Allocation Board shall allocate funds to school districts using the same maximum grant eligibility amounts that are used for purposes of the Leroy F. Greene School Facilities Act of 1998 (Chapter 12.5 (commencing with Section 17070.10) of Part 10), as set forth in Sections 17072.10 and 17072.11 for new construction, and as set forth in Section 17074.10 for retrofit projects.

(e) As a condition of receiving grant funds pursuant to this section, and before the release of those funds, the school district shall do all of the following:

(1) Execute and submit a grant agreement consistent with the applicable sections of the grant agreement specified in Section 1859.90.4 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations.

(2) For a school district applying for grant funds for a transitional kindergarten facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to offer, or expand enrollment in, a transitional kindergarten program.

(3) For a school district applying for grant funds for a California state preschool program facilities project, pass a resolution at a public meeting of the governing board of the school district stating the school district's intent to expand enrollment in a preschool program and apply for expanded program service funding, and certify that the school district has or will apply for a

contract to operate a preschool program before occupying the to-be-constructed or retrofitted facility.

(f) (1) A school district may use grant funds awarded for new construction on costs necessary to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils in an approved project, which shall include only the following:

(A) The costs of design, engineering, testing, inspections, plan checking, construction management, site acquisition and development, evaluation and response action costs relating to hazardous substances at a new or existing schoolsite, demolition, construction, landscaping, necessary utility costs, utility connections and other related fees, equipment including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, furnishings, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.

(B) The costs of acquiring an existing government-owned or privately owned building, or a privately financed school building, and the necessary costs of converting the government-owned or privately owned building for public school use.

(2) (A) A school district may use grant funds awarded for a retrofit project to retrofit an existing school facility to adequately house preschool, transitional kindergarten, and kindergarten pupils, which shall only include the costs of design, engineering, testing, inspection, plan checking, construction management, demolition, construction, necessary utility costs, utility connection and other related fees, the purchase and installation of air-conditioning equipment and insulation materials and related costs, furniture and equipment, including telecommunication equipment to increase school security, fire safety improvements, playground safety improvements, the identification, assessment, or abatement of hazardous asbestos, seismic safety improvements, the upgrading of electrical systems, and the wiring or cabling of classrooms in order to accommodate educational technology.

(B) Grant funds awarded for a retrofit project shall not be used for costs associated with acquisition and development of real property or for routine maintenance and repair.

(3) A school district shall not use funds to purchase or install portable classrooms. For purposes of this article, "portable classroom" means a classroom building of one or more stories that is designed and constructed to be relocatable and transportable over public streets, and for a single-story portable classroom, is designed and constructed for relocation without the separation of the roof or floor from the building and when measured at the most exterior walls, has a floor area that does not exceed 2,000 square feet.

(g) For a modernization grant pursuant to this article to retrofit an existing preschool classroom, including outdoor play areas and installed equipment, the applicable classroom shall comply with all of the following:

(1) The Field Act, as set forth in Article 3 (commencing with Section 17280) and Article 6 (commencing with Section 17365).

(2) The California Building Standards Code, as set forth in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations.

(3) The regulations for early learning and care programs as set forth in Chapter 19 (commencing with Section 18000) of Division 1 of Title 5 of, and Chapter 1 (commencing with Section 101151) of Division 12 of Title 22 of, the California Code of Regulations, as applicable.

(4) Written approval from the State Department of Education that the building plans comply with the standards set forth in Subchapter 1 (commencing with Section 14001) of Chapter 13 of Division 1 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations.

(h) The State Allocation Board may adopt regulations to implement this section. Any regulations adopted pursuant to this section may be adopted as emergency regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Title 2 of the Government Code). The adoption of these regulations shall be deemed to be an emergency and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, or general welfare.

(i) Notwithstanding any other law, a school district shall be subject, with regard to this section, to an audit conducted pursuant to Section 41024.

(j) The Office of Public School Construction shall report to the Director of Finance, and shall post on its internet website, information regarding the use of grant funds that have been made available to school districts during each fiscal year grant funds are disbursed pursuant to this section. A final report shall also be issued after projects have been audited pursuant to Section 41024 and any savings have been spent or returned to the state.

(k) The Department of General Services may charge its administrative costs against the California Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, and Full-Day Kindergarten Facilities Account, which shall be subject to the approval of the Department of Finance and which shall not exceed 2.5 percent of the account. These administrative funds shall be subject to the encumbrance or expenditure availability for the appropriations described in paragraph (4) of subdivision (a).

(l) Funds made available to school districts pursuant to this article shall supplement, not supplant, existing funds available for school facilities construction.

(m) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

(1) "Kindergarten" includes transitional kindergarten, as defined in Section 48000.

(2) "Preschool classroom" means a preschool classroom used or proposed to be used for instructional purposes in a California state preschool program.

(3) "Preschool program" means a full-day California state preschool program pursuant to Article 2 (commencing with Section 8207) of Chapter 2 of Part 6.

(4) "Schoolsite" or "site" means the project site for which the school district is applying for grants under this article.

(5) "School district" means as follows:

(A) For transitional kindergarten and full-day kindergarten facilities grants, "school district" means a school district.

(B) For preschool facilities grants, "school district" means a school district, county office of education, or a community college district that operates a preschool program on behalf of, or in lieu of, a school district or county office of education.

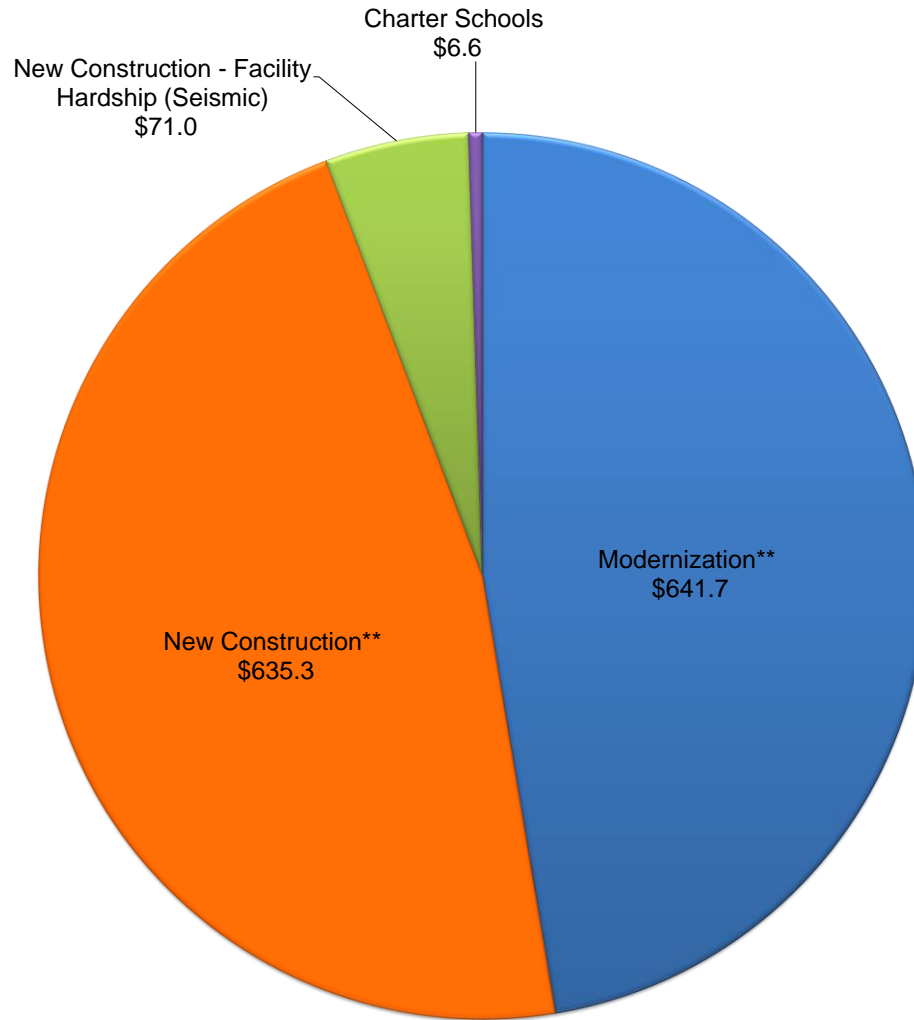

## **Section 1859.81. Financial Hardship.**

Except for Joint-Use Projects and Career Technical Education Facilities Projects, a district is eligible for financial hardship to fund all or a portion of its matching share requirement after demonstrating the requirements of (a), (c), and (d) below:

(a) The district is financially unable to provide all necessary matching funds for an eligible project. To determine this, an analysis shall be made of the district's financial records by the OPSC including data and records maintained by the CDE and the County Office of Education. The analysis shall consist of a review of the district's latest Independent Audit regarding funds available from all capital facility accounts, including, but not limited to, developer fees, funds generated from capital facility certificates of participation, federal grants, redevelopment funds, sale proceeds from surplus property, the appraised value of facilities approved for replacement pursuant to Section 1859.82, bond funds either encumbered, unencumbered or authorized but unsold, and savings from other SFP projects. All funds thus identified that have not been expended or encumbered by a contractual agreement for a specific capital outlay purpose prior to the initial request for financial hardship status shall be deemed available as a matching contribution.

After the initial request for financial hardship status is granted, no further encumbrances will be approved by the OPSC and all prospective revenue made available to the district's capital facility accounts shall be deemed available as matching contribution on the subsequent financial hardship review, with the exception of:

- (1) Approved interim housing expenditures.
- (2) Funding to pay for previously recognized multi-year encumbrances approved at the initial financial hardship approval.
- (3) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Federal Renovation Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum Federal Renovation Grant amount.
- (4) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the School Facilities Needs Assessment Grant Program or Emergency Repair Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (5) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and is used for the express purpose of the Career Technical Education Facilities Program when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the applicant's share of the maximum grant amount apportioned.
- (6) Funding that is transferred into a Special Reserve Fund and used for the express purpose of the Overcrowding Relief Grant when the amount expended out of that fund does not exceed the amount of the site acquisition and design costs of the project and the district has submitted an approved Form SAB 50-11.
- (7) Funding that is used for the express purpose of reimbursing the State a proportionate share of financial hardship received when there has been a transfer of a special education program and title to the facility. In addition, the funding was used within five years of the title transfer.
- (8) Funding to pay for obtaining a structural report pursuant to Section 1859.82.2 for an approvable and funded seismic mitigation project.
- (9) All other capital facility funding for a period of three years when no subsequent financial hardship request is made during this period, with the exception of the funding identified in (6). The three-year period begins with the date of the most recent financial hardship new construction or modernization adjusted grant funding apportionment.

When Overcrowding Relief Grant funding is set aside pursuant to (6) and the School District has not submitted, or the OPSC has not accepted, a Form SAB 50-04 for an Overcrowding Relief Grant within three years from the date of deposit into the Special Reserve Fund, or the School District has not met the requirements in Sections 1859.90 or 1859.105, remaining funds plus interest accrued at the Pooled Money Investment Board rate at that time period shall be deemed available as matching contribution on a subsequent financial hardship project or be captured through an audit adjustment pursuant to Section 1859.106.

The financial hardship analysis is subject to approval by the Board.

(b) From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may retain \$19,776 per classroom in each enrollment reporting period for the cost to provide interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) as follows:

(1) Determine the current enrollment of the district by grade level as shown on the latest Form SAB 50-01.

(2) Determine the New Construction Grants apportioned by grade level for all SFP projects and LPP funded under the provisions of Sections 1859.12 or 1859.13 where the district has submitted Form SAB 50-06 indicating that the project is 100 percent complete.

(3) Subtract (b)(2) from (b)(1).

(4) Determine the number of classrooms by grade level reported in Part 1, Line 8 on Form SAB 50-02.

(5) Multiply the classrooms determined in (b)(4) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe.

(6) Subtract the product determined in (b)(5) from the difference determined in (b)(3) by grade level.

(7) Divide the difference by grade level determined in (b)(6) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per portable toilet unit in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim toilet facilities for the currently unhoused pupils of the district. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of toilet facilities needed for interim housing shall be the sum of the positive numbers determined in (b)(7) divided by eight rounded up to the nearest whole number.

From the funds deemed available as a matching contribution, the district may also retain \$19,776 per classroom in each reporting period for the cost to provide necessary interim housing for the currently unhoused pupils displaced as a result of a SAB approved seismic mitigation project pursuant to Section 1859.82.2. The amount shown shall be adjusted annually in the manner prescribed in Section 1859.71. The number of classrooms needed for interim housing shall be the quotient of the displaced pupils by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

If the district's available funds, as determined by the OPSC analysis less costs for interim housing, is less than its matching share, the district will be deemed to have met the requirements of this Subsection.

(c) The district has made all reasonable efforts to fund its matching share of the project by demonstrating it is levying the developer fee justified under law or an alternative revenue source equal to or greater than the developer fee otherwise justified under law at the time of request for hardship and the district meets at least one of the following:

(1) The current outstanding bonded indebtedness of the district issued for the purpose of constructing school facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17072.35 or 17074.25 as appropriate, at the time of request for financial hardship status, is at least 60 percent of the district's total bonding capacity. Outstanding bonded indebtedness includes that part of general obligation bonds, Mello-Roos Bonds, School Facility Improvement District Bonds and certificates of participation which the district is paying a debt service that was issued for capital outlay school facility purposes.

(2) The district had a successful registered voter bond election for at least the maximum amount allowed under Proposition 39 within the previous two years from the date of request for financial hardship status. The proceeds from the bond election that represent the maximum amount allowed under the provisions of Proposition 39 must be used to fund the district's matching share requirement for SFP project(s).

(3) It is a County Superintendent of Schools.

(4) The district's total bonding capacity at the time of the request for financial hardship status is \$5 million or less.

(5) Other evidence of reasonable effort as approved by the SAB.

If the district's request for financial hardship status is denied by the Board, the district may be deemed eligible for rental payments of \$2,000 per year per classroom under the Emergency School Classroom Law of 1979 for a two year period when relocatable classroom buildings are available and the district provides financial documentation that it is unable to afford the full rental amount and any other information satisfactory to the Board that the rental reduction is necessary. The number of classrooms eligible for the \$2,000 rental payments shall be the sum of the numbers determined in (c)(5)(B) as follows:

(A) Determine the number of pupils by grade level that the district requested a New Construction Grant on the Form SAB 50-04 that were denied financial hardship status.

(B) Divide the number by grade level determined in (c)(5)(A) by 25 for K-6, 27 for 7-12, 13 for Non-Severe and 9 for Severe and round up to the nearest whole number.

(d) The district has not signed a contract for acquisition or construction of classrooms that replace existing facility(ies), which were included in the determination of the district's new construction eligibility pursuant to Education Code Section 17071.75, in a locally funded project during the five-year period immediately preceding the district's application for financial hardship assistance. This restriction may be lifted if the Board finds that unforeseen and extenuating circumstances existed that required the district to use local funds to replace the facility(ies).

(e) If the district meets the financial hardship requirements in this Section, the amount of financial hardship is equal to the district's matching share less funds deemed available in (a).

(1) Once a district has been notified by OPSC that it meets the requirements of financial hardship in this Section, the district may file Form SAB 50-04 under the

provisions of financial hardship anytime within a period of 180 calendar days from the date of the OPSC notification.

(2) If the district does not submit Form SAB 50-04 under the provisions of financial hardship within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship status, the district must re-qualify for financial hardship status under the provisions of this Section by submittal of a new request for financial hardship status.

(3) If the project(s) has been included on an unfunded list for more than 180 calendar days, a review of the district's funds pursuant to (a) will be made to determine if additional district funds are available to fund the district's matching share of the project(s).

Financial hardship approval status by the OPSC for a separate design and/or site apportionment does not apply to any subsequent funding for the project(s).

(f) If the district submits Form SAB 50-04 within 180 calendar days of the OPSC notification of approval of financial hardship and the project(s) has been included on the "Unfunded List (Lack of AB 55 Loans)" for more than 180 calendar days as a result of the State of California's inability to provide interim financing from the Pooled Money Investment Account (AB 55 loans), the Board may suspend the unfunded review requirement as defined in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Projects added to any other unfunded list shall be subject to the review detailed in Regulation Section 1859.81(e). Regulation Section 1859.81(f) shall become inoperative July 1, 2011.

(g) A project added to an unfunded list on or after July 1, 2011 will be subject to the review detailed in section (e)(3). For projects added to an unfunded list between February 25, 2009 and June 30, 2011, only the district's financial records on or after July 1, 2011 will be considered in calculating any adjustment to the district's matching share.

(h) On or after September 22, 2017, a district may submit a request for funding in advance of obtaining a determination of Financial Hardship.

(1) To be considered for Financial Hardship, the district must check the box on the Form SAB 50-04 requesting Financial Hardship pursuant to this subsection when submitting a request for funding.

(2) Prior to processing an application OPSC will notify the district in writing to submit the necessary documentation for a Financial Hardship analysis pursuant to (a), (b), (c) and (d). OPSC will not accept any documents for a Financial Hardship analysis in advance of the notification. Failure to submit the requested documentation within 60 calendar days of OPSC's notification will result in either a. or b.:

a. District may amend their Form SAB 50-04 to exclude the request for Financial Hardship determination.

b. OPSC will return the request for funding and related materials to the district.

(3) Upon notification of Financial Hardship approval, any Form SAB 50-04 processed within 180 calendar days of the approval date will be included in the approval.

(4) For any Form SAB 50-04 processed more than 180 calendar days after the date of the Financial Hardship approval the district shall re-qualify for Financial Hardship status.
